If the American threat of preemptive military action against Iraq inflamed the Muslim world over the winter, the war itself fanned the flames, with a sharp new rise in hostility toward the United States, the latest Pew survey has found.

Animosity is so high that solid majorities in five populations surveyed expressed confidence in Osama bin Laden to "do the right thing" in world affairs.

And, at a time when the Israeli government has accepted the right of Palestinians to statehood, most Muslim populations surveyed believe by wide margins that the needs of Palestinians cannot be met so long as the state of Israel exists.

The poll, conducted by the Pew Global Attitudes Project, surveyed more than 15,000 people in May. Muslim populations included were Indonesia, Jordan, Kuwait, Lebanon, Morocco, Nigeria, Pakistan, the Palestinian Authority, and Turkey.

The survey shows that negative attitudes among Muslims toward the United States have soared anew since the war, both in the Middle East and beyond.

Anti-Americanism peaked in Jordan, where 99 percent of the people now CONTINUED ON PAGE 3 Arab Democracy?



have a somewhat or very unfavorable opinion of the United States, up from 75 percent last summer, the survey found. Hostility was also extremely high in the Palestinian Authority (98 percent).

More than eight out of 10 in Turkey and Pakistan questioned since the war have a negative view of the United States, as do seven out of 10 in Lebanon, and two-thirds in Morocco. The most extreme shift was seen in Indonesia, where 61 percent had a favorable opinion last summer but now only 15 percent do.

Steven Simon, an analyst of Muslim affairs with the Rand Corporation, said the about-face in Indonesia could be explained by "a rising sense of Islamic identity of a kind that is new" for that country.

Part of this new self-perception, he said, is tied to the return of people who went through the Islamic fundamentalist camps in Afghanistan and became radicalized there.

As for the spike in hostility in Jordan, he said, the war in Iraq was "colossally unpopular" there and heightened the resentment of the country's largely Palestinian population, who already saw US policies in the Middle East as "helping to perpetuate a situation that is grossly unfair to Palestinians."

Even in Nigeria, traditionally a friend of the United States, favorable opinion sank to 61 percent after the war from 77 percent last summer.

Several Muslim populations also express strong dislike of Americans as people. Nine out of 10 Palestinians, eight out of 10 Jordanians, and 60 percent of Turks say they feel somewhat or very unfavorable toward Americans. The rise is sharpest in Jordan, where fewer than half had a negative view last summer.

Distrust today blazes so brightly that majorities in seven of eight Muslim

populations surveyed—Turkey, Indonesia, Nigeria, Pakistan, Lebanon, Jordan, and Kuwait—expressed fears that the United States could become a military threat to their country.

In Morocco, 79 percent said they felt Islam was under serious threat today, and people in other countries largely agreed, in many cases far more strongly than last summer. In Pakistan, for example, 64 percent now say Islam is seriously threatened, up from 28 percent in summer 2002. The threat is perceived most sharply in Jordan, by 97 percent, up from 81 percent last summer.

Perhaps as a consequence, bin Laden was one of the three "leaders" most trusted by the nine Muslim populations surveyed, outranking even the UN secretary-general, Kofi Annan. The Qaeda leader's confidence rating was matched only by Yasser Arafat, leader of the Palestine Liberation Organization, and Crown Prince Abdullah of Saudi Arabia.

As for the crisis in the Middle East, in a wave of sentiment that bodes ill for the future of the US-sponsored "road map" to peace, Muslims lined up strongly behind the opinion that "the rights and needs of the Palestinian people cannot be taken care of as long as the state of Israel exists." The conviction that no way can be found for Israel and the Palestinians to coexist is strongest in Morocco (90 percent), followed by Jordan (85 percent), the Palestinian Authority (80 percent), Kuwait (72 percent), Lebanon (65 percent), Indonesia (58 percent), and Pakistan (57 percent).

Overall, Muslim populations see US policies as destabilizing the Middle East, as do pluralities in many other countries surveyed. Nearly 50 percent take this view in France and Spain, as do 63 percent in Morocco, 74 percent in Indonesia, and 91 percent in Jordan.

Regarding the US-led war, disappointment was widespread among Muslims that Iraq put up so little resistance. More than 70 percent shared this view in Turkey, Indonesia, Pakistan, Lebanon, Jordan, Morocco, and the Palestinian Authority. The notable exception was Kuwait, which was invaded by Iraq in 1990, and where 61 percent said they were happy Iraq did not put up much of a fight.

Despite the animosity toward America, the survey found "a considerable appetite in the Muslim world for political freedoms," the Pew report says.

A considerable part of the Christian fundamentalist community in the United States has by now convinced itself that Islam represents evil, and that US war with the Islamic world is part of the biblical plan.

This bigoted, theologically ignorant and dangerous idea has a sophisticated counterpart in the widely circulated proposition that Muslims are incapable of democracy.

Samuel Huntington's mischievous argument that the "next world war" will be a clash of civilizations included an assertion that Muslims are peculiarly and uniquely given to violence.

The scholar Bernard Lewis' bestselling book on Islam and modern history, *What Went Wrong*, ends on a "with us or against us" note that contributes to an intellectual climate of Islamic-Western confrontation.

There is a pragmatic challenge to this idea in an article by Larry Diamond of the Hoover Institution that appears in the latest issue of the Washingtonbased journal *Policy Review*, titled "Universal Democracy?"

While democracy is indeed absent from the 16 Arab Middle Eastern countries, Diamond writes, this is not true for the world's 27 other Muslim-majority nations, whose record on democratic development differs little from the international average.

His explanation is politically convincing. Since 1948, the Palestinian-Israeli conflict has become a paralyzing political obsession in the Arab world. It has generated "a powerful symbolic struggle over Arab identity and dignity. Until the fog of this struggle is lifted," Diamond writes, "genuine and lasting democratization will be unlikely in the region." As you can see from the chart below, Israel is the only free country in the Middle East. Other Muslim nations that border this region (not given on the chart) include Algeria, Tunis, Ethiopia, Nigeria, Morocco, Afghanistan, and Pakistan. But adding these doesn't help. None of these are free, either. They may be called "Islamic Republics" or "Constitutional Monarchies" but it is all formalities. They are police states. In each case, one man basically owns all the people and all the land. — Zola

Arab Vs. Arab

One Palestinian was killed and more than 30 were wounded in clashes between two Palestinian clans in the Hebron marketplace Wednesday.

A mob of more than 1,000 Palestinians destroyed cars and stores and fired shots at each other. Calm was restored by the Israel Defense Forces deployed in the area.

The incident was sparked by a dispute between two stall owners from the Jabari and Nirouch clans, and resulted in the death of a Jabari family member after he was hit on the head with a stone by a stall owner from the Nirouch clan.

Jabari family members went on a rampage and the fight spread to other parts of the city. Palestinian claims that soldiers did not intervene were refuted by the IDF.

Most Americans Pro-Settler

Just 10 percent of Americans see settlements as the main obstacle to peace between Israelis and Palestinians, and a majority say Jews should be permitted to continue living and building in the West Bank and Gaza Strip, according to a survey commissioned by the Zionist Organization of America.

The survey of 1,000 adults, which was carried out on May 21 by John McLaughlin & Associates, found that 64% oppose expelling Jews from the territories, compared to 16.5% in favor of expulsion. A greater proportion of respondents, 31.3%, said that Jews have the "strongest historical claim" to Judea, Samaria, and the Gaza Strip, compared to 18.8% who said they favor Arab claims. (The survey has a margin of error of 3.5 percent.)


The answer seems to be "no," and the reason is that the seminaries. since about 1985 or so, have offered only End Times teaching that is very muddled and unclear so that students are not as informed as they once were. Progressive Dispensationalism is a disease like cancer that only gets worse. It's next to impossible for pastors who graduated within the past twenty years to coherently relate to the Bible and explain what is happening in this world. Seemingly there are almost no teachers like Hal or me stepping out behind us and it's just getting worse all the time.

His answer is the fascinating part of this story. He looked at me and said, "Maybe there just doesn't need to be." In other words, there will be no need for anyone to teach End Times prophecy once the Tribulation starts. We're "The Last of the Mohicans."

Maybe another one of those signs of the End?

Meanwhile there are serious objections among believers to the Road Map. Christians everywhere are appalled at what the State Department and White House are trying to do in Israel. It is absolute Scriptural anathema to divide the Land, and that needs to be said loud and clear. The fact that the Palestinians are in no way ready for peace (or have even asked for it) is obvious.

Lives are being lost, terrorism has doubled and tripled, and President Bush, Colin Powell, and our other people are being made to look foolish



as they demonstrate their inability to cope with the Palestinian situation. At the same time Iraq is proving to be an irascible problem. We simply do not understand people who, in effect, live in a time a thousand years ago and have no appreciation for democracy or freedom—or for that matter for people being kind or trying to help them.

Anyone who has ministered to people who have been abused or downtrodden in any way realizes that they have an odd adversity to being helped and are difficult to work with.

In Branson, Missouri, on our Midwest trip, I spoke at The Hiding Place, a wonderful, spiritual restaurant in the middle of the city which (behind the scenes) takes care of abused women and children. When I remarked from the speaker's podium that abused people object to being helped, I received some very sobering nods from the staff.

In my own experience of serving lunches in a soup kitchen and supporting the Ruff House, a home for retarded children,

I noticed the resentment of underdogs receiving help. They have an odd fraternity of suffering to which more secure people are not really welcome.

Arab people have been downtrodden not just for decades but for centuries under the heels of uncaring dictators who have made themselves wealthy at the expense of huge popu-



lations. Saudi Arabia is a perfect example. Iraq, of course, is another, as are virtually all the Arab states which are variations on the same theme. (See page 4 where the *Reader's Digest* comparison of Middle Eastern nations shows that only Israel is free.)

When we try to help these people, their first reaction is to lash back at us as in Iraq or Afghanistan. Admittedly in the end we can succeed. After World War II we helped Japan and Germany to make the long step from fanaticism to become progressive democracies with free enterprise. Both societies recovered very well and are functioning, free-world nations today.

But the Germans and the Japanese were very cultured peoples living in the 20th century. However misguid-

> ed they had been in regard to dictatorial leadership, they recovered relatively quickly because they had some grasp of goodness, honesty,

and liberty. The Arabs have no knowledge of any of these and don't act as if they care to learn.

While the media rants on about fatalities in Israel, it doesn't admit that the American army is taking two and three times the casualties in Iraq, even though the terrorism has increased in the Holy Land.

I heard a similar testimony just six days ago when the pastor of my church said that he has recently led a Muslim to Christ. This person has been ostracized from his family, including his wife and children whom he dearly loves. He went to his former mosque and explained that he wanted to cut all ties to Islam. The members of his mosque beat and kicked him, but miraculously, God protected him so that he did not feel a thing.

I feel God is prompting me to see that this message gets out to other Muslims, as well as Christians and nonbelievers. I don't know if this is God, but in my spirit I believe God is telling me to help put together a video on Islam and Christianity with testimonies by former Muslims like Zachariah Anan, Dr. Ergun Caner, etc. There are literally billions of Muslims empty inside, looking for answers for their eternal salvation and I believe that they should hear from their brethren that Jesus is the answer for the Muslim! What I would also like to add to the video is a Biblical foundations section with short teachings from the Bible on salvation and the Lordship of Christ. I am not of the means financially to undertake such a task on my own, but I believe that this is God's will so He will provide the necessary finances to take the gospel to a growing, but also dying, Muslim population.

Judeo-Christian-Islamic?

Leading Muslim organizations say it's time for Americans to stop using the phrase "Judeo-Christian" when describing the values and character that define the United States. Better choices, they say, are "Judeo-Christian-Islamic" or "Abrahamic," referring to Abraham, the patriarch held in common by the monotheistic big three religions.

The new language should be used "in all venues where we normally talk about Judeo-Christian values, starting with the media, academia, statements by politicians and comments made in churches, synagogues and other places," said Agha Saeed, founder and chairman of the American Muslim Alliance, a political group headquartered in Fremont, CA. "These are not just let's-make-youfeel-good words," Saeed said. "These are words that define how we're related to each other."

Others take offense, arguing that to alter the phrase "Judeo-Christian" is political correctness and revisionist history at its worst. "A lot of the ideas that underpin civil liberties come from Judeo-Christian theology," said the Rev. Ted Haggard of Colorado Springs, CO, president of the National Association of Evangelicals. "What the Islamic community needs to make are positive contributions to culture and society so we can include them."

Michael Cromartie, vice president of the Washingtonbased Ethics and Public Policy Center, said a "Judeo-Christian understanding of things like freedom of conscience and liberty" are embodied in the Constitution. "No offense intended," he said, "but Muslims weren't a part of that, even though they're part of the discussion now."

The movement to drop or change the ["Judeo-Christian"] phrase has some non-Muslim support, including the head of the National Council of Churches.

The Rev. Bob Edgar, general secretary of the council, which represents 36 Christian denominations, said he prefers "Abrahamic" to "Judeo-Christian-Islamic" because it "rolls off the tongue a little easier."

"The more inclusive we can be, the more committed we are to the founding fathers and mothers who struggled with the issue of respect for each other's religious faiths," Edgar said.

The Father's Correction

The Hebrew noun *musar* denotes fatherly correction intended to impart moral discipline and character development to a child. "Hear, my child, the *musar* of your father, and forsake not the *torah* of your mother" (Prov. 6:20). "My son, despise not the chastening *(musar)* of the Lord; neither be weary of his correction *(tokhechah)*. For whom the Lord loves he corrects; even as a father the son in whom he delights" (Prov. 3:11; see also Heb.12:5-6).

Like a human father might correct a wayward child in order to develop responsible character within the child, so the Lord corrects His children in



order to form His character within them. And just as a human father gives light and insight to the way of a child, so God's revelation (i.e., His laws and commandments) gives light for the way of Life. Correction, then, is the primary means by which God reveals both His charac-



means by which God reveals both His charac- Chastening, Correction ... ter to us and our own characters to our-

selves.... It is also the instrument that leads us to godly sorrow and repentance. God tests what is within our hearts (Deut. 8:2) and thereby reveals Himself as the salvation *(yeshua)* from our inner condition. By being broken, humbled, and corrected, we learn to rely on God's provision and begin to genuinely understand that "man does not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of the Lord" (Deut. 8:3). Correction from the Lord is ultimately "soul building," since it enables us to be partakers of His holiness — and is grounded in His love for us as our Heavenly Father (see Heb. 12:5-11).

World War IV might well be the invasion of Gog and Magog.—Zola

The US is already fighting World War IV, says former Central Intelligence Agency Director James Woolsey, and the enemies are the Shiite fanatics who rule Iran and control Hezbollah, the Islamo-fascists who rule Syria and previously controlled Iraq, and the Wahhabi brand of Sunni Islamists who get their inspiration and funding from Saudi Arabia. Woolsey adds that while all three of these enemies hate each other and occasionally kill each other in wars and smaller skirmishes, they are fully capable of uniting against a common enemy and have—in this case, the United States of America.

All three members of this axis had attacked the United States repeatedly in different ways since at least 1979. The attacks became increasingly more dramatic because the enemy concluded, based on deductive reasoning, that the US was a paper tiger—unwilling to fight, or, at least, fight to win. They concluded the US just didn't have the stomach for it.

"In 1979, they took out hostages and we tied yellow ribbons around trees and launched an ineffective effort, crashing helicopters in the desert, to rescue them," explains Woolsey. "In 1983, they blew up our embassy and our Marine barracks in Beirut. What did we do? We left.

Throughout much of the 1980s, various terrorist acts were committed against us. We would occasionally arrest a few small fry. There was one honorable exception—President Reagan's strike against Tripoli. But, generally speaking, we prosecuted individuals when we could—essentially we litigated—in response to the terrorist acts of the '80s."

The 1990s, mostly during the Clinton administration years, the US continued to overlook terrorist attacks on its interests—sometimes even covering them up rather than dealing with the forces responsible.

The force finally used against al-Qaida and the Taliban in Afghanistan and Saddam Hussein's regime in Iraq was a stark contrast to the US policies of the past. Woolsey believes they represented a real surprise to those who calculated that the US was a paper tiger.

The risk now, he suggests, is that we pack up and go home and pretend the war is over. It is not.

Iraq has been dealt with, but the other partner in the Islamo-fascist camp, Syria, remains a threat. Iran has many problems at home. The US must make those problems worse — largely through propaganda and support of the dissident student groups and jailed clerics who oppose the mullah regime.

"The third group, the Islamist Sunni, al-Qaida and the like-thinkers, are in many ways going to be the hardest to deal with," Woolsey says. "They are fueled by oil money from the Gulf, Saudi Arabia principally. They are wealthy in and of themselves. They are present in some 60 countries and they loathe us, like the Wahhabis, who are their first cousins. They are fanatically anti-Western, anti-modern, anti-Christian, anti-Jewish and anti-most-Muslims."

Woolsey projects this fourth world war is going to last decades, not years. But he is confident that we will win. The message the US and its allies have to send to the autocrats of the Middle East is this, he says: "We want you to realize that now, for the fourth time in 100 years, this country is on the march. And we are on the side of those whom you most fear — your own people."

And that, Woolsey says, is the recipe for winning World War IV.


