

he United States and its allies must act to stop Iran's nuclear programs — by force if necessary — because conventional diplomacy will not work, three senior Israeli lawmakers from across the political spectrum recently warned.

As a last resort, they said, Israel itself would act unilaterally to prevent Iran from acquiring nuclear arms. Iran will not be deterred "by anything short of a threat of force," said Arieh Eldad, a member of Israel's right-wing National Union Party, part of a delegation of Knesset members visiting Washington D.C.



"They won't be stopped unless they are convinced their programs will be destroyed if they continue," he said.

Yuval Steinitz, chairman of the Knesset Foreign Affairs and Defense Committee, said the best hope was for the United States and other major powers to make it clear to Iranian leaders now that there was "no chance they will ever see the fruits of a nuclear program."

Get out if you want sharia law, Australia tells Muslims

Muslims who want to live under Islamic sharia law were told on recently to get out of Australia, as the government targeted radicals in a bid to head off potential terror attacks.

A day after a group of mainstream Muslim leaders pledged loyalty to Australia at a special meeting with Prime Minister John Howard, he and his ministers made it clear that extremists would face a crackdown.

Treasurer Peter Costello, seen as heir apparent to Howard, hinted that some radical clerics could be asked to leave the country if they did not accept that Australia was a secular state and its laws were made by parliament.

"If those are not your values, if you want a country which has sharia law or a theocratic state, then Australia is not for you," he said on national television.

"I'd be saying to clerics who are teaching that there are two laws governing people in Australia, one the Australian law and another the Islamic law, that that is false. If you can't agree with parliamentary law, independent courts and democracy, and would prefer sharia law, and have the opportunity to go to another country which practices it, perhaps, then, that's a better option," Costello said.

Asked whether he meant radical clerics would be forced to leave, he said those with dual citizenship could possibly be asked to move to the other country.

Education Minister Brendan Nelson later told reporters that Muslims who did not want to accept local values should "clear off."

Basically, people who don't want to be Australians, and don't want to live by Australian values and understand them, well then, they can basically clear off," he said.

Separately, Howard angered some Australian Muslims by saying he supported spies monitoring the nation's mosques.

"Threats of sanctions and isolation alone will not do it," said Mr. Steinitz.

Yosef Lapid, head of the centrist opposition Shinui Party in the Knesset, added that Israel "will not live under the threat of an Iranian nuclear bomb."

"We feel we are obliged to warn our friends that Israel should not be pushed into a situation where we see no other solution but to act unilaterally" against Iran, he said.

Mr. Steinitz, a member of Prime Minister Ariel Sharon's

ruling Likud Party, stopped just short of a direct threat to bomb suspected Iranian nuclear sites. Steinitz said Israeli officials estimate that Tehran is only two to three years away from developing a nuclear bomb and that time was running out for the world to act.

"We see an Iranian bomb as a devastating, existential threat to Israel, to the entire Middle East, to all Western interests in the region," he said.

"Despite all the different circumstances, we see similarities to what happened in the 1930s, when people underestimated the real problem or focused on other dangers. For us, either the world will tackle Iran in advance or all of us will face the consequences."

massacring the Christians, city after city. I ended up living in a bomb shelter underground from age 10 to 17, without electricity, eating grass to live, and crawling under sniper bullets to a spring to get water.

It was Israel who came to help the Christians in Lebanon. My mother was wounded by a Muslim shell, and was taken into an Israeli hospital for treatment. When we entered the emergency room, I was shocked at what I saw.

There were hundreds of people wounded, Muslims, Palestinians, Christians, Lebanese, and Israeli soldiers lying on the floor. The doctors treated everyone according to their injury. They treated my mother before they treated the Israeli soldier lying next to her. They didn't see religion, they didn't see political affiliation, they saw people in need, and they helped.

For the first time in my life, I experienced a human quality that I know my culture would not have shown to their enemy. I experienced the values of the Israelis, who were able to love their enemy in their most trying moments. I spent 22 days at that hospital. Those days changed my life and the way I believe information, the way I listen to the radio or to television. I realized I was sold a fabricated lie by my government, about the Jews and Israel, that was so far from reality. I knew for a fact that, if I was a Jew standing in an Arab hospital, I would be lynched and thrown over to the grounds, as shouts of joy of *Allahu Akbar* (God is great) would echo through the hospital and the surrounding streets.

I became friends with the families of the Israeli wounded soldiers: one in particular, Rina, her only child was wounded in his eyes.

One day, I was visiting with her, and the Israeli army band came to play national songs to lift the spirits of the wounded soldiers. As they surrounded his bed playing a song about Jerusalem, Rina and I started crying. I felt out of place and started waking out of the room, and this mother holds my hand and pulls me back in without even looking at me. She holds me crying and says: "It is not your fault." We just stood there crying, holding each other's hands.

What a contrast between her, a mother looking at her deformed, 19 year old, only child, and still able to love me, the enemy, and between a Muslim mother who sends her son to blow himself up to smithereens just to kill a few Jews or Christians.

The difference between the Arabic world and Israel is a difference in values and character. It's barbarism versus civilization. It's democracy versus dictatorship. It's goodness versus evil.

Once upon a time, there was a special place in the low-

est depths of hell for anyone who would intentionally murder a child. Now, the intentional murder of Israeli children is legitimized as Palestinian "armed struggle."

However, once such behavior is legitimized against Israel, it is legitimized everywhere in the world, constrained by nothing more than the subjective belief of people who would wrap themselves in dynamite and nails for the purpose of killing children in the name of God.

Because the Palestinians have been encouraged to believe that murdering innocent Israeli civilians is a legitimate tactic for advancing their cause, the whole world now suffers from a plague of terrorism, from Nairobi to New York, from Moscow to Madrid, from Bali to Beslan.

They blame suicide bombing on "desperation from occupation." Let me tell you the truth. The first major terror bombing committed by Arabs against the Jewish state occurred ten weeks before Israel even became independent.

On Sunday morning, February 22, 1948, in anticipation of Israel's independence, a triple truck bomb was detonated by Arab terrorists on Ben Yehuda Street, in what was then the Jewish section of Jerusalem. Fifty-four people were killed, and hundreds were wounded. Thus, it is obvious that Arab terrorism is caused not by the "desperation from occupation," but by the VERY THOUGHT of a Jewish state.

So many times in history in the last 100 years, citizens have stood by and done nothing, allowing evil to prevail. As America stood up against and defeated communism, now it is time to stand up against the terror of religious bigotry and intolerance. It's time to all stand up, and support and defend the state of Israel, which is the front line of the war against terrorism."



Ali Baba and the Forty **Terrorists**

The term "caliphate" conveys, for many, if not most Westerners, allusions derived from old Aladdin movies, the book "1001 Arabian Nights," or even Nikolai Rimsky-Korsakov's symphonic monument Scheherazade. "Caliph," the word, similarly connotes some mythical Middle Eastern version of King Arthur's Court, but with magical lamps and heroic thieves.

Oddly, it has been that way since the early 1500s, only decades after Spain, under Ferdinand and Isabella, drove the last Moorish caliph from their lands. California, in fact, was named by Spanish explorers of the era after a literary reverie penned by Garcia Ordonez de Montalvo who fantasized an antithesis to the Moorish occupation — a lost Muslim land ruled by peaceful, wealthy and beautiful Amazon women.

The true story of the caliph, or commander of the entire Muslim world, is quite different and far more recent.

The Ottoman Caliphate, surviving in a virtually unbroken line from Muhammad, ended only when the Sultan Abdul Mehmed VI, at the end of the first World War, signed the Treaty of Sevres. Because Turkey had joined with Germany, he was forced to accept conditions, granting parts of western Anatolia to the Greeks and a

homeland to the Kurds, that infuriated his own hardliners. In 1924, the caliph Mehmed was driven into exile and his office officially eliminated.

While this may all seem an arcane history lesson to Westerners, I can assure you it is current events to many. There are still, after all, people alive today who lived under the caliphate. Moreover, the incredible advances brought about by science, globalization, market economies, and modernity, in general, have taken place largely in the Judeo-Christian West after the humiliation of the Ottoman caliph. For many Muslims, whose regimes prevented these modernizations, their reduced status is inextricably linked to the fall of the caliphate and is now seen as a conspiracy perpetrated on them by the infidel.

One event, the rebirth of Israel in lands once part of the caliphate, uniquely symbolizes the Ottoman disintegration and most infuriates Islamic supremists. Known in Arabic as "the catastrophe," it ended the Muslim ability to treat all Middle Eastern Jews and Christians as dhimmi, servants who could be exploited for any economic or psychological end.

The Christians in Lebanon also irritate the Muslims, but less so because they have never actually been in control of the country they share with powerful Islamic blocs.

Israel's very autonomy mocks the myth of Islamic invincibility. It is the reason that Muslims intent on resurrecting the caliphate are unconcerned by the deaths of millions of Muslims at the hands of other Muslims, but are enraged to a demented apoplexy by any apparent insult by Jews.

A succession of Arab tyrants has promised to recreate a pan-Islamic caliphate and destroy the Jewish state, including Saddam Hussein, Osama bin Laden and Abu Musab al-Zargawi. So powerful is this obsession that the Arab League issued fewer complaints about Iraq's murderous invasion of Kuwait than it has about the Israeli security fence.

For privileged Westerners, blithely unconcerned with the barbarisms that afflict distant peoples in the Middle East and Africa, it has been a slow awakening. Things began to change when terrorists, dreaming of a new caliphate, hit New York, London, Madrid, Bali, and elsewhere, but the denial has been surprisingly persistent.

For four years, even as American and allied troops fought the troops of some future caliph, the official spin was that the coalition was engaged in a "War on Terror." Such, of course, was fiction, but a fiction meant to mollify "moderate" Muslims who might be driven away if their religion were mentioned.

On October 6, 2005, in a speech originally scheduled for the anniversary of the 9/11 terror attacks, but postponed because of Hurricane Katrina, President George Bush stopped blaming terror and named names. For the first time in four years, he said the words "Islamic radicalism" and even "Islamofascism."

Or course, he continually held out the olive branch to peaceful Muslims, but his speech showed a real understanding of the nature of the enemy, referring specifically to the caliphate when he said, "The militants believe that controlling one country will rally the Muslim masses, enabling them to establish a radical Islamic empire that spans from Spain to Indonesia."

Further, he said of the Islamists that, "They blame the West, America and the Jews for their own failures" and pointed out that they are abetted "by elements of the Arab news media that incites hatred and anti-Semitism," while working for a global "totalitarian empire."

The president went out of his way, yet again, to say that the Islamic radicals do not represent true Islam. Though I think we must leave that matter to Muslims themselves, he nevertheless eloquently rejected the standard Muslim game of decrying terror, but blaming it on Israel.

The creation of the modern nation of Israel, in fact, must be seen in its true. context. Faced with the Gordian task of creating practical nations from the vast and incongruous lands once held together by the armies of the Ottoman caliph, great regions of Asia, Europe and Africa were assigned, in sometimes arbitrary and probably ill-advised ways, new borders and names. Jordan was invented whole cloth, without regard for local wishes, to give a kingdom to the Hashemite dynasty that had once controlled Mecca and Medina, now part of Saudi Arabia. Syria and Iraq, as well, were European fabrications that imposed dictatorial national rule on many local peoples despite their brutally repressed protests.

Nitpicking the legalities and niceties of Israel's birth and struggle to survive

outside this context is a sophistic and unfair exercise that needs to be ended. Israel is on the front lines of the ongoing war with those who are willing to massacre women and children of any race and religion to move forward their dark vision of a resurrected caliphate—with no magic lamps or beautiful populist princesses. It needs our support.

The Takeover Goes On

Raed Omar Sbeit recently stood before the Richardson (TX) City Council with a simple request: to open a center for young Muslims "to combat the campaign of terrorism."

The Irving engineer said the Muslim American Society Youth Center would be modeled after the YMCA and would provide a place for men and women ages 17-30 to hone their leadership skills, practice their faith, receive academic tutoring and become good citizens.

The Muslim American Society has nine such centers around the country. The Richardson would be the first in north Texas. "After the London bombings our leaders called upon us to combat terrorism," Mr. Sbeit told the Council.

Opinions about the group vary widely. *The Chicago Tribune* published an article last year linking the Muslim American Society to the International Muslim Brotherhood, an organization that has a violent history in the Middle East.

Richardson, a suburb of Dallas (the ninth largest city in America), was home to the Holy Land Foundation "charity group" closed by the FBI for raising money for terrorism. The new center is blocks away from that site. That's

not enough to suspect their motives, but it does give food for thought.

I have not heard of any Muslim officials setting out "to combat the campaign of terrorism," though some have said they deplored the deaths. One has to be suspicious of an enemy that has already attacked us, even for such a benign request as a youth center. It would be difficult to picture a Japanese or German center opening in a large American city during World War II.

Of course, Italian Americans, Irish, Jews, etc. have their own clubs or youth centers, and always have had. But these are assimilated Americans with no pretensions to win this land for their home country or religion. When I was a kid, I went to the YM&WHA (Young Men's and Women's Hebrew Association) in Pittsburgh. I remember that an American flag flew on the top of the building. It never occurred to us to promote anything for Israel. We were simply young Americans who were Jewish. It is reasonable to suppose that Muslims getting together in this country after we have been attacked repeatedly would not fly an American flag or see themselves as assimilated Americans. The difference is crucial.

I'm simply nervous about the idea of continual Muslim organization in America. In view of the fact that the announced goal of certain Muslims is a world takeover, the above planned youth center seems like part of the plan.

Israel Today

The new government of Iran is not only continuing with the country's nuclear weapons program in defiance of the international community, it has also established a new military unit called the Volunteer Martyrs Command to carry out suicide attacks against the US and Israel.

This was revealed by the Iranian newspaper *Partw-e Sokhan*, which interviewed the unit's commander, Mohammadresa Jafari. "We have already recruited 50,000 fighters said Jafari. "America and other NATO countries should be on the alert!"

The paper said that one of the key supporters of the suicide operations is Iranian hardliner Ayatollah Yazdi, who is close to the new president, Mahmoud Ahmadinejad.

"Americans and Israelis find themselves today in a very weak position," Jafari said. "Nevertheless, we cannot ignore the threat that Israel poses. We cannot ignore the Palestinian problem. Resistance against Israel is not a mission that can be left to one nation or one group. Everyone must be active today with regard to Palestine. This is a duty."

Jafari went on to quote the late Ayatollah Khomeini, who described Israel as "an ulcerating tumor that must be erased from history."

For the sake of the Islamic revolution and for the realization of paradise," Jafari said," we will plan martyrdom operations, and we will carry them out."

Even though the doctor himself delivered the woman's baby in the hospital, he instructs the husband how to convincingly relate the false tale that because of supposed delays imposed by the Israelis, the father had to deliver the baby in their car, while he was driving. It is apparent that the couple and doctor feel that it is their patriotic duty to lie for the "cause."

In another segment, Palestinians are seen at a Gaza junction, apparently staging fake "war scenes." Civilians are seen directing the movements of the gunmen and crowds. Palestinians are shown running, supposedly under Israeli gunfire, faking injuries, while bystanders watch or wander around in the open, just a few feet away, not appearing to be in any fear of the supposed Israeli gunfire.

Ambulances arrive, as if on cue, a few seconds later to take the "wounded" away. Gunmen are shown firing, supposedly at the Israelis, but when examined closer, we realize that they are simply firing into an empty building, just for show, to make it appear that they are in a firefight with the Israelis.

Anyone watching the raw footage or the actual filming of these scenes clearly must know that staged, bogus

scenes are being filmed. The faking of scenes for the news cameras is an open "secret" among the Palestinians. So why do the Western media continue to show video clips from such suspect sources? Journalists should carefully verify any video and testimony coming from the Palestinians. Video and photos from cameramen involved in past frauds should not be accepted.

I. Glory

The Church seems to often focus on the future of unbelievers. The oncoming Tribulation Period, the actions of the Antichrist, and Armageddon are repeatedly taught, as if they are the Believer's main concerns.

Studying the Tribulation is very important, since it signals the culmination of God's plan and the return of our Lord. But it's more pleasant to think of those entering Heaven during that period, and later returning with God to populate His Kingdom on earth. The hallmark of Christianity is our bright future. What we see is not all we get. Earthly life is of little significance to those who have been promised the Kingdom to come. We're already living our eternal lives, and this is the worst part of them.

II. The Rapture: What is it?

The Rapture of the Church is the moment when Jesus will come and take the Believers with Him to heaven. This promise of Christianity distinguishes it from worldly religions. Buddha and Mohammed won't be making another appearance. Cults last about as long as their founders exist. But followers of Christ are assured deliverance to come — true deliverance of the Chosen People to the Promised Land.

It's sad that there are churches which haven't disclosed the Rapture to their members. Liberal churches which have put away the Bible, losing the prime promise of Jesus, and they live on in a pathetic "Christian ethic" — a meaningless and powerless copy of life in Christ. But those aware of the Rapture and awaiting Jesus' return will live in a new Kingdom in an ongoing eternal life.

"Rapture," borrowed from the Latin Vulgate Bible, appears in the King James as "caught up" (I Thess. 4:17). Verses 16-18 contain the prime promise of Jesus' return. Verse 18 isn't quoted often, but should be, for what is more comforting than knowing we'll go beyond this life and "ever be with the Lord"?

On His last Passover night, Jesus indicated His departure from the Church, promising to return again:

Let not your heart be troubled: ye believe in God, believe also in Me. In My Father's house are many mansions: if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again, and receive you unto myself; that where I am, there ye may

After His resurrection and forty days with His Disciples, Jesus rose to His Father, repeating His promise (Acts 1:9-11). In these final forty days, the Lord taught not so much how to behave, as about witnessing to all men in preparation for the Kingdom to come (Acts 1:9).

The men in verse 10 were angels, come to assure the Disciples that in just the manner they had seen the Lord ascend — into Heaven — He would return. Thus, the Lord will not return "in a spiritual way" or "in your heart," but literally in the manner that He left, bodily and miraculously.

In the same way Jesus spent His last moments on earth, we also should focus on the Kingdom to come, which starts with the Rapture. We learn more about the Rapture from 1 Cor. 15:22-23. Everyone "born of Adam" dies, but those in Christ will be resurrected. It also indicates that we have an order, which ties in with "the dead in Christ will rise first." Jesus' number was one, and He is called the "first fruits" as He is the first man permanently resurrected. First fruits is the third Jewish feast, Resurrection Sunday, which we have come to call "Easter." Referring to it as "first fruits," we realize there is a second, third, etc. We're all numbered, and will rise in that order in the Rapture. The dead in Christ, having lower numbers, will rise first.

We will undergo a mysterious metamorphosis: we will be outfitted for eternal life, as our present bodies won't do for that (I Cor. 15:51-53). Death is the common fear of all mortals — except for the true Believer. Paul exults in the face of death in verses 55-57. After the Rapture is accomplished, we're ready for the exciting events of our seven years in heaven, as the Tribulation Period takes place on earth. (The Rapture is more fully covered in

my books, *Raptured*, with Dr. Thomas S. McCall and *The Signs of the End*.)

III. Heaven

Once we're in Heaven with Jesus, we have important matters to transact. We are not issued wings and harps, but instead have a momentous conference with the Lord — aimed at preparing us for our wedding. We, the bride of Christ, shall become the Lord's wife.

The first event is a review of our earthly lives (II Cor. 5:10). Each of us meets individually and privately with the Lord at this "Judgment Seat" in order to evaluate our lives on earth. The emphasis is not on our sins, which are forgiven, but on our works. Believers are saved "unto good works", and have responsibilities as disciples of Christ. If not for our appointed tasks on earth, we could have gone to Heaven the moment we were saved. As it is, we will or will not have accomplished certain assignments, according to our gifts.

Paul expounds on the standards in the Judgment Seat of Christ, and how our works are reckoned (I Cor. 3:11-13). He writes that no foundation for this life can be laid outside of that in Christ. (Good works done outside of Christ by unbelievers are not relevant to this Scripture because unbelievers won't be going to Heaven. Those works, plus sins, are presented at the Great White Throne of Judgment, after the Kingdom.)

Paul next divides our works into two categories, "gold, silver, and precious stones," and "wood, hay, and stub-

ble" — two very different rankings of quality. Jesus will test all of our works with fire. The analogy is clear, as fire certainly shows the difference between works of gold, silver, and precious stones, and those of wood, hay, and stubble. That is the real purpose of the Judgment Seat.


Each Believer has a life of great variety to present to God, and we are not always sure ourselves just which of our works are of high value in Heaven. We recall from the Gospels the story of the man who prayed, fasted, and thanked God that he was not like the poor beggar who lay on his face at the back of the synagogue, while the beggar plead to God, "Have mercy on me, a sinner." As the Lord explained, it was found that the beggar's humility and plea for mercy were the real gold, silver, and precious stones, while the hypocrisy of wood, hay, and stubble belonged to the sup-

posedly righteous man in the front.

Paul then states our rewards for the works that survive the fire (I Cor. 3:14), jewels for our crowns. The rewards of the Christian come at the end of this life, in Heaven, not on the earth. Paul also says we shall suffer loss for our works of wood, hay and stubble in verse 15. We note the phrase "but he himself shall be saved." God is clear that salvation is a free gift, not an earned prize; we cannot lose our salvation by bad works or sins, which were forgiven when we believed in Christ. We will suffer loss of our rewards, in effect, for our bad works, but we won't fall back out of Heaven. Peter thought the heavy net of fish he had "caught up" might break, and some fish fall back in the water (John 21:11). But the Lord had selected the fish on this occasion, and none were lost once they were caught up.

The fire does not consume the Believer, for God has fire that does not totally burn up, such as the Burning Bush and the Lake of Fire. The fire is only to purify away the bad works, as fire sterilizes bacteria in foods. The Judgment Seat of Christ is to prepare us as a spotless bride for our Lord (II Cor. 11:2). If we still had the memory of bad works we had done in our lifetimes of service, we would have, as it were, a guilty conscience, and would not be the pure virgins the Lord requires. The Judgment Seat is the final preparation for the marriage supper of the Lamb. Just as earthly brides adorn themselves in finest garments, so we will go before the Lord cleansed of all bad works, forgiven, and in that sense, as perfect as He is Himself.

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It surprises many Believers that we will then be, in our purity, equal to Christ. But that is our destiny, the Scripture is clear. Christ could not marry less a bride than He Himself, and we shall reign with Him in the Kingdom as the Queen on the earth.

This, then, is true Christianity, a transcendence of this worldly life, state, body, mind, and all worldly labor we trade it all for eternal bliss in the presence of God Himself in Christ Jesus.



"The Lone Soldiers"

As the latest surge in Palestinian violence has dragged on for the past several years, Israel has become increasingly isolated in the world for taking the necessary tough measures in order to secure her citizens. While the Gaza disengagement did garner substantial political credit for Sharon and the state, nations were still quick to point out the ongoing "occupation" and unbearable poverty in Judea and Samaria, the "West Bank." It has been during these tough past years that Israelis have found out who their friends are and who is willing to stand by them, and discovered that many of those friends are Christians.

Israel soon realized the need for an official government body to coordinate Christian aid, encourage tourism, and, most importantly, to facilitate dialogue between Israel and her Christian supporters. In January of 2003, just over two years after the beginning of the latest intifada, the Israeli government established the Knesset Christian Allies Caucus (CAC). In addition to

the reasons outlined above, an official booklet for the CAC says that it, "...is intended to increase awareness, both in Israel and the international community, to Israel's appreciation for the many and varied contributions that its Christian allies have made to the wellbeing of the people of Israel in their day-to-day lives."



The intifada has helped to educate a

lot of Israelis that not all Christians are soul-seeking missionaries, crusaders, or out to get them in any way. Israelis are starting to realize that just as there are differences between the many varied forms and sects of Judaism, so too are there differences within Christianity, and they are interested to learn who these Christians are that so earnestly love, support, and encourage them through their most troubled times.

Knesset member Yair Peretz of the Shas party is co-chair of the CAC and head of the Knesset Social Lobby. He has dedicated much of his time to helping some of Israel's

poorest and most underprivileged citizens, and has recently turned to Christian supporters from abroad in an effort to seek more funding and support for his charitable and very worthy causes. Working in close cooperation with Israeli attorney and Christian Believer Calev Myers, MK Peretz has just established a new non-profit charity to help "lone soldiers." Christian support has already made an impact.

Lone soldiers are generally people that have made *aliyah* to Israel by themselves; they have no family members in the country. Soldiers in the IDF are paid next to nothing and therefore usually rely on their parents for financial help, a place to sleep, eat and do laundry on the weekends, and the love and support necessary to serve in the IDF. Immigrating to a new land is already difficult, but the army years can be especially hard for these new immigrants without a family support base in the country. MK Peretz and his organization seek to help these lone soldiers during the holiday seasons with gift baskets and coupons to department stores and supermarkets.

Just a few days before Yom Kippur, MK Peretz organized an event at Tel Aviv's *Beit Chiyal* (soldier's house) to recognize the lone soldiers and give them their holiday baskets. In addition to the soldiers, on hand were Knesset Speaker Reuven Rivlin, Deputy Defense Minister Zeev Boim, and representatives from the companies that donated items and coupons to the soldiers. Calev Myers also delivered a thank you to the many Christians who donated to help the soldiers. He received warm applause from the soldiers and dignitaries present. The festive evening was a great success with soldiers treated

to good food, stand-up comics, an IDF chorus, and, of course, their holiday baskets.

The coupons that the soldiers received help ensure that they can buy some basics like food and clothing during the holidays. It is hoped that the organization will continue to grow and be able to provide these lone soldiers with help throughout the year, not just during the holidays. As a former American soldier, I can tell you that soldiers always need food and clothes, and the knowledge that strangers are willing to give and support you is a great comfort and encouragement. As someone who has moved to Israel alone, I can tell you that help from family or an outside source is a must for the basic needs, as well as for the support and encouragement necessary to live alone in a foreign place.

A Parallel Case

On October 20, Bill O'Reilly on Fox News made the point that Mexico's leading source of income is the money sent back to its citizens from illegal aliens who find work in the United States. It is otherwise unable to support its population.

This was the case in "Palestine" before Arafat's terrorism of the 90s. The Palestinians worked in Israel, and, in

The unemployment rate is 40%. These are people who had every chance to cooperate with democracy, as so many American immigrants have over our two centuries, and yet, instead, they have chosen to try to seize the land by murdering innocent civilians.



Palestinians Killing Palestinians

For the first time since the start of the intifada, more Palestinians have been killed in internal violence since the start of the year than those who have died in clashes with Israel, according to an official report.

In the report, the Palestinian Authority's Interior Ministry cited 219 deaths as a result of inner-Palestinian violence compared to 218 deaths at the hands of Israeli security forces over the course of the first nine months of this year. The statistics reflect the relative calm in the territories vis-a-vis Israel as well as the increasing anarchy in PA-controlled areas.

The ministry, which oversees the PA's security services, argued that the data speak to the dangers inherent in the deteriorating security situation within the PA. It called on all the factions within the PA to support efforts in enforcing the law.

The PA added that the security services are trying to cope with two main challenges in establishing law and order — crime and domestic violence within families, and the activities of armed groups and factions in the territories.

A Touchy Subject

Pakistan has agreed to accept indirect aid from Israel to help in the recovery effort from the devastating earth-quake that killed 54,000 people. The aid will probably be delivered through a third party, such as the UN.

"The fact that there is a channel of communication is a sign of the times," said Foreign Ministry official Mark Regev.

The *Financial Times* reported that Israel offered assistance immediately after the quake hit, but was only answered on October 15.

Direct aid may be a touchy subject for a country with no official diplomatic ties with Israel and one in which the population is against Pakistan's recent thawing of relations with Israel.

On September 1, Israeli Foreign Minister Silvan Shalom met his counterpart, Khurshid Kasouri, in Istanbul. Two weeks later, at the UN General Assembly, Pakistani President Pervez Musharraf shook hands with Israeli Prime Minister Ariel Sharon and spoke at a dinner hosted by the American Jewish Congress.

At that event, Musharraf said Pakistan had no direct

conflict with Israel though full diplomatic relations would only

happen after an independent state of Palestine is established.

A general warming of ties with Arab and Islamic countries has been occurring since Israel's withdrawal from Gaza and northern Samaria. However, full recognition is still far off.

However, Israel's offering aid to countries without diplomatic relations is not new. The Jewish state routinely offers aid to any country that needs it, even if that country is one of its staunchest enemies, such as Iran. After a devastating earthquake there several years ago, Israel offered aid, but was turned down by the Islamic state.


Israel Developing Hurricane Technology

Israel is on the forefront of developing solutions to mitigate the damage from hurricanes such as Katrina, which lashed the southeastern United States recently.

The *Tnufa*, ["Momentum,"] committee, which is headed by Chief Scientist Dr. Eli Opper, has approved a preliminary research and development program aimed at advancing the development of an innovative technology for barriers against floods like the ones that followed Hurricane Katrina, according to a *Globes Business* report. The technology will make it possible to speedily build anti-flood barriers of any length and height necessary to protect a population center from the kind of massive flooding that destroyed thousands of homes in New Orleans.

The committee has also approved a preliminary R&D program for the development of a small personal water purification system, to be used by those stranded during disasters. Many died of thirst or from drinking contaminated water following hurricane Katrina. "The recent events in the US lent urgency to these plans," said *Tnufa* director Jacob Fisher. "The *Tnufa* committee has approved \$350,000 for 16 preliminary R&D programs. Six of the programs are in the life sciences, three are for information systems, and seven are for consumer products or in other fields."



The High Cost of Terror Israel Today

The Palestinian terror war has cost both Israelis and Palestinians over a million jobs and billions of dollars. A recent survey by the Portland Trust revealed the 1.16 million new jobs could be established in the Palestinian territories if they lived peacefully with Israel.

An increase in Palestinian jobs would bring some \$5 billion into the Israeli economy each year, the same amount that's lost to combating terror. The Palestinians lose approximately \$850 million annually. Some 40 percent of Palestinians are unemployed, with more than half of the population living under the poverty line.

The Portland Trust supports economic development to advance the peace process.

Israeli Doctor Develops Cancer Vaccine www.israel21c.com

An Israeli-born doctor, Eliav Barr, stands at the head of a team from pharmaceutical giant Merck which announced recently a vaccine that is 100% effective in preventing cervical cancer and precancerous changes linked to two types of common sexually transmitted viruses.

Senior director of Clinical Research, Merck Research Laboratories' Dr. Eliav Barr, originally from Haifa, made the dramatic announcement about the genetically engineered vaccine Gardasil, saying, "This is the first time we have been able to state that administration of the vaccine is going to have an effect on cervical cancer."

While more testing is required, Merck plans to seek US Food and Drug Administration approval to sell Gardasil by year's end.

New U.S. ambassador to Israel not "familiar" with Israel, but speaks fluent Arabic

Richard Jones, the newly-appointed U.S. ambassador

to Israel, arrived in the country last September, ending the four year term of former ambassador Dan Kurtzer.

A short while after landing at Ben-Gurion Airport, Jones arrived at the Foreign Ministry in Jerusalem to formally present his credentials to Chief of Protocol Yitzhak Eldan. The following day Jones presented his credentials to President Moshe Katsav and officially begin his term as ambassador.

Upon arriving in Israel Jones said his dream is that regional peace would be achieved during his term.

"I am not familiar with Israel, but I plan to study the country as soon as possible," he said. "This is my fourth term in the region, and I come with a desire to learn."

During the Foreign Ministry ceremony, Eldan advised Jones, who speaks fluent Arabic, to learn Hebrew.

"I promise to learn the language," Jones responded.

Israeli Ambassador to the U.S. Danny Ayalon hosted a farewell party for Jones in Washington prior to his departure for Israel. Some 200 people, including former ambassadors to Israel, U.S. government officials and Jewish community leaders were on hand to congratulate Jones on his appointment.

"The American ambassador to Israel is not only the senior diplomat, he is also a friend and a family member,"

Ayalon said during the event.

"I hope that during your term, concrete steps will be taken toward peace and the Road Map."

Jones, who arrived in Israel with his wife and two of his four children, said recently that following Israel's withdrawal from Gaza the ball is in the Palestinian Authority's court and it must prove itself by improving the lives of the Palestinians and eradicating terror.

An article in The National Weekly Edition of *The Washington Times* was entitled "Jordan's King Reaches Out to Jews, Hits Radical Islam." That sounds encouraging, but the world has trusted the King of Jordan before—the present king's father—and it cost Israel three different armed assaults and 58 synagogues blown up in Jerusalem.

Some of our readers and some pastors, and finally a U.S. Senator, have declared that Hurricane Katrina, with its destruction of particularly New Orleans, was the Godly retribution for sin.

Famine is increasing in the world because of increasing populations and poverty throughout the third world. As far as pestilences go, we have exotic diseases brought on by pollution and nuclear accidents and the like. In addition, the avian flu is in the news with predictions of the deaths of 150 million people if the pestilence really breaks loose and we are unable to keep up with it with vaccines or treatments. Dog flu is spreading across the country. Experts say the flu, which can be deadly to pooches, is spread at kennels and other places dogs gather. There's no vaccine for the dog flu, but experts are working on it.

In view of the combination of prophecies heading to fulfillment (when I am asked about the signs of the end in Matthew 24 these days, I say that they are all "birth pains"). I can only say, "Look up, your redemption draweth nigh!"

There are two possible cases in assigning motives to God. The first is to understand that we are in the Age of Grace, and sin in itself is not punished. The Scripture says that God is "winking at sin" now (Acts 17:30). If that were not true, there would certainly be no Germany left in this world, no Russia, no Cambodia, and no

Islamic fanatics. It defies logic to imagine that a calamity like, say, the tsunami in Indonesia, which killed a quarter of a million people, was a Godly retribution, although that was said at that time. It just seems as though we cannot assign sin to victims anywhere on the basis of some Godly action. Were the people at the World Trade Center sinful, or was it a matter of sin in any way?

The second case, however, in considering God's motives, would be a matter of scheduling in the End Times. Since the Lord said there would be famine, pestilences and earthquakes in diverse places (Matt. 24:7), we can expect that these things would start up and get worse. In


fact, the Lord's analogy was travail or labor pains, which have the characteristic of beginning slowly and building in intensity until the actual fact of the delivery. Likewise, the Tribulation period will start at a given time, but phenomena like famines or pestilences, or natural disasters like earthquakes, build up slowly according to certain conditions.

Therefore, if the End Times are right around the corner, we should not be surprised by the large hurricanes that hit Florida last year, or the tsunami, or Katrina, or anything coming up. As a matter of fact, these should continue to get worse as the Tribulation draws near. In the other case, if the Tribulation is a long way off, I simply don't think we can judge the sinfulness of any people or the actions of God in the Age of Grace other than as pertains to the situation in Israel, and other Biblical considerations which have continued through the Church Age and toward the End Times.

It might seem odd to give an either/or proposition, but that is given in Scripture in respect to the timing of, say, the Rapture. We are taught that we are to live as if the Rapture were in fifty years, or that it could, as a matter of fact, be immediately, before you finish reading this paragraph.

With all the famine in the world, the natural disasters and the oncoming pestilences, I stop to reflect on how I teach the lesson called "The Signs of The End." It is derived from the Lord's remarks in Matthew 24 in answer to His Disciples' question, "What is the sign of Your coming and the end of the age?" I realize that my teaching has changed from saying that we should look out for upcoming

"Nothing to See Here. Move along."

October 12 marked the fifth anniversary of the bombing of the USS Cole. Seventeen American sailors were murdered in the attack. They were casualties of a war with radical Islamic terror that America hadn't yet declared and which the mainstream



media still refuse to acknowledge today.

Too many of us were blind in 2000 — unable or unwilling or simply too uninterested to connect such bloodstained dots as al-Qaeda's 1993 World Trade Center bombing attack, the 1996 Khobar Tower bombings, the 1998 African embassy bombings, and the attack on the Cole. After Sept. 11, 2001, all of our eyes should have been pried wide open to the evils of Muslim extremism that exist among us in both organized and freelance form.

The watchdogs in the national press, however, insist on clouding our vision.

Since 9/11, I've reported on the media's reluctance to highlight the convicted Washington D.C.-area snipers' Islamist proclivities and journalists' refusal to call Egyptian gunman Hesham Hadayet's acts of murder at the Israeli airline counter at Los Angeles International Airport on July 4, 2002, "terrorism."

Middle East scholar Daniel Pipes noted how quickly the media sought to whitewash the bloody bus-hijacking by Croatian illegal alien Damir Igric a month after 9/11. Although the incident "echoed similar attacks by Palestinians on Israeli buses," Pipes observed, the "media attributed the violence to post-traumatic stress syndrome."

National Guardsman Ryan Anderson (a.k.a. Amir Talhah), a Muslim convert who allegedly attempted to pass sensitive military information to al-Qaeda over the Internet, rated barely a blip on the media radar screen.

Similarly, press accounts have downplayed the disruption of terrorist cells on American soil: The Lackawanna Six were just nice Muslim boys led astray. The Virginia Jihad Network was just a group of weekend paintball enthusiasts. Those indicted imams in Lodi, Calif., are

just misunderstood "moderates." Terror suspects deported on immigration charges are just victims of discrimination.

Now, many of my readers wonder why the MSM won't touch the strange and troubling story of the University of Oklahoma bomber, Joel Henry Hinrichs III. On Oct. 1, Hinrichs died on a park bench outside the school's packed football stadium when a homemade bomb in his possession exploded. The Justice Department has sealed a search warrant in the case. The university's president, David Boren, is pooh-poohing local media and Internet blog reports of possible jihadist influences on Hinrichs. The dead bomber was, we are being told, simply a depressed and troubled young man with "no known ties" to terrorism.

Never mind that, according to local news reporters, the bomb-making material found in Hinrichs' apartment was triacetone triperoxide — the explosive chemical of choice of shoe bomber Richard Reid and the London 7/7 subway bombers.

Never mind the local police department's confirmation that Hinrichs had attempted to buy ammonium nitrate a few days before his death.

Never mind the concerns of Oklahoma University student journalist Rachael Kahne, who told me this week in a call for the media's help:

"I've been working on this story since the night it happened, and have been stonewalled at every turn. . . . Minutes after the explosion, police busted into a student's apartment and arrested four Muslim students who were there for a small gathering (the president of the Muslim Student Association assures me this was in no way a "party"). Among those arrested [and later released] was Fazal Cheema, Joel Henry Hinrichs' Pakistani roommate. I was baffled when I heard this. I didn't know how police would be able to identify who Hinrichs was, where he lived, who his roommate was, and then find where his roommate was in a matter of minutes. Something isn't adding up, and I've been wracking my brain for the past week trying to figure out what happened here. OU isn't saying anything more than the typical PR spin, and the FBI won't talk."

Nothing to see here. Move along. Islam is a peaceful religion. Stop asking so damned many questions.

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examples of these phenomena to simply cataloging them since they're all here with us now.

The Time Is Imminent

Hebraic Insight:

Chazak v'ematz!

Though the time appointed by God for the Messianic redemption of Israel is a heavenly kept secret (Mark 13:32), there are certain signs called *chevlei mashiach* — the "birth pangs" of the Messiah — that indicate that the time is indeed imminent.

Most of these birth pangs indicate peril and danger, including "distress of nations in perplexity because of the roaring of the sea and the waves," and "men's hearts failing them for fear, and with foreboding of what is coming on the earth" (Luke

21:25-6). In addition, the moral depravity of mankind will be unmasked, showing us clearly that "men shall be lovers of their own selves, covetous, boasters, proud, blasphemers, disobedient to parents, unthankful, unholy, without natural affection, truce-breakers, false accusers, incontinent, fierce, despisers of those that are good, traitors, heady, highminded, lovers of pleasures more than lovers of God; having a form of Godliness, but denying the power thereof" (2 Tim. 3:2-3).

As followers of the LORD Jesus, we must cling to the truth that "all

Arabs Question Suicide Terror

In an article in the Jordanian newspaper *Al-Dustour*, Dr. Huda Kukhoury claimed that suicide attacks stem from American intervention in world affairs. He pointed to the American occupation of Iraq and U.S. support for Israel's occupation of the Palestinians as examples.

Kukhoury expressed the popular perception in the Arab world that the massacre of civilians by Islamic "militants" is justified by American and Israeli military actions.

But in the same paper, author Layla al-Atrash expressed the opposite view. While she criticized US hegemony in the Middle East, she said Arab nations must begin a painful process of self-examination and fight the sources of terrorism in their societies.

"Everyone from the political leaders to the public at large fears terrorism and wants to eliminate it." Al-Atrash wrote. "No one knows when he will be gripped by the invisible hand of terror or when he will get into its line of fire."

She described terrorism as a "disease born of fundamentalism," and warned Arab states to reverse the trend before they wind up like Iran.

"American Heresy"

The Palestinian Authority (PA) is continuing to allow incitement against the US on the airwaves, despite receiving \$50 million in American aid for infrastructure and housing. The following sermon was broadcast on the PA-run Voice of Palestine Radio, shortly after the aid deal was signed by Palestinian and American officials.

"Anyone who closely watches the nature of our world today can see that the heretical countries — first and foremost the US — have greatly succeeded in tearing our Islamic world apart, intending to weaken it, disperse (its citizens) and plunder its resources," said Yusuf Abu Sneina, a preacher at the al Aksa Mosque on the Temple Mount in Jerusalem. "It is terrorism and there's no choice but to fight it."

"I believe that God wants me to be here to get my degree," he said. "He gives me the courage to stay. "This is a special country!"

'Israeli Jews are suffering less than Israeli Arabs because there have been fewer victims on the Jewish side.'

According to a Haifa University study, every fifth Israeli Jew has lost a family member or a close friend in a war or terrorist attack. Among the Jews, the actual percentage was 22 percent; among Israeli Arabs the percentage was 11 percent.

In other words, every fifth Israeli Jew lost a relative or friend to war or terrorism compared to every tenth Israeli Arab. That's double the victims on the Jewish side. Nevertheless, each one who has lost his life to war or terrorism is one too many, whether Jew or Arab.

Still, this breakdown is important to dispel the misconception that Arabs have suffered more than Jews since the State of Israel was created in 1948. Misconceptions are often spread through ignorance, but they are used to damage Israel's image and stoke anti-Semitism.



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Blah, Blah, Blah,...

President George W. Bush declared October 20 that the dream he shares with the Arab world of birthing a Muslim state on the ancient Jewish lands of Judea, Samaria and Gaza is closer to reality today than ever before. He vowed to use America's considerable influence to help "realize [that] shared vision."

Speaking at a joint press conference in Washington, Bush heaped praise on visiting Palestine Liberation Organization chief Mahmoud Abbas, despite the latter's refusal to honor his primary peace commitment to disarm and dismantle anti-Jewish Palestinian terrorist organizations. For Israel he had a warning: You will be "held to account" for any actions that hinder Washington's "peace" efforts and burden the lives of the Palestinian Arabs.

Bush also admonished Abbas, telling him that "the way forward is confronting the threat that armed gangs present to the creation of a democratic Palestine." He said it is time for the Palestinian Authority to "earn the confidence of its neighbors by rejecting and fighting terrorism."

The tone of his remarks indicated the president had accepted Abbas's assertion that the Palestinian Arabs are "committed to peace," and that his regime has already taken steps to impose the rule of law.

But Abbas made it clear that his policies do not include the forced disarmament of those dedicated to Israel's demise. "We are following a policy I believe is successful," he said. "All [terrorist] organizations accepted the [temporary] truce." Likud Member of Knesset and Foreign Affairs and Defense Committee chairman Yuval Steinitz, however, warned that if Abbas

"Either he fights terror and disarms the organizations, or Israel will behave toward him as it did toward his predecessor and isolate him in the Muqata," the Itim news agency quoted Steinitz as saying. Steinitz reacted with fury to an editorial published earlier in the day that Abbas had penned for *The Wall Street Journal*, in which he accused Israel of acting to strengthen the more radical elements of Palestinian society in an effort to see his rule fail.

"It's clear that there is no end to audacity," Steinitz said. "The man, who is personally making it possible for Hamas and the other terror organizations to hold onto their weapons and prepare for another round of bloodshed, is accusing Israel of strengthening them."

In the editorial, Abbas claimed to have created "a climate of peace" since his assumption of power in January and suggested the only thing preventing regional harmony were the obstacles "Israel has created."

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Let the Jordan Flow Israel Today


Christians sing praise songs about the Jordan River flowing, but for Israelis, Palestinians and Jordanians, making the river flow again is a national — and practical — goal.
