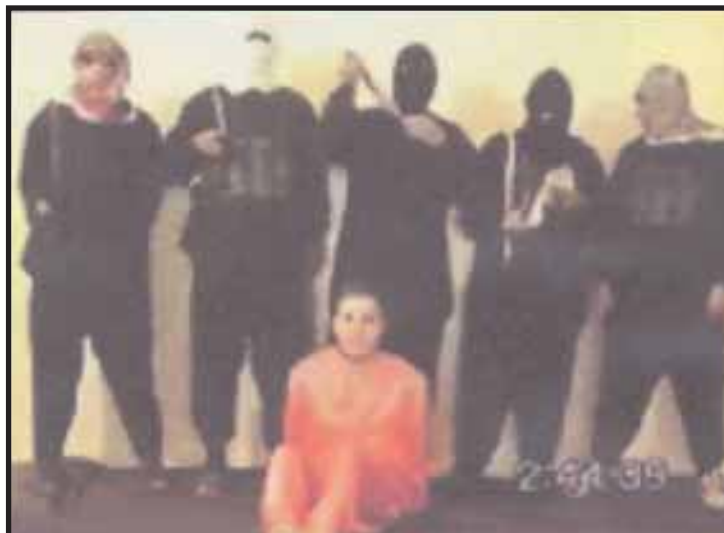

## Europe's Double Standard

When an Israeli missile ended the life of Sheik Ahmed Yassin, the 68-year-old “spiritual leader” of Hamas, much of the world responded with anger and condemnation.

U.N. Secretary-General Kofi Annan intoned: “Such actions violate international law and do nothing to help find a peaceful solution.” The European Union’s foreign policy chief, Javier Solana, issued a corresponding denunciation, adding that the assassination of Yassin did not “contribute at all to create the conditions of peace, the conditions of dialogue, which are necessary at this moment.” Other EU ministers issued similar statements.

Jack Straw, the British Foreign Secretary, reiterated Britain’s opposition to “targeted” killings as a violation of international law and was seconded by French Foreign

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Chechnya, Bosnia, Indonesia, Spain, Morocco, India, Tunisia, Somalia, etc. Can anybody name three ongoing world conflicts in which Muslims are not involved? Today, where there is war, there are fanatical Muslims.

We might quibble about who started what conflicts, but look at the sheer number of them.

One thing is sure. Muslim killers started the one we are in now when they slaughtered more than 3,000 people, including fellow Muslims, in New York City.

Madeleine Albright, the former secretary of state and feckless appeaser who helped get us into this mess, said last week Muslims still resent the Crusades. Well, Madam Albright, if Westerners were not such a forgiving people, we might resent them too.

Let's recap the Crusades. Muslims invaded Europe, and when they reached sufficient numbers, they imposed their intolerant religion upon Westerners by force. Christian monarchs drove them back and took the battle to their homeland. The fight lasted a couple of centuries, and we bottled them up for 1,000 years.

Now, a millennium later, Muslims have expanded forth again. Ask France.

Ask England. Ask Manhattan. Two-and-a-half years ago fanatical Muslims laid siege to us. We woke up to the obvious. Our president announced it would be a very long war, and then took the battle to the Islamic homeland.

Sound familiar?

Let's consider the concept of a "long war." Last time it was 200 years, give or take. Anybody catch *Lord of the Rings*? You know, the good part, the part that wasn't fiction, the part that drew us to the books and movies because it was the truest part: the titanic struggle between good and evil, between freedom and enslavement, between the individual and the state,

between the celebration of life and the worshipping of death.

That's the fight we are in, and it never ends. It just has peaks and valleys.

There may be a silent majority of peaceful Muslims. Some live here, but that did not save 3,000 people in the World Trade Center, the million gassed and butchered in the Middle East, the tens of thousands slain in Eastern Europe and Asia, the hundreds blown to bits in the West Bank and Spain, or the four Americans shot, burned and hung like sausage over the Euphrates as a fanatical minority of Muslims did the joyful dance of death.

Maybe we are so tolerant, we are so bent on "diversity," we are so non-judgmental, we are so wrapped up in our six-packs and ballgames that our brains have drained to our bulbous behinds. Maybe we're so addled on Ritalin we wouldn't know which end of a gun to hold. Maybe we need a new drug advertised on TV every three minutes, one that would help us grow a backbone.

It doesn't take a Darwin to figure out that in this world the smartest, the fastest, the strongest, and the most committed always win. No exceptions.

Look at your spouse and children. Look at yourself in the mirror.

Then look at the pictures from the paper. You better look at them. Those are the people out to kill you.

Who do you think will win? You? Or them? Think you can take your ball and go home and they will leave you alone? Read a little history. Start with last week, last month, last year, and every other year back for half a century. Then go back a thousand years. Nobody hides from this fight.

Like it or not, that's the way it was and that's the way it is.

But many Americans don't get it.

That's why we published those pictures.

If they jarred you off the sofa, if they offended you, if they scared your children and sent you into a rage at mass murderers or heartless editors, then I say, it's a start. ★

## Europe's Double Standard *continued*

Minister Dominique de Villepin, who declared, "France condemns the actions perpetrated against Sheik Yassin."

Norwegian Foreign Minister Jan Petersen also "condemned" Israel even while admitting that Hamas is a terrorist organization. Germany, Russia, Japan, South Africa, and other nations added their denunciations.

Many leading religious figures joined in the censure. Canon Andrew White of the Anglican Church (known as the Episcopal Church to most Americans) claimed serious damage had been done to the peace process. The General Secretary of the Lutheran World Federation, Rev. Dr. Ishmael Noko, characterized the "murder" as "abominable." The Pope said through a spokesman: "Authentic and lasting peace cannot be the fruit of a mere ostentation of force," and added that the violence could not be "justified in any state of law."

Arab leaders universally denounced the killing. Egyptian President Hosni Mubarak struck a representative note when he said: "We condemn this aggression because he is one of the political symbols in Gaza." In America, many Islamic organizations joined in execration, and several announced plans to sue the U.S. government for selling weapons to Israel (based on prohibitions against transferring arms to governments that use them against civilians).

Yassin, however, was no civilian.

In 1987 he founded the most vicious of the Palestinian terrorist groups, Hamas, and wrote the group's char-

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ter. That document, available to anyone who wishes to examine it, states explicitly that the group's goal is the elimination of Israel, the cleansing of Jews from the Holy Land and the establishment of an Islamic state in Israel's place.

Almost as comic relief, Yassin referred to the fraudulent *Protocols of the Elders of Zion*, which weaves a tinfoil-hat conspiracy theory that puts Jews at the head of the French Revolution, Hitler's Nazi party, Communism and both World Wars in conjunction with a coterie of "Zionist" organizations that includes the Freemasons, the Lions Clubs and the Rotarians.

Proving there is nothing funny about his organization, however, the gang that Yassin built has perpetrated more than 425 attacks, killing 377 people and wounding more than 2,000. The infamous 2002 Park Hotel Seder massacre, which killed 29 Israeli babies, newlyweds and grandparents, is an example of Hamas' handiwork.

Hamas operates openly in the West Bank and Gaza with the public blessing of Yasser Arafat, whose Palestinian Authority has licensed the group to keep weapons. It runs an extensive network of recruitment and terror support activities aimed at turning Palestinian children into suicide bombers and rewarding their families for sending them to their deaths.

Article 13 of the Hamas charter bans any agreement with or concerning Israel. Palestine, according to Hamas, is an Islamic holy possession. "There is no solution for the Palestinian problem except by jihad. All initiatives, proposals, and international conferences are a waste of time and vain endeavors."

Still, Europeans insist that Israelis must refrain from military action against those who regularly kill them, relying only on negotiations with fanatics who have openly sworn to destroy them. Ironically, the taped mid-April proposal for a truce between al-Qaeda

and Europeans elicited an entirely different reaction from the perennial critics of Israel. Believed to have come from Osama bin Laden, the offer was to institute a temporary halt to terrorist attacks on any European country that withdraws its troops from all Islamic lands.

A German government spokesman in Afghanistan protested that Germany "will not be coerced, seduced or threatened by anyone." French President Jacques Chirac declared: "There can be no possible bargaining with terrorists. Nothing can justify terrorism and, on that basis, nothing can allow any discussion with terrorists."

Even Spain, where voters threw out Jose Aznar's pro-coalition party after the deadly railway bombings, rejected the very concept that civilized people would negotiate with a terrorist leader. Though many analysts believe bin Laden's temporary "truce" proposal was inspired by the electoral results of the terror attacks in Madrid, incoming Foreign Minister Miguel Angel Moratinos said, "Bin Laden is the enemy of all of us who seek peace, democracy and freedom. Therefore, we must not listen to him or pay attention to him."

Spain's situation is, in fact, perfectly analogous to the Jewish homelands.

Neither bin Laden nor Yassin actually carried out attacks, leaving that to their lieutenants while they concentrated on fundraising and providing "spiritual" justification for those who kill in their names.

Like Israel, Spain was settled by the ancestors of its current inhabitants long before Islam ever existed. Because even temporary and violent occupation of a land by Muslim forces is all it takes to make it once and forever Islamic, in the minds of Islamists, both Israel and Spain are now claimed as part of the new Caliphate and control of significant portions of their historical territories is now being challenged by Muslims.

There is, of course, an enormous difference in the way the two countries are treated by the international community. When Spain was attacked, Spanish authorities immediately struck out at those responsible, and the world cheered. When Israel, finally, after fifteen years, decided to eliminate the man responsible for killing hundreds of its innocent civilians, most of the world booed and hissed.

There is a reason and a name for this double standard, one that nobody wants to hear. The last time it was allowed to flourish, however, it led to the deaths of six million European Jews. ✪

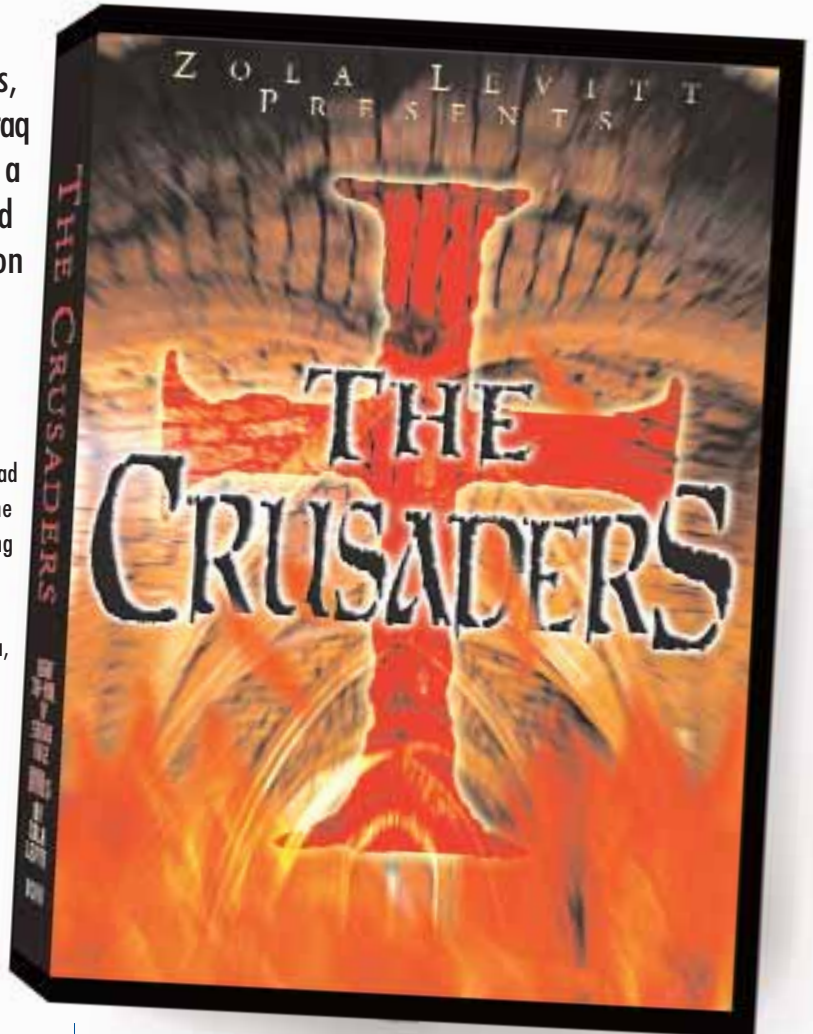

## The Muslims are Coming! – I

**HAMTRAMCK, MI**—A request by Detroit-area Muslims to let mosques use loudspeakers for the call to prayer has prompted a backlash among their non-Muslim neighbors.

They're circulating a petition opposing the request by the Al-Islah Islamic Center for a change in the city of Hamtramck's noise ordinance. The Muslim call to prayer occurs five times a day between 6am and 10pm.

At a City Council hearing, one citizen objected that a call to prayer is proselytizing and he doesn't want to hear it. Another said: "It is not my God. My God is Jesus Christ. I don't want this noise invading my home at 10pm."

Still, the council's president says the proposed amendment is likely to pass next week.

Muslim speakers said they often hear church bells as early as 6 am and insisted that their call to prayer will be less noisy.

*P.S. The measure passed the council, but is on hold until a citywide vote in August.* ★

## The Muslims are Coming! – II

Muslims in the Canadian province of Ontario can soon turn to settling disputes in their own courts, known as sharia, *The Washington Post* reported.

Muslim promoters of sharia arbitration said no cases have yet been decided but the process is set. Islamic leaders created an Islamic Court of Civil Justice last fall and it has chosen arbitrators who have undergone training in sharia and Canadian civil law.

"People can agree to resolve disputes any way acceptable," said Brendan Crawley, a spokesman for the Ontario Attorney General's office said in an interview. He said the

arbitration act has a number of safeguards, including the requirement that parties enter into arbitration only on a voluntary basis, and any decisions by arbitrators are subject to court ratification.

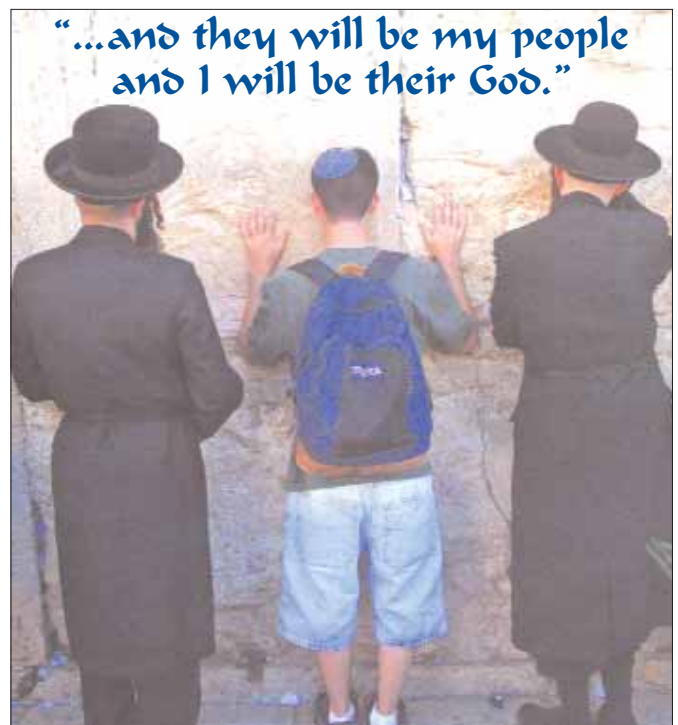
Jewish courts, using similar methods, have long been operating in Ontario. Such a court, called a Beit Din, deals with monetary, business and family disputes, but no criminal matters.

"Jewish courts have been operating in Toronto for as long as Jews have been here, hundreds of years," said Rabbi Reuven Tradburks, secretary of the Beit Din of Toronto. He said he had not heard of cases decided by arbitrators in Jewish courts that had been overturned. ★

After all, how else will we have peace?

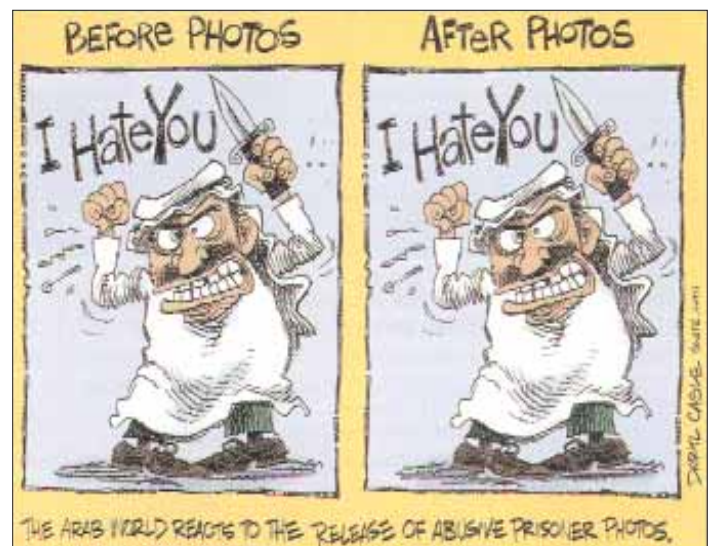

You may recall my "State of the Ministry" article on page 23 of our April *Levitt Letter*, which is posted at [www.levitt.com](http://www.levitt.com).

I expressed gratitude for your supporting our expansion onto the PAX television network, which is larger than ABC-Family and TBN combined.

We are still running in the red on PAX, but this is no surprise. Accumulating enough viewers and, subsequently, supporters, to cover a new airtime can be a long, costly process. Actually, it can be grueling, unless you consider such expenses an investment in the Kingdom, which we do.

Our PAX invoices are equivalent to the purchase of a small house each

month, and they are taxing our reserves considerably, more than anticipated. Fortunately, contributions from PAX viewers are increasing by an average of 5% per month. The faith tester is that we're in the midst of vacation season, when our gifts traditionally drop, and they have fallen precipitously.

Since we own no real estate, airplanes, or limos, our overhead is low. We have only a dozen employees and office in just over 3,000 square feet of rented space. In the December *Levitt Letter* cover article, "Zola on PAX — A Major Step of Faith," I observed that we were spending 46% of our revenue on TV airtime, 13% on TV production, 21% on newsletters, and 14% on personnel. Then we increased our airtime expenses to 77%, which was worthwhile, but we're feeling the growing pains.

Now Zola and I ask you to stay with us, to help us protect our investment in a superior airtime on an incredible network that reaches people via cable, satellite, broadcast, and the Internet. # Arab Terrorists Now Eligible For Pre-Boarding

In June 2001, as Mohamed Atta completed his final “to do” list before the 9/11 attacks (“... amend will to ban women from my funeral ... leave extra little Friskies out for Mr. Buttons ... set TiVo for Streisand on ‘Inside the Actors’ Studio’...”), Secretary of Transportation Norman Mineta was conducting a major study on whether airport security was improperly screening passengers based on ethnicity. As Mineta explained: “We must protect the civil rights of airline passengers.” Protecting airline passengers from sudden death has never made it onto Mineta’s radar screen.

A few months later, after 19 Muslim men hijacked U.S. airplanes and turned them into weapons of mass destruction on American soil, Mineta was a whirlwind of activity. On September 21, as the remains of thousands of Americans lay smoldering at Ground Zero, Mineta fired off a letter to all U.S. airlines forbidding them from implementing the one security measure that would have prevented 9/11: subjecting Middle Eastern passengers to an added degree of pre-flight scrutiny. He sternly reminded the airlines that it was illegal to discriminate against passengers based on their race, color, national or ethnic origin, or religion.

Mineta would have sent the letter even sooner, but he wanted to give the airlines enough time to count the number of their employees and customers who had just been murdered by Arab passengers.

On September 27, 2001, the ACLU sent out a press release titled, “ACLU Applauds Sensible Scope of Bush Airport Security Plan,” which narrowly won out over the headline: “Fox Approves Henhouse Security Plan.” As a rule of thumb, any security plan approved by the ACLU puts American lives at risk. ACLU Associate Director Barry Steinhardt praised Bush’s Transportation Department for showing “an admirable degree of restraint by not suggesting airport security procedures that would deny civil liberties as a condition of air travel.” The ACLU had zeroed in on the true meaning of 9/11: Americans needed to be more tolerant of and sensitive toward ethnic minorities.

Flush with praise from the ACLU, Mineta set to work suing airlines for removing passengers perceived to be of Arab, Middle Eastern or Southeast Asian descent, and/or Muslim. If we’re going to start shifting money around based on who’s rude

to whom, my guess is Muslims are going to end up in the red. But that’s not how Mineta’s Department of Transportation sees it.

Despite Mineta’s clearly worded letter immediately after the 9/11 terrorist attacks and another follow-up letter in October, the Department of Transportation found that in the weeks after the 9/11 terrorist attacks carried out by Middle Eastern men, the airlines were targeting passengers who appeared to be Middle Eastern. To his horror, Mineta discovered that the airlines were using logic and deductive reasoning to safeguard their passengers — in direct violation of his just-issued guidelines on racial profiling!

The Department of Transportation filed a complaint against United Airlines, claiming United removed passengers from flights in “a few instances” based on their race, color, national origin, religion, or ancestry. Mineta gave United no credit for so scrupulously ignoring ethnicity on September 11 that it lost four pilots, 12 flight attendants and 84 passengers (not including the nine Arab hijackers). In November 2003, United settled the case for \$1.5 million.

In another crucial anti-terrorism investigation undertaken by Norman Mineta, the Department of Transportation claimed that between September 11, 2001 and December 31, 2001, American Airlines — which lost four pilots, 13 flight attendants and 129 passengers (not including 10 Arab hijackers) on September 11 by ignoring the ethnicity of its passengers — removed 10 individuals who appeared to be Middle Eastern from American Airlines flights as alleged security risks. On March 1, 2004, American Airlines settled the case for \$1.5 million.

# And the World Still Remains Silent

There are only a couple of possible explanations for why the world is not out even now, protesting the intentional murder of a pregnant woman and her four young daughters by Palestinian gunmen.

I think it's clear that had the shooters been Israeli soldiers and the victims a Palestinian family, millions of righteously indignant protesters would have hit the streets and the airwaves calling for the capture and punishment of the murderers and, no doubt, the immediate dismantling of "the Zionist entity."

They do that when a Palestinian civilian gets unintentionally caught in the crossfire. They do it when actual gunmen and terrorists are killed. They do it when fences are constructed to keep the killers out. They do it when terrorists' houses — their houses, not their families — are destroyed. They do not do it when defenseless Jewish women and children are gunned down in the street.

There are only a limited number of explanations for this — none of them very pleasant.

One must realize that we are talking about the intentional murder of a pregnant woman and four little girls. Someone had to take aim at and shoot an obviously pregnant woman and four small children ages 2 to 11. This was not a case of accidental collateral damage. This was a targeted killing. And, I'm sorry, but there is absolutely no moral equivalency between the targeted killing of an armed (or even an unarmed) terrorist mastermind, and the murder of an unarmed pregnant woman and her children, no matter how much certain people would like there to be. It is the difference not between apples and oranges, but between apples and skyscrapers.

Had the victims been any other pregnant woman and her children, practically anywhere else in the world, there would have been a deafening hue and cry.

So, either much of the world is OK with the Jews as victims or they have a very low opinion of Arabs.

What I mean is, that unless there is a collective understanding that Jews are unimportant, expendable or worse, justifiable targets, the only other explanation is that the world feels the Palestinian Arabs are simply incapable of civilized behavior. Unless the world is collectively thinking, "well,

they're Arabs, what do you expect?" then we can explain the deafening silence over this atrocity only through worldwide, systemic and deeply entrenched anti-Semitism.

I'm not crazy about either explanation, but I think I hope it's the former, because there is some chance for the Arabs themselves to change that perception by behaving in a civilized manner, and by calling on their misguided brethren to do so, too.

The latter explanation, on the other hand, has terrifying and far-reaching implications that I'd prefer not to contemplate, and which people all over the world, in the United States in particular, are dismissing as impossible.

Unfortunately, those of us familiar with history know that dismissing unpleasantness out of hand doesn't make it go away. On the contrary, it allows it to fester and grow.

If the international acquiescence to or rationalization of the murder of that Jewish family isn't a function of anti-Semitism or a belief that no better behavior can be expected from Palestinian Arabs, then it can only be a fear, a terror as it were, that to speak out against the wholesale slaughter of innocent Jewish men, women and even children may bring the wrath of the proverbial Hun down upon the protester.

If that's it, we're all doomed, of course, because that means the terrorists have already won.

(What makes these murders even more horrendous is the fact that the Arabs involved deliberately came up to the car and slaughtered the children at close range.)

## Those Jews Again

Terrorists hit Saudi Arabia over the weekend, killing six foreigners, including two Americans, at an oil refinery partly owned by Exxon Mobil. Some Saudi authorities blamed al-Qaeda, but Crown Prince Abdullah, the kingdom's de facto ruler, offered a theory of his own, as the Saudi Press Agency, a regime mouthpiece, reports:

"It became clear to us now that Zionism is behind terrorist actions in the Kingdom. I can say that I am 95 percent sure of that," he said.

He regretted that Zionism has misled some of our sons. . . .

Crown Prince Abdullah added that the misled persons also killed people at Public Security. He described those deceived persons as stooges of Satan and colonialism, affirming that the Kingdom will be victorious in confronting any deviating group. ★

## Israel Defends Attack on Rafah

On May 17th and 18th, Israel destroyed about 100 Palestinian homes in the Rafah refugee camp in Gaza on grounds that they were used by gunmen firing on Israeli forces or for tunnels used to smuggle weapons from Egypt to terrorist groups in the region. Today, Amnesty International issued a report describing the home demolitions as "unnecessary collective punishment" that in some cases amounts to war crimes.

But Israel defended its actions. "When terrorists fire from within civilian structures or activate roadside charges from trees and fields, military necessity dictates the demolition of these locations," a government statement said. "Under international law, these structures are considered legitimate military targets. Therefore, in the midst of combat, when dictated by operational necessity, Israeli security forces may lawfully destroy structures used by terrorists." ★

The Department of Transportation also charged Continental Airlines with discriminating against passengers who appeared to be Arab, Middle Eastern or Muslim after the September 11 terrorist attacks. In April 2004, Continental Airlines settled the complaint for \$500,000.

Like many of you, I carefully reviewed the lawsuits against the airlines in order to determine which airline had engaged in the most egregious discrimination, so I could fly only that airline. But oddly, rather than bragging about the charges, the airlines heatedly denied discriminating against Middle Eastern passengers. What a wasted marketing opportunity! Imagine the great slogans the airlines could use:

"Now Frisking All Arabs — Twice!"

"More Civil Rights Lawsuits Brought by Arabs Than Any Other Airline!"

"The Friendly Skies — Unless You're an Arab."

"You Are Now Free to Move About the Cabin — Not So Fast, Muhammed!"

Worst of all, the Department of Transportation ordered the settlement money to be spent on civil rights programs to train airline staff to stop looking for terrorists, a practice known as digging your own grave and paying for the shovel. Airlines that have been the most vigilant against terrorism are forced by the government into reeducation seminars to learn to suppress common sense. Airlines are being forced, at their own expense, to make commercial air travel more dangerous.

If John Kerry would promise to fire Norman Mineta and start racial profiling at the airports, I would campaign for him. Unfortunately, like George Bush, Kerry doesn't travel commercial air with the little people. ★

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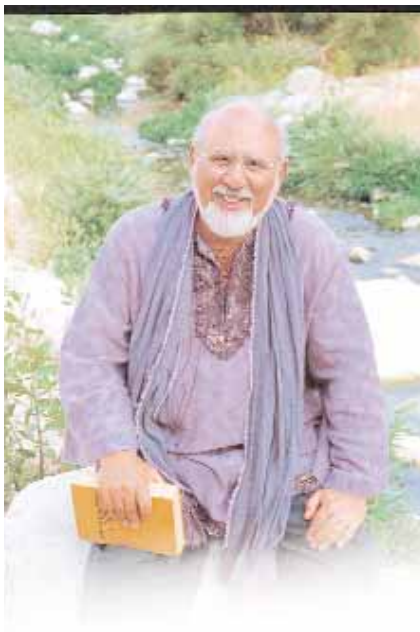
