Why Do They Hate Us?

The idea that what goes around comes around applies not only to individuals but to nations and whole civilizations. It was just a few centuries ago—not long, as history is measured—that China had the highest standard of living in the world and the Dutch were the world's largest exporters, while North Africans were enslaving a million Europeans. Nowhere have whole peoples seen their situation reversed more visibly or more painfully than the peoples of the Islamic world. In medieval times, Europe lagged far behind the Islamic world in science, mathematics, scholarship, and military power.

Even such ancient European thinkers as Plato and Aristotle became known to Europeans of the Middle Ages only after their writings, which had been translated into Arabic, were translated back into European languages.

Today that is all reversed. The number of books per person in Europe is more than ten times that in Africa and the Middle East. The number of books translated into Arabic over the past thousand years is about the same as the number translated into Spanish in one year.

Blaming the Good Guys

Twice in recent days, the world has witnessed situations in which democracies at war with terrorists—the U.S. military in Iraq and the Israeli Army in Gaza—have launched raids against military targets in which civilians also suffered harm. As more information comes out about both actions, it seems increasingly clear that both the United States and Israel were legitimately acting to stop terrorist activity.

There are only 18 computers per thousand persons in the Arab world, compared to 78 per thousand persons worldwide. Fewer than 400 industrial patents were issued to people in the Arab countries during the last two decades of the 20th century, while 15,000 industrial patents were issued to South Koreans alone.

Human beings do not always take reversals of fortune gracefully. Still less can those who were once on top quietly accept seeing others leaving them far behind economically, intellectually and militarily.

Those in the Islamic world have for centuries been taught to regard themselves as far superior to the “infidels” of the West, while everything they see with their own eyes now tells them otherwise. Worse yet, what the whole world sees with their own eyes tells them that the Middle East has made few contributions to human advancement in our times.

Even Middle Eastern oil was largely discovered and processed by people from the West. After oil, the Middle East’s most prominent export has been terrorism.

Those who look at the world in rationalistic terms may say that the Middle East can use some of its vast oil wealth to expand its own educated classes and move back to the forefront of human achievement. They did it once, why not do it again?

All sorts of things can be done in the long run, but you have to live through the short run to get there. Moreover, even the short run, as history is measured, can be pretty long in terms of the human lifespan.

Even if the Islamic world set such goals and committed the material resources and individual efforts required, they could not expect to pull abreast of the West for generations, even if the West stood still. More realistically, it would take centuries, as it took the West centuries to catch up to them.

What will happen in the meantime? Are millions of proud human beings supposed to quietly accept inferiority for themselves and their children, and perhaps their children’s children?

Or are they more likely to listen to demagogues, whether political or religious, who tell them that their lowly place in the world is due to the evils of others—the West, the Americans, the Jews?

If the peoples of the Islamic world disregarded such demagogues, they would be the exceptions, rather than the rule, among people who lag painfully far behind others. Even in the West, there have been powerful political movements based on the notion that the rich have gotten

rich by keeping others poor—and that things need to be set right “by all means necessary.”

These means seldom include concentration on self-improvement, with 19th-century Japan being one of the rare exceptions. Lashing out at others is far more immediately satisfying—and modern communications, transportation and weaponry make it far easier to lash out destructively across great distances.

Against this background, we may want to consider the question asked by hand-wringers in the West: Why do they hate us? Maybe it is because the alternative to hating us is to hate themselves. ★

Unfortunately, some of the early press reports suggest that some journalists instinctively tend to blame democratic governments rather than the terrorists when noncombatants die as a result of actions taken on the battlefield.

In Iraq, the American military has come under fire following a strike carried out by air and ground forces near Mogr el-Deeb, a town near the Syrian border. Locals claimed that the Americans struck a wedding party, killing more than 40 civilians, and that the dead included more than two dozen women and children. In Britain, the *Sunday Herald* ran a story titled "Iraq: The Wedding Party Massacre," depicting the American military action as a strike against innocent revelers. The British newspaper the *Independent* ran a story citing the incident as proof that U.S. troops are "deliberately and indiscriminately shooting civilians." Pictures from the scene, the *Independent* claimed, are "worse than those of the humiliation and torture of detainees at Abu Ghraib prison. These show chunks of flesh... scattered across a scene of devastation."

The problem (virtually ignored in the aforementioned stories) is that the U.S. military has found plenty of evidence suggesting that what the American military struck was a "rat line"—a gathering on a trail used by terrorists infiltrating from Syria in order to kill Iraqis and coalition forces. It found items including rifles, military binoculars and battery packs that could be used to detonate road-side bombs—which have killed and maimed hundreds of American soldiers. Also located there were terrorist training manuals and machines used to forge Iraqi identification cards.

Although major American news outlets generally have done a responsible job thus far of reporting on the Mogr el-Deeb strike, the same cannot be said of stories on Israel's

campaign to destroy terrorists' weapons-smuggling tunnels in densely populated civilian areas in the Gaza town of Rafah. Major American newspapers like *The Washington Post*, for example, have emphasized the physical destruction caused by the fighting in Gaza, while ignoring or burying information that would put the story into proper context—like the fact that the terrorists bribe local residents to allow weapons tunnels to be built under their homes.

Without such essential information, stories from the battlefield become propaganda—the antithesis of real reporting. ✨

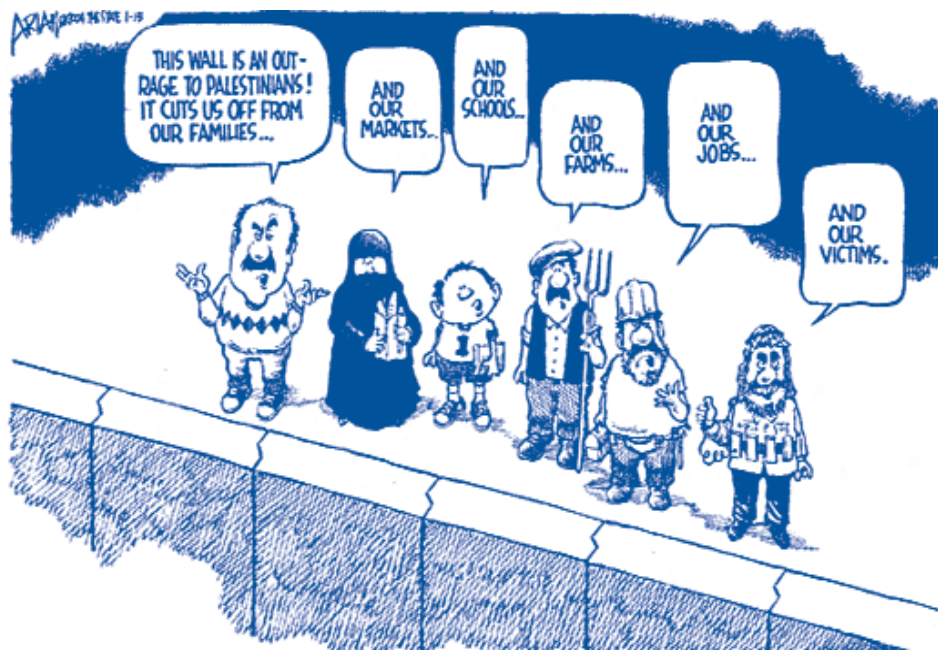

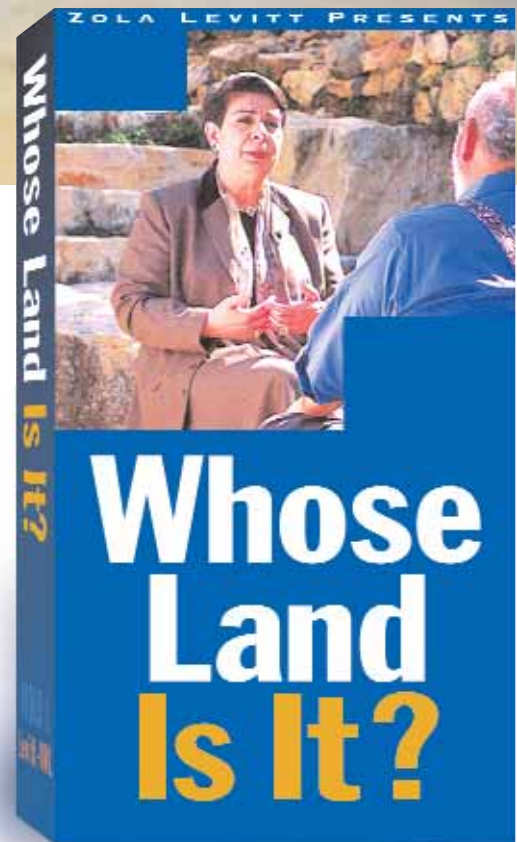

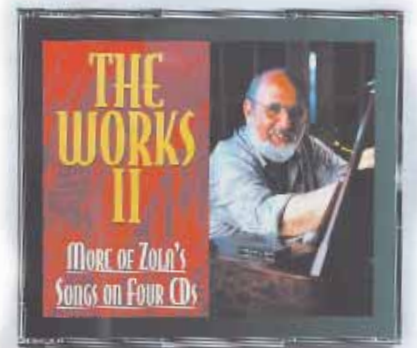

Fences and More Fences

Manmade barriers are springing up around the Middle East at points where manmade conflicts are most intractable. Be they security fences, earthworks, moated ramparts, steel walls, razor wire, or combinations thereof, their purpose is to apply division and separation to break up difficulties into manageable elements. Will this device work? Some think it's worth a try.

Israeli forces who drove into the southern Gaza Strip town of the terrorist hotbed of Rafah's Tel Sultan early Tuesday, May 18, came with giant engineering corps bulldozers. Earth banks were speedily thrown up to isolate from their environment the spaces in which Israeli armored and infantry units were hunting for wanted terrorists, cut off their escape routes and provide perches for Israeli snipers lying in wait for escaping terrorists.

On Tuesday, May 11, after an Israeli armored personnel carrier was blown up, banks were raised to protect and conceal the units looking for the remains of the six-man crew killed in the blast. Two days later, after a second APC blew up, earthworks helped protect units who were scouring sections of the Philadelphia Route for the remains of their five dead comrades against Palestinian harassment. Another two Israeli soldiers were nonetheless shot dead.

These earth barriers—and the large-scale wall under construction down the West Bank/Israeli border—are not only found separating Israelis from Palestinians. In Iraq, US forces are finding them useful for besieging guerrillas and al-Qaeda terrorists in Fallujah and for blockading Moqtada Sadr's militiamen at flashpoints in Najef and Karbala.

The largest American military barrier project of all is now underway to seal Iraq against the incursions of al-Qaeda and Arab fighters from Syria, especially the truck convoys carrying ammunition. The American barrier strategy resembles the new Israeli tactic for sealing off the Egyptian-Israeli-Gaza border against Palestinian smugglers. Both are aimed at plugging cross-border leaks with one important difference: in the great Syrian Desert, terrorists find their way across the border overland, while in Rafah, Palestinian smugglers tunnel their way through underground.



Speaking of fences, in our last issue we noted the plan-

ning of India's fence to protect against Bangladeshi Muslim terrorists on its eastern border. Now India may want a fence on its border with Kashmir to keep hostile Muslims from entering on that side. Compare this with the United States, which has Muslims sneaking in from both Canada and Mexico. — Zola

Kashmir Bus Explosion Kills 26 Soldiers

Suspected Islamic militants blew up a military bus in India's portion of Kashmir, killing at least 26 soldiers and wounding 15, officials said. The bomb was planted under a small bridge along a road connecting the cities of Sringar and Jammu, Border Security Force spokesman Neeraj Sharma said. The attack on the Border Security Force bus came hours after India's new Prime Minister, Manmohan Singh, took charge in New Delhi.

Sharma blamed the explosion on Islamic guerrillas who have been fighting for independence in the Indian-controlled portion of Kashmir or to merge it with mostly Muslim Pakistan. The 14-year insurgency in India's only Muslim-majority state has claimed more than 65,000 lives. There was no immediate claim of responsibility.

The United Nations is set to begin a slate of projects — including the construction of a new perimeter fence — to bolster safety and security measures at its New York Headquarters.

The fence that currently runs along First Avenue will be replaced and new gates installed, and the lighting and surveillance systems along the perimeter will be enhanced to deter unauthorized entry, according to UN spokesman Fred Eckhard.

The perimeter fence currently present at First Avenue was not part of the initial design for UN Headquarters, Mr. Eckhard noted. It was added later, in consultation with New York City's Parks Department, to be compatible with the fences that encircle other city parks.

The new fence was designed by the Parks Department, and personally approved by Secretary-General Kofi Annan, he added.

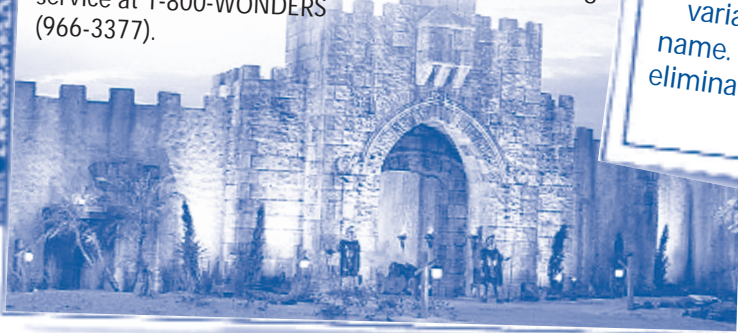

Dear Friends:

A commentator recently observed that Islam is in need of reform. He said that just as Catholicism and Mormonism underwent reform and got better, so might Islam, and in that manner get rid of its terrorism and become a more cooperative force in this world.

That statement bothered me for days and I finally think I put my finger on it. Catholicism and Mormonism are different from Islam. For all of their errors, Catholics worship the true God, Son and Holy Spirit. They have left the Biblical path and listened to philosophies of men. They have appointed Saints, Popes, Cardinals, and all sorts of extra-Biblical church traditions, but their God is the creating God, the God of Israel, the Father of Jesus Christ.

Likewise, the Mormons have departed even further, but still at least refer to themselves as the “Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints.”

Whatever “Latter Day Saints” really are is quite a mystery, but at least they have some reckoning of the true God and His true Son. (I know that experts on Mormonism will differ, but I am trying to look at its major contrasts with Islam.)

The Muslims, on the other hand, worship a god of their own who is not related to the creating God. He is not the Father of Jesus Christ and he is not represented by the Holy Spirit. He comes out of a primitive Middle Eastern tradition and is said to be originally a moon god among a plethora of other false gods.

Believe me when I say that no Muslim will bow to “the God of Israel.” As much lip service as some Muslims give to Scripture, theirs is an utterly different book of holy writ and filled with doctrines inimical to Scripture and promoting even the excesses of murdering innocents, as we see around us today.

You can see the contrast by looking at how different religions regard the Chosen People and the Promised Land. The Catholics indeed have reformed on this point and at least give some credence to the Jews and feel sorry about the Holocaust, or at least that is the official Vatican position. They have never been particularly friendly to Israel, but they do regard it as the Holy Land, unlike the Muslims.

Likewise, the Mormons at least give token respect to the Chosen People, but, unfortunately, they feel they have replaced them. I felt perfectly comfortable in Salt Lake City surrounded by such things as the House of Israel, the Bank of Zion, etc. But when I tried to tour the Mormon Tabernacle, I was barred from entering the place. I wanted to tell them that they have made nothing but a copy of the ancient temple of God built by my own forefathers and that I am a priest of that line and I just wanted to pay respects. But, they are not quite that friendly to the real Israel.

We might even bring up the denominational Protestants (the Methodists, Lutherans, Episcopalians, Presbyterians, etc.), who are not really religious people at all in a Biblical sense. They carry out forms and styles of Christianity and they pronounce the proper names. But, given the test of love for the Chosen

People and the Promised Land they fail virtually every time. The denominations mentioned are generally supporters of the so called “Palestinians,” even to the point of sending them money from church tithes. Their missionaries in Israel are invariably friendly to the Arabs and critical of the Jews.

But none of the above hold a candle to the Muslims who would like to murder every Jew on earth. There is simply no question that Islam hates Israel and the Jewish people. I have never in my lifetime met a Muslim friendly to the Jews or even neutral about them.

And that is a Scriptural test. In fact, it is exactly the test of the Old Testament prophets who rated nations on how they treated Israel. And it also

will be the test of Tribulation believers who will be asked, in effect, “How did you treat my brothers?” by the King of the Jews

(see Matthew 25:40).

Reforming Islam is really not possible. We ran an article about it last month and we put some wishful thinking in the newsletter, but it got under my skin somehow and I thought the matter through.

Worse Than Nazis

Dear Zola:

The following is an example of my encounters with Islamic beliefs. I was practicing in a small town (I am a doctor).

A new doctor recruited to the area was from a country very unfriendly to Israel and America. I am an intermarried Jew with a Christian wife.

Despite our theological and political differences, I attempted to befriend the man. I offered to help him move in, offered him the temporary use of my personal study, and checked on his progress in acclimating to his move. When he bought a new piece of equipment similar to one I owned, I offered to give him some pointers in its use. I greeted him at a meeting with the Arabic, "Peace to you, Doctor—Salaam tabib." He was astounded that I knew even a little Arabic. I then asked him, in Hebrew, if he spoke or understood Hebrew. He sneered and asked, "Why should I?" I jokingly replied, "We're neighbors." He snarled, "Not very good ones." He then moved his papers to another place at the table and glared at me.

Despite this, my wife and I took a small gift to his open house. During what should have been a celebration, he took me to a room and lectured me for 45 minutes on the evils of Judaism and Christianity. He told me, "You Zionists are worse than Nazis" and pledged that "14 million Arabs will drive the Israelis into the sea." He challenged me to "read the Holy Koran if you doubt anything I tell you." Despite my pleas otherwise, he told me coldly, "We will never be friends."

Some letters have been edited for space.

Well, Zola, I read the Koran as he suggested. I found it to be a manual for conquest on par with Sun Tzu's treatise on war and equal in hatred to Hitler's *Mein Kampf*.

What a frightening combination!

I read that Muslims can never befriend Jews or Christians. Non-Muslims and Muslims can live in peace only if the non-Muslim is subservient to Muslim authority (by accepting dhimmi status). If we fail to submit, we may be killed, without mercy, in the name of Allah. I also found Islam incorporates sufficient Jewish and Christian theology to, at least superficially, prevent Jews and Christians from challenging Islamic precepts. Islam, contrary to what many Jewish and Christian "leaders" spout, is not merely a "different way of worshipping G-d." There may be "moderate" Muslims, but according to the Koran, they are seen as traitors to the "true believers." For vastly different reasons than my antagonistic colleague, I recommend that all Jews and Christians read and learn what is taught in the Koran.

My encounter had positive outcomes. My wife and I regularly do volunteer work in Israel, speak publicly in support of Israel, and contribute generously to pro-Israeli charities. My work in Israel has brought me into contact with numerous Christian Zionists. I enjoy their company and fellowship, and I value their contribution to the survival of the Jewish homeland. Your work on behalf of Israel is likewise appreciated.

My wife was raised in the Methodist church, but refuses to join a congregation because of the anti-Israel and liberal politics at the administrative level. Her mother subscribes to your *Levitt Letter* and forwards copies to us.

Illegal Aliens

Dear Zola:

I watch your program sometimes, and you made a statement this past week that I didn't understand. You called the Arabs in Gaza "illegal aliens." It was a blanket state-

ment (not referring to individual groups). I am not sure where you think they came from, where their native land is, and where you think they belong. Maybe I didn't hear the whole context. I remember, during an earlier show, you said that Israel is a democracy and all the Arabs there have equal rights as citizens, so, given your comment, I was a little confused.

I appreciate your taking the time to clarify what you were talking about.

Dear J.K.:

Arabs in Gaza and in Israel proper are very different people. When the Jews resettled Israel in 1948, they accepted all the Arabs living in the land given to them by the United Nations as full citizens. They have the right to vote, they have members in parliament and they can serve in the military.

But Arabs of Gaza and the West Bank tended to arrive after the Jews had started building a modern nation, coming across the various borders to take jobs that were plentiful. Those Arabs lived outside of Israel, as it was, and were never citizens, nor wanted to be. As matters stand now, the Israeli Arabs are generally more peaceful and cooperative, as are minority citizens in any other democracy. The Arabs of Gaza and the West Bank—now calling themselves Palestinians—have deteriorated into terrorism.

We have a similar situation with Hispanic immigration to the U.S. It is composed of citizens and aliens. But in the U.S., the Hispanic aliens have not declared the entire country to be theirs just because they made their way across the borders. — Zola

Terror Ambulances

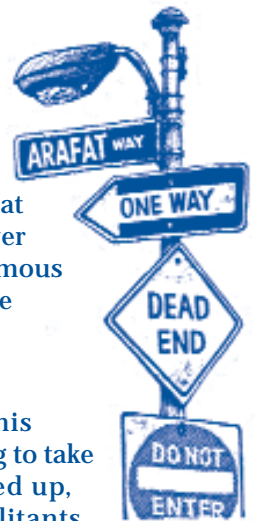

This is the Enemy

Nick Berg, an American from Philadelphia, was kidnapped and beheaded by Arabs in Iraq sometime in May. The murderers filmed the deed and proudly displayed the victim's severed head.

After killing six Israeli soldiers in an attack on an armored vehicle in Gaza on May 11, the Arabs near the scene of the carnage gleefully held aloft human body parts in front of rolling cameras. One of the Arab terrorists was later interviewed on film with what appeared to be a human head in front of him.

The week before, after shooting at Tali Hatuel's car, causing it to skid and stop, Arab terrorists walked over to the vehicle to finish the occupants off. They looked at the heavily pregnant mother and her four no-doubt frightened girls; the youngest was two years old. And then shot them all. At point-blank range. With sadistic satisfaction, they systematically murdered Tali Hatuel and her unborn son, as well

as all of Tali's daughters—Hila, age 11, Hadar, 9, Roni, 7, and two-year-old Meirav.

In Fallujah (Iraq), in March, crowds of townspeople dragged four American civilians out of their vehicles, shot or beat them to death, mutilated their bodies, dragged them through the streets, suspended them from a bridge, and burned them.

And they danced and cheered.

With their children.

In Ramallah in 2000, two Israeli soldiers were kidnapped, beaten, stabbed countless times, had their eyes gouged out, and were literally disemboweled and dismembered by an Arab lynch mob.

The people—and I use the term loosely—who carried out the initial beatings, threw one of the victims down to the waiting mob, where his face was further crushed with stones, feet, fists, and even a heavy metal window frame. One Jew was set on fire and dragged along the street as Arab onlookers danced and cheered. Some of the butchers celebrated their crimes with the

victims' internal organs. One of the killers, famously captured on film, proudly displayed his blood-soaked hands to the cheering Ramallah crowd.

And it gets worse. In 2003, Arab parents in Gaza cheered again when their little children dressed up as members of the Ramallah lynch mob, complete with hands painted blood red, for a kindergarten graduation ceremony.

During the lynching of the two IDF soldiers who had taken a wrong turn into Ramallah in 2000, one of the Arab murderers paused in his savage beating to answer a cell phone belonging to one of the dying soldiers.

He told the worried voice on the other end of the line, "We are killing your husband."

There is a Talmudic dictum that states, "One who is merciful to the cruel, will ultimately cause cruelty to the merciful."

It seems to me that we, Israelis and Americans, have proven the Talmudic sages absolutely correct. Please, no more mercy. ★

The Palestinian Disaster

Facts and figures about the “Palestinian Struggle” that the Arabs of the West Bank and Gaza won’t learn from their leaders:



A day after Israeli troops killed its second leader within a single month, the Islamist terrorist organization Hamas put on a brave face. The Israelis “are dreaming” if they think this would weaken Hamas, announced Ismail Haniyeh to a crowd of over 70,000 mourners at the funeral for Abdel Aziz Rantisi. “Every time a martyr falls,” Haniyeh insisted, “Hamas is strengthened.”

This sort of boosterism and puffery has a long history among Palestinians. The last time Israeli forces did real damage to the Palestinian war machine, in May 2002, for example, Khaled Meshaal of Hamas announced that the Israeli devastation was actually, “a Palestinian victory that lifted the morale of our people.” Not to be outdone, Yasser Arafat of the Palestinian Authority (PA) claimed that same month: “The more destruction I see, the stronger I get.”

These leaders may be fooling themselves by pretending that defeat is victory, but growing numbers of Palestinians are wising up to the bitter realities of losing a war. Their mood has darkened since February 2001, when Prime Minister Ariel Sharon came to office intent to establish that violence against Israel does not work.

The results have deeply affected Palestinian life. In one town of 5,000 on the West Bank, a resident told *The Times* of London how his town has been “isolated from the whole world, even from other villages. Everybody has to be in their homes by 6 p.m., and the Israeli patrols come around every day to check.”

Protracted isolation has led to steep economic decline. Recent PA figures show that 84 percent of the Palestinian population lives in poverty, as defined by the World Bank, four times the number that did so before the Palestinians stepped up the violence in late 2000. PA residents number 3.5 million and their economy produces \$2.5 billion a year, meaning the average per capita income is US \$700 a year.

A World Bank study in 2003 found that investment in the PA declined from about \$1.5 billion in 1999 to \$140 million in 2002. The United Nations found in 2003 that Palestinians have turned to subsistence agriculture—growing their own food—in place of the more sophisticated work they had previously been doing.

Commenting on the situation, the UN special envoy to the region, Terje Roed-Larsen, describes the Palestinian economy as “devastated.”

(That said, conditions should not be exaggerated. Foreign aid adds \$800 million a year, bringing annual per capita income to about \$1,000—or about the same as Syria and higher than India and all but a few sub-Saharan countries. Palestinians are thus by no means the poorest people in the world.)



In a word, Sharon’s tough policies have established that terrorism damages Palestinian interests even more than it does Israeli ones. This has led some analysts deeply hostile to Israel to recognize that the “second intifada” was a grievous error. Violence “just went haywire,” says Sari Nusseibeh, president of Al-Quds University. An “unmitigated disaster,” journalist Graham Usher calls it. A “crime against the Palestinian people,” adds an Arab diplomat.

After the execution of Hamas’ other leader, Ahmed Yassin, sixty prominent Palestinians urged restraint in a newspaper ad, arguing that violence would provoke strong Israeli responses that would obstruct aspirations to build an independent “Palestine.” Instead, the signatories called for “a peaceful, wise intifada.”

Ordinary Palestinians, too, are drawing the salutary conclusion that murdering Israelis brings them no benefits. “We wasted three years for nothing, this uprising didn’t accomplish anything,” says Mahar Tarhir, 25, an aluminum-store owner. “Anger and disillusionment have replaced the fighting spirit that once propelled the Palestinian movement,” finds Soraya Sarhaddi Nelson, a reporter for Knight Ridder.

As for Israelis, as early as July 2003, the military brass reached the conclusion that Israel was achieving victory. More sharply, Israeli analyst Asher Susser concluded in the *Middle East Quarterly* back then that the Palestinian effort to break the Israeli spirit through terror “has failed” and resorting to force “was a catastrophic mistake, the worst the Palestinians have made since 1948.”

In this context, rapidly eliminating two Hamas chieftains in a row deepens Palestinian perceptions that Israel’s will to defend itself is strong, its military arm long, and that terrorism is tactically wrong. Perhaps more Palestinians will realize the time has come to accept the existence of the Jewish state. ✪

Attacks on Christian Zionism

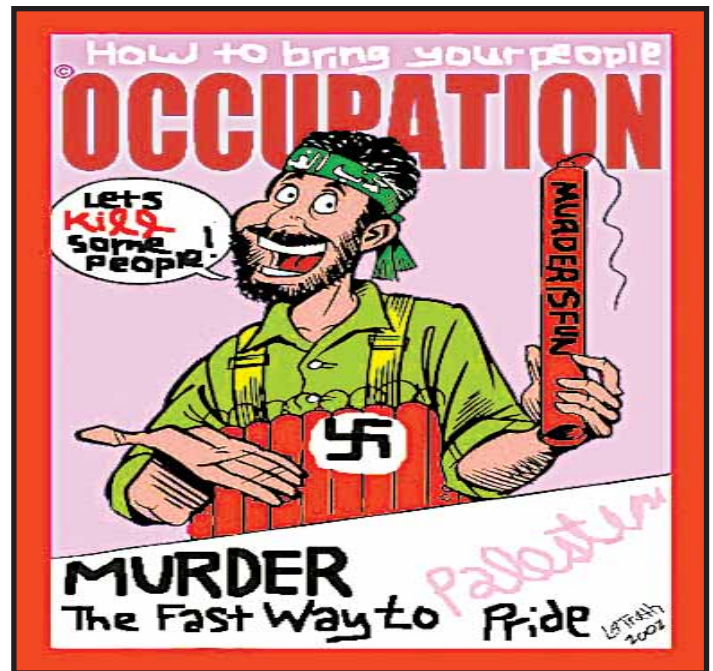


Christian Zionism, supported for years by the *Levitt Letter*, is having an impact on the Church and on the world. In spite of the lukewarm attitude of many leaders of the churches in America toward Israel, and the strong opposition to Israel in Europe and the United Nations, there is a sizable number of Evangelical Christians in America who strongly support Israel—for Biblical, historical and political reasons—enough to resonate in the national decisions. No small part of this support has been brought about through the small, but effective, outlets of Biblical truth about the Church, Israel, the Rapture, and the Second Coming of Christ, all blessed and energized by the power of the Holy Spirit.

The enemy does not like this at all. Satan has organized most nations and most of the world's press against Israel and against Christianity. He has furthermore succeeded in turning many of the formerly strong Bible teaching schools in this country against taking a strong stand for Israel, as we have chronicled over the years in this newsletter, and in our book *Battles with Seminaries*. The one movement that has remained resolute in its support for Israel and sound Biblical teaching is the loose-knit conglomeration of individuals and groups that form the entity called "Christian Zionism."

Christian Zionism believes that God has revealed in the Bible that He has a great destiny for Israel, restoring the Jewish people to the Land, bringing them to true faith in their own Messiah, Christ Jesus, and bringing about the Second Coming of Christ and the Kingdom of God on earth. This is distinct from, but parallel to, the destiny He has for the Church, including the Rapture and the return of the Church with the Lord when He comes back to the earth.

Satan cannot stand this teaching, and has tried to destroy it wherever possible, but, with all the academic and media opposition he could muster, he has not been able to stamp out Christian Zionism. Now it appears he has raised up a direct attack against us, with the development of a new ecumenical organization called Sabeel, which had its International Conference in Jerusalem last month, with the theme, "Challenging Christian Zionism." In a press statement, Sabeel stated that over 500 delegates from over 30 countries participated in the conference. Representatives from a broad spectrum of international Christian organizations met in the Roman Catholic Notre Dame Centre in Jerusalem, led by Dr. Naim Ateek, who describes himself as a Palestinian Christian and is the Canon of St. George's



Cathedral in Jerusalem. Other speakers were representatives of the Vatican, the Greek Orthodox Church, an Anglican vicar, a spokesman for the Archbishop of Canterbury, and a professor from Wheaton College. It appears that almost all branches of Christianity were involved.

What was taught during that conference would amaze many of our readers, but was reported by Paul Wilkinson, a Christian Zionist from England. The website of Sabeel contains no report on either the title of the conference or the messages of the speakers at the conference, so we are dependent on Wilkinson's eyewitness account of the proceedings. However, what he reports is consistent with arguments against Christian Zionism we have heard before, and below is a synopsis of what Wilkinson reported, and my response.

The Anglican, Dr. Sizer, attempted to discredit Christian Zionism as being related to the Dispensational movement that began with J. N. Darby in 1809, claiming it has no lengthy historical basis.

Response: The truth is that Darby claimed only to have rediscovered (not invented) the truths of prophecy in the Bible, and there have been Christian Zionist writings supporting the restoration of Israel going back to the 16th century, long before Darby.

The Bethlehem Lutheran pastor, Dr. Raheb, stated that the Apostles of the Lord "did not get it," when they asked the Lord in Acts 1:6 if He would "at this time restore the Kingdom to Israel." They were, according to Raheb, the forerunners of contemporary Christian Zionists.

Response: I would agree that the Disciples were our fore-runners, and count it an honor to be so associated with the Apostles. However, Dr. Raheb meant it as a criticism, describing the Apostles as “nationalistic,” “narrow-minded” and “blinded” to the future. It should be noted, though, that Jesus did not rebuke His Disciples for asking about the restoration, but merely told them that the timing of the restoration could not be revealed to them.

The Wheaton College New Testament professor, Dr. Gary Burge, gave a rather accurate history of the development of Christian Zionism in its association with Dispensationalism, but then claimed that we believe that the Church is merely an afterthought in redemptive history.

Response: This is certainly not representative of the vast majority of Dispensationalists. We believe that the Church was always in the plan of God, but He did not reveal anything about the Church until after the First Coming of Christ, and the pouring out of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. The full revelation about the Church was then made manifest to the Apostles, especially Paul.

The St. Mary’s (Roman Catholic) College Bible professor, Dr. Prior, had the audacity to lecture that “the Bible is a very dangerous book,” and the God of the Books of Exodus and Joshua is an immoral God, who is guilty of ethnic cleansing of the indigenous Canaanite people in the land. These sentiments were met with the applause of the delegates to the conference.

Response: Dr. Prior thus questioned the sovereignty of God in the matter of His raising up kingdoms and putting down kingdoms, and allowing one nation to defeat another nation as a matter of His rule and discipline.

Arab member of the Israeli Knesset, Azmi Bishara, complained that the recent Bush-Sharon letters were a second Balfour Declaration, that the most potent form of racism in the world today is “Islamophobia,” denied the existence of terrorism, and urged that Americans should rid the world of the Bush administration.

Response: The Bush-Sharon letters stated, in part, that the Arab refugees from the 1948 war and their descendants were not to be resettled in present-day Israel, and pledged U.S. support for Israel’s right to “defend itself against terror.” This is an important guarantee for the future stability of Israel. Furthermore, for Bishara to deny the existence of terrorism, with all the atrocities that terrorists have committed before and after September 11, 2001, demonstrates how biased the enemies of civilization are.

The conference would not have been complete without a visit to Ramallah and a private audience with none

other than Yasser Arafat. According to Wilkinson, Arafat and Dr. Hanan Ashrawi expressed their delight in seeing “the Church,” as represented by the Sabeel delegates, express such solidarity with the Palestinian cause.

Response: If there was any doubt before, the delegates show their true political bias in their rally around the infamous Arafat. They apparently had no similar meeting with a leader of Israel during the conference.

All in all, the conference amounted to an organized attack against Biblical Christianity and against all Christians who believe that the restoration of the Jewish people to their ancient land is a harbinger of fulfilled Bible prophecy and the Second Coming of Christ. Are we ready for the battle? It is well to remember Zechariah’s admonition: “Not by might, nor by power, but by My Spirit, says the Lord of Hosts.” ✨

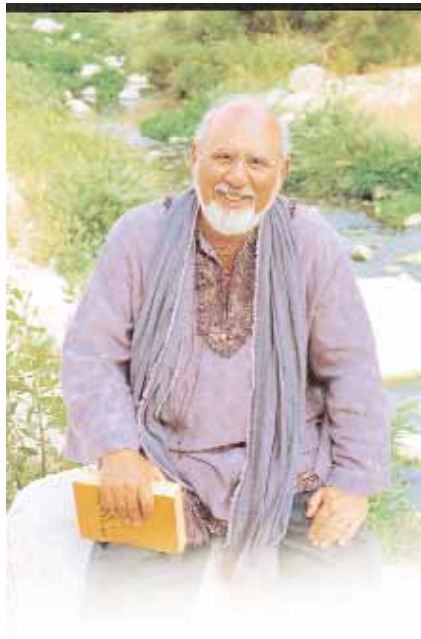
