Christian "Freedom Fighters" and the Muslims Among Us

While visiting a Union camp in 1861, Julia Ward Howe heard spirited soldiers singing an abolitionist song called "John Brown's Body." The

"freedom fighters'" hymn moved her to pen a rapturous song of her own: "The Battle Hymn of the Republic." Her upbeat tune so struck a cord with Westerners that it was employed at the funerals of Sir Winston Churchill, Senator Robert Kennedy, and Presidents Reagan and Nixon.

Lines like "Mine eyes have seen the glory of the coming of the Lord; He is trampling out the vintage where the grapes of wrath are stored; He hath loosed the fateful lightning of His terrible swift sword; His truth is marching on!" have fired national enthusiasm and left a lasting impression on the American psyche. Howe's fifth stanza was edited: "In the beauty of the lilies Christ was born across the sea, With a glory in His bosom that transfigures you and me: As He died to make men holy, let us live to make men free; While God is marching on." Originally, however, she wrote: "As He died to make men holy, let us die to make men free," and then followed with "Glory! Glory! Hallelujah...." (continued next page)

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Religious Profiling in Europe

Recently, The Washington Times reported that security officials throughout Europe have endorsed a plan to "profile mosques on the Continent and identify radical Islamic clerics who raise the threat of homegrown terrorism." One of the key issues security officials will be investigating is sources of funding. For years, I have been critical of the role Saudi money is playing in the spread of Wahhabism, an extremely virulent form of radical Islam that breeds jihadist sentiment. In my report about the Muslim radicals arrested for plotting a massacre of U.S. troops at Fort Dix, N.J., I suggested that the mosque they attended should be investigated and Saudi-funded extremism kept out.

"Die to make men free...." While many of today's Christians seem to have trouble finding a "cause to die for," Muslims apparently do not—evidenced by a seemingly brazen disregard for their own lives and others'. Muslims killed Bobby Kennedy in 1968, kidnapped and murdered Olympic athletes in 1972, took the U.S. embassy in Iran in 1979, commandeered the Achille Lauro in 1985, hijacked TWA flight 847 in Athens in 1985, bombed Pan Am flight 103 in 1988, bombed the World Trade Center in 1993, and bombed embassies in Kenya and Tanzania in 1998.

Muslims, of course, hijacked airplanes in 2001 and flew them into the WTC's Twin Towers, Pentagon, and a field in Pennsylvania, killing multiple thousands. These are but a few examples.

Set "on edge" by it all, let us attend to the following question: *How should* we deal with Muslims among us? To find our answer, let's examine some classic Jewish literature: Deuteronomy 16:18-20.

18 You shall appoint judges and... they shall judge the people with just judgment.
19 You shall not pervert justice; you shall not show partiality....
20 You shall follow what is altogether just, that you may live and inherit the land which the Lord your God is giving you.

The italics above denote the premium Moses placed on the administration of justice for all. "Altogether just" in the English translation of verse 20 literally reads in Hebrew "Justice, justice shalt thou follow." The seeming redundancy of "justice, justice" presses the point forcefully and emphasizes the literature's insistence on righteous evenhandedness in the administration of justice. Accordingly, criminal convictions were to be secured on the basis of more than one witness (19:15-21) and judges were to "make careful inquiry" of facts (19:18). In no uncertain terms, Bible readers note that God demands justice, and is not kindly

disposed toward those who deny it to those in need of it!

Judeo-Christian "freedom fighters" believe that all of humankind was created in "God's image" (Gen. 1:26) and, therefore, possesses inalienable rights, whether Muslim, Jew, or atheist. Rights due every person, irrespective of race, religion, sex, and creed, include—and are not limited to—(1) honor, (2) personal dignity and respect, (3) freedom to think and be different, and (4) freedom to benefit from the fruits of one's own labor. Given the above, injustice—toward anyone, for any reason—is, by nature, deemed a blasphemous disrespect toward God.

A "freedom fighter" myself, I am compelled to grant others the freedom to worship according to the dictates of their own wishes (not mine); thus, I impose no vision or action upon the religious rights of our multicultural citizenry. And to those who mistake our culture's freedom/strength for a weakness, as a "freedom fighter" I suggest the following: Anyone among us who enjoys the freedoms granted by us should experience the full weight of the justice administrated through us.

So, how should we deal with Muslims among us? Because our Judeo-Christian constitution demands that we treat everyone fairly, we must be restrained in our judgments and keep our swords in their sheaths. That said, we should also serve the following notice: Anyone —citizen, alien, anyone—and everyone who steps outside the bounds of our distinctly Judeo-Christian way of being, our code of law, will be held accountable. Regarding those deviants, I agree with Julia Ward Howe that we should "loose the fateful lightning of the terrible swift sword," letting them know that they misconstrued our meekness as weakness, and demonstrating that, in the wake of "due process," we have the liberty and obligation to unsheathe our swords and deal them a blow of justice.

The Pervasive Internet

Obviously, there is a delay between an essay's creation and when you read it,



especially if you read it on paper as opposed to, say, in an email. The words have to be edited, approved, graphically formatted, printed, addressed, transported to a post office, and eventually delivered to you.

By the time you read this essay, its news won't be new. I say this to point out that the world has been mightily changed by the Internet. Yet, I think that a lot of people don't really understand how changed it is. Two recent events help demonstrate the scope of the Internet's influence.

One of them is the widely circulated video of a Palestinian kiddy show featuring "Mickey Mouse" preaching Islamic supremacism and urging children to martyrdom as a means to destroy the nation of Israel and eventually rule the world. Similar videos have circulated before, including one that I've written about here: 12-yearold Mohammed al Dura beckoning from paradise and encouraging other Palestinian children to join him by dying in jihad. Al Dura's death was blamed on Israeli soldiers, a fabrication by Palestinian propagandists spread by French television and the Internet.

The Internet's surge since al Dura is huge. Millions of people have watched aghast as the imitation Disney character urges murder and genocide. I doubt the Hamas government expected anyone to tape and subtitle snippets of the kiddy show and release it to the Internet or that it would have such an impact in the West. They still think in terms of the old media days when they could pull off propaganda like the al Dura fraud. In that, they are not alone.

Still, several aspects about the hail of criticism the show provoked are worth noting. One is the relative impotence

of Disney's lawyers, renowned for their zeal and effectiveness in preventing copyright infringements. In the world that respects the rule of law, nothing like the mouse video could take place. Proving that the Palestinian Authority is not part of that world, a Hamas spokesman claimed that suggestions the show be removed from the air constituted a "criticism of Islam." I invite you to ponder the depths of that sophistry for a moment.

"Criticism of Islam."

The other event regards the six New Jersey Muslims who were arrested before they could carry out their planned murders of Fort Dix soldiers. Somehow, these men of mostly Albanian descent became convinced that Fort Dix was attacking Islam. In reality, the base

attacking Islam. In reality, the base played an instrumental role in the destruction of the Christian Serb government, thereby protecting Albanian Muslims during the Clinton years.

How did the arrested men get it so wrong? News reports say that they were saturated in Islamist Internet propaganda. The same loathsome death cult that corrupted an American cartoon icon among Palestinians managed to turn men with every advantage against the country that cradled and tolerated them. You may have heard this from others by now; still, I ask you to consider how much more effective this immersive cultural darkness must be when children literally grow up in it.

In Islamist-influenced countries around the world, hundreds of millions of people believe that they can enter paradise by dying in the effort to kill or conquer anyone who disagrees with their religious and political philosophy. Their numbers increase daily. The fact that American troops risked—and gave their lives in order to protect the religious rights of ethnic Albanian and other Muslims during the conflict in Yugoslavia, yet these would-be terrorists still view American soldiers as their enemies, indicates to me that there is no change we can make, short of converting to Islam, that will lessen their hatred of us.

Being on the replica of a first-century boat on the Sea of Galilee in Israel always reminds me what Kelly Strong's poem says: that "freedom is not free." After we have boarded the boat, one of the first things we do is play the Star Spangled Banner and raise the American flag. We all stand with our right hands over our hearts and sing. I usually end up crying. Then we play HaTikva, Israel's national anthem, and raise the Israeli flag. (I usually end up crying here, also.) This is done in the middle of the water, in full view of the Golan Heights and the mountains all around —like a bowl with the Sea of Galilee in the middle. Out in the middle of the Sea—a lake really, 7 miles by 14 miles we have no protection other than our prayers. Gospel music blares from a CD player and we are singing and dancing. One of my favorite worship songs that we sing has the words, "put your hand in the hand of the Man from Galilee." Here we are on the water where Messiah walked and taught. It is a great visual. We are also sitting targets for anyone who wants to harm us, and yet there is a peace that passes all understanding (Phil. 4:7). We are in His hands. It is just the boat, the water, and us. No other protection. It is, for me, the whole picture of life in full view.


The Golan is a tiny part of Israel, about 300 square miles, that was occupied by the Syrians from 1948 until 1967, when the IDF (Israel Defense Forces) took back the land. It is strategic for the security of Israel, for beyond Syria lies Iraq. When the Jews really started coming home in the late 1800s, *kibbutzim* were established in the areas of the Golan, Hula Valley, Jordan Valley, and, of course, Galilee. The Jews came home to land that was mosquito-infested, swampy, and with very little vegetation. No one

wanted it. It had been destroyed and left to rot. The Jews bought the land, paying many times more than what it was worth. The Jews just wanted a home, so they paid the price. Their enemies would fire guns at boats on the Galilee and attack the *kibbutzim* without hesitation. Those early returning Jews made great personal sacrifices, dying not only from terrorists, but also from diseases such as malaria

On the boat in the middle of the Sea of Galilee, I realize how much has been sacrificed for me. My Savior sacrificed His life for my sins and my eternal salvation. Men and women who fought for my country's freedom from tyranny and oppression sacrificed their lives for me. The Jewish people sacrificed their lives to rebuild a home for me—for Israel is my eternal home.

I thank God everyday for His Son, the Messiah. And, especially this month when we celebrate American independence, I thank the men and women in our armed services for their sacrifices in protecting America's freedom. No, freedom is not free.

The Pool of Siloam

In Hebrew. Shiloah—it means, "The water is sent." All this began when the Assyrians with King Sennacherib came to attack the Southern Kingdom

of Israel, Judah (called Yehudah in Hebrew), destroying some cities (such as Lachish), and were in the way to the capital. Jerusalem.

King Hezekiah of Yehudah, prepared Jerusalem for that war and fortified the walls of Jerusalem (the broad wall), dug the Hezekiah's Tunnel to bring the water of the Spring of Gihon to a pool of water called Shiloah/Siloam, which will be within the walls of the city. 2 Chronicles 32:2-4, 30


All these were ready by 701 B.C. So, when the Assyrians came, they found a ready city and God destroyed the Assyrian army—a great miracle of God. Year 586 B.C. the Babylonians destroyed Jerusalem and the Pool of Shiloah and the walls around it. Seventy years later the city of Jerusalem was rebuilt.

The Pool of Shiloah/Siloam which is mentioned in the Book of John 9:7connected to the miracle made by

Yeshua—Jesus—healing a man born blind, telling him to wash in the Pool of Shiloah/Siloam.

Those two mentioned pools were unknown, or mistaken known as very little pool in the end of Hezekiah's Tunnel, with some ruins around and a mosque beside. It was hard to believe that it was the famous biblical pool, but it was the official tradition, leaving a very bad taste to people who expect something more impressive.

The Israelis liberated the political East Jerusalem in the Six Days War 1967, with great miracles of God, but they didn't act as winners of war which was started by enemies who wanted to eradicate the Jewish Nation from the world including their history, heritage, present, and future. They didn't start a massive archaeological dig in the real Old City of Jerusalem —the City of David—, but dug few square yards here and there. In 2004, just by chance, few old stones were found few vards southeast of the traditional pool and then the excavations started in the summer of 2004 (it's still going on), but they are very limited to about 11% of the size of the monumental Second Temple period—Yeshua's time—just because Israel is afraid to declare all the area around as a very important for archaeology (the reasons are political reasons, a fear from the world, United Nations, etc.). This is a sign of weakness and not of a free nation in her homeland. At least we can see some of the real pool. The traditional pool is Byzantine 4th century A.D. and it's brand new. (In Israel everything after year 70 A.D. is brand new, up to 70 A.D. is ancient.) God bless you in Yeshua name. See vou in Israel.



For Zion I Will Not Be Silent. U.S. Rabbis Arrested

On April 17th, 50 rabbis, students, and laymen staged a sit-in protest calling on the United Nations Secretary General to expel Iran from the international body for its threats to wipe the State of Israel off the map. The protest began with a demonstration at the Iranian mission to the UN, and continued with a march through the streets of New York to the Isaiah Peace Wall.

It was under this wall bearing Isaiah's prophecy of world peace that the group of distinguished Jewish leaders acted on the prophet's declaration: "For Zion's sake I will not be silent and for Jerusalem's sake I will not be still." In a glaring act of civil disobedience, the U.S. Jewish leaders sat down on the busy New York City sidewalk obstructing pedestrian traffic.

New York City police warned the activists to voluntarily clear the way or face arrest and charges of disorderly conduct. The rabbis chose the latter option, and one by one, they were handcuffed and hauled away. Three paddy wagons of rabbis, students, and lay leaders were brought to Central Booking where they joined together in a spirited afternoon, *Mincha*, prayer service. They were later released.

The event was organized by Rabbi Avi Weiss's AMCHA— The Coalition for Jewish Concerns.





Staying In Step

Better than any other word I can think of, *change* describes our world. Vast, sweeping changes, espe-



cially in the last 150 years. Simply to survive requires adjusting, and to make any kind of significant dent calls for a willingness to shift in style and to modify methods.

Consider two of the more pronounced changes in our world.

Population. It was not until 1850 that the number of people on this globe reached one billion. By 1930 (a mere eighty years later), the number had doubled. Only thirty years later—1960—it had shot up to three billion.

Speed. Until the early 1800s the fastest any human being could travel was about 20 miles per hour—on the back of a galloping horse. By 1880 the "streamline" passenger train whipped along at 100 miles per hour, an unheard of and fearsome velocity. Today... manned space rockets jump the speed to 16,000 miles per hour.

And I haven't even mentioned the technological advancements in the last century, or the enormous changes made in military armament and defense, agricultural processes, housing, modes of transportation, medicine, music, architecture and engineering, luxury items and personal conveniences, computers, clothing, and cars.

Since God is eternally relevant, since none of this blows Him away (omniscience can't be mind-boggled!), He is still in touch, in control, and fully aware. Why He has caused or allowed this radical reshaping of human history, nobody can say for sure. But we can reasonably surmise that God is up to something.

Some would suddenly shout, "These are signs predicting Christ's soon return." Quite possibly. But what about until then? What is essential? We're back where we started, aren't we? Being adaptable, willing to shift and change.

Take communication. We must hammer out new and fresh styles on the anvil of each generation, always guarding against being dated and institutionalized. This calls for creativity, originality, and sensitivity.

More than anything else, I'm convinced, the characteristic that attracted people to Jesus was His fresh, authentic, original style in a world of tired phrases, rigid rules, and empty religion. Remember the report made to the Pharisees? "Nobody ever spoke like this man." He was in step with the times without ever stepping out of the Father's will.

Though times may change, the Lord is constant.





Hamas's Mouse of Hatred

The Palestinian Authority, led by the radical Hamas terrorist group for over a year, has introduced yet another program of hatred and incitement to violence against Jews, this one aimed at children. A weekly television program aired on a Hamasrun station features a Mickey Mouse look-alike who encourages children to "resist the Zionist occupation until we win." The Hamas mouse also promotes resistance in Iraq, taunting U.S. President George W. Bush and U.S. Secretary of State Dr. Condoleezza Rice by name.

The TV program's co-host is a young girl who appears to be around only 12 years old and dresses in Muslim religious fashion. As the video on Palestinian Media Watch (www.pmw.org.il) shows, she speaks directly to her audience of fellow children watching the program and proudly proclaims the Hamas doctrines of resistance and Islamic defeat over the West. She and the mouse speak of liberating the Al-Aqsa mosque and all of "Palestine" (including Israel inside the Green Line), and of resistance and war. Children can call into the show, and several sing songs spewing the same kind of hatred.

By the way, the impostor Mickey Mouse is called *Farfour* which means "butterfly" in Arabic.

At first, a look-alike Mickey Mouse named butterfly might seem odd, but not when you know something about Israeli children's TV. The program Parpar Nechmad, meaning lovely butterfly, has been a popular Israeli children's program since 1982. Partly animated and partly children interacting with puppets and adult hosts. the program teaches children about holidays, stories, songs, and other specific children's topics. Hamas simply stole a symbol popular to American children, Mickey Mouse, and named it after a popular Israeli children's program, The Lovely Butterfly, in order to teach Palestinian children about fighting and hatred of Israel and the U.S.

Phase I of the Roadmap peace plan requires that, "All official Palestinian institutions end incitement against Israel." With the formation of the Palestinian unity government, the difference between Fatah—the "good" Palestinians who supposedly want peace—and Hamas — the terrorists—has disappeared. By choosing to sit in the same government with the terrorist group Hamas, the Fatah Party and Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas, whom the U.S. labeled as a partner in peace, become equally responsible and accountable for the effluents issuing from their government partner Hamas, including the hate-filled mouse program.

U.S. Taxpayers Fund Anti-Israel Comments

Overseers of the United States government's Arabic-language satellite television network say a speech by Hezbollah leader Hassan Nasrallah was not screened for anti-Israel content before broadcast because no supervisor spoke Arabic.

"Mistakes were made," Joaquin Blaya, of the Broadcasting Board of Governors, told the House Middle East subcommittee, referring to the broadcast last December and others by the network, Al-Hurra, that he said "lacked journalistic or academic merit."

The subcommittee chairman, Rep. Gary L. Ackerman, a Democrat, said that in several instances Nasrallah used the U.S. government's satellite television network as a platform for inciting a crowd to violence against Israel.

"Why are American taxpayer dollars used to spread the hate, lies, and propaganda of these nuts, when our goal was to counter them?" Ackerman asked.

Focusing especially on the Nasrallah speech, Ackerman said the Hezbollah



leader spoke for more than 30 minutes live on the U.S. network inciting violence against Israel.

"Doesn't anybody watch the broadcasts?" he asked.

A new vice president for news, Larry Register, has been appointed, and editors are now accountable for monitoring news items before and while they are delivered.

Board member D. Jeffrey Hirschberg said he knew of no recurrences of anti-Semitic incidents. "The Broadcasting Board of Governors promotes freedom and democracy," he said.

One in four younger U.S. Muslims says suicide bombings to defend their religion are acceptable at least in some circumstances, though most Muslim Americans overwhelmingly reject the tactic and are critical of Islamic extremism and al-Qaeda, a poll says.

The survey by the Pew Research Center, one of the most exhaustive ever of the country's Muslims, revealed a community that in many ways blends comfortably into society. Its largely mainstream members express nearly as much happiness with their lives and communities as the general public does, show a broad willingness to adopt American customs, and have income and education levels similar to others in the U.S.


"Twenty-five percent is a hair-raising number," said Radwan Masmoudi, president of the Washington-based Center for the Study of Islam and Democracy, which promotes the compatibility of Islam with democracy. "U.S. Muslims have growing Internet and television access to extreme ideologies," he said, adding, "People, especially younger people, are susceptible to these ideas."

Federal officials have warned that the U.S. must be on guard against homegrown terrorism, as the British suffered with the London transit bombings of 2005.

Even so, U.S. Muslims are far less accepting of suicide attacks than Muslims in many other nations. Support in some Muslim countries exceeded 50 percent, while it was considered justifiable by about one in four Muslims in Britain and Spain, and one in three in France.

Six in 10 said they are concerned about a rise in Islamic extremism in the U.S., yet, only 40 percent said they believe Arab men carried out the attacks of September 11, 2001.





Why the Peaceful Majority is Irrelevant

I used to know a man whose family were German aristocracy prior to World War II. They owned a number of large industries and estates. I asked him how many German people were true Nazis, and the answer he gave has stuck with me and guided my attitude toward fanaticism ever since.

"Very few people were true Nazis," he said, "but many enjoyed the return of German pride, and many more were too busy to care. I was one of those who just thought the Nazis were a bunch of fools. So, the majority just sat back and let it all happen. Then, before we knew it, they owned us, and we had lost control, and the end of the world had come. My family lost everything. I ended up in a concentration camp and the Allies destroyed my factories."

We are told again and again by experts and talking heads that Islam is the religion of peace, and that the vast majority of Muslims just want to live in peace. Although this unquantified assertion may be true, it is entirely irrelevant. It is meaningless fluff, meant to make us feel better, and meant to somehow diminish the specter of fanatics rampaging across the globe in the name of Islam.

The fact is that the fanatics rule Islam at this moment in history. It is the fanatics who march. It is the fanatics who wage any one of 50 shooting wars worldwide. It is the fanatics who systematically slaughter Christian or tribal groups throughout Africa and are gradually taking over the entire continent in an Islamic wave. It is the fanatics who bomb, behead, murder, or execute honor killings. It is the fanatics who take over mosque after mosque. It is the fanatics who zealously spread the stoning and hanging of rape victims and homosexuals. The hard, quantifiable fact is that the "peaceful majority" is the "silent majority," and it is cowed and extraneous.

Communist Russia was made up of Russians who just wanted to live in peace, yet the Russian Communists were responsible for the murder of about 20 million people. The peaceful majority were irrelevant. China's huge population was peaceful as well, but Chinese Communists managed to kill a staggering 70 million people. The average Japanese individual prior to World War II was not a warmongering sadist. Yet, Japan murdered and slaughtered its way across Southeast Asia in an orgy of killing that included the systematic murder of 12 million Chinese civilians -most killed by sword, shovel, and bayonet. And who can forget Rwanda, which collapsed into butchery? Could it not be said that the majority of Rwandans were "peace-loving"?

History lessons are often incredibly simple and blunt; yet, for all our powers of reason, we often miss the most basic and uncomplicated of points. Peace-loving Muslims have been made irrelevant by the fanatics. Peace-loving Muslims have been made irrelevant by their silence. Peace-loving Muslims will become our enemy if they don't speak up, because, like my friend from Germany, they will awaken one day and find that the fanatics own them, and the end of their world will have begun.

Peace-loving Germans, Japanese, Chinese, Russians, Rwandans, Bosnians, Afghanis, Iraqis, Palestinians, Somalis, Nigerians, Algerians, and many others have died because the peaceful majority did not speak up until it was too late. As for us, watching it all unfold, we must pay attention to the only group that counts: the fanatics who threaten our way of life.

Iraqi Girls School Rigged for Death

American soldiers discovered that a girls school being built north of Baghdad had become an explosives-rigged "death trap."

The plot at the Huda Girls School in Tarmiya was a "sophisticated and premeditated attempt to inflict massive casualties on our most innocent victims." military spokesman Maj. Gen. William Caldwell said. The military suspects the plot was the work of al-Qaeda because of its nature and sophistication, Caldwell said in an interview.

The plot was uncovered when troopers found detonating wire across the street from the school. They picked up the wire and followed its trail, which led to the school. Once inside, they found an explosive-filled propane tank buried beneath the floor. There were artillery shells built into the ceiling and floor, and another propane tank was found, the military said.

The wire was concealed with mortar and concrete, and the propane tanks had been covered with brick and hidden underneath the floor, according to a military statement. Soldiers were able to clear the building.

"It was truly just an incredibly ugly, dirty kind of vicious killing that would have gone on here," Caldwell said. Iraqi contractors were responsible for building the school, which was intended to bring in hundreds of girls.

"Given the care and work put into emplacing this IED, it is likely it had been planned for a long time," the military said, adding that it is thought "the IED was not intended to be set off until the building was occupied." Authorities intend to question the Iraqis involved in the school's construction.

Tehran Police Enforce Summer Cover-up

Iranian police have begun a

summer campaign to ensure that women do not flout the nation's sharia dress code as temperatures soar.

Such crackdowns have become a regular feature of Iranian life in the summer as police confront growing numbers of young women testing the limits of the law with shorter, brighter, and skimpier clothing. Under sharia law, imposed in Iran after the 1979 revolution, women are obliged to wear a head-to-toe black chador or cover their hair with scarves and choose long, loose-fitting clothes.

Women who "violate" the law can receive lashes, fines, or imprisonment. A police spokesman said, "Police have started to confront those women who appear in public in an inappropriate way." He added that in the first weeks of enforcement, police in the capital, Tehran, had stopped more than 1,300 women and warned them against breaching the dress code.

Iran Bans Western Haircuts, Eyebrow Plucking for Men

Iranian police have warned barbers against offering Western-style haircuts or plucking the eyebrows of their male customers, the Iranian media said.

The report appeared to be another sign of authorities cracking down on clothing and other fashion deemed to be against Islamic values.

"Western hairstyles ... have been banned," a reformist daily newspaper said in a front-page headline.

It came a week after police launched a crackdown against the growing number of young women testing the limits of the law with shorter, brighter, and skimpier clothing ahead of the summer months.

Young Iranian men in recent years have started paying more attention to the way they look and dress, especially in affluent parts of the capital Tehran. Spiked up hair, by using gel, is known as the *Khorusi* (Rooster) style and some also use makeup.

Several hairdressers for men in Tehran offer cuts in the style of Hollywood movie stars and other Western celebrities. Clients can also have their eyebrows plucked.

Since hard-line President Mahmoud Ahmadinejad won the presidency in 2005

on a promise of returning to the values of the revolution, hardliners have pressed for tighter controls on what they consider immoral behavior.

Palestine Issues Fatwa on Hairdressers

The Supreme Fatwa Council of Palestine has issued a fatwa permitting men's and women's hairdressers to operate on condition that they do not break Islamic law.

The fatwa stated that women can be employed as hairdressers as long as they only cut the hair of women who want to look attractive for their husbands and not other men or foreigners; this would be *Haram* (forbidden).

It also stated that if a foreign man is present in the hairdressers, women must be prohibited from entering it.

The fatwa also said that men can work as barbers, and activity in the barbershops is not prohibited in any way, as long as it is not against Islam.

Hezbollah Captures Israeli Balloons

Law of Return

Dear Levitt Ministries.

Why does Israel as a nation refuse to allow Hebrew-Christians to be citizens of Israel? If this is true, I pray that the Lord will open their hearts. Love. R. L.

Greetings R.L.—

The information is half true. Israel has what's called "the Law of Return," under which any Jew, from any part of the world, can come to Israel and get citizenship in the ancestral homeland. The question is whether that law applies to Jews like me, who believe in Jesus, but still consider ourselves Jewish. Rabbinic authorities in Israel have determined that because we are no longer "really Jews," we are not entitled to automatic citizenship on the basis of the "Law of Return," which is for Jews. Because Israel is a democracy, individuals who are citizens, however, have no problem worshipping as they want, and needn't fear being deprived of their citizenship. — Jeffrey Seif

Greetings to you Mr. al-M. — I was thrilled to get your letter. Corresponding with Muslims fascinates me and I trust that you, I, and my newsletter's readers will benefit from the experience.

Dialogue With A Questioning Jew

Dear Zola Levitt Ministries. I have some questions that I have repeatedly tried to get answered. I am a Jew, and my wife is Christian. I think I have a pretty good understanding of Christianity except for one area in which the rabbis refuse to tread and the pastors can't give me anything except rote answers that don't really answer my question, which is this: Christians say that unless you believe in, and accept Jesus into your heart, vou are doomed to Hell. But, if Jesus is the sacrifice for the whole world, for all people, forever, then, why does it matter whether you believe it or not?


Cases in point: 1) An illiterate Jew unaware of the annual Yom Kippur sacrifice would still have been covered by it along with all the people of Israel. 2) A first-born son in Egypt at the time of the Passover, even if he thought that painting the doorposts with blood was nonsense, would still have been passed over, as were believers. 3) I can understand the theology of blood sacrifice and how Christians say Jesus did it once, for everyone, for all time. Our Scripture says over and over that if we come to God with teshuvah (repentance), God will forgive us. Nowhere is belief in Messiah a condition. From what I read in the New Testament, it says that if you believe you will be saved, but it never says that if you do not believe you will be lost. That would be contrary to Torah, anyway. If God changed His mind between Torah and the New Testament, then Christians worship a different god. 4) According to Christianity, even Jews who tried to keep Torah, when they went into Nazi ovens went into everlasting fire because they never believed in Jesus. Did millions of our people go into everlasting fire when they went into the ovens? God forbid!

Perhaps you can shed some light. I am tired of rote answers with no Torah to back them up. Without Torah back-up, they become only interpretations of a particular theology.

Dear A.D. — These are excellent questions. Because you have received unsatisfactory responses from ministers and rabbis, I realize that I could be added to the list. But, I'll give you my answers and if you find merit, great; if not, I still wish you well as you wrestle with it all.

First, it is my understanding that Jesus' death is not an automatic remedy for the whole world, but rather, with His death, all individuals have the opportunity to come to God through Him. His sacrifice/death provides an opportunity for everyone, not an automatic pass to paradise for the whole world. That the annual Yom Kippur sacrifice could be obscured from Jewish view, as you note, underscores why the "Day of Atonement" was a particularly special, all-Israel convocation: at issue was bringing it center-stage, given its importance. Lev. 17:11 informs readers that in the absence of that blood sacrifice, there is no remission of sin. Likewise, smearing the blood of the Paschal sacrifice under-

scores that Someone had a "Divine design" that He wanted to commend to a generation then, and to future ones: at issue here, as with the "Day of Atonement," is that sacrifice wasn't to be merely a footnote to the Jewish people and religion, but an intrinsic, central element. Salvation, then, seems to me to be preconditioned by coming to terms with these: a sacrifice in both cases. While I grant that the Torah doesn't say "accept the Messiah"—as you correctly note—it, nevertheless, does direct attention toward these issues. And these are often ignored in classical Judaism, though they are central in the Gospel—which I see as an extension of Jewish theology, hope, and expectation. It is there, I believe!

What becomes of those who "went into the ovens" without this? I'll let the Judge who tries the individual cases sort through the particulars and render His verdicts. In my case, however, I want a nice Jewish lawyer advocating for me at the Judge's bench. The fact that my lawyer (Jesus) is related to the Judge (God) suits me just fine! I say that those who want Moses to represent them, instead, should attend to the issues Moses raised in his writings; issues that you say are too-often ignored in classical Judaism. The need for sacrifice and priest is an essential element in Moses, much as it is in the Gospel.

Did I shed any "light"? I hope this helped. For my money, for these and

other reasons, Moses' light leads to Jesus' light.

Whether or not you agree with my answers, I appreciate that you care enough to raise the questions, and wish you the best in your search.

Dear Dr. Seif,

Thank you so much for your reply. I think you are approaching what I am looking for—and I will attempt to state it here along with my understanding of the universe.

In the beginning, God provided a way to atone for the sin of Adam and *Chavah* (Eve) through the blood of an animal. Since then, humankind, with limited understanding, has been trying to develop atonement theology.

Historically, we were brought out of Egypt as a new nation, needing instructions in order to be a holy people before God, so God gave us Torah through Moses. This was, and is, the plumb line to which everything needs to line up. The Torah gave us instructions for atonement and sacrifice. Since we didn't quite catch on to God's plan, He sent us the Prophets and Writings, during which period, and still not getting it, we ended up exiled in Babylon where Messianic hope and theology began to develop.

Jumping forward a few hundred years, we find Yeshua telling Nicodemus he must be born again through *mikvah* (water) and *Ruach Kodesh* (God's Spirit). Yeshua's answers to the questions of the times always point back to the plumb line, Torah.

A couple hundred years later, we come to the Council of Nicea (325 A.D.) and the formal break of Christianity with Judaism. For the past 1,800 years, Christians have been developing theologies based on New Testament writings and almost completely ignoring the Hebrew Scriptures.

Two overriding problems with modern Christian thought are: 1) it interprets Torah and the Hebrew Scriptures through New Testament writings and modern interpretations of those writings, forgetting that Torah is the plumb line and everything should be interpreted through Torah. And, 2) its explanations of atonement theology exclude a direct Torah (plumb line)-based reference.

To me, as a Jew, there is a huge disconnect here. As Adam was sinless when he first sinned, so must the perfect atonement be sinless in order to restore the world. Ritual sacrifice was an imperfect replacement for the perfect sacrifice to come. Just as Adam's sin put the world into darkness, so too should the perfect atonement put the world back into the light.

I say all this to show that it is not a matter of whether one believes it or not. Truth is truth and untruth is untruth regardless of what we believe. Therefore, if Yeshua is that perfect atonement, then the blood has been spilled and painted on the doorposts of the world for all time. As a Jew, I see another disconnect between Torah teaching and the common Christian teaching of, "Say the prayer and you're in." To me, this disagrees with both the requirements of Torah and the teachings of Yeshua.

My struggle, then, is twofold. The first is that one doesn't have to believe in

the sin of Adam for it to affect the world and the individual; so it should not take belief in the atonement of Yeshua for it to affect the world or the individual, except for the requirements of Torah. The second struggle is getting clear Torah-based answers that connect New Testament writings instead of the other way around. For me as a Jew to accept Yeshua in the Christian way, there needs to be some movement in these areas.

One more question: If God has hardened our hearts, as the New Testament says, is He not responsible to provide for our salvation?

How I think we differ

Greetings A.D.—

Though I thank you for granting that I may be "approaching what you are looking for," I do not presume to know what that is—given that our heart's intents can be secretive, even from ourselves. From what you have written, however, I observe that you have invested an inordinate amount of energy, working with and through these matters, and this prompts me to conclude that your weighty and impressive questions reflect the inquiries of a fellow who cares about these matters more than most. Wow! Compliments aside, let me note how I think we differ.

Your most recent correspondence picks up with what I believe is a mistaken, universalistic "atonement theology." Though I am genuinely impressed by your narrative's development, I do not believe God has waved a "magic wand" over humankind and thereby inculcated forgiveness into humankind. I believe the means has been provided, but the acquisition is predicated, to a certain degree, upon our affirmative response to Him, which begins with that "prayer" that you took issue with. Secondly, though you and I—and erudite Jewish historians and theologians, generally—observe that "Messianic hope" surfaced explicitly in and around the Babylonian captivity, I think it is

mistaken to assert that it began there. I believe that Messianic theology is rooted early in Moses' writings where, (1) with the problem of sin's entrance came the possibility of redemption and covering, and (2) with the advent of Moses' liturgical system came an institutionalized vision for sacrifice that presages the Messiah's ultimate sacrifice. These, and others, strike me as markers pointing ahead to a future redemption, one that finds expressions more fully in the person of God's Agent, the Messiah. In this sense, Jesus wasn't just a Jew pointing back to Torah—as you so aptly state (and I agree with you) -but, more than that, He is argued to be the object of the Torah, which pointed ahead to Him.

How the Jesus and Messianic faith got so disconnected from the Church makes for a troublesome, but interesting study. Should you be interested, might I suggest you acquire a book I wrote, published by University Press of America, entitled: The Evolution of a Revolution: Reflections on Ancient Christianity in its Judaistic, Romanistic and Hellenistic Expressions? You might find it helpful, as I explore the strange rift. (Or, if you contact me in the fall, I'll get you a copy of a lecture I am giving this summer at the Union of Messianic Jewish Congregations conference on the subject.)

With you A.D., I acknowledge problems with imposing non-Jewish eyes and sentiments on biblical interpretations. But, because I view the New Testament itself as a Jewish book, I do not have a problem interpreting the Torah with New Testament lenses, believing that it offers a better telling than rabbinical Judaism, which, among other things, obscures and/or ignores the aforementioned mandates for sacrifice.

Getting "in" by simply saying "the prayer" sounds problematic, I grant. I am more inclined to believe that the prayer is a reflection of one's "entering in." Consider that all of life's adventures begin with a first step. The first step in marriage isn't when the rabbi pronounces "husband and wife," but

more when the parties give voice to their intention. That intentionality is the necessary precondition, the first step—when they go "in" and toward the new future; the ceremony merely ratifies it. In much the same way, the "sinners prayer"—which I suggest you and all men pray—is the necessary "knock on the door" to get back into the garden. It is when we admit to ourselves, never mind to God, what we already know—that we are sinners; that sin separates us from Him; and that we want that problem remedied so we might walk with Him, as with Adam at the beginning—and reach up to Him, according to the Scriptures, that we experience a regeneration through the means by which He provided it—the Messiah.

You close by commenting on a passage where a rabbi named Paul noted there being a veil that lies on some Jewish eyes and a consequential blinding and/or a "hardening of the hearts." While I grant that that sounds patently offensive, I still can't help but wonder how a system of thought could develop that obscures the obvious, and reduces Jewish faith and practice to a form of observance that is disconnected from Mosaic literature, though reverential toward it.

Furthermore, I believe that "Look,"the Message being delivthey just ered with assorted signs and wonders-miracles!don't get should itself have underscored its veracity. For these reasons, I construe that a frustrated Paul said, in effect, "Look, they just don't get it. They don't want to get it!" But not for the reasons you stated. At issue back then wasn't Jews becoming non-Jewish in their thinking and being; rather, at issue in the Jewish book called the New Testament was some of them lacking a willingness to respond to the fulfillment of Jewish hopes and expectations.

That's how Seif understands the world. Blessings, —Jeffrey Seif

The Valley of Decision

The Valley of Decision

Before his death, Yehoshua (Joshua), the great successor of Moses, assembled the people of Israel together at Shechem for his final speech.

Shechem was near Mt. Gerizim and Mt. Ebal, the place where the LORD unconditionally promised Abraham the Land of Israel (Gen. 12:6-7). It was also the place where Joseph was abducted (and later buried), and where the "blessings and curses" were recited after Yehoshua led the Israelites back to the Promised Land (Deut. 27:12-29:1, Josh. 8:30-5).

Since the people who gathered at Shechem did not directly experience the giving of the Torah at Sinai (as their ancestors who died in the wilderness had), Yehoshua inscribed large stones with the words of the Torah written on them and built an altar at the foot of the mountain (just as Moses had done at Sinai). After offering sacrifices, six tribes stood on Mt. Gerizim, representing the blessings, and the other six tribes stood on Mt. Ebal, representing the curses. The Kohanim and the Levites, along with the Ark of the Covenant, stood in the valley in between. The Levites then proclaimed curses on those who performed various sins (such as idolatry) and blessings on those who obeyed the LORD. All of the twelve tribes were to respond to each blessing and curse with "Amen."

Undoubtedly Yehoshua did this to re-enact the Sinai experience for those who would dwell in the Promised Land.

Yehoshua's final speech reminded the Israelites how the LORD vanquished all their enemies and overthrew all the so-called gods of the nations on their behalf. He passionately warned them to abstain from any hint of idolatry and to fear the LORD in sincerity and faithfulness. Yehoshua finally asked the people to *make a decision*—either to vainly serve idols or to serve the LORD alone.

Paradoxically, we are forced to freely choose whether to live as a *tzaddik* (righteous person of faith) or as a *rasha* (idolatrous person of unbelief)—and we cannot not choose! All of us have ultimate concerns and values, but if we spurn faithful submission to the LORD, we will invariably be consigned to a life based on the *yetzer hara* (the natural state of the soul) and self-serving idolatry.

Will we serve the LORD or spurn His commandments in favor of our own selfish lusts? Each of us must make up our own mind and "choose this day whom we will serve."

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Jews Welcome France's New President

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The French Jewish umbrella organization CRIF has hailed the election of Nicolas Sarkozy as the new president of France as a positive sign. Sarkozy, of the ruling Union for a Popular Movement (UMP), defeated Socialist Party candidate Ségolène Royal in the second-round runoff by 53% to 47%, with a record turnout of 86%. The former interior minister is seen by Jewish organizations as a friend to Israel and an important figure in the fight against anti-Semitism.

CRIF president Roger Cukierman said in a letter of congratulation to Sarkozy: "Your position statements during the electoral campaign carry much hope for a France that needs to be reconciled with itself. I was touched by what you said, and I understand that you intend to be a standard bearer of the French values we so cherish, those of a republic that allows each of its citizens to find his and her place in a framework of values that respect every individual and leave no room for intolerance, racism, and anti-Semitism." Political expert Frederic Encel called Sarkozy "by far the most pro-Israeli French presidential figure Israel could have hoped for." Encel said Sarkozy's campaign speeches, political program, and advisers will mean a more balanced approach on Israel.

You never know what Divine appointment awaits on the streets of Israel.




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


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
