"A Place Among Nations"

Now and then we see an article of such interest and import, we find we just can't say it better. The following editorial by A. M. Rosenthal appeared in The New York Times on May 11, 1993. We have made slight edits for space considerations.

Judging by journalistic and diplomatic attention to their views, nearly half the Jews of Israel have vanished, snap. They are the voters who refused to support Labor and other parties in the coalition that now runs the country with a thin parliamentary majority...Labor was fully entitled by the 1992 election to change Israeli strategy and set its fast pace toward the goal of peace for land...But not always. The previous Likud Government turned national political power into international propaganda debacle, and made the Labor opposition the favorite of foreign journalism and diplomacy...

And of course Bushbaker's vivid enmity toward Likud helped. ("Bushbaker" is the writer's term for the past administration. Like me, he thought James Baker did so much of Bush's thinking that he deserves full credit for all that happened.) So did the tendency of Western journalism to see the 150 million Arabs as the underdog to Israel's 4.1 million Jews. This perception is encouraged by Arabists in Western foreign offices, who outnumber pro-Israelis in roughly the same proportion.

So while Labor gets the attention it won, journalism and diplomacy seem unable to

consider the arguments of the present opposition that exchanging land for promises of Arab good conduct is neither to the interests of peace nor Israel nor the West, which may again discover common security interest with Israel, but perhaps too late. Israel is the name, not Lazarus.

But in a new book Benjamin Netanyahu, Likud's new leader, makes it difficult to pass over those arguments without paying attention. Readers of *"A Place Among Nations"* (Bataam) will agree or disagree with him. But without reading it, people seriously interested in the Mideast will remain intellectual bystanders, ducking the historic discourse it forces open.

Mr. Netanyahu sees the defense of Israel as possible only within the "walls" of time and space that the Golan Heights and the high ground of the West Bank provide. Nothing, he says, is as important to Israel as a good mountaintop — and few things as dangerous as the creation of still another Arab state, this one smack within Israeli defense

boundaries already only a few minutes wide. If that means living with the rifle, Mr. Netanyahu plainly sees it as the choice to lying dead beside it.

The decision on its peace strategy is Israel's. But the bulk of the book is not about the "peace process" but an important analysis of the myths, distortions and lies that created and sustained almost a century of warfare — first against the dream of a Jewish homeland and then the state itself.

When Israel dared survive four military wars and never-ending religious, political and economic warfare, this same propaganda structure was used to turn Israel from small hero to huge villain, one of the great propaganda triumphs of all time.

Point by point he dissects the mythology now so casually accepted in the West. There was no separate Palestinian Arab identity that was smothered by the Jews — Arabs knew of no such thing until they invented it. The existence of Israel is not the central cause of Mideast problems — that honor goes to the wars and terrorism among the Muslim dictatorships. Neither Israel's nationhood nor its military victories created Arab hatred against Jews — the Grand Mufti, Yasir Arafat's hero, begged Hitler for his very own Holocaust against Jews.

And no gulf about the goal of Israel's destruction divides the P.L.O. and various fundamentalists — mostly tactics. Should Israel be eliminated in one phase, or two?

Mr. Netanyahu, who could be Israeli's next prime minister, believes that Israel can survive only though peace by deterrence, as it has all the years of its life — unless and until real political freedoms come to the Arab Mideast.

Only those liberties can in time dilute the power of Arab dictators to make war at will against Israel, each other, or any Western target of their choice. Strange — the West says hardly a word to push for democracy in the Arab lands, the one place in the world where it is so peculiarly mute. Mr. Netanyahu wonders why that is so. Perhaps somebody in Washington could tell him and the rest of us.

"The Big Lie"

An article entitled, "Blessed are the Peacemakers..." appeared in *The Colorado Episcopalian* recently. We found it interesting that the author, Marjorie Hyer (formerly a religion editor of the *Washington Post*), chose for her title words taken from our Lord's Sermon on the Mount. Hanan Ashrawi, the Palestinian delegate to the Middle East "peace talks," proclaims her Christianity, yet perpetuates the big lie that Bethlehem, the birthplace of King David and of the Jewish Jesus Christ, is a "Palestinian" town.

The article purported that "an American evangelical broadcaster challenged the Pales-tinian demand that Israel exchange land for peace, arguing that the Arab world had been poor stewards of 'Judea and Samari'. These biblical terms for the occupied West Bank area, where Ashrawi lives and where Palestinians are seeking to establish an independent state, are code words for Israel's religion-based claim to the area," claims the writer. These "code words" were in use for nearly 4,000 years before Western journalists arrived.

Ashrawi did not respond to the charge that the Arab world had been poor stewards of Judea and Samaria, but instead, she sidestepped the issue and responded, "I find your reference to 'Judea and Samaria' a statement of extreme bias and rather offensive. I am a Palestinian Christian, and I know what Christianity is. I am a descendant of the first Christians in the world, and Jesus Christ was born in my country - in my land. Bethlehem is a Palestinian town. So I will not accept this one-upmanship on Christianity. Nobody has the monopoly." I could not believe she really said this. This lady is a descendant of Jesus as I am a descendant of Sitting Bull. (My people decided to squat on this land, so by her reasoning I guess Sitting Bull is my

ancestor!) That she finds the terms "Judea and Samaria" to be of "extreme bias and rather offensive" is presumptuous — Abraham was given the land in 4,000 B.C.

CNN and the other media pointed out that when the Palestinians closed the borders of the territories, the Palestinians became destitute, being totally dependent on the Israeli economy for their daily bread.

Perhaps the article's introduction, "It seems appropriate to profile an Anglican woman a product of the church in that area — who is playing an important role in the effort to bring peace to the Holy Land," sums up this church's tolerance of the big lie. Who's to say just what will happen to the Holy Land if Christians (in name, at least) continue to accept such fantastic allegations as truth?

WHY ISLAMIC FUNDAMENTALISTS ARE WINNING

The following article appeared in The New York Times on March 22, 1993. The author, Bradford R. McGuinn, teaches international relations at Florida International University. We thought you'd benefit from the thoughtprovoking insight the author presents.

It is tempting to dismiss the Islamic fundamentalists accused of bombing the World Trade Center as fanatics like the Waco cultists. Yet to do so would be to ignore the fact that Islamic radicals in America and the Middle East are successfully pursuing an ambitious political agenda. Energized by new trends in the Middle East, fundamentalist forces are seeking to undermine America's position in the region and will bring terrorism to our shores.

A crisis of authority is evident in the widening gap between discredited, though tenacious, regimes and restive civil societies. Charismatic rulers can no longer bewitch the masses with secular ideological incantations. Even raw power may not suppress the growth of Islamic radicalism, the only ideology enjoying widespread legitimacy....

Despite its reputation for turmoil (unfortunately), the outstanding characteristic of modern Arab politics has been the stability of its leadership. King Hussein has ruled since the 1950's. Hafez al-Assad, Saddam Hussein, Muammar el-Qaddafi and Yasir Arafat came to power between 1968 and 1970. Along with the Persian Gulf rulers and the Egyptian regimes of Anwar el-Sadat and Hosni Mubarak, these men have long held sway, defining the Middle East's political culture.

This will change as the old elite loses its grip on power. A revolt is under way, with "baby boomers" rejecting their fathers' secular ideologies and preoccupations. The young generation seems to favor an Islamic agenda featuring militant rejection of the old guard's compromises with the West and Israel.

The region's increasing independence from outside powers and the world's growing indifference to its problems play into the fundamentalists' hands. During the cold war, superpower rivalries defined disputes. With the Soviet Union gone and the U.S. emphasizing its domestic problems, more than at any time since World War II local passions will determine Mideast politics.

In the absence of a sustained U.S. presence, it is difficult to imagine such allies as Egypt and Saudi Arabia heading a stable regional order for very long, lacking as they do general ideological and political support... Today, an informal network of activists oppose America, Israel and the secular Arab elite... Even more menacing is the realization that the war between the fundamentalists and the old order can be fought in America... Is it now America's turn to play host to the third world's traumas? Operatives of Hamas, Hezbollah, Algeria's Islamic Salvation Front and Sheik Omar Abdel-Rahman's Islamic followers have been exploiting the freedom of speech and movement the U.S. offers to recruit, raise funds and plan terrorism ...

For some, "progress in the peace process" will offer a way out of trouble. Yet treaties, even if obtainable, will not save the Arab secularists or neutralize the radicals... As the sole superpower, America will have to confront its challenges in the region and at home resolutely and perhaps brutally. Otherwise, the Islamic enemies of moderate Arab rulers will be doubly emboldened if they can strike with impunity in their world and ours.

A Look at the Book By Steve Ger

Over the last few months we have concentrated on the nature of God as revealed by seven of the twelve minor prophets (Amos, Hosea, Micah, Obadiah, Joel, Habakkuk and Zephaniah). This month we contemplate what these prophets teach about man's relationship with God. The prophets wrote in the context of ancient Israel, yet their scope is not limited by culture or time. Although the basis of Israel's relationship to God was His covenant with them, these prophets paint with broad strokes on their theological canvas. Whereas the Lord created through His Son's blood a New Covenant between Himself and believers today, the basic truths these prophets proclaim about God and his relationship with man have not changed.

Even in biblical times, Jewish faith was intensely directed toward the future: future redemption, national deliver-

ance and supremacy, the coming of Messiah, etc. The emphasis of their faith, however, was on present responsibility. This responsibility was the keeping of the Covenant. As divinely promised, obedience to the Covenant brought blessing and disobedience provoked punishment. No matter how the nation as a corporate entity behaved, there would always be a faithful remnant who obeyed the Covenant. Even in the midst of the worst national apostasy, the Lord would never reject that remnant nor fail to bless it. The standard of God's measure for His people was the Covenant. There was much expected of them by way of obedience to and faith in their God.

Israel had to follow certain basic guidelines in maintaining a right relationship with God. Joel admonished the people to rejoice in God who had blessed them freely and

deals wondrously (2:23-26). Hosea stressed that the people must make God alone their refuge and that they must trust in



Him alone, not themselves or their allies (5:13; 7:8-11; 8:9-10; 12:1; 14:2-3). How appropriate this truth still is today for the contemporary nation of Israel with whom He has dealt so wondrously! He alone must be their trustworthy refuge — not the peace process, loan guarantees or even the United States.

Social injustice was a major breach of the Covenant that the prophets addressed. God

is not only concerned with His people's relationship with Himself, but also with their relationships with each other. The Lord's justice needs to be reflected in His people. His

holiness and righteousness have vast ethical implications for his people, individually and corporately. The Jewish people today hold this as arguably the most important aspect of Covenant. Their historical and contemporary commitment to social justice has its roots here in the pages of the Old Testament in the writings of Amos and Micah.

It is beneficial for believers to turn their attention to the timeless message of these two prophets. This message is not limited to "liberal" Christians and is not to be ignored or belittled by those who would define the entire mission of the church as "soul winning." True religion, biblically defined, cannot divorce itself from the cries of the

oppressed. The Bible teaches that evangelism and the quest for social justice are both to be our concerns, for they are God's concerns.

The injustice that men manifest toward each other comes under harshest condemnation by the prophets. The Lord promises that it will result in judgment. He declares that it is not to continue. Both Micah and Amos are quite eloquent, even graphic, on the subject. Micah compares economic exploitation with cannibalism and warns the Southern kingdom, "Hear now...you who hate good and love evil, who tear off their skin from them and their flesh from their bones, and who eat the flesh of my people...and chop them up as for the pot, and as meat in a kettle" (3:1-3).

Amos, a contemporary of Micah who ministered in the Northern kingdom, likewise warns the "fat cats" in most explicit terms that their time is almost up. "Hear this

word, you cows of Bashan...who oppress the poor, who crush the needy...Behold, the days are coming upon you when they will take you away with meat hooks" (4:1-2). The gross sins of injustice would not go This supreme unpunished. is the admonition of Micah and Amos throughout their messages (Micah 2:1-4,8-9; 3:9-12; Amos 2:6-8; 3:15; 5:10-20; 8:4-8). The requirement of righteousness and justice for all people is rallied by Amos in his awesome credo, the theme of his work, "Hate evil, love good, and establish justice in the gate...Let justice roll down like waters and righteousness like an ever-flowing stream" (5:14-15,24).

How relevant this message is in our world today. How great is the need for the words of these men to permeate our souls and

burn into our hearts. This is a divinely appointed responsibility the church must continue to pursue in the midst of our decaying society. God's people are to seek the Lord in righteousness and meekness. The prophets urged the people to repent of their wrongdoing. Every year in the fall, Jewish people worldwide celebrate the Day of Atonement, Yom Kippur. On this day there is strict fasting, mourning, synagogue observance as past sins against God are remembered and repented for. Last September I had the privilege to be in Jerusalem on this day and was a firsthand witness to the throngs of repentant Jews gathered at the Western Wall. On that day it was truly the "Wailing Wall" as tears and ascended to the heavens. prayers Repentance leads to the Lord's restoration. As Joel wrote, true repentance is not vain outward, ritualistic show, but is rather an

inward repentance wherein the heart, and not just the garment, is rent (2:12-14).

The Lord is the Divine Healer who will restore His people both to health and eventually to glory

(Zeph. 2:3; Hosea 5:14; 6:1,3; 14:2-4), even after the most awesome judgment. Indeed, the godly are told to await judgment patiently for ultimately it will result in their salvation. Righteousness is learned through judgment (Zeph. 3:11-20). Micah expresses this concept so eloquently, "I will watch expectantly for the Lord, I will wait for the God of my salvation...Though I fall I will rise; though I dwell in darkness the Lord is light for me...I will see His righteousness" (7:7-9).

In the conclusion of our study next month, we will focus on the minor prophets' writings about judgment for the unrighteous and worship: God's requirements and man's responsibilities.

True religion cannot divorce itself from the cries of the oppressed.
