"Here I Can Complain" by Zola Levitt

Many of you have written to us about the troubling situation between the Israeli government and certain Messianic Jewish families. It seems that three families have been threatened with deportation on the basis that they are not genuinely Jewish, but instead are believers in Jesus Christ. This very unscriptural and undemocratic conclusion troubles me as well.

Some people suppose I always support decisions of the Israeli government, but that's really not true. Just as in America I cherish my right as a citizen of a democracy to dissent and disagree with my government, so I disagree with the democratic government of Israel. If I disagreed with the governments of China, Cuba or any Arab "country," I would have been dead for years by now. But in America and Israel, I can say what I like about government policies. And that reminds me (as do so many modern Israeli situations) of a joke.

A Russian immigrant had just arrived in Israel and was questioned by a reporter about his previous circumstances. "What kind of job did they give you?" he was asked.

"I couldn't complain."

"Well, what kind of apartment did you get? I understand housing was a problem under the communists, especially for Jews."

"I couldn't complain," replied the new immigrant again.

The reporter was exasperated. "Well, if you couldn't complain about anything in Russia, why did you bother coming here?"

"Here I can complain!"

Truly, the Russians can complain in Israel, and they're complaining about a lot of things. And I have my complaints, too. The chief one is about what we would call in Washington, D.C., a "special interest group."



In short, it seems to me that a particular group — the ultra-orthodox rabbis — have appointed themselves spiritual watchmen over Israel, and while their intentions are good, some of their biases are very clear. They do not understand the concept of Messianic Judaism, and they regard Jewish believers in the Messiah as renegades or even traitors. Most damning of all, they regard them as no longer Jewish. With that reasoning they "wheel and deal" in the Parliament to get some sort of deportation order passed to come down on Jewish believers in Jesus Christ, a full-blooded Israeli.

Ultra-orthodox rabbis regard Jewish believers in the Messiah as renegades or even traitors.

At this moment, I don't think the matter is as serious as some have made out. My contacts in Israel tell me that they doubt the government will carry out this harsh decree. Furthermore, the publicity becomes a blessing in disguise. Whether or not they are condemned, the Messianics have found a place in the media, on talk shows and in public discussion, which is a lot better than being ignored. In reality, some unsaved Jews are rallying to their cause as fellow citizens of a democracy, and they are actually gathering support and enormous chances to witness.

I was advised by certain Messianic Jews to take my complaints to the government itself. Although I didn't have much heart for that, I did register them with the office of the Minister of Tourism in New

York where I have some influence as one who takes tours to Israel. The minister discussed the situation with me and said, very reasonably for a secular person, "Either they're going to be Jews or they're not. Which is it?"

We believers have failed to witness to the Israeli government the true concept of Christianity.

And that's where I think we believers have to shoulder some responsibility. We have not only failed to witness to Israel, we haven't defined for its government what a Christian is. I average member imagine the Parliament in Jerusalem would say that a Christian is one who conducts crusades inquisitions. Some and probably think Jesus Christ was a Gentile. None of them would have knowledge of the Messiah's definition of a Christian: "Ye shall know my disciples by their love" (John 13:35).

And so indeed, we sing, "They shall know we are Christians by our love," but apparently "they" does not include Israel. I wonder what the King of the Jews thinks of that!

I think if churches sent missionaries to Israel and did good works for the Jewish people there, it would seem a more reasonable thing to the government that some of their citizens might believe in Christ. As it is, they cannot even



A NOTE FROM ZOLA



Dear Friends,

Let me try to give you some of my thoughts, for what they're worth, on events of the past month:

The Hamas organization, from which the Palestinian deportees come, wants to destroy as many Arabs as they do Israelis. Their first target is the peace conference, and their next would be the moderate Arabs (like Sadat, for example). Even though CNN and the New York Times find nothing but poets, painters and doctors among them, they are cop-killers according to the Israelis (and I know who gives the more reliable picture of the news). These 400-odd thugs have utterly dominated world news as if there was some importance to their bloody cause. No one has seemed to notice that the murders of police and security personnel stopped immediately upon the deportations. It will take them some time to reorganize and so a few people will live a little longer, until the media breaks them loose. CNN itself referred to Israel's sad "season of funerals" which directly preceded the deportations. Their constant agitating about this nothing situation reminds me of NBC's placing the sparking devices under the GM trucks to make them explode, creating some kind of conflagration in the minds of the viewers when really nothing happened.

During the exhaustive media coverage of the fabled 400, among whom a few stuffed noses are the major casualties, India experienced 600 killed and 2,000 wounded in its own ethnic clashes, and Bosnians cannot even attend their funerals for fear of snipers.

A quote from Yasser Arafat: "Peace will be when Israel is no more," (as quoted by Reverend Jan van der Hoeven of the International Christian Embassy Jerusalem).

Pat Buchanan is back on *Crossfire*, alternating with John Sununu. It's like a contest of clowns hitting each other with pies and imagining they're doing some kind of serious service for the audience.

General Motors and NBC continue their betrayal contest in a wonderful fulfillment of Matthew 24:10, many shall "be offended, shall betray one another, and shall hate one another."

Much more happened this month, including the President's new economic package, but I'll reserve comment for further developments. In the meantime, this is an interesting time to be alive, especially because Israel is back in its land and Jerusalem, in answer to prophecy, is becoming indeed "a burdensome stone for all nations" (Zech. 12:3).

DOUBLE STANDARD FOR ISRAEL

The outcry over Israel's deportation of 415 Palestinians is another example of the hypocritical double standard to which the strife-ridden region's only democratic nation is held.

Israel, following the kidnapping and torture-murder of an Israeli military

officer last year, deported the Palestinians to a no-man's land between Israel and Lebanon in mid-December. Ever since, the world has been treated to much wailing by the Palestinians' Arab brothers. The United States, too, signed on to a United Nations Security Council resolution demanding that Israel repatriate the deportees.

One needn't condone Israel's actions, however, to understand the country's motives. And the comparisons that have arisen — such as comparing Israel with Iraq under Saddam Hussein or equating the deportations with Serbians slaughtering Muslims in Bosnia — are patently absurd.

Israel deported the Palestinians because they are members of the radical group known as Hamas, the very same group that claimed responsibility for last year's murder of the Israeli officer.

"It is the fate of the Jews to be slaughtered at our hands," Hamas teachings say. "We have taken upon ourselves to fulfill our obligation to society and to torture them, because torture is the fate of the Jews."

Life is no doubt difficult for the Hamas partisans as they endure a cold, harsh winter in the no-man's land of southern Lebanon. They should consider themselves lucky. Their treatment at the hands of the Israeli government is far more benign than what the governments of Syria, Iraq, Iran — name any of the region's Muslim autocracies — would extend to any Israeli national.

A Look at The Book

God's forgiveness is

inexhaustible and is

activated by the

repentance of His people.

This is the second part of our study of the message of the minor prophets. Last month we focused on God's intense, passionate and protective love for His Covenant people Israel. This month we will explore additional aspects of the relationship between God and Israel found in the writings of the prophets Amos, Hosea, Micah, Nahum, Zephaniah, Joel and Obadiah.

The prophets continually convey God's overwhelming love and capacity for forgiveness. The Lord exhibits great mercies toward His people and, although they may be disobedient, He continually calls them to repentance. He is compassionate and longs

to shower His mercies upon His people, if only they will heed His call to return to Him. The prophet Joel calls on the Jewish people to rend their hearts and return to God (2:12-13). Zephaniah tells them to seek the Lord

before the coming judgment, when it will be too late (2:3). God is the source of life and will be gracious toward those who seek Him (Amos 5:4). Micah tells the people that if they will return, in His compassion God will cast all of their sins into the sea (7:19). There is tremendous continuity in the Lord's program — the offer available to Israel 2,500 years ago is still open to them today, and also to us! We simply need to avail ourselves of His gracious offer.

As He awaits His people's eventual and inevitable repentance God is infinitely patient and longsuffering. His people will be granted forgiveness and restoration into a right relationship with Him as they are faithful to the Covenant (Nahum 1:3; Hosea Micah 7:18-20). 2:23: forgiveness is inexhaustible but is always

portrayed by the prophets as being activated by the repentance of His people. The motivating concept is that the



initiative must be taken by both parties to the Covenant.

All too often today evangelicals have neglected the social issues with which the Lord is concerned in both the Old and New Testaments. In the important quest for correct doctrine and evangelism, the explicit social obligations God requires have taken a back seat. The prophetic voice offers a

potent corrective to this negligence. The message is clear - God is good and is the sustainer and great source of strength for all His people. The prophets portray God as being particularly

concerned with the helpless.

are incapable of helping Those who themselves are offered refuge in Him (Nahum 1:7). He has a special concern and relationship with the oppressed, humble, the lame and the outcast. He promises to uplift and exalt them (Micah 4:6-7; Zeph. 3:19). The Lord Jesus Himself expresses nothing less throughout the gospel record. The Jewish people have traditionally taken this portion of the prophetic message to heart and even today, as a people, are extremely involved in social causes and various charities. As the people of the Covenant they are very much aware of their obligation to all other peoples.

course, the restoration of Israel. The of Amos. Joel. Micah and writings Zephaniah resound with this promise. The Jewish people will be the praise of the whole world as God restores their fortunes (Zeph. 3:20) and as they walk in eternal harmony with their God in mutual faithfulness to the Covenant (Amos 9:14-15; Joel 2:18-27; Micah 2:12: 4:1-8: 5:7-8). This will be the New Covenant spoken of by the prophets Jeremiah and Ezekiel and will permanently written on their hearts and not on stone tablets.

God's authority and power extend far beyond the restoration of Israel.

The minor prophets portray the majestic God as sovereign and in control of world events (Hosea 4:1-10; 5:8-15). As the omnipotent God of the whole earth, His authority and power extend far beyond the the restoration of Israel. He has power over natural forces and is mightier than any armies. He is irresistible and nothing can withstand His awesome power (Nahum 1:2-14; Micah 4:13). Amos eloquently extols the might of the Lord who directs the course of nature itself. He blesses or curses the land as He wills, creates the seas and the stars in the skies, and causes the sun to rise and set (5:8: 9:5-6). This was and is a compelling reminder to a small and powerless people that the God who parted the Red Sea would continue to superintend their safety. In our ever-changing world of wars, revolutions, famines, earthquakes, hurricanes and "ethnic cleansing," this is a formidable reality for us also remember.

God is holy and righteous, and because of attributes He cannot tolerate wickedness. He must punish wickedness, even if it means punishing His Covenant people. Because to whom much is given much is expected, a harsh judgment upon Israel is promised if they are performing iniquity. As Paul writes in Romans, just as salvation is to the Jew first, so too is judgment for unrighteousness (1:16; 2:9). Wickedness in any form results in righteous and holy judgment (Hosea 8:1-14; Micah 6:9-11). A prevalent theme in the prophets is the "Day of the Lord," a time of great judgment both locally on Israel and universally on the nations. God is the ultimate judge of the whole earth (Zeph. 1:2-4: Joel 2:1-11).

The basis for God's judgment on Israel will be her transgression of the Mosaic Covenant. The sins of God's people are enumerated throughout the prophetic literature. It appears that Israel collectively broke each of the Ten Commandments (with the possible exception of the Sabbath). Israel's rebellion against God's precepts, their abominable continuance in idolatry, rejection and neglect of the Lord and His Covenant could not be tolerated and the prophets prophesied stern judgment (Micah 1:3-5; Zeph. 1:4-6; 3:11). However, it is scripturally clear that God does not categorically pronounce judgment without indicating some means to escape from the coming wrath, and the Lord admonishes His people to seek Him before it is too late (Zeph. 2:1-3; Hosea 2:2,14). Furthermore, it is God's judgment of His people that refines and purifies them and ultimately leads to their salvation (Zeph. 3:11-20; Micah 5:10-15; Amos 9:9-10). Next month we will investigate what the minor prophets teach concerning the basis of God's judgment of the Gentile nations.


