The Evil that Israel Faces

French President Francois Hollande recently stressed that Europe will take steps to get Israel and the Palestinians back to the negotiating table. "We shall make sure that both the United States and Europe can support the revival of negotiations that can lead to a two-state solution," Hollande told reporters.

The international community has clearly lost sight of the very nature of the struggle in which Israel finds itself, one that pits it against a foe that is bent on Israel's destruction.

Despite Israeli concessions since the 1993 Oslo accords, the Palestinians have refused to forsake violence and intimidation; neither have they shown a willingness to make even minimal compromises in order to forge a final agreement.

This is not a battle over borders, but a clash of civilizations.

ing, but the news media ignored a report by FreedomHouse.org, an independent watchdog group dedicated to the expansion of freedom around the world, that rated Israel as the only free country in the Middle East.

In the 2013 edition of its annual report, *Freedom in the World,* the organization wrote:

Israel remains the region's only Free country. In recent years, controversies have surrounded proposed laws that threatened freedom of expression and the rights of civil society

March 11th marked the second anniversary of one of the most brutal Palestinian terror attacks in the region's history. **Hakim Awad** and **Amjad Awad** (below) slaughtered five members of the Fogel family in

the Jewish community of Itamar.

With chilling cruelty, the two perpetrators went from room to room, slashing the throats of Ruth and Udi Fogel and three of their children: Yoav (11), Elad (4), and three-month-old Hadas.



After their capture, the two terrorists expressed no remorse for their actions, saying that had they known that two other children had been sleeping in the Fogel home at the time, they would have murdered them as well.

Many Palestinians reacted with sheer joy to news of the massacre, as though their team had just won the World Cup. Thirty-two percent of Palestinians said

they supported this despicable act of murder.

The slaughter in Itamar, like the bus bombings, rocket attacks, and kidnapping of soldiers throughout the years, says a lot about Palestinian society and its leadership, that it countenanced such behavior and continues to laud the perpetrators of such terror as heroes.



Clearly, these are not people with whom a lasting agreement can be forged, however much Israel or the international community might wish it.

It is time to drop the delusion that has underpinned the peace process all these years and admit the obvious: the Palestinians do not truly wish to live in peace with Israel. They have had ample opportunity to do so, but have rejected every offer, even the most generous, with nary a bit of compunction or regret.

What the world fails to grasp is that the key to peace lies not in removing Jews from their homes, but rather in uprooting delusions of possible victory from the hearts of Palestinians. As long as they continue to think that the Jewish presence in the Middle East is temporary and that time and international backing is on their side, Israel's foes will press forward with their aggressive intentions, employing violence and terror to achieve their goals.

This type of malevolence cannot be negotiated with, nor can reason prevail over it. Confronted by such enmity, Israel does not dare to empower it still further by yielding to its demands. The evil we face must be opposed, not appeased.

organizations. In most cases, however, these measures have either been quashed by the government or parliament, or struck down by the Supreme Court.

In other words, Israel's democracy works. By contrast, both Gaza, under Hamas, and the West Bank, under the Palestinian Authority were rated "Not Free," as was Jordan. Lebanon and Egypt ranked as merely "Partly Free." In a section called "Worst of the Worst," Freedom House cited three of Israel's neighbors: Sudan, "ruled by a leadership that has elements of both radical Islamism and a traditional military junta," Saudi Arabia, "an absolute monarchy with severe social controls," and Syria, "a dictatorship in the midst of a bloody civil war."

If you look at a map of world freedom, you have to enlarge it quite a bit to see the sliver of green freedom that is Israel in the sea of yellow ("partly free") and purple ("not free") that is the Middle East and North Africa.

Given the hyper-focus on Israel by the press, one might expect news outlets to at least mention this positive evaluation of the Jewish State. However, although Israeli and Jewish outlets reported the Freedom House study,

CAMERA could not locate any mainstream news media that covered it. More embarrassing still, even Egypt's *Daily News* wrote: Egypt is now one of six countries in the Middle East that is classified by Freedom House as "partly free." Eleven are classed as "not free," while Israel is the region's only "free" country.

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The Dry Bones

Ezekiel 37 represents one of the most striking visions and clear fulfillments to be found in the Bible. Some prophecies elude us in their subtlety or raise controversies among interpreters. Others are yet to be fulfilled, so we cannot know if a point of view is correct. But God Himself explains the vision of the Valley of the Dry Bones within the chapter; its fulfillment—the restoration of the Jewish nation to the land of Israel—is abundantly clear to all who live today. The chapter begins with Ezekiel faithfully reporting his arcane vision in which he was taken to preach in a valley of dead, bleached bones.

God bids Ezekiel, "Prophesy upon these bones and say unto them, 'O ye dry bones, hear the word of the Lord."

Some preachers complain about speaking to dead audiences!


Ezekiel does as he is told and the bones gather themselves into human bodies, "but there was no breath in them." At the end of the vision, God tells Ezekiel, "Prophesy unto the wind...and breathe upon these slain, that they may live." The wind (the Holy Spirit) throughout the Bible provides true life to human beings dead in their sins. God breathed upon Adam to make him live; the Lord breathed the Holy Spirit on His disciples, and the Holy Spirit Himself described that great day of Pentecost as "a rushing, mighty wind" (Acts 2:2).

GOD'S EXPLANATION

In Ezekiel 37:11–14, God gives the complete explanation of the confounding vision, saying, "These bones are the whole house of Israel... and I shall place you in your own land."

The vision was of a future event, after some great dispersion of the Jewish people out of the land. This is clear from various phrases in the ensuing chapters. This is no small regathering of the people in exile, such as the return from Babylon,

but rather a worldwide, latter-day restoration. It is spoken of by many other prophets, and the language – "It shall be in the latter days" (Ezekiel 38:16)—identifies the time with certainty.

Chapter 37 also explains the sign of the two sticks, wherein Ezekiel realizes that Israel and Judah will be made one again (37:16–17), a fact which the exiled prophet of Judah could not have appreciated from his viewpoint in Babylon. The northern 10 tribes of Israel had been deported by Assyria better than a century before his lifetime, and they are still referred to as "lost tribes," even though they were never lost (the NT Book of James is addressed to "the Twelve Tribes").

God continues His explanation of Ezekiel's vision all the way to the coming of the Kingdom to Israel and the reign of the Messiah (37:24–25). He even takes the opportunity to certify that His Temple will be rebuilt in the Millennium and that the whole world will know Him (37:27–28).

Israelis are convinced of this prophecy; few Bible students quibble about its meaning. An occasional Mormon will claim that the two sticks represent the Bible and the Book of Mormon, but their meaning is most plain in God's explanation of the vision.

Please also read "Ten Lost Tribes: Found" on page 33. I use its premise to correct congregational folks who are in danger of being swept up in the "two sticks" heresy that tries to identify all Believers as lost Jews. While there are communities of genuine Jews around the world reuniting with their Jewish brothers, there is no magical "missing tribe" of spiritual Believers in Western churches. -Myles

Temples Come and Go... and Come Again!


The Temple Mount may be the center of the universe. It is ground zero for the coming rule of Messiah. According to the B'rit Hadashah (NT), Yeshua will return to the nearby Mount of Olives; the prophet Ezekiel predicts that the glory of God will re-enter the Temple through the Golden Gate / Messiah's Gate / Eastern Gate.

There is no more-contested piece of real estate in the world than the small nation of Israel. In that land, the hot spot is the Temple Mount, and the searing white-hot place is the Western Wall, because it is closest to "HaMakom" (Hebrew for THE Place), the Holy of Holies of the former Temple.

Ironically, Islam-which continually tries to erase the Jewish history of Jerusalem and Israel-draws much of its lore and foundational teaching from Jewish ancestors. However, along with its historical debt to Judaism, Islam has continually tried to block the inevitable: the Messianic promises connected with the area and the coming, rebuilt Third Temple.

The Ottoman sultan Suleiman the Magnificent sealed the Golden Gate in 1541. Jewish tradition claims that the Messiah will enter Jerusalem through this gate. Scholars agree that Suleiman sealed the Golden Gate to prevent the Messiah's entrance. The Muslims also built a cemetery in front of the gate. This was to stop Elijah, the forerunner to Messiah, from passing through the Golden Gate.

The action was based on Jewish tradition: According to Islamic teaching, Elijah is a descendant of Aaron, and thus a priest (a kohen). Since Jewish priests are not permitted to enter a cemetery, Elijah would be stopped. However, this premise is weak because a kohen is permitted to enter a non-Jewish cemetery.



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Temples: Myles continues



Approximately 150 years ago, British archaeologist Charles Warren excavated layers of red earth containing shards dating from the First Temple period. The first *lamelekh* ("to the king") ring seals found in Israel were discovered in this red earth. These are official seals embossed on the handles of jugs from the time of King Hezekiah (8th century BC). Based on the information gathered by Warren, the site represents a rare point of contact between Second

Temple-period construction and earlier ruins from the First Temple period.

The grounds are full of historical artifacts. The Muslim cemeteries cause political tussling and highly charged negotiations. ZLM cooperates with the Israel Antiquities Authority to sift through the rubble that is painstakingly revealed. Just last summer, one of our pilgrims found a 2nd century BC coin! *(Levitt Letter, Aug. '12, p. 15)* I will never forget the jubilation on the face of the attending archaeologist. It was a significant find, further validating the historical authenticity of Jewish presence on the Mount. The Gospel is going around the world. The fullness of time is upon us. The return of the Lord is very near.

Our saying "From Golden Gate to Golden Gate" describes the ends of the Earth: from the San Francisco Bay to the Temple's Golden Gate. Several months ago, Katharine and I stood between the graves and the Gate and prayed, "Even so, come, Lord Yeshua!" (Rev. 22:20).

On the road to Emmaus, Yeshua revealed Himself to His disciples and left us a template for opening the eyes of His Jewish brethren today. It is a 7-mile journey from Jerusalem to Emmaus, but for the two students it was a slow, morose walk. They talked together about everything that had recently happened in Jerusalem (Luke 24:13-14).

24:15 As they talked and discussed, Yeshua himself came up and walked along with them, **16** but something kept them from recognizing him. **17** He asked them, "What are you talking about with each other as you walk along?" They stopped short, their faces downcast; 18 and one of them, named Cleopas, answered him, "Are you the only visitor to Yerushalayim who doesn't know the things that have been going on there the last few days?"

They recounted to Him the events regarding His own arrest and crucifixion and the miracle of His apparent resurrection. In their own words, they tied His deeds to prophetic promises and His authority with God and man. The disciples despairingly confessed their hope that He had been the redeemer of Israel.

As only He can do, Yeshua completely surprised them!


25 He said to them, "Foolish people! So unwilling to put your trust in everything the prophets spoke! 26 Didn't the Messiah have to die like this before entering his glory?" 27 Then, starting with Moses and all the prophets, he explained to them the things that can be found throughout the Tanach (OT) concerning himself.

As I read this, I asked the Lord, "How did You reveal Yourself to Moses and the prophets?" With further study, I found that the person and work of Messiah is in

each of the 39 books of the *Tanach*. This is where His Jewish brethren can find Him.

In Genesis, He is the seed of the woman. In Exodus, He is the Passover Lamb. In Leviticus, He is our High Priest. In Numbers, He is the glory of God who takes us through the wilderness. In Deuteronomy, He is the living Word.


The New Testament (B'rit Hadashah) **confirms each aspect:**

- Galatians 4:4 tells us of the fullness of time when God sent forth His Son, made of a woman.
- Paul tells us that He is our Passover Lamb (1 Corinthians 5:7).
- According to the writer of Hebrews, Jesus is our High Priest who intercedes forever for us (Hebrews 6:20).
- Like the Israelites in the desert, we can look to Yeshua for supernatural provision on our journey (Matthew 6:11).
- John begins his gospel by telling us, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God!"

David Hartman *(shown below)*, rabbi, author, and innovative Jewish teacher passed into eternity at the age of 81, earlier this year. He was an American Jew, born into a poor, ultra-Orthodox family in Brooklyn, New York.

In 1971, Hartman emigrated to Israel, and established the Shalom Hartman Institute in Jerusalem, an educational center with remarkably broad appeal to many segments of the Jewish community—both religious and secular. His creative approach to Jewish life—seeking to integrate modern concepts of personal liberty with a love for Torah touched both disillusioned *yeshiva* (religious school) students and IDF (military) officers.

Hartman drew from the works of Maimonides, Rabbi Joseph Soloveitchik, Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel, and Rabbi Mordechai Kaplan. Each of these men emphasized the need to integrate biblical revelation with the forward movement of scientific discovery. As a rabbi speaking to the modern challenges of Israel, David Hartman became known for his intellectual honesty, his humor, his understanding of people and their relationships, his passion, his tolerance, and his spontaneity. He

refused to be shaped by existing molds, but charted new territory with admirable energy and vision.

Why is Rabbi Hartman's life relevant to us, followers of Yeshua? I believe that his dedication brings us fresh inspiration. We are called by authors in the New Covenant to rise up and change the worn out, failed solutions of our civilization. "If anyone is in Messiah, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new" (2 Corinthians 5:17). "Then He who sat on the throne said 'Behold, I make all things new'" (Rev. 21:5). We have been given a new song (Psalm 96:1) and are exhorted to overcome evil with good (Romans 12:21).

Here are some quotes from Hartman.

Especially as a resident of Israel for the past twenty years, I find them salty and energizing.

"Love of Israel is not love of the land; it's love of the people living in the land."

"I want to return the Torah to the Labor Party (note: a liberal, secular Israeli political party), to the entire people of

> Israel. I don't want religion to be the private property of certain people. I don't want the length of the sidelocks to be the determining factor."

"Even though it drains my energy and I am weak— Israel is the place. If we can't make it here, we can't make it anywhere."

David Hartman was indeed a man of the heart. May we all live from the heart—a heart for the God of Israel, for His Messiah, and for the full redemption of *Am Yisrael*, the people of Israel.



Islamic Cleric Rapes and Kills 5-Year-Old Daughter

In Saudi Arabia, an Islamic cleric who admits to raping, torturing, and killing his daughter received a fine for his heinous crime. Saudi media report that the father paid \$50,000 in "blood money" for his crime, but was not required to serve any time in prison.

Fayhan al-Ghamdi, *(top right)* a popular Islamic preacher who has made numerous television appearances promoting Islam, confessed to the crime. Reports indicate that he had doubted his five-year-old daughter's virginity. (His crime was so brutal that we will not describe it here. –Editor.)



Lama al-Ghamdi died last October. The amount her father was fined

for the brutal rape, torture, and murder would have been doubled if Lama had been male. In Saudi Arabia, Islamic law is interpreted to mean that a father cannot be executed for murdering his children, nor can husbands be executed for murdering their wives.

Human rights activists point out that judicial leniency towards male abusers

and murderers reflects the highly

problematic nature of the male guardianship system in Saudi Arabia. Currently all women in Saudi Arabia are considered minors, and all are automatically assigned to the care and judgment of their most immediate male relative. This system of male guardianship gives the male relatives the power to sell girls legally into child marriages and to ban adult women from work, travel, and obtaining medical operations.

Burkas to Stop Baby Girls from Tempting Muslim Men

A Saudi cleric has called for all female babies to be fully covered by wearing the face and body veil, commonly known as the burka, citing reports of little girls being sexually molested.

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In a TV interview on the Islamic al-Majd TV, Sheik Abdullah Daoud stressed that wearing the veil will protect baby girls. The sheik backed his assertion with claims of sexual molestation against babies in the kingdom, quoting unnamed medical and security sources.

When will Gog and Magog attack Israel? (Ezekiel 38:18–23)

The war of Gog and Magog will occur prior to the sevenyear Tribulation, since Israel will be burying bodies for a seven-year period (Ezekiel 39:9). This kind of activity will not happen during the 1,000-year Kingdom of Messiah, which will commence after the Tribulation concludes. Ezekiel says that this battle will occur in the Last Days when all of the nations of Ezekiel 38:1–6 are aligned—which they are today!

How many biblical covenants are there?-Godcovenants, not man-to-man covenants.

The Bible reveals eight covenants that God made with mankind:

- The Edenic Covenant (Genesis 1:28–30; 2:15–17)
- (2) The Adamic Covenant (Genesis 3:14–19)
- (3) The Noahic Covenant (Genesis 8:20–9:17)
- (4) The Abrahamic Covenant (Genesis 12:1–3)
- (5) The Mosaic Covenant (Exodus 19–24; Deut. and Leviticus)
- (6) The Davidic Covenant (2 Samuel 7:4–17)
- (7) The Land of Israel Covenant (Genesis 17:7–8; Deut. 30:1–10)
- (8) The New Covenant
 (Jeremiah 31:31–37; Matt. 26:27,28
 2 Corinthians 3:6)


Or Construction I have heard that the year, the month, and the date of the restoration of Jerusalem in 1967 was prophesied by three Old Testament prophets. Two of them were Ezekiel and Haggai. Who was the third prophet? And could you cite the verses?

A 3 Such claims are too obscure to be valid. However, we have he clear prophecies that Israel is restored in the Last Days and we can look to them for assurance that God keeps and fulfills His Word to Israel (Isaiah 11:11–12; 49; Ezekiel 36–37; Amos 9:14–15).

I always believed that Israel is "the chosen" nation/people of God. But doesn't Eph. 3:6 void that premise? Are not the "chosen ones" of the New Covenant those who choose to receive the offering that is Christ?

While it is true that the redeemed of the Church are God's "chosen" in the present Age, Ephesians 3:6 in no way teaches that Israel has been cast aside in favor of the Church. This is the erroneous premise of Replacement Theology.

God chose the Jews as His people forever and will never cast them away a truth throughout Scripture (Is. 49:15; Jeremiah 31:35–37; Romans 11:1). And that is all there is to that! Gentiles (non-Jews) have been "grafted in" to the salvific blessings that Israel enjoys and that is the point of passages like Ephesians 3:6. God has not "unchosen" Israel in the process of choosing the gentiles. As Scripture says, God forbid!




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One Hungry Heart After Another / by robert williams

How Christians Lose Credibility with Israelis

The reaction last November seems to be the reaction whenever a flare-up occurs between Israel and its neighbors: "What is happening in Gaza is a vicious circle of violence," William Shomali, the vicargeneral of the Latin Patriarchate of Jerusalem, told Vatican Radio. "It's difficult to know who started it."

It's as if Israel's leaders woke up one day and decided to kill Palestinians! No mention was made by him or other Church officials of the countless Hamas rocket attacks on Israeli communities that prompted the punishing air strikes on Gaza. Naturally, this "Christian" response sparked outrage among Israelis. For them, Christians are uninterested in Jewish suffering and Israel's right of self-defense. "When there's conflict, it's always our fault," a taxi driver remarked. "But even when it's quiet we don't get any support." To Jews, those who speak for the Catholic Church speak for all Christians. In private conversations, you repeatedly hear the opinion that Christians will never change, that they will always hate the Jews.

A headline on Israeli website Arutz 7 read, "The Vatican on Gaza: Israel is a Baby Killer." Another article said that for the Vatican, the babies of Israel's rocket-battered southern town of Sderot are not even worth mentioning.

Israel's blockade of Gaza is aimed at preventing weapons-smuggling to Hamas. But the former Latin Patriarch of Jerusalem, Palestinian Michel Sabbah, told the Vatican News Agency that it's an "absurd embargo which makes the daily lives of a million and a half people inhumane." Sabbah joined with more than 100 Christian leaders in an appeal to the international community to recognize Palestine as a full member of the United Nations. Among those signing the petition was Greek Orthodox Archbishop Atallah Hanna, an Israeli Arab who supports Palestinian suicide bombings as legitimate acts of "resistance" to the "occupation."

The Vatican was silent about the rocket barrages that preceded the Israeli offensive. It was only after Israel began



attacking the rocket launching sites and other terrorist infrastructure that Pope Benedict himself and other senior Church officials loudly condemned the violence.

"During the Cast Lead operation in 2009, Vatican officials called Gaza 'a concentration camp," the Arutz 7 article noted. "After the Nazi comparison did its work, the Jesus-killer motif has now returned to the Catholic Church." For Israelis, such comments by the Vatican send a clear message that Christians are opposed to a Jewish state. There is no differentiation between Catholics and Protestants; from an Israeli point of view, they are speaking for all Christians.

Many Israelis are unaware of the worldwide support for Israel among born-again Christians who stand on God's Word and promises to the Jewish people. Negative statements against Israel by senior clergy are reminiscent of Church history and cause all Christians to lose credibility in the eyes of the Jews. And once lost, such credibility is difficult to win back.

The Weapon of Praise

"I call upon the LORD, who is worthy to be praised, and I am saved from my enemies." (Psalm 18:3)

When you are feeling oppressed or otherwise troubled, use the "weapon of praise." Satan and the powers of darkness simply cannot stand before someone who is offering up sincere thanks to God in anticipation of their personal deliverance.

Calling upon the LORD means more than simply keeping a positive attitude, though having a positive attitude (i.e., hope) and using *ayin tovah* (a good eye) is surely part of the arsenal we use to "fight the good fight of faith." Victory over the dark powers comes through verbally affirming (confessing) our faith in God's Presence and trusting in the deliverance given in Yeshua our Savior (Rom. 10:9). We must repent of our attitude of defeat and **believe** in the victory: **As we call** upon the LORD **so are we** delivered from our enemies.

It is written that the LORD is "enthroned among the praises of His people" (Psalm 22:3), and therefore offering earnest praise is our direct line to the Divine Presence. Praising the LORD also causes the power of the Evil One to be cut off, his eyes blinded, and his malice thwarted. For example, when Israel went to battle, the *shofar* (ram's horn) was sounded and great cries of praise went up to Heaven. "So on they went, ahead of the army chanting, *hodu ladonai, ki leolam chasdo* — 'Praise the Lord, for His mercy endures forever!'" And the scripture says, "... when they began to sing and to praise, the LORD set an ambush against the children of Ammon, Moab, and Mount Seir, who had come against Judah; and they were routed" (2 Chron. 20:22). Our victory over darkness is found in praise and hope, even when we are tested in the midst of the battle. Friends, use the weapon of praise!

Praise God **despite** your present difficulties by anticipating good to come: "Though the fig tree does not blossom, nor fruit be found on the vines, though the produce of the olive fails and the fields yield no food, and though the flock be cut off from the fold and there be no herd in the stalls, yet **I will rejoice** in the LORD; **I will take joy** in the God of my salvation" (Hab. 3:17–18). Augustine renders the phrase "God of

my Salvation" (Elohei Yishi) as "God my Jesus," since "Jesus" (i.e., Yeshua) literally means YHWH saves. Always remember that we never fight for, but always from, the place of His victory. The joy of the LORD is our strength, and we find that strength in Yeshua, our risen and victorious Savior.



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



Small selfless acts between spouses aren't just nice – they also are necessary, experts say. When you are compassionate to your spouse, it increases your own happiness at least as much as the other person's. if you take my needs into account' path to relationship improvement is guaranteed to fail," he says.

10 Marriage Sweeteners—ways couples can show "compassionate" love to improve a relationship:

- Put your spouse's goals first.
- Try to understand your spouse's thoughts and feelings.
- Accept, don't judge.
- Be open to your spouse's requests.
- Modify your plans for your spouse's sake.
- Do something special for your spouse.
- Express tenderness and caring.
- Go out of your way to "be there."
- Show respect and admiration.
- Show that you value your spouse. Two words: Thank you.


Apocrypha

Strawberry Leaves' Israell Substance Helps Protect Crops Israeli Advances in Science & Medicine

A novel, environmentally friendly agent that naturally controls fungus and bacteria in agriculture has been developed by the Yissum Research Development Company of the Hebrew University of Jerusalem. The new biocontrol method for protecting plants from pathogens uses yeast isolated from strawberry leaves, is non-toxic, and effective for a large variety of plants.

Agriculture depends heavily on the use of pesticides to increase crop yield. But the widespread use of chemical pesticides has resulted in severe environmental pollution, and many pathogens are developing resistance to the chemicals. In addition, many pesticides are now banned for use, and organic farming may not

rely on such substances at all. A major goal, therefore, is to develop new, environmentally friendly tools to control pathogens.

Now, Yissum's new biocontrol agent, based on naturally occurring fungi, not only boosts the plants' resistance to infestations but also





enhances growth. The agent was developed by Dr. Maggie Levy from the university's Department of Plant Pathology and Microbiology.

Early Detection of Breast Cancer

Researchers at the Hebrew University's Institute of Medical Research Israel-Canada (IMRIC) have discovered a new mechanism by which breast cancer cells switch on their aggressive cancerous behavior. The discovery provides a valuable marker for the early diagnosis and follow-up treatment of malignant growths.



In a study published in the online edition of *Cell Reports,* conducted by doctoral student **Vered Ben-Hur** (*l*) in the lab of **Dr. Rotem Karni** (*r*) at IMRIC, the researchers found that breast cancer cells change the alternative splicing of an important enzyme, called S6K1, which is a protein involved in the transmission of information into the cell.

When this happens, breast cancer cells start to produce shorter versions of this enzyme and these shorter versions transmit signals ordering the cells to grow, proliferate, survive, and invade other tissues.

On the other hand, the researchers found that the long form of this protein acts as a tumor suppressor that protects normal cells from becoming cancerous.

There are several medical implications emanating from the research, say the researchers. One is the use of the newly discovered short forms of S6K1 as a diagnostic marker for the detection of breast cancer. Several new anticancer drugs can inhibit the cancerous activity of the short forms of S6K1. Thus, the detection of these new forms can predict the efficacy of these drugs to treat cancer patients.

Good News for Knees

In a groundbreaking advance, a novel Israeli implant provides a scaffold for the body to regenerate true joint-protecting cartilage.

If you get a cut, break a bone, or scrape an elbow, your bloodstream brings the injury all the necessary nutrients for healing. But if your cartilage gets damaged, you're out of luck. This flexible soft tissue that cushions joints—especially in the knee—has no blood vessels and therefore little ability to heal itself.


However, an Israeli medical device company is now offering a safe and effective, off-the-shelf cartilage regeneration solution. CartiHeal's trademarked Agili-C can be implanted in a single-step arthroscopic procedure. In clinical studies, it was shown to regenerate true hyaline cartilage (the most abundant type of cartilage in the human body) after six months.

Founder and CEO Nir Altschuler says that this is a breakthrough in the field—the "Holy Grail" in orthopedics—because other experimental treatments generate only "hyaline-like" cartilage, which is actually a non-lasting fibrous tissue rather than the real deal.

"Our clinical results, to date, confirm rapid cartilage and bone formation, as clearly visible on MRIs and X-rays," says Altschuler. "Patients are reporting significant improvement in pain level and return to normal function, including sports."

The implant has earned the European Union's CE Mark of approval, and the company is currently running post-marketing clinical studies at leading centers in Europe.

Cartilage can't repair itself

There are approximately 1.2 million cartilage repair procedures performed annually worldwide, and these surgeries mainly aim for pain relief since it hasn't been possible until now to regenerate true hyaline cartilage.


Altschuler says Agili-C has the potential to heal the problem at an early stage and halt further joint degeneration. Therefore, it might have the potential to prevent the need for more radical procedures, such as knee replacement, down the road.

The implant provides a scaffold that enables stem cells to climb up from the bone marrow, form vessels within the scaffold, and regenerate tissue, Altschuler explains.

Within a few months, the top layer becomes cartilage while the bottom layer becomes bone—each identical to the body's own tissues. The regenerated cells gradually dissolve the implanted scaffold and the joints are nearly as good as normal.

The first patient to receive Agili-C was a 47-year-old Slovenian man, a former athlete whose knee cartilage was damaged due to a volleyball injury six years before the June 2011 surgery. Unable to enjoy sports, he suffered on and off from knee swelling and pain.

Six months after receiving the Agili-C implant, the patient was on the ski slopes. A year from his surgery, he completed a 180K cycling marathon, according to company officials.

Iran Unveils Finger Amputating Machine By Phoebe Greenwood / Telegraph.co.uk

Photographs appearing to show a blindfolded man having his fingers severed by a mechanical amputation device have been published by an official Iranian press agency.

According to the ISNA news service, the prisoner used to demonstrate the brutal contraption had been convicted of theft and adultery by a court in Shiraz the previous week.

A series of pictures showed three masked officials, clad entirely in black, holding the man's right hand in a vice while one turns a wheel operating the guillotine in the manner of a rotary saw. In none of the four closely cropped images does the bearded prisoner's expression register pain, suggesting that he may have been drugged.

The Iranian government's deplorable human rights record has been well documented. Public executions (including death by stoning) and torture (including flogging and amputation) are routine.



Elbit said its C-MUSIC system proved effective a number of times in protecting a Boeing 707 aircraft.

In 2002, militants fired two surface-toair missiles at an Israeli charter plane shortly after takeoff in Mombasa, Kenya. The missiles missed their target but spurred an Israeli effort to improve countermeasures.

Elbit says the new system can be applied to any aircraft. It says it integrates advanced fiber laser technology with a thermal camera to protect against missiles fired from the ground.

Middle East Mustaches By Tim Hume / CNN.com

Thick, handsome mustaches have long been prized by men throughout the Middle East as symbols of masculine virility, wisdom, and maturity.


Turkish plastic surgeon Selahattin Tulunay and Pierre Bouhanna, a Parisbased surgeon, have been performing increasing numbers of mustache implants. Bouhanna says the majority of his patients come from the United Arab Emirates, Iran, Lebanon, and Turkey, with men traveling to France to have the surgery performed.

"My impression is they want to establish their male aspect," he said. "They want a strong mustache."

Both surgeons use follicular unit extraction in which groups of hairs are taken from areas of dense hair growth to be implanted in the mustache area. Patients are generally aged between 30 and 50, and able to fly home the day after the procedure, which costs about \$7,000, performed under local anesthetic.

Andrew Hammond, a Saudi Arabiabased journalist and author on Arab popular culture, said the mustache has a long history in the region. "A mustache was a big thing, ever since the Ottoman time," he said. "Most Arab leaders have mustaches, or some form of facial hair."

Christa Salamandra, associate professor of anthropology at City University of New York, said that "traditionally, a luxurious mustache was a symbol of high social status," and figured heavily in matters of personal honor in the Arab world. Men swore on their mustaches in sayings and folk tales, used them as collateral for loans and guarantees for promises, and sometimes even shaved



their opponents' lips as a punishment.

The notion of a man's personal honor being bound up with his mustache appears to have survived into more recent times in some areas. In 2008, militants in Gaza abducted a Fatah opponent and shaved off his mustache to dishonor him.

The American diplomat Joel Barlow, posted in 1795 as U.S. consul to Algiers, wrote to his wife that he had grown a thick black mustache, which gave him "the air of a tiger," and had proved useful in his work in the region.

Archaeology: Samson Coin Archaeology By Leon Watson DailyMail.co.uk





A tiny seal has been uncovered that could be the first archaeological evidence of Samson, the Bible's slayer of Philistines.

Archaeologists discovered the ancient artifact while excavating the tel of Beit Shemesh in the Judean Hills near Jerusalem. It appears to depict the Old Testament story of Samson, whose might was undone by his lust for the temptress Delilah, and his fight with a lion.



The seal, which measures less than an inch in diameter, shows a large animal with a leonine tail attacking a human figure. The level of the excavation where it was found dates to roughly the 11th century BC, when Israelite tribes had moved into the area after Joshua's conquest of Canaan. It was a time when the Jews were led by ad hoc leaders known as judges, one of whom was Samson.

The location of the find was close to the River Sorek that marked the boundary between the Israelites and their Philistine foes. The location also indicates that the figure on the seal could represent Samson, according to Israeli archaeologists Professor Shlomo Bunimovitz and Dr. Zvi Lederman.

Beit Shemesh is regularly mentioned in the Old Testament, most notably in 1 Samuel 6- the book of the ruler immediately after Samson-as being the first city encountered by the Ark of the Covenant on its way back from Philistia after having been captured by the Philistines in battle.

Ten Lost Tribes: Found

The kingdom of Israel reached its height at the time of David and Solomon, approximately 1,000 years before the time of Christ. During the reign of Solomon's son, Rehoboam, the northern ten tribes of Israel split away from Judah and Benjamin, dividing the kingdom into the northern tribes of Israel and the southern tribes of Judah.

From this division rose a hope to be reunited by the future Messiah (Ezekiel 37:12ff). The northern tribes of Israel were taken into captivity by the Assyrians in the eighth century BC and the southern tribes of Judah followed in the sixth century BC. The Bible records the captives of Judah returning to the land of Israel during the fifth century BC.

Lacking a major description of the restoration of the northern tribes, speculation has risen over the years: "Where are the lost ten tribes?"

Many Christian cults claim to be descendants of the ten northern tribes. This includes groups in Japan, Native Americans, some elements in Mormonism, Jehovah's Witnesses, and parts of the Christian Zionist movement.

The truth: there are no ten lost tribes. During the time of the captivities, members of each of the northern tribes returned to the area of Judah. After that, the name Judah—or the Jews—referred not only to Judah but to the Benjaminites, the Levites, and the remnant of all the northern tribes.

All the tribes of Israel are included in what we call today the Jewish people. Here are four of seven basic biblical facts proving this position. (See all seven at http://wp.me/pieUD-1A9.)

- 2 Chronicles records many times that members of the northern tribes immigrated to Judah after the kingdom division.
- After the Babylonian captivity, the nation of Israel was restored under the leadership of Ezra and Nehemiah. Extensive genealogy lists indicate that the northern Israelites kept family records and knew which tribe they were from.
- Yeshua ministered all over the land of Israel and never mentioned the possibility of any lost tribe floating around somewhere. He was called to go to "the lost sheep of the house of Israel" (Matthew 10:6).

In the same way, the Apostles addressed the crowds of Jews in the first century as the descendants of Israel. (Acts 2:36)

• In Romans, chapters 9 to 11, Paul expresses his prayer for the Children of Israel to be saved. This biblical remnant of Israel that fulfills the prophecies is the same group who rejected Yeshua in the first century. Not some lost tribe, but Jews living in Israel at that time.

The falling away of Israel has meant the salvation of the gentiles. The drama of Romans 9–11 only makes sense if speaking about the Jewish people. If someone thinks it refers to Mormons or Jehovah's Witnesses, the whole meaning of the passage is lost. That viewpoint would destroy the promises of God to Israel, the purpose of evangelism in Israel, and the meaning of the reconciliation between Israel and the Church in the End Times.
