Resolution of Solidarity with the People of Israel

From the National Unity Coalition for Israel (The Largest Coalition of Jewish and Christian Pro-Israel Organizations in the United States)

Because of the deteriorating situation in Israel, we, the members of the 200 Christian and Jewish organizations within the National Unity Coalition for Israel, declare a renewal of solidarity with the people of the State of Israel.

The issue at stake is no longer the establishment of borders between Israel and her neighbors, but the very survival of the nation and the Jewish people who live there. We are acutely aware that the peace process no longer exists. On the contrary, Yasser Arafat and his radical terrorists are engaged in an all-out effort to annihilate the State of Israel.

Therefore:

- **We commend the United States House of Representatives for adopting Resolution 426 of October 24, 2000, passed by a two-thirds majority of members.** The Resolution “places sole blame for the recent violence in the West Bank and Gaza on the Palestinians.” We believe the congressmen acted with the facts fully in hand and with the support of the vast majority of the American people.
- **We are appalled by the stream of misinformation, distortions, and falsifications of fact transmitted by a large segment of major Western news media that regularly criticize Israel while remaining virtually silent about the atrocities committed daily by Palestinians.**
- **We condemn Mr. Arafat’s release of violent terrorists from Palestinian prisons.** These terrorists have joined with Fatah, Hamas, Islamic Jihad, and Hizbollah forces now allowed to operate with impunity on the West Bank and in Gaza, with the sole aim of establishing a united front for killing Jewish people and obliterating Israel.
- **We deplore the attacks against**

Jewish holy places such as Hebron, Rachel’s tomb in Bethlehem, the Temple Mount and the tomb of Joseph near Nablus. We find the building of a mosque over the remains of Joseph’s tomb particularly reprehensible and indicative of the final goals of the radical Islamic elements now operating against Israel and her people.

- **We further condemn as inhuman and intolerable the Palestinians’ deliberate use of small children to shield their gunmen from Israeli military forces.** The Palestinians have premeditated this inevitable carnage solely to manipulate international public sympathy in their favor and provide film footage for unscrupulous journalists who allow themselves to be a party to the death of innocent children. Criminal charges for manslaughter should be sought.
- **We unanimously petition for immediate and full disclosure by the United States’ State Department regarding the violence, terror tactics, and wanton persecution unleashed on hundreds of Christian Arabs in areas controlled by the Palestinian Authority.** Well-documented sources verify that these Christian Arabs are in extreme peril and are being forced

to flee their homes to find safety in Israel or in other countries.

Furthermore:

1. **Because we strongly believe that Israel has a Biblical, historical, moral, and legal right to Eretz Yisrael [the land of Israel], and that peace and stability in Israel are inexorably related to a commensurate measure of tranquility for American citizens, we fully support Israel in her struggle to survive.** Furthermore, in order to provide peace and safety for all citizens—Arabs, Christians, and Jews—we counsel Israel's representatives to reject Yasser Arafat as a legitimate peace partner and use whatever means necessary to disperse and expel terrorist enclaves operating in Israel, the West Bank, and Gaza.
2. **We petition the United States government to maintain a strong and unequivocal commitment to Israel and her citizens, not solely as a self-professed "honest broker," but as a strong, reliable ally that honors**

its relationships to friends and rejects slander of an ally in international forums. Integral to America's exhibition of credibility are the move of the American Embassy from Tel Aviv to Jerusalem; universal support of Jerusalem as the united capital of the Jewish state; unqualified rejection of Muslim exclusivity over the Temple Mount; and refusal to refer to the Temple Platform as Al-Qods-Al-Sharif, which implies prior Muslim claim to the sacred area, which is unquestionably historically Jewish.

3. **We implore the Congress and the Administration to hold fully accountable any nation that hosts, sponsors, or finances the perpetrators of terrorist acts and to exert all legitimate means at this nation's disposal to force those countries to cease condoning or supporting all such operations.**
4. **We challenge concerned Christians and Jews to band together in a union of solidarity and take decisive public action to alert our communities and duly**

elected representatives to the urgent need to support Israel, the Israeli people, and the persecuted Christians under attack by the enemies of peace. We further counsel all people of faith to fervently "pray for the peace of Jerusalem" and those charged with the heavy burdens of leadership in these trying days.

Hebraic Insight

The Hebrew word for peace—*shalom*—refers to something greater than the absence of external conflict, but includes a sense of internal completeness, soundness, and joyful spiritual health. Such *shalom* is obtained, says the psalmist, by means of loving God's law, or *Torah*.

Torah generally refers to instruction, understanding, and direction, and therefore is decidedly *not* to be thought of as opposed to grace. Rather, the Torah written on our hearts (Jer. 31:33) ought to manifest the grace of God already imparted in our everyday lives.

As the Lord Jesus taught us, the weightier matters of Torah are justice, mercy, and faith (Matt. 23:23), and the rock-bottom foundation of the Torah is the love of God and our neighbor (Mark 12:30). The Lord Jesus is both the fulfillment of the Torah on our behalf as well as our provision for living out its inner meaning in our lives. And those who earnestly live according to this Torah will neither stumble nor fall...

Ramallah and Jerusalem aren't the only sites of Arab protests these days.

They're also taking place in the streets near the *Chicago Sun-Times*, the *Los Angeles Times* and the *New York Times*.

Arab-Americans are, if you can believe it, charging that the major US media are biased in favor of Israel and against them. Let's analyze that claim.

A couple of weeks ago, the *New York Times* ran a photo of a young man bleeding on the streets of Israel and labeled him a "Palestinian" beaten by Israeli police or soldiers. It was complete reflex by the *Times*. Bleeding? Must be a Palestinian victim. It turns out the young man was a Jewish American student attending school in Israel, and he was beaten by an Arab mob.

Would a paper biased in favor of Israel and against Arabs make such a mistake? How about the *Chicago Sun-Times*? It turns out the Arabs' beef with the Hollinger International Inc. paper is that the parent company also owns the *Jerusalem Post*, the largest English-language paper in Israel. The Arab protests at the *Chicago Sun-Times* also focused on an Oct. 3 editorial blaming Yasser Arafat for recent violence.

That's not bias, folks. Those are facts of life. I think it's great that at least one paper in America recognizes that the pro-Arab propaganda disseminated by CNN and most of the establishment press in the US is just that— one-sided disinformation.

And what about the *Los Angeles Times*? Oh, the syndicate owned by the company had the audacity to distribute a column that criticized "radical, fundamentalist, murderous Islam." The column quickly pointed out that it was not an indictment of a religion, only an attack on extremism within that religion.

But that was too much for the newly organized, monolithic Arab-American community. It strikes me that all this protest is misguided, if, indeed, the objective is fair,

balanced, and accurate coverage by the press.

Why is it that these protesters are not criticizing the lack of free press in their native lands? In virtually every case, the official and semi-official news organs of the Arab world have one objective—fostering hatred against the Jewish state.

Reporters, editors, and producers for Arab media show one side and one side only — not just in their editorials, but in their so-called news stories. In fact, their "news stories" are, by Western standards, editorials. They are designed to enflame passions, not inform citizens.

No wonder Arab-Americans see pro-Israel bias in the US press. If their standards for objectivity and neutrality are based on the closed-minded government propaganda spewing forth in the Arab world, coverage in the West must, indeed, look slanted toward the Israeli side.

That's what I can't understand about most Arab-Americans. They are the new victims of prejudice and bias, we're being told over and over again in the US media, thanks to an aggressive public relations offensive by organized groups.

I'm an Arab-American. Why haven't I seen any evidence of this bias and prejudice in 46 years of life? Not once have I been mistreated, misrepresented or vilified because of my Arabic heritage — until very recently. And, interestingly, the hatred — and there is no other word for it — has been directed against me not by Jews, not by the US media, not by Israelis, but by other Arabs.

Apparently what bothers these activists more than anything is one of their own — ethnically speaking — breaking ranks. It's the unforgivable sin. Death threats and insults that would curl your hair are sure to follow. And that's why I say none of these protests should be taken seriously by anyone.

These folks — and, by this, I mean the protesters, the activists — are not interested in fairness. They are not interested in truth. They are not interested in a better image for Arabs and Arab-Americans. What they are interested in is the ultimate irony — bullying their way into victimhood status, as so many other groups have in recent years.

It's sad. It's group-think. And, unfortunately all too often, it works in America.

Too bad, though, that some of this energy isn't redirected at the closed, police-state world of the Arab states. Do these folks really remember from whence they came?

A Note From Zola

Dear Friends,

So many thoughts come to me during these difficult times for Israel. The first is always “Why don’t more Christians care?” I have pointed out over and over again that we’re all going to live there for a thousand years, and that could start seven years from today. But churches seem oblivious to the Promised Land. The seminaries have dropped it, and other than in the fine Bible churches, Israel is seldom mentioned or thought about.

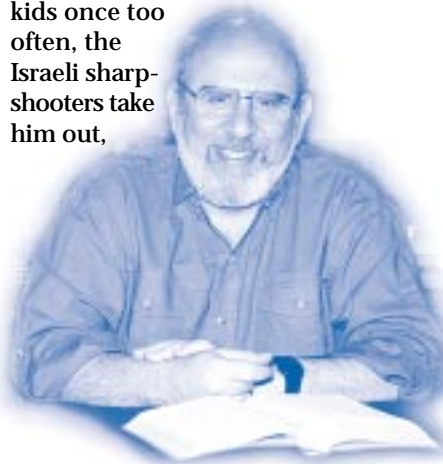
And yet, God is moving there so dramatically in these times that any Bible student should be on the edge of his seat. The “coincidence” between what the prophets foretold for Israel in the End Times and the situation that is actually occurring there as we watch is truly remarkable. Even the unbeliever would have to say that the Bible has certainly seemed to learn a lot lately.

I carry a shirt-pocket tape-recorder, and I dictate thoughts as I travel and minister, so if the following ideas are not in perfect order, please do forgive me. But I would like to relate all that I can on the crucial subject of Israel and what is going on there.

First of all, the Oscar nominations are coming up, and I think Yasser Arafat should get one for his portrayal of an innocent victim. The large supporting cast of Palestinian stone-throwers, riflemen and children deserve awards, too, for their pretense of a war for independence. Of course, I

don’t mean to belittle the sad events going on in the Holy Land today, but folks, this is not a war, it’s not about independence, and there are no such people as Palestinians, at least not with any history worth mentioning (notwithstanding Sen. John Kerry of Massachusetts, who said that the Palestinians and the Israelis have been at war “for thousands of years”).

The average Palestinian crowd is composed of little children up front (for the cameras), bigger kids behind them throwing rocks, and finally, the occasional rifleman in a police uniform, who pops up now and then and shoots at the Israelis. If he stands up over the heads of the kids once too often, the Israeli sharpshooters take him out,



and that is why so many of them are shot in the head (and sadly why so many kids get hit, as well). But let’s not exaggerate the casualty figures. At this point, they’re running about two per day, approximately what typically occurs in Atlanta, CNN’s headquarters, and the same, I suppose, that has always occurred in the West Bank and Gaza, whether we’re talking peace or playing war or whatever. It’s just that when CNN does its Israel-bashing job, they can make nothing much seem like a nationwide war, and that is exactly what they’re doing.

On the point of the Palestinian children being occasionally wounded or killed, former Israeli Prime Minister Golda Meir said, “We can forgive the Palestinians for killing our boys. We can’t forgive them for making us kill theirs.”

The sad part of it for Arafat and his people is that they need not be poor at all, if they would only cooperate with the Israelis. They are the only Arabs privileged to live in a democracy in that part of the world, and in truth, their lifestyle is far ahead of the Egyptians, the Syrians, the Jordanians, etc. Egyptians are prevented from touring Israel by their own “government” because Hosni Mubarak, their dictator, does not want them to see how well the Palestinians live. It would be the end of the “government” in Egypt if they did.

I saw a PBS special on Hitler’s incredible search for some racial background for Nazism. It was called *Search for the Holy Grail*, and it involved his “scientists” traveling everywhere in the world, even to Tibet, measuring people’s skulls, trying to find an “Aryan” background for his ridiculous prejudices. We are watching the same thing with Arafat when he fabricates a long history for the “Palestinians” and even states that the Israelis never lived in Israel, the Temple Mount was not Jewish, the Western Wall is not holy, etc., etc.

If you’re going to tell lies, they may as well be big ones.


In the meantime, one almost has to admire the Israeli handling of these

Mr. Carter's reply:
I am sorry that you

found the use of the word "Palestine" as a first-century designation objectionable. In the first century A.D. that is probably the only accurate word that could be applied to that region. I have read the article you mentioned. I believe that Mr. Levitt has confused his historical references. The article does not reflect the findings of either Biblical scholars or writers of encyclopedia articles (both of which I have today researched). The fact is that the Kingdom of Israel was destroyed in 722 B.C. and the nation of Israel was created out of Palestinian territory in 1948. There was no Israel in the first century A.D., or at any other time during that 2,670-year span. There was a Judea for part of that time (referring to the southern kingdom of the Old Testament), but it was only a province of Rome and did not include all of the territory referred to in the New Testament. However, the name "Palestine" has been used for that region for all that time and is the only one that avoids historical conflicts. In spite of Mr. Levitt, I feel that it is an appropriate name in references to the FIRST CENTURY A.D., which was the context of its use. Sorry to have disturbed you, or that Mr. Levitt disturbed you, whichever may be true. I do make historical mistakes (I made one in the 1998 series that was a doozy), but I believe that this is not one of them.

Dear T.N.,

What if the people of the world insisted on calling America "India," no matter how much historical information you showed them? That is something like what

the world has done and continues to do to Israel, no matter what the supposedly historical facts demonstrate. The whole world seems determined to call the land of Israel "Palestine," in spite of the overwhelming evidence to the contrary.

Worst of all, it appears that professing Christians are taking the lead to de-legitimize the name Israel. Take a look at the maps in the back of your Bible, and you will probably find one entitled, "Palestine in the Time of Christ." (Thank the Lord, the new *Tim LaHaye Prophecy Bible* uses the correct term Israel on the maps.) There was no Palestine in the time of Christ. The term had not even been invented then. The Romans did not come up with the name "Palestine" until 100 years after the resurrection of Christ, when Emperor Hadrian crushed the Jewish revolt under Bar Kochba, and was determined that the name Israel would disappear from the earth. Much of the world has bought into this notion, and refuses to recognize even the name "Israel," much less the nation.

It appears Bill Carter has made another "doozy" of a historical mistake when he says that Palestine in the first century A.D. "is probably the only accurate word that could be applied to that region," and that "there was no Israel in the first century A.D."

If there was no Israel in the first century, then the New Testament would have to be wrong. Note the very words in the article in the December 1997 *Levitt Letter* to which our reader referred the author and editor:

In the New Testament, the term "Palestine" is never used. The term "Israel" is primarily used to refer to the people of Israel, rather than the Land. However, in at least two passages, Israel is used to refer to the Land:

Saying, Arise, and take the young child and his mother, and go into the land of Israel: for they are dead who sought the young child's life. And he arose, and took the young child and his mother, and came into the land of Israel. (Matt. 2:20-21)

But when they persecute you in this city, flee ye into another: for verily I say to you, Ye shall not have gone over the cities of Israel, till the Son of man shall have come. (Matt. 10:23)

The first passage is when Joseph, Mary and Jesus returned from Egypt to Israel, and the second has reference to the

proclamation of the Gospel throughout the Land of Israel. Jesus, Matthew and the angel speaking to Joseph use the term "Israel" with reference to the Land, even though the term was not then recognized by the Roman authorities. It is clear, then, that the Bible never uses the term "Palestine" to refer to the Holy Land as a whole, and that Bible maps that refer to Palestine in the Old or New Testament are, at best, inaccurate, and, at worst, are a conscious denial of the Biblical name of Israel.

The New Testament, including Matthew, was written in the first century, and clearly uses the name "Israel" to refer to the Land, and never uses the term "Palestine." How could somebody say that the term "Israel" was never used in the first century? The only explanation is that they consult "Biblical writers or writers of encyclopedia articles" rather than the Bible itself. Resource materials are fine, but they should not be used to contradict the Bible.

We are grateful for our sharp, intelligent and spiritual readers who stand up for the truth about the Scriptures, about the Lord and about Israel.

Subject: We shouldn't be surprised

Shalom Brother Zola,

Rabbi Sha'ul [Paul] warned the believers in Macedonia to beware of those who would introduce and preach false doctrines, not from people outside of the Church, but from people within the Church (Acts 20:28-31). Even then, false doctrines were beginning to infiltrate the Church.

Therefore, it should come as no surprise that seminaries such as Criswell and others are using a textbook replete with heretical theology and anti-Semitism. This would also include liberal denominations, Mormonism, Jehovah's Witnesses, and the Catholic Church. As you have stated, anti-Semitism, in whatever guise, that is preached, taught, and accepted to the extent it is today, is, indeed, a sure sign of the fact that we're in the last days. Anti-Semitism has been in existence since the first-century Church; however, it's not been as blatantly vehement, readily preached, and widely accepted as it is today. A good example is the way the media covers Israel, compared to the way it treats countries where truly horrendous human rights violations are occurring. 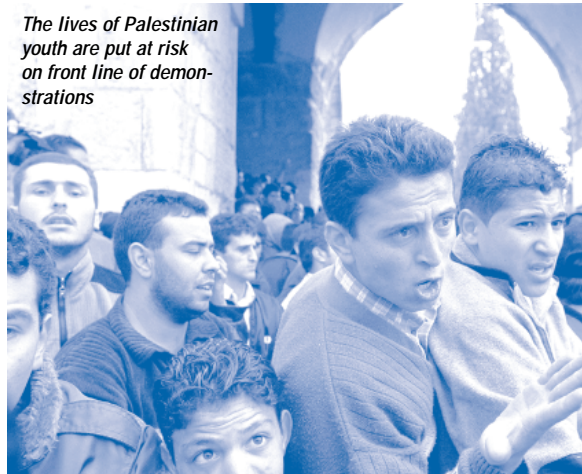

They want to believe, so they believe. They want not to see, so they shut their eyes. They want not to learn from thousands of years of history, so they distort it. It would be comic if it weren't so tragic."

Sadly, this wise young man died in Entebbe in 1976.

... Israelis, however, do seem to be learning something. They are learning that the international support generated by territorial concessions can last only as long as it takes the Palestinians to gin up another grievance—and there's an endless supply of those, from hassles with work permits to the "right of return" for refugees. They are learning that goodwill gestures are taken by their enemies as a sign of weakness, not goodness. They are learning that Palestinian demands are non-negotiable, calling into question the utility of negotiation. They are learning that to have formal relations with their neighbors counts for little, as the recall of Egypt's ambassador last week showed. They are learning, in short, that

The BBC (British Broadcasting Company) just crossed a line that has Israel media watchers up in arms. BBC news reporter, Hilary Anderson, becoming well known for her biased reporting against the Jewish people and the nation of Israel,

BBC was clear and large in the windows, and the word "TV" was written giant-sized in duct tape on the windows on all sides. In the dirt on the bottom third of the van, someone had scrawled, "Tell the truth!"

It is an appropriate moral with which to end this open protest letter. The truth is continuing to go out in many personal emails from every strata of society. News sources will wind up with egg on their faces when unbalanced reporters like Hilary are allowed to skew facts to their own agenda.

My Hairbrained Idea For December

Sometimes my father, Zola, gives me the sort of “reality check” that he would like to give to America’s secular media. His frankness can be just what the doctor ordered. He remains as much smarter than I am now as he was twenty years ago, when I was a wet-behind-the-ears college kid.

Zola and I have watched week-by-week as CNN and the other media have meticulously disassembled Israel’s tourism industry. Casualties per week remain as negligibly few as ever, but suddenly each one has become as newsworthy as a man-bites-dog story. Our amazement and bewilderment with this malicious campaign stem from the fact that the statistics haven’t changed from a year ago. A violent protester dying in the ongoing jihad (“holy war”) is about as novel as a dog-biting-man story or a drug dealer getting shot in a Los Angeles gang area.

Zola said that my idea was not useful, that it would be a waste of time. Here was my plan: I wanted to join our December tour and shoot a home video entitled *Looking for Trouble in Israel*. With a little luck, I might have caught CNN staging a stone-fest (see www.goisrael.com testimonial on page 12). My main objective was to do an up-to-the-minute documentary on how peaceful Israel is everywhere that tourists go.

Zola said, “I give up. I can’t overcome the footage they (the mass media) show every hour on the hour.” He believes that my peaceful tape, representative of a ten-day tour, would be perceived as the exception while CNN’s footage, methodically collected at troubled borders and checkpoints, would be thought the rule.

The emails we get from Israel complain more about their economic condition than any fear for safety. Our December tour passengers, reminiscent of those we took during the scud missile “crisis” of the Persian Gulf War, were more warmly received than you can imagine. The pilgrims who go during “war times” like this deliver a strong testimony of faith to our guides and drivers. You, too, can send a message from stateside. 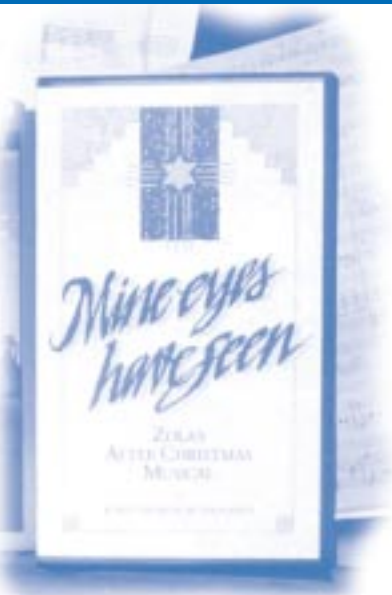
