"A Tale of Honor and Faith"

During a recent speaking engagement, I made the acquaintance of the inspiring lady who is the subject of the following article. The story appeared in the Bloomington, Indiana, Herald-Times under the byline of Dann Denny.

When 74-year-old Cecilia Rexin is asked what she learned during her eight years in prison and concentration camps before and during World War II, her gray-green eyes sparkle and her wrinkled face spreads into a smile. "I find that when everything is taken from you," she says, pointing a bony finger toward the sky, "God is enough."

Rexin ought to know. In the camps, she was beaten, starved and humiliated. A tattered dress was her only possession. Her "name" was No. 2675.

But she says that even in her darkest, loneliest hours, God was with her. And that through him, she was able to not only forgive her oppressors, but pray for them.

Rexin's story begins in 1936, as Hitler was preparing to thrust the world into World War II. Rexin, a German citizen and medical student, became enraged when she saw a number of Jewish friends disappear, never to be seen again.

"I say to myself, "Why do the Germans hate the Jews?" she says. "What did they do to deserve this kind of hatred?" Joining the underground movement, Rexin helped hide Jews from German authorities and make passports for them to flee the country. But at age 19, she was turned in to the Gestapo by her best friend and arrested as a political prisoner.

She spent three years in a German prison, then five years in concentration camps at Auschwitz and Ravensbruck.

While at Ravensbruck, Rexin became friends with Corrie Ten Boom, the Dutch woman who's written a number of best-selling books, including *The Hiding Place*, in which she describes how her Christian faith sustained her during her stark existence in the camps.

Auschwitz also was the home of Josef Mengele, the doctor who conducted heinous experiments on hundreds of Jews and Gypsies in an attempt to advance his medical career. Immaculately dressed in a white medical coat and white gloves, Mengele was known by the Jews as the "Angel of Death."

"He seem very nice and charming, like someone you want to invite into your home," says Rexin in broken English. "Once an old Jewish woman fell down and he helped her to her feet. But in his medical laboratory, he treats the prisoners like guinea pigs. He injects dye into their eyes to see if he can change their eye color, cut their limbs off to see how long it takes for gangrene to set in, and see how long they can survive after being injected with a virus."

As bad as Auschwitz was, Ravensbruck was worse. "When I first go there, I get sick from the smell of human flesh," she says. "Day and night, I smell the bodies from the mass killings. The first few weeks, I spend a lot of time leaning over toilet, throwing up. Then I get used to it; I not smell it anymore."

During her first year at Ravensbruck, says Rexin, there were no gas chambers to dispose of the weak, old or infirm. So the guards would load them into a truck, attach a hose to the exhaust pipe and wedge the hose into the truck's window.

Rexin will never forget the Ravensbruck guards, some of whom seemed to have no conscience.

"One day a guard was playing with two small children," she says. "They were throwing a stone to one another. Suddenly, the guard pick them up and smash their heads together, killing them both. Then he laugh."

It was at Ravensbruck that Rexin received a number of brutal beatings, some of which left her hanging onto life by a thread.

"They take you into a room in the basement and throw you over a table, face down," she says. "They hold you down by tying a leather strap around your ankles and another strap around your back.

"Then they force two women prisoners to hit you with clubs made of hard rubber. They always whack you 25 times, and you have to count the strokes out loud. If you lose count, they start over again."

One of Rexin's floggings came after a guard discovered she had been hiding a young Jewish girl.

"The little girl's family had been killed in the War, and they going to ship her to Auschwitz, so I hide her in the crawl space beneath my barracks," says Rexin. "I steal food and blankets for her. The girl become very attached to me. She call me Mama."

But her worst thrashing came after a guard heard her, on Christmas Eve, remark to a fellow prisoner. "They kill 3,000 Jews today. How can they now go home and celebrate the birth of a resurrected Jew?"

Rexin's final days at Ravensbruck were hellish. On a snowy December day, a guard caught her trying to smuggle a loaf of bread and some medicine into the barracks where the Jewish prisoners were housed.

She was tossed into a 3- by 5-foot cell. Inside, it was pitch black and frigid. The cell had a register, but the heat had been turned off. There was also a bed, but it was bolted sideways onto the cell wall, forcing Rexin to sleep on the concrete floor.

She lived in the cell for eight weeks — barely surviving on water and scraps of food. She spent her days sitting on a stool in total darkness, shivering in her short-sleeved cotton dress and wooden shoes.

Just when it seemed as if things could get no worse, they did. For five consecutive days, Rexin was given no food — only cups of water. By this time, she had developed pneumonia, and her strength was so sapped she could barely stand up.

In utter desperation, she dropped to her knees and prayed, "It's OK, God, if you want me to die and be with you. But I've been here seven and one-half years and I don't want to die now. Please God, please let me live."

An hour later, she heard a key slip into the lock. Her cell door swung open and a young man from the Swedish Red Cross walked

in. When he saw her emaciated, quivering body, a look of horror swept over his face. He turned and rushed out of the door.

Thirty minutes later, he returned with a huge meal — a plate of meat, a boiled cabbage, liverwurst, and 23 potatoes. Rexin devoured every morsel.

The man then unbolted the bed from the wall and set it up in her cell. Moments after he left, Rexin felt a blast of warm air rushing through the register.

"It was a miracle," says Rexin. "In my darkness, my Heavenly Father hear my prayer and reach down to me."

Near the end of the war, Rexin was transferred to an ammunition factory to make bullets for the German army. But her health was failing. She weighed only 79 pounds and her damaged kidneys ached from the beatings.

On January 2, 1945, she heard a celebration in the streets outside the factory. It was a

convoy of American soldiers who had come to free them. "I was so excited I run out into street, throw my arms around an American soldier and kiss him," she says. "The soldier cried."

After the war's conclusion, Rexin began putting her life back together. She married, gave birth to a daughter and went to work as a nurse in a German hospital.

But her past continued to hound her. "I could not get rid of the smell of burning flesh," she says. "And I have many night-mares about the camps."

In 1974, Rexin moved from Germany to Bloomington to be with her daughter, Nancy Evans — a single mother who was raising three children at the time. Today, Rexin lives in a small apartment southwest of Bloomington.

When Rexin applied for permanent residency in the United states, she was required by the federal government to fill out a number of forms. One of them asked the question, "Have you ever aided in the overthrow of a government?" With pride, she checked the box marked "yes."

A few days later, a pair of stern-looking men in gray suits came to see her at her Bloomington home. They said they were from Washington, D.C., and wanted to know what kind of subversive activity she had been engaged in.

When she told them the government she'd tried to sabotage was Nazi Germany, they laughed. She got her green card a week later.

Though it's been nearly half a century since Rexin spent those dehumanizing years in the camps, she still carries the scars on her back and the atrocities in her mind.

A Look at the Book

It is an imposing reality that God will judge the peoples of the entire earth. Last month we explored what the minor prophets wrote concerning the Lord's sovereignty and righteousness. The prophets warned their readers of the great and terrible "Day of the Lord," the future period when the divine magistrate will exercise perfect and universal justice. We have seen that the basis for God's judgment of Israel is her transgression of the Mosaic Covenant. This month we will examine the basis of God's dealings with the Gentile nations, a study charged with consequence for every American today.

According to the minor prophets there are two standards by which God judges the Gentile nations. The first basis is the extent to which the natural law of conscience has been transgressed. While they did not have the privilege of

God's revealed law in the days of the prophets, it is no secret that the Gentiles acted abominably in disobedience to natural justice and law. Filling their corrupt cup full to the brim, these nations were involved in the occult and in countless other

forms of continued wickedness and were especially unjust in their treatment of other nations (Amos 1:3 - 2:3; Micah 5:15; 7:13; Nahum 3:4-5).

The Bible most clearly teaches the concept of natural, universally revealed law in the first chapter of Paul's letter to the Romans and in the ancient Hebrew prophetic writings. Application of this same idea was presented by the writers of our own Declaration of Independence and United States Constitution.

Scripture reveals that there are absolute standards of right and wrong that cannot be explained away by culture, temperament or environment. For example, the entire world recoils at the atrocities being committed in what was once Yugoslavia. Indiscriminate murder and rape are obvious and unambiguous violations of natural law. The world has definite moral absolutes, the prophets teach, because we have a moral Lawgiver. National violations of natural law will not go unpunished. Justice will

be dispensed by the true Supreme Court.

As his second basis for judgment, God will deal with the nations proportionate to how they have dealt with His nation Israel. This is in fulfillment of the Abrahamic Covenant, often quoted

by Zola. The nations which come against Israel are seen by the Lord as coming against Him; He takes it rather personally. The prophets are unequivocal that God will curse those that curse Israel, either personally or nationally (Nahum 1:9-11; 2:1-2; Micah 7:10, 16-17).

God is the ultimate and awesome avenger of His people; vengeance belongs to Him. Nahum records that the Lord is jealous and avenging and no one can stand before His wrath (1:2,6). The Lord will right every wrong done to His people Israel and will gather all the nations into

the awesome valley of decision. There they will be judged specifically on how they treated Israel. The prophet Joel warns that the blood of the multitudes will flow freely in the wine-press of God's wrath (3:1-16).

In God's righteous justice the punishment will always fit the crime. This perfect justice is prophesied by Obadiah. As the nations have done, so will it be done to them (15). Those who plunder will be plundered. Those who destroy will be destroyed utterly (Nahum 2:3-10). Within this context it is apparent that God is the deliverer of His people and though judgment comes first, deliverance will follow soon after.

The Lord will eventually restore His people, Joel promises, and they will never again be made a reproach among the nations. The marauding armies will be thrown into the sea by the Lord Himself, the God of His chosen people (2:18-20). Let that stand as a warning to all hostile Arab nations or terrorist organizations that "vow to drive Israel into the sea!" Find yourself a Bible, Mr. Arafat; you don't realize Whom you are up against! As the Lord has delivered His people in the past (Amos 2:10; Micah 6:4; 7:15) so He will in the future!

The prophets picture the Lord as a mighty warrior, fit for battle in defense of His people. Joel and Nahum describe the visible appearance of the Lord of Hosts arrayed and descending into battle (Joel 3:16; Nahum 1:2-8; 2:13). Zephaniah portrays Him as a victorious warrior in the midst of His people (3:17). This is the great comfort and assurance of Israel.

Finally, as God exalts the humble and the lowly, He delights in humbling the arrogant and proud. This theme is repeated in all seven of the prophetic books we are studying and refers to both the nations and Israel. Nations which believe they are impregnable are brought low, those who boast of their might are decimated, and those who trust in themselves and their armaments will be gone with the wind (Obad. 3-4; Nahum 3:8-13; Zeph 2:10,15; 3:11-12; Hosea 10:13; 12:8; Micah 5:10-11; Amos 3:14). The former Soviet Union is a consummate contemporary example of this theme.

These past lessons have concentrated on the prophets' revelations about God. Next month we will contemplate what is perhaps the most impacting and graphic arena within the prophetic writings as we grapple with what they reveal about man's relationship with God.






