The world was treated recently to another declaration by Palestinian Authority President Mahmoud Abbas that Jesus was a Palestinian.

Abbas called Jesus "a Palestinian messenger who would become a guiding light for millions around the world," and suggested Israel was to blame for the exodus of Christians from the Middle East.

Israel's foreign ministry spokesman noted, "He should have read the Gospels before uttering such offensive nonsense," adding that Abbas's remarks are an "outrageous rewriting of Christian history."

As an Orthodox Jew, I'm no expert on Christianity. However, I know a dangerous and offensive ambush on Judaism and Christianity when I see it, and when those called "Palestinians" today

erase and rewrite whole sections of Scripture that are the foundation of Judaism and Christianity, it must be called what it is: a dangerous lie, a hybrid between Palestinian propaganda and the ultimate Replacement Theology.

One egregious example: when Palestinians say (often) that there was never a Temple on the Temple Mount—the focal point of biblical Jerusalem. In fact, this architectural landmark was destroyed, rebuilt, destroyed again in the year 70 AD—and replaced by two mosques 600 years later. One doesn't have to look very hard to find more examples, and one doesn't have to dig very deep in Jerusalem to find archaeological remains of Temples and Jews.

Abbas also mentioned Palestinians "trapped under siege" in Gaza, "prevented from worshiping in Bethlehem," conveniently overlooking that it's his fellow "Palestinians" (from Hamas) who control Gaza and who make life for Christians there a living hell—like Christians in Lebanon, Syria, Egypt, Iran, etc.

I care because Israel is the birthplace of both Judaism and Christianity. Jews and Christians have a common, biblical bond that has never been more important. Though the Church in the past 2,000 years has been less enlightened toward the Jews, the awakening in the past century of Christians who understand the biblical injunction to bless Israel, and who know that Israel's rebirth is fulfillment of prophecy, needs to be met with open arms by Jews, and reciprocated. When a Palestinian leader refers to Jesus as a Palestinian, it's an affront to the foundation of Christianity, making one imagine Jesus dying not on a Roman cross, but wearing a suicide belt packed with explosives at a 2,000-year-old Jerusalem café.

While there were indigenous Arabs in Israel pre-1948, Arab migration to Israel exploded as the land flourished with Jews returning from exile and the corresponding economic opportunities. But while Jews returned en masse, fulfilling prophecy, there was always an unbreakable Jewish presence in the land. It is the indigenous Jews who have the rightful claim to Israel, going back to those who lived in Israel in Jesus' time, with its center in Jerusalem established by the Jewish King David 3,000 years ago, in the Land God promised to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob long before that, and documented in the Bible.

But those who read and understand Scripture knew that already.

Ouch! The Foreign Ministry of Israel stands for truth in the face of revisionism and cowardice from Europe. Another note on the shared destiny of Jews and Christians. —Myles


While we are updating different visual aspects, please realize that these changes are only window dressing. This ministry is unwavering in our commitment to bring





Israel's 'Magna Carta' The San Remo Mandate

What better present could God give than to put the birth of Israel on my birthday? He did so forty years before my debut, but sprang the surprise on me only recently! —Mark

It happened on April 25, 1920. Representatives of the powers that triumphed in World War I met in the Italian town of San Remo to divide the Middle Eastern lands they'd conquered. Ninety years later to the day, Christians and Jews gathered on the same spot to commemorate the event.

The men who met in San Remo ninety-four years ago are long gone. But their decisions made history and transformed the Middle East. They called for the establishment of a homeland for the Jewish people—after a Diaspora of nearly 2,000 years—in an area of the Ottoman Empire called Palestine.

Before its defeat in World War I, the 400-year-old Ottoman Empire spread across the Middle East. In San Remo, representatives of Britain, France, Italy, and Japan, with the United States as an observer, divided the Empire into three mandates: Iraq, Syria, and Palestine. France would oversee Syria; Iraq and Palestine fell under Great Britain. The San Remo Resolution included the Balfour Declaration, a call in 1917 by England's Lord Balfour for "the establishment in Palestine of a national home for the Jewish people." The Resolution has been called Israel's "Magna Carta."

Tomas Sandell of the European Coalition for Israel helped organize the 90th anniversary of the San Remo signing and repeated Chaim Weizmann's 1920 observation that the Israeli state was born on the 25th of April 1920 in San Remo. The Resolution was *that* significant.

Howard Grief, author of *The Legal Foundation and Borders of Israel under International Law*, explained that the Resolution set several precedents. It was adopted by the League of Nations and signed by 51 countries. Exclusive legal and political rights in Palestine went to the Jews, while those same rights in the rest of the Middle East went to the Arabs.

Grief emphasized that the Resolution was the preeminent document for Jewish rights to the land of Israel. The Arabs got the lion's share: Syria—subsequently divided into Syria and Lebanon, all of Mesopotamia, and all of Arabia. Balfour himself asked the Arabs, "Why are you complaining? You are getting all these lands, and we're granting a niche," he called it a niche, "to the Jewish people who are going to get Palestine."

Grief also pointed out that the 1920 San Remo Resolution supersedes later UN resolutions: "There is a doctrine in international law. Once you recognize a certain situation, the matter is executed. You can't change it. And [more recently] the UN General Assembly exceeded its authority, exceeded its jurisdiction. It did not have the power to divide the country."


But what about those contested Israeli "settlements" in Judea and Samaria ["the West Bank"] that many people, including the current Secretary-General of the UN, claim are illegal?

Eli Hertz, the president of Myths and Facts, Inc. (MythsAndFacts.org), observed: "Settlements are covered in Article 6 of the Mandate for Palestine, again the legal international document of the Mandate for Palestine. It clearly says that not only do the Jews have the right to settlement, but the world has the obligation to help them to settle."

This legal right of the Jews to build in the West Bank and in East Jerusalem is little understood in the world today, a situation that Tomas Sandell hopes to remedy. Sandell said that we have a duty simply to put the facts on the table. This is about historical facts that should be included in discussions.

Yeshua's miraculous intervention on behalf of humanity also elevated women's stature. I have been a direct beneficiary of His love and support. When we receive Him and His spiritual life and new paradigm for us, our high adventure with Him results in restoration.

I love the way Myles includes me and honors me on Shabbat. Whether at home with the family or sharing Shabbat with 250 people at Beit Abba, Myles points out that as the "queen" of the home, I represent not only the promise to humankind, but also a warning to the adversary: "And I will put enmity between you and the woman, And between your seed and her Seed; He shall bruise your head, And you shall bruise His heel." (Genesis 3:15)

The Gospel improves the lot of women wherever it thrives in the world. When God revealed His miraculous resurrection to His disciples, He first appeared to two women—Mary Magdalene and the other Mary (Matthew 28:1)—when they arrived at the sepulcher after Shabbat to ceremonially wash and prepare Jesus' body for burial.

God used angelic visitations and personal touches to make the women aware of their value in spreading the word of His resurrection. The angel said to the women, "Go quickly and tell His disciples that He is risen from the dead, and indeed He is going before you into Galilee; there you will see Him. Behold, I have told you." (Matthew 28:7)

After ministering in "the graveyard of preachers" in northern India, Myles and I traveled with our Gospel companions over the mountains in an ancient rickety bus—an eleven-hour drive to Calcutta. The Lord brought great joy to us through the night and assured me that the "the angel of the Lord encamps around those who fear His name" (Psalm 34:7). We laughed and sang to the consternation of the bus driver and his rifle-wielding companions. Instead of meeting the expected road bandits, we celebrated God's goodness in fellowship with Him and each other.

So it was with the companions of Yeshua: They went out quickly from the tomb with fear and great joy, and ran to bring His disciples word. "And as they went to tell His disciples, behold, Jesus met them, saying, 'Rejoice!'" (Matthew 28:91.

I love this picture of Jesus telling the women to be joyful! What a contrast to Islam—Jesus elevates women, whereas Islam hides them under a burka or hijab and holds them in bondage and fear.

Let us be joyful and share the Good News. He is Risen... He is Risen indeed!



Israel's Christian Population Grows

According to 2013 figures released by Israel's Central Bureau of Statistics, there are roughly 161,000 Christians living in Israel, equaling about 2% of the population, up from 158,000 in 2012.

Nearly 80% of these Christians are Arab, while the majority of the remaining 20% are largely from the former Soviet Union.

The cities with the largest Christian populations are Nazareth with 22,400 Christians, Haifa with 14,600, and Jerusalem with 11,900.

Israeli Christian women had fewer children than Jews or Muslims, with only 2.2 children per Christian woman compared to 3.5 for Muslim women and 3.0 for Jewish women.

Israel has one of the few Christian communities left in the Middle East that is still growing. According to the Pew Research Center, just 0.6% of the world's 2.3 billion Christians now live in the Middle East and North Africa. Christians make up only 4% of the region's total inhabitants, drastically down from 20% a century ago, making Middle East Christians the smallest regional Christian minority in the world.

Ironic, isn't it, that after the tragic interaction between the Church and the Jewish people throughout the centuries, the small Jewish State is the safest place in the Middle East for Christians? Thanks to Israel for its democratic, freedom-loving ethic that allows Christians to worship in safety. —Myles





Israel's Unique Bay

Haifa Bay intrigues me. Standing at the back edge of Rambam Medical Center—Haifa's sprawling, ever-growing city of treatment—we view the rolling Mediterranean waters and smell their salt.

Looking to the north, the mountain ridge separating Israel and Lebanon captures the eye. Cities with names like Kiryat Yam (town of the sea) and Akko/Acre line the bay's shore. The bay and its principal city, Haifa, have changed radically from the sleepy fishing village David Roberts chronicled in iconic mid-19th-century paintings.

Made famous by the 4,000-plus rockets that were launched against Israel by Hezbollah in the 2006 war, Haifa and its bay have seen foreign invasions dating all the way back to the Egyptian empire. The Romans used these waters to stage their landings while extending their empire to the Middle East and Northern Africa. More recently, the British pinned their hopes for oil and territorial domination on the attractive potential of Haifa as a world-class port. They dredged the bay in the 1930s, at the same time attempting an oil pipeline that was slated to reach Iraq. It was here, at the Haifa Port, that the British Mandate over Israel ended in 1948 after a bitter struggle for independence by the ragtag Jewish forces.

Today, massive freighters sit in the bay waiting to unload their cargo. Other

cular port city of today?

For centuries, in fact, Haifa was overshadowed by the strategic position of Akko/Acre at the northern end of the Haifa Bay. From 1100 until 1918, the small settlement was fought over by the Crusaders, the Mamluk and Ottoman Turks, Egypt, and even Napoleon. In 1765, there were 250 inhabitants. Now there are 600,000 in the greater Haifa area. Haifa's favorable vantage point at the south end of the broad, sandy bay drew the British Government of Palestine to make it a central port and energy center. Maneuverable for large ships and sheltered from severe weather. Haifa's bay-Israel's only natural harbor-gave the newly born Jewish state an advantageous entry point for refugees fleeing Europe and arriving from the Islamic-run nations of the Middle East where Jews became unwelcome following Israeli independence.

Near the site of Elijah's spiritual battle on Mt. Carmel, the Haifa Bay area could well hold a key to end-times revival. Next month, I will take up this aspect of the strategic northern coastal region.





Zola—Anti-Semitic?

CLASSIC ZOLA: 1999—15 years ago

Dear Zola-

Your recent show was an outright attack on Judaism. It was offensive, inflammatory, and anti-Semitic. An effective way to tell a lie is to sprinkle it with a little truth, which is what you did. Citing an example of one Jew you know who does not follow Judaism, and condemning Judaism for it, is a tactic I would expect from the Ku Klux Klan or a Nazi, but certainly not from any ministry that has a true understanding of God. By the way, there is a difference between a fable and rabbinic law. —S.Z.

Dear S.Z.—

I don't know any difference between a fable and rabbinic law. In fact, the term "Jewish fables" was coined by a rabbi, Apostle Paul. (Titus 1:14) If you believe that you may wear a certain coat on Saturday but you may not carry it on your arm, or if you believe that chickens killed by one sect of Orthodox Jews cannot be eaten by a different sect, if you think those things are scriptural, then you are being led astray by the rabbis. I believe that the takeover of Judaism by the rabbis simply reflects what happens to a society whose lawyers get control of it.

"Rabbi" means teacher in the sense of someone who elucidates the Scriptures. But the rabbis are not teachers; they don't know the Scriptures. I've never met a rabbi with Bible knowledge equal to a church member who had gone to Sunday School for six months. The typical rabbi could not name

the Seven Feasts of Israel or say an intelligent word on prophecy.

Now, admittedly, the rabbis are not doing this on purpose; but like Catholic priests or some Protestant ministers, they simply lead according to some extraneous legal system, not according to Scripture, and therefore, they continually lead their congregations astray. My argument with all these sects (and I'm glad you pointed out that I criticize the Jews as much as I do anyone else) is that people who don't read God's Word don't know God, and that's all there is to that. However well-intentioned any clergymen may be-and some of them are exemplary community leaders, morally decent, and deeply committed to their ministries—they simply cannot get it right or even close to right without consulting the Bible.

And after spending a lifetime combating anti-Semitism, I'm really disheartened to have someone call me anti-Semitic. I'm not using tactics of the Ku Klux Klan or the Nazis; I'm simply begging my people—the Jews—to read the Word of God that they themselves wrote down and gave to the world. —Zola

What is the origin of the Star of David emblem used on Israel's flag and general symbol of Jewry?



The Star of David (Magen David, lit. Shield of David) is a national symbol for the Jewish State of Israel. Its shape, a hexagram formed by two interlocking equilateral triangles, adorns the State's flag. It's been around as a design element for over two thousand years, confirmed by archaeological discoveries in Israel.

Its name likely derived from the Psalms, e.g. 3 and 18, in which David wrote: "But You, O Lord, are a shield for me" and "You have also given me the shield of Your salvation." It gradually joined the menorah as an exclusive symbol that represents unity among Jews, a connection to Israel, that is, Jacob. But it doesn't appear to have been exclusively Jewish until the Middle Ages.

Many scholars have attributed deep theological significance to the symbol and others have tried to attach


occult connotations to it, but its origins as a Jewish symbol were nationalistic and not occult.

I want to find a Greek/Hebrew study Bible that doesn't require a degree in theology to understand. I have spent hours in Christian bookstores trying to decide but without success. My pastor uses a new translation like the NIV, but I want to know more about what was originally translated.

If you mean you would like an English text that is a literal translation from the Hebrew Old Testament and the Greek New Testament, then biblical scholars generally consider the New American Standard (NASB) to be the most literal translation. I suggest you also purchase a Hebrew/English interlinear Old Testament with the Hebrew text alongside the English text. Interlinear formats are also available in Greek/English for the New Testament. You should find them all at ChristianBook.com.








Maggidim (Preachers) of Messiah

As our **To The Jew First** team left the Jewish quarter in the Old City of Jerusalem, we met a sailor in Israel's navy. We stopped to encourage this brave, young man in his fight for freedom and democracy in the Middle East.


After we shared customary greetings, I told him that every time I come to

the regathering of the
Jewish people in the reborn
State, it reminds me that God
keeps His promises to His people. The
modern-day regathering is a fulfillment
of many ancient prophecies in the
Jewish Bible. (Isaiah 11:11–12; Ezekiel
37) Such a miraculous occurrence, I
said, strengthens my firm belief in the
God of Israel.

Dolev gladly concurred and was amazed that I come to Israel three times a year in a joyful obligation to return the greatest gift that God gave to me through the Jewish people: Yeshua the Messiah. The same Word that reveals Yeshua as the Messiah also tells me I am in debt to Israel for these spiritual riches. (Romans 15:27) I explained to Dolev that the best way for me to repay my spiritual debt is to give him the complete (both Old and New Testaments) Jewish Bible in Hebrew for him to read for himself.



Dolev seemed to appreciate our conversation. As he took the Scriptures from me, I prayed for the Holy Spirit to open his mind and heart to understand the central theme of the Jewish Scriptures—that the Father above sent Yeshua to bring the New Covenant of salvation to the People of Israel.

Bloomfield Science Museum in Jerusalem curator Varda Gur Ben-Sheetrit said that hundreds of ingenious inventions were considered for the museum's Inventions, Inc. We continue our series of the top inventions highlighted at the exhibition, in no particular order.

31. **PrimeSense** allows digital devices to "see" in three dimensions and transfer control from remote controls and joysticks to hands and body. Provider of low-cost, high-performance 3D machine vision technologies for the consumer market.



- 32. **TaKaDu** provides monitoring software to leading water utilities worldwide. The product offers real-time detection and control over leaks, bursts, and inefficiencies. (See related story on page 26.)
- 33. Hewlett Packard (HP)'s **Indigo** digital printing presses—for general commercial printing like photos, publications, labels, flexible packaging, and folding cartons—print without films and plates, allowing for personalized short runs and changing text and images without stopping the press.
- 34. Cubital's **solid rapid prototyping machines** craft 3D models of engineering parts directly from designs on a computer screen. Think: automotive,

aerospace, medical industries, and academic and research institutions.

35. The **Zomet Institute** in Jerusalem is a non-profit, public research institute where rabbis, researchers, and engineers devise practical solutions for modern life without violating Sabbath restrictions on the use of electricity, e.g. metal detectors, security jeeps, elevators, electric wheelchairs, and coffee machines that can be used on *Shabbat*.

"Why are you so anxious? Take a lesson from the wildflowers... They neither toil nor spin, yet even Solomon in all his royal glory was not arrayed like one of these ... And if your Heavenly Father gives such attention to the appearance of flowers, many of which grow in unseen places, surely He will attend to you, too" (Matt. 6:28–30). So take a deep breath. Don't let worry blind you to God's ongoing care; don't live as those without faith. You have a place in your Father's heart; you have a share in His house above. See the Lord as your Dwelling Place "in all generations"; behold His unchanging glory despite the fleeting shadows of this world.

We must first look to the Eternal to rightly see the finite; we must look upward before we look downward. As we contemplate God's Eternality and power, we realize the wonder and sanctity of our short time here. The Eternal is our refuge, our "dwelling place," in all generations, and that means in the *present* generation as well, on the other side of fleeting appearances of this world. When we pray to God as *Avinu She-bashamayim*, "Our Father in Heaven," we are calling to the One who (ש) is in the midst of the waters (מימ) of life.

The psalmist says (Psalm 118:17): "I shall not die, but live." In order to live, you must give yourself to death, but when you have done so, you discover that you are not to die, but to live. "Giving yourself to death" here means *surrendering* to God's will, *accepting* the yoke of Heaven, and *trusting* in His governing "flow" over all of Creation. This is the deeper meaning of "baptism" as we are immersed into God's care for our lives. Yeshua gives us abundant life.

The bloom of every flower is by Eternal purpose, and not one common sparrow is forgotten by your Heavenly Father (Luke 12:6). God's irresistible providence comprehends

and orders all things, from the realm of the subatomic to the cosmic motions of the heavenly bodies. The Lord is the Center of reality: "All things were created by Him, and for Him, and in Him all things hold together" (Col. 1:16-17). In light of this, Blaise Pascal asked, "What is left for us but to unite our will to that of God Himself, to will in Him, with Him, and for Him the thing that He has eternally willed in us and for us." In other words, what else can we do but learn to trust, accept, and to say "yes" to life-even if at times we may feel like strangers in exile. All our days are ordained; recorded in God's scroll. Therefore, may God "teach us to number our days to get a heart of wisdom" (Psalm 90:12). So don't lose heart, friend; He who cares for you is a Good Shepherd, and you shall dwell in the house of the LORD forever.



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


Your letter is disconcerting because it is subtly imbued with mixture. Unfortunately, yours is a minority voice in the world today. Others may believe as you do but are afraid to state it. Israel Shows CA How to Cope with Drought

Six decades of providing water in a country that's 60 percent desert have made Israel a technological leader in the field. Desalination of seawater, reuse of treated sewage for agriculture, software warning of leaks, computerized drip irrigation, and careful accounting of every drop have become the norm in Israel, the world's 40th largest economy. Officials in drought-stricken California, which would be the 10th if it were a nation, are paying attention.

North of San Diego, Israel's IDE Technologies Ltd. is helping to build the largest seawater desalination plant in the Western Hemisphere. The facility in Carlsbad, when finished in 2016, will be able to provide 50 million gallons of potable water a day. Three smaller plants already operate in California, and 15 more have been proposed. About two-



thirds of California, home to 38 million people, is gripped by "extreme" or "exceptional" drought. Israel has been dealing with such conditions throughout its history. The climate has forced the country to go to unusual lengths to lower consumption and raise supply, methods it now uses as a matter of routine.



Desalination, which provides about one-quarter of Israel's water supply, wasn't the first step that Israel took on its way to increasing supply. Likewise, because of the expense and environmental concerns, desalination should be considered in California only after other measures are exhausted, said Katalyn Voss, a water policy fellow at the University of California at Irvine's Center for Hydrologic Modeling. These include recycling and careful accounting of both ground and surface water.

In Israel, 75 percent of the country's sewage is recycled, the highest percentage in the world. More than 50 percent of water used in agriculture comes from treated sewage. California's agriculture keeps it the top state in cash farm receipts with 11 percent of the U.S. total. Israel has also been able to lower leakage to less than 10 percent by using technology that monitors and warns of leaks and pipe bursts. About 25 to 30 percent of the world's water production is wasted because of faults in distribution, according to TaKaDu, an Israeli company that developed technology to minimize leakage. (*Please see story on page14*)

The Carlsbad plant is a "game changer" in desalination in the U.S. and will pave the way to future plants in California, and the U.S. in general, said Mark Lambert, chief executive officer of IDE Americas. In the meantime, Californians should learn to conserve water, said Avraham Tenne from Israel's Water Authority. Raising prices, education to reduce waste, and cutting back on grassy areas are some of the methods that Israel has used to cut back on consumption, which is currently about 90 cubic meters per year per person compared with 170 in California.

"We do a lot of things, not just desalination," Tenne said. "These are all things that California can do."

Alzheimer's Cure: Stronger Immune System

Imagine being able to inhibit or reverse a universal affliction—brain degeneration—and specific diseases or physical injuries that cause its sudden onset. This is precisely what Prof. **Michal Schwartz** (below) has spent the last two decades studying, with revolutionary results.

Schwartz's research has turned pre-existing dogma about the central nervous system on its head. She holds the Maurice and Ilse Katz Chair in Neuroimmunology at the Weizmann Institute of Science in Rehovot. Her fierce drive kept her going in the face of opposition from peers who dismissed the hypotheses that sparked the last 20 years of her work. And her office wall displays professional recognition that her intuition about conventional neuroscience misinterpreting the communication between the brain and immune system was correct.

Schwartz explains that the central nervous system (made up of the spinal cord, brain, and optic nerve) controls the entire body, including the immune system. But because the brain is isolated from the immune system, neuroscientists believed

that immune cells are harmful to the brain, and therefore should be kept away from it.

As a result, whenever a person suffered a spinal cord injury or a degenerative disease such as Alzheimer's, Parkinson's, or ALS—and his immune system immediately responded locally—doctors would prescribe anti-inflammatory drugs to prevent the immune cells from getting into and damaging the brain.



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Schwartz felt the prevailing wisdom was inherently illogical. "It was hard for me to believe that an organ that cannot be replaced would so severely lack a system to help it heal." Testing her hypothesis on mice, Schwartz and her team found that the dialogue between the brain and the immune system is unique.

"Think of a gate through which only those with a passport can enter," she says. "This 'passport' checks which cells may enter, and adjusts their activity so that they do what the brain needs them to do." From this understanding, Schwartz hypothesized that the immune system may perform day-to-day healing of the brain. "After all, the brain is always going out of balance, either due to positive activities or due to mini-traumas and stress, yet most of us regain equilibrium quite quickly. Something must be working to restore the balance in our brains. And that something is the immune system," she says.

As a result of Schwartz's understanding, the door has been opened to new research avenues in fighting age-related dementia and neurodegenerative diseases.

With the premise that the aging of the brain is a direct result of the aging of the immune system, Schwartz believes that maintaining a healthy immune system, rather than tackling the pathology of brain-related injury and illness, is the key to a reversal of conditions once deemed incurable.

In New York, Rose's relatives soon ensconced her in their home. With her mature demeanor, it was not long before Rose found a job as a sewing machine operator.



Life in America was new. Polish mannerisms, clothing, and accent were quickly shed along with keeping kosher and Torah. Rose's relatives insisted religion was an unnecessary accessory in America. Rose put on the new clothes and cut her hair to suit the fashion but never gave up the Sabbath.

Every week, Rose devised a new excuse to miss work on Saturday: a toothache, a sick stomach. After three weeks, the foreman called her over. "Rose, either you come in this Saturday, or you can look for a new job."

Rose's relatives were adamant: work on Sabbath, she must. Rose felt like a leaf caught between gusts of wind, pushed and pulled with no weight of its own.

I want to fit into this new land, she reasoned. But, how can I forget Sabbath?

On Friday, Rose sat at her machine. Would it be so awful to do this tomorrow? As the sun slipped away, Rose knew: She was Jewish, and she would keep the Sabbath.

But Rose lacked the courage to face her relatives. Instead, she left the house next morning as if headed for work. In Tompkins Square Park, she sat among the pigeons, singing traditional Sabbath songs, tears in her eyes. When three stars finally peeked out from the black sky announcing the end of Sabbath, Rose had triumphed, but her victory would cost her dearly. Rose trudged home dreading the nasty scene when her relatives learned what she'd done.

As she neared home, a shout broke from her cousin Joe. "Rose! You're here? Where were you? There was a fire in the factory and no way out of the building. People even jumped to their deaths!"

Of 190 workers, Rose Goldstein was among the few who survived. The infamous

New Big Bang Evidence Supports Creationism

The recent announcement that scientists have confirmed the existence of gravitational waves rippling through the universe, thereby bolstering the Big Bang Theory, would presumably be a blow to those who believe in the Bible.

Not so, said Professor Nathan Aviezer of Israel's Bar Ilan University. "... the mechanics of the creation process in the Big Bang match the Genesis story perfectly. The universe had a definite starting point—a creation—as described in the Book of Genesis. To deny this now is to deny scientific fact."

Professor Aviezri S. Fraenkel of the Weizmann Institute noted that science is actually moving closer to, rather than farther from, the biblical account. Whereas ancient philosophers thought that the universe had existed forever, modern science now knows that "there is a definite beginning."

Fraenkel continued: "In fact, the modern theories, which don't yet explain all the observed cosmological facts, bestow new meaning to Psalm 92:6 'How great are your deeds, O Lord! Your thoughts are very "deep.'"

Syrian Christians Ordered to Pay Jizya

A militant Islamist group has demanded Christians living in Raqqa province in the northeast of Syria pay it a tax in return for protection as it seeks to build a traditional "Caliphate" in areas it controls. The Islamic State of Iraq and al-Sham (ISIS) published the terms under which minorities

under which minorities could live under its rule in a statement on the Internet.

nternet.

"Christians are obligated to pay jizya tax on every adult male to the value of four golden dinars for the wealthy, half of that for middle-income citizens, and half of that for the poor," the decree said. "They must not hide their status, and can pay in two installments per year." Four dinars weigh just over half an ounce of gold, worth about \$720.



In return, Christians will not be harmed and will be allowed to worship privately, maintain their own clergy without interference, and keep their own cemeteries, it added. They are implicitly allowed to continue drinking alcohol and eating pork, but may not do so publicly or trade them with Muslims. Nor may they build or renovate churches, or display the cross.

The demand carries weight because ISIS, which grew out of al-Qaeda in Iraq, has become the most feared militia in Syria. It has now been disavowed by Osama bin Laden's replacement as al-Qaeda leader, Ayman al-Zawahiri, and is effectively at war with the rest of the rebel movement. Raqqa—overwhelmingly Sunni Muslim—had a small Christian community, but much if not all of it has already fled.

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Los Angeles Gang Members Fight Alongside Hezbollah

Videos and images that surfaced recently show members of Los Angeles gangs fighting in Syria alongside pro-Hezbollah and pro-Assad forces. Two gang members, "Creeper," from the God Up-13 gang and "Wino," from the Westside Armenian Power gang, filmed themselves firing AK-47s and boasting of being on the "front lines." Wino, aka "Wino Ayee Peeyakan," whose real name is Nerses Kilajyan, uploaded the images and videos to his Facebook profile.

The images on Wino's Facebook page include multiple photos of him brandishing weapons; in one he is seen standing beside a Hezbollah operative, and in another he himself is wearing Hezbollah garb. Creeper is also photographed and filmed alongside Wino in multiple photos and videos posted on the page.

Judging by the photos, Wino seems to have been fighting in Syria since December 2012. Comments by Wino's Facebook friends suggest that the two were deported from the U.S. due to their involvement in criminal activity.

Man's Best Friend—and Fighter

"Let us not underestimate the courage they showed at death, and let us not forget the heroic and courageous deeds they did in life. Despite obstacles, dangers, and pressure, they persevered, demonstrating the essence of friend-ship and sacrifice."

Such soldiers' eulogies are often carved on plaques or tombstones in military cemeteries. This one appeared in a military cemetery—for dogs, members of the Israel Defense Forces' Oketz Canine Unit.

Established four decades ago, the Oketz's highly trained dogs can attack, assist in manhunts, and locate explosives. Teams of a soldier and a dog take part in every operational activity of the military. Their training is long and complex; they must adapt to combat under all conditions, in all kinds of terrain—and, of course, soldiers must learn how to work closely with their canine partners.

Army officials recognize Oketz's importance and invest in it. Its base is well-kept and the dogs enjoy hotel-like conditions: exercise room, spacious kennels, a high-tech veterinary clinic where they are examined regularly to stay in excellent health. The cemetery has a monument at the entrance depicting a soldier hugging his dog.

Together, teams go through the complicated training that enables the soldier to work with the dog and the dog to become a fighting machine. The dog's training is Pavlovian in nature—only positive reinforcement and a great deal of love bring him to a high level.



The relationship between soldier

and dog is amazing. Most even vacation together, for short weekends or a week-long furlough. The strength of the relationship can be seen in the way soldier and dog look at each other. Each knows that his life depends on the other. Oketz's dogs prove themselves time and again. In most cases, the public never learns about their heroism. But there are many instances in which an Oketz dog saved an entire force from a booby-trapped area.

If a mission goes wrong and a dog is hit, the army's supreme value—never leave wounded soldiers behind—applies to the dog as much as to the soldier. The dog's partner and fellow soldiers will do everything in their power to save him. Soldiers also receive training in canine first aid.

Unfortunately, not every rescue attempt is successful. When the worst happens and a dog is killed in action, it is buried with ceremony in the base's cemetery.

Wearing their berets, their eyes filled with tears and their words warm, the soldiers bury their fallen comrade. It is exactly like the lyrics of the well-known Hebrew song, "One Human Tapestry": "If one of us goes away, something dies within us—and something stays with him."

Petra and Celestial Events


During the winter solstice, the sun filters into the Monastery at Petra, Jordan, illuminating the podium (motab) of a deity. Just at this moment, the silhouette of the mountain opposite draws the head of a lion, a sacred animal. These examples from a study by researchers from Instituto de Astrofisica de Canarias and CSIC (Spain) showed how celestial events influenced the orientation of the great constructions of the Nabataeans.

The results, published by the *Nexus Network Journal*, indicate that their palaces, temples, and tombs were erected bearing in mind the equinoxes, solstices, and other astronomical events that determined the Nabataean religion. The Nabataeans prospered in the first century BC and the first century AD in what is now Jordan and neighboring countries.

A clear example is seen in Ad Deir, the Monastery at Petra. During the winter solstice, the light of the setting sun entering through the gate of the monument illuminates the sacred motab where stone blocks representing divinities such as the god Dushara are placed.

"The effect is spectacular, and would have only been observable during the few days closest to this solstice," commented Juan Antonio Belmonte, researcher of IAC and coordinator of the study.


