The State of the Ministry – One Half of One Percent!

By Mark Levitt We bless Israel with on-location television programs, quality newsletters, speaking engagements in churches, a 12-month correspondence course, music CDs and tapes, www.levitt.com with its chat room and discussion board. books and booklets, answers to Bible questions, and the list goes on.

My father, Zola, founded this organization in 1978 in a corrugated tin shed that sat behind our house. With a typewriter and a part-time secretary, he graduated from hosting a live, daily radio show, The Heart of the Matter, to a weekly TV program, Zola Levitt Live. In twentyfive years, our Romans 10:1 outreach went from covering just Dallas with one TV station to broadcasting on several formidable national networks.

One of the *Times*' brilliant suggestions — I'm not making this up — is that mass murderer Marwan Barghouti be released from prison where he is serving several life sentences for his terrorism. They say he should be the new Palestinian dictator (choosing the new leader *before* the coming election). Even some left-wing Israelis have said as much; each democracy has its similar crazies. If Barghouti is released from jail, then we need to open all American prisons and let every murderer run free in the streets. Fair is fair.

We might do well to watch what's happening in Europe, and particularly Holland, with the ongoing Muslim takeover. Reasonable people everywhere have written off France, Germany, and England on bad days, as utterly lost to the Muslims, and not real allies of ours. In Holland, the enemy has taken a further step, murdering a filmmaker for questioning their treatment of women, and then terrorizing by means of arson, beatings and killings in their host country. As in the U.S., these Muslim immigrants were originally welcomed. Holland has sown the wind and reaped the whirlwind. Their political correctness has come back to haunt them.

We're doing much the same. Obviously, such violence will begin to happen in the United States if we don't do something about the Muslim incursion. This is a much larger country and the Muslims are progressing more slowly here, but the takeover is running according to schedule. As an example, we could take the recent pronouncements of James Zogby, brother of pollster John Zogby, an Arab American. He remonstrated with us for criticizing Arafat and calling him anything but Abraham Lincoln and George Washington wrapped into one. He is among the first to cry out when Muslims feel what they call discrimination, but is silent when they murder children in Russia or Israel, or murder anyone anywhere else.

The larger problem here is that Muslims not only are encouraged by their religion to lie, but they are guilty of believing their own lies. When I interviewed such personalities as Faisal Husseini or Hanan Ashrawi, I listened to seemingly normal human beings lying through their teeth in the most obvious manner, and yet sounding very sincere in all that they said. They were forthright and used persuasive language and what they considered reasonable arguments to pronounce the most unbelievable and far-fetched falsehoods. But they seemed to believe their own lies. Hanan Ashrawi's statement, "Jesus Christ was a Palestinian prophet born in Bethlehem in my country," is really hard to beat. She claims to be a Christian woman.

This situation reminds me of the story of a Muslim fellow who was trying to take a nap while some children were playing outside his bedroom window. He finally yelled out of the window, "You kids go to Muhammed's house. He's giving away free candy." The children ran away and the man resumed his nap. But in ten minutes he was in the living room. His wife said, "I thought you were going to take a nap," and he replied, "No. I'm going over to Muhammed's to get some free candy."

The sickening part of what's going on globally is that the United Nations, and even elements in our own government, are friendly with the Muslims whose plan is to take us over. Political correctness is one thing, but embracing an enemy who has already attacked you, is plain stupidity. Such organizations as the U.S. State Department, with its endless tolerance for dictatorships, terrorism and the like, and the Presbyterian Church USA, are examples of liberal foolishness. The Presbyterians have now received threats of arson and have put security in their 11,000 churches. I would suggest they simply fire the 431 anti-Semitic unbelievers in their General Assembly. I was amazed to find them still in office 15 minutes after passing their ungodly resolution. But the Anglicans are soon to follow suit, as The Jerusalem Post recently specified.

The issue that I refer to, of course, was the vote to divest from Israel and, in effect, a public statement that these particular Presbyterians have decided

not to support the Chosen People and the Promised Land, but rather to side with the terrorists who assail them. I suppose this ungodly position results from the utter lack of Bible knowledge among denominational churches, but unbelievers hated the Jews long before the Bible even existed. It all started with Pharaoh and is continuing today with the ungodly everywhere.

Those were thoughts that came to me during our November tour of Israel — my 8oth such tour — which was larger than the tours of our past years. This is because people are finally beginning to understand that Israel is not a dangerous place and terrorism has much abated recently — or it could be because CNN, *The New York Times*, and Israel's other enemies were busy with the election, and simply didn't have the time or the space to continue bashing our valuable ally and sister democracy.

For the 8oth time we had an absolutely peaceful tour in Israel. No one ever suffered so much as a stubbed finger. I now have a joke where I apologize for the shooting in the streets, and the tour laughs and applauds, since it's the most peaceful land to visit. Once again, Israel has some tough characters, and some unrest, just like in your hometown. But, on the whole, it's perfectly safe to travel where we go, and, the State Department warnings notwithstanding, I have no reason to stop saying that.

A trip through Israel is not only spiritually cleansing and inspirational, but it provides a respite from the American scene. I notice that each time we arrive home, and my passengers have said the same, we have something of a new perspective on our own country. For one thing, we see the place as a bit boring after the electrifying scenes of Israel with their intense spirituality and, to believe CNN, an element of "danger" to traveling there. In my usual sublime experience in seeing Israel again, I had nearly forgotten the Scott Peterson murder case, the Martha Stewart prison term,

the "what went wrong" editorials of *The New York Times* and CNN concerning the election, etc., etc. I had instead been on the high level of the Mount of Olives, the Sea of Galilee, and the Empty Tomb, and I landed back in America with a spiritual thump.

My arrival home to America was disheartening in another way. It happened that I turned on the TV as soon as I got to New York. Television is quite different here than in Israel. Immediately, there were commercials for lawyers trying to sue drug companies over certain prescriptions, one of which I take every day. Exercise machines, insurance, mortgages, diet pills and the like were all waiting to welcome me home. Such mercenary ads do not appear in the Holy Land, along with a whole lot of other Americanisms.

As I reached New York, I was also accosted by New York Times and USA Today editorials criticizing the President for each and every choice in his new cabinet, and accusing him of surrounding himself with yes-men (except for Condoleeza Rice, who is a yes-person, I suppose). Evidently, the criticism of President Bush is not going to stop, even after the campaign, and a leader who is doing at least an adequate, and in some cases, a fine job, is to be maligned in favor of the "blue state" point of view. Terrorism, of course, is the subject, and what should or should not be done about it.

What is ahead in terrorism and how does it play into the End Times?

In Israel, we taped a new series with the working title, "Age of Terror: Islam and The Tribulation." It seems to me that those now committing the terrorist acts will be very useful to the Antichrist when he arrives on the world scene (and I believe he is mature and functioning somewhere



today. Such names as Kofi Annan, Bill Clinton, and personalities in the European Confederacy have been suggested. But we don't know).

The Islamic terrorists represent the Antichrist's best allies in the sense that they are everywhere in the world and they purport to be a religious movement. The Antichrist himself is probably not a very religious figure, but one who cultivates religious people (think of Arafat or Saddam Hussein or the Saudi "royal family").

Three groups have always appeared to me as being widespread throughout the world and "religious," but not Believers in the Lord. They would be the Muslims, the unsaved Catholics, and the unsaved Jewish people. All three are very influential, have considerable power and influence, and are not going in the Rapture of the Church, which will occur at the beginning of the Tribulation. Thus, they will be in place everywhere on earth for the Antichrist's manipulations.

I can picture the Muslims as an enforcement corps, in keeping with that scary euphemism "security forces." The Catholics, by their sheer numbers and their willingness to obey a central figure like the Pope, whoever he may be at that time, will provide a delusion that the world is still full of Christians after the Rapture.

After all, here will be all these "Christians" (along with many Presbyterians,

Lutherans, Methodists, etc. The liberal Protestants will join with quasi-Christians like Catholics, Mormons and the like, to serve the new system.)

This huge ecumenical movement will afford easy religious control of all of the rest of the world, apart from the Kings of the East, who will be preparing for their opportunity at Armageddon.

Thus, when I come home to a United States preoccupied with fear of terrorism, teaching democracy in Iraq, or pursuing cockamamie new ideas for a "peace process" in Israel, I realize how very off-point we are. Biblical knowledge is the only solution to understanding the absurdities in today's world. Without a working knowledge of End Times prophecy, one finds it impossible to understand or resist terrorism, nuclear weapons getting into hostile hands, dictatorships in general, and all the rest of the hatred, murder and racism all over the world today.

Does President Bush have this working knowledge of End Times prophecy? It's possible. He grew up in the United Methodist Church, which, in most cases, is not a very good source of this information. But he seems to have a certain grasp of the bigger picture — the fact that this terrorism is leading somewhere more awful than we have seen so far. And he is willing to combat our enemies, and to call them what they are — evil. And, like Ronald Reagan, he is despised for that.

I ran into a quotation by ex-President Clinton on Bush. He is reputed to have said: "The President should learn to call things right or wrong without calling them good or evil." It's apparent that Clinton does not have a grasp of End Times Prophecy. As the Scripture warns us, the end will be a time when men will call good evil and evil good, but in any case, they will freely use those terms. I came home to the opening of the library to celebrate Clinton's presidency (for what reason, I don't know).

A commentator on Fox News stated that, "In a finite world, there is neither

complete victory nor complete defeat." There's someone who doesn't understand the Rapture, a perfectly complete victory, or Hell, a total defeat. Of course, news programs are not a source of religious knowledge anywhere, though, in a sense, they once were. In ancient Israel, the prophets provided the "news," many times before events happened, and it was up to the people to listen seriously and understand the lessons.

In our war on terrorism, we are reacting to the danger in the manner of the priests who jailed Jeremiah for warning them that Nebuchadnezzar and the Chaldeans were coming to destroy the Temple. They did exactly that, and he lived to write the Book of Lamentations in his cell after his conviction for high treason.

I've gone on quite a while here, since there really is so much to say at this time. But I mustn't forget, now at year's end, to ask you for as large a donation as you can manage. No ID, No Bomb

An international human rights group has called on Palestinian militants to stop using children in suicide bombings and military attacks, reports the BBC.

Human Rights Watch made the call after a 16-year-old bomber blew himself up in a Tel Aviv marketplace killing three Israeli civilians.

The New York-based group claimed at least 10 bombers aged under 18 have attacked Israel in the past four years.

Any attack on civilians is prohibited by international law, but using children for suicide attacks is particularly egregious, said Jo Becker, advocacy director for children's rights at Human Rights Watch.

Palestinian armed groups must clearly and publicly condemn all use of children under the age of 18 for military activities, and make sure these policies are carried out.

Only when Hamas, al-Aqsa and the rest begin requiring Arabs to show ID before murdering Jewish children will the folks at Human Rights Watch be able to rest easy.

Here is possibly one great mystery solved. Our much criticized President might have been right after all. — Zola

Russian special forces troops moved many of Saddam Hussein's weapons and related goods out of Iraq and into Syria in the weeks before the March, 2003 U.S. military operation, *The Washington Times* has learned.

John A. Shaw, the deputy undersecretary of defense for international technology security, said in an interview that he believes the Russian troops, working with Iraqi intelligence, "almost certainly" removed the high-explosive

material that went missing from the Al-Qaqaa facility south of Baghdad.

"The Russians brought in, just before the war started, a whole series of military units," Mr. Shaw said. "Their main job was to shred all evidence of any of the contractual arrangements they had with the Iraqis. The others were transportation units."

The Salvation Army is preparing for what may be its leanest holiday kettle drive, because Target stores won't allow the bell-ringers back this year. Target's action will cost the Christian charity \$9 million in lost holiday collections.

"The Salvation Army is a really great thing for people who are unfortunate, collecting funds for those in need," said Joseph Graves, a Target customer. Shoppers can expect to see the red kettles and bell-ringers posted outside other stores, eagerly awaiting donations. Major George Hood, Salvation Army spokesman, said Salvation Army kettles and bell-ringers will still be posted outside Wal-Mart and other stores, collecting money to help the needy, homeless and disabled in their local communities.

"The Dead Children Have Been Forgotten"

Yasser Arafat died at age 75, lying in bed surrounded by familiar faces. He left this world peacefully, unlike the thousands of victims he sent to early graves.

In a better world, the PLO chief would have met his end on a gallows, hanged for mass murder much as the Nazi chiefs were hanged at Nuremberg.

In a better world, the French president would not have paid a visit to the bedside of such a monster. In a better world, George Bush would not have said, on hearing the first reports that Arafat had died, "God bless his soul."

God bless his soul? What a grotesque idea! Bless the soul of the man who brought modern terrorism to the world? Who sent his agents to slaughter athletes at the Olympics, blow airliners out of the sky, bomb schools and pizzerias, machine-gun passengers in airline terminals? Who lied, cheated, and stole without compunction? Who inculcated the vilest culture of Jewhatred since the Third Reich? Human beings might stoop to bless a creature so evil — as indeed Arafat was blessed, with money, deference, even a Nobel Prize — but God, I am quite sure, will damn him for eternity.

Arafat always inspired flights of nonsense from Western journalists, and his last two weeks were no exception.

Derek Brown wrote in *The Guardian* that Arafat's undisputed courage as a guerrilla leader was exceeded only by his extraordinary courage as a peace negotiator. But it is an odd kind of courage that expresses itself in shooting unarmed victims — or in signing peace accords and then flagrantly violating their terms.

Another commentator, columnist Gwynne Dyer, asked, So what did Arafat do right? The answer: He drew worldwide attention to the Palestinian



cause, for the most part by successful acts of terror. In other words, butchering innocent human beings was right, since it served an ulterior political motive. No doubt that thought brings daily comfort to all those who were forced to bury a child, parent, or spouse because of Arafat's successful terrorism.

Some journalists couldn't wait for Arafat's actual death to begin weeping for him. Take the BBC's Barbara Plett, who burst into tears on the day he was airlifted out of the West Bank. "When the helicopter carrying the frail old man rose above his ruined compound," Plett reported from Ramallah, "I started to cry." Normal people don't weep for brutal murderers, but Plett made it clear that her empathy for Arafat — whom she praised as a symbol of Palestinian unity, steadfastness, and resistance — was heartfelt:

"I remember well when the Israelis reconquered the West Bank more than two years ago, how they drove their tanks and bulldozers into Mr. Arafat's headquarters, trapping him in a few rooms, and throwing a military curtain around Ramallah. I remember how Palestinians admired his refusal to flee under fire. They told me: 'Our leader is sharing our pain, we are all under the same siege.' And so was I." Such is the state of journalism at the BBC, whose reporters do not seem to have any trouble reporting, dry-eyed, on the plight of Arafat's victims. (That is,

when they mention them — which Plett's teary *bon voyage* to Arafat did not).

And what about those victims? Why were they scarcely remembered in this Arafat death watch?

How is it possible to reflect on Arafat's most enduring legacy — the rise of modern terrorism — without recalling the legions of men, women, and children whose lives he and his followers destroyed? If Osama bin Laden were on his deathbed, would we neglect to mention all those he murdered on 9/11?

It would take an encyclopedia to catalog all of the evil Arafat committed. But that is no excuse for not trying to recall at least some of it.

Perhaps his signal contribution to the practice of political terror was the introduction of warfare against children. On one black date in May 1974, three PLO terrorists slipped from Lebanon into the northern Israeli town of Ma'alot. They murdered two parents and a child whom they found at home, then seized a local school, taking more than 100 boys and girls hostage and threatening to kill them unless a number of imprisoned terrorists were released. When Israeli troops attempted a rescue, the terrorists exploded hand grenades and opened fire on the students. By the time the horror ended, 25 people were dead; 21 of them were children.

Thirty years later, no one speaks of Ma'alot anymore. The dead children have been forgotten. Everyone knows Arafat's name, but who ever recalls the names of his victims?

So let us recall them: Ilana Turgeman. Rachel Aputa. Yocheved Mazoz. Sarah Ben-Shim'on. Yona Sabag. Yafa Cohen. Shoshana Cohen. Michal Sitrok. Malka Amrosy. Aviva Saada. Yocheved Diyi. Yaakov Levi. Yaakov Kabla. Rina Cohen. Ilana Ne'eman. Sarah Madar. Tamar Dahan. Sarah Soper. Lili Morad. David Madar. Yehudit Madar.

The 21 dead children of Ma'alot — 21 of the thousands who died at Arafat's command.

Our continuing growth gives us economies of scale that improve our efficiency, especially when you consider that our airtime expenses are growing while our overhead remains relatively stable. Once a TV program is produced and broadcast affordably — once a newsletter is created, printed and mailed to an appreciative readership — it costs progressively less to add more viewers and readers. That is calculated per viewer and reader, and lately we've been trying to add millions of them.

My "State of the Ministry" article in the March '04 *Levitt Letter*, archived at www.levitt.com, gives a perspective of what an ambitious step we took in adding PAX just over a year ago. Only now are we about to break even on that. It takes a long time for viewers to progress from being curious and interested in a teaching program, to becoming loyal and, eventually, helpful. Only three percent of our audience supports us!

The IRS audited this ministry in 2002 and gave us a clean bill of health. For details you may wish to refer to the "State of the Ministry" article in the December 2002 *Levitt Letter*. An IRS letter this year indicated that 501(c)3 non-profit organizations who report zero fundraising expenses are likely to be audited. An independent CPA has audited this outreach every year since 1990, and his reports are available to you. Since we've never hired professional fundraisers, our auditor asked us to calculate how much of our TV time and newsletter space we devote to asking for financial support.

The answer, in 2003, was less than one half of one percent!

Would you please pray about this need, by the way? This ministry deserves better support, if I do say so myself. Obviously, there is no "free" television, and obviously, anyone should contribute to a ministry that has passed so strict an audit as the one mentioned above. How about catching up with us at this time? Thanks.

We love what we do — teaching. We don't particularly like what we don't do very well — fundraising. This ministry has operated too hand-to-mouth for comfort while our monthly bills have multiplied. I personally see this as a demonstration of faith. We pay all of our bills on time, but just consider how little we will leave behind. Certain industry norms, however, caused us to be downgraded for organizational strength in the area of Capacity while we scored exceptionally well on Efficiency even before adding the PAX network! For details, please see the "State of the Ministry" article in the November 2003 *Levitt Letter*, posted at www.levitt.com.

The *LA Times* ran an article that criticized a Christian television network for having 18 months' worth of revenue in cash reserves. Management consultants would similarly tell Zola that this ministry is remiss in *not having* six months' worth, a healthy average. When I came aboard in 1988, we had no cash reserves whatsoever. Now we have about two

months' on hand, about a third of what is considered ideal for stability and the capability to grow responsibly. Nonetheless, we've taken an additional step of faith. Last month's opportunity to add the World Harvest Network's (WHT) Saturday evening broadcasts to our schedule was too good a value to pass up. This gives us access to the 20 million homes that receive Channel 321 on DirecTV!

Zola Levitt Ministries competes for good airtimes almost like bidders at an auction. We get price breaks, in effect, when we buy in quantity. It costs us much more to add households when we buy a time slot on a local station than when we buy access to a national network's large number of viewers.

You who are reading this are the very ones who *already* support us, the ones who have brought us this far. Your letters express a consistent eagerness for us to reach vaster audiences. Our financial statements prove that we are striving to do just that. Our new catalog, mailed in November, features significantly reduced prices on our TV series, plus remarkable values on our four best-selling titles on DVD (please refer to page 31). We added closed captions for the deaf a bit ago, and, just lately, we began shooting TV footage that will be compatible with HDTV and wide-screen TVs, something we believe TV stations soon will require of us. Each of these steps, like the addition of television networks, takes an ongoing toll, but helps us to bless more souls.

At this stage, I respectfully ask you to consider three requests. First, please help us now with year-end gifts so that we can plan a season of exciting, high-caliber TV productions. Second, prayerfully complete the Monthly Gift Program form on page 15 to sustain us as we face airtime invoices, month in and month out, which have increased with both inflation and the addition of new airtimes. And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors (Matthew 6:12 KJV).



"Forgive us...as we forgive..." which means that our forgiveness of others *is* the measure of our own forgiveness, "for with the measure you use it will be measured back to you" (Matthew 7:2).

If we cling to resentment, bitterness, or a desire for revenge, we appeal to principles that alienate us from reconciliation with others. But if we intend to have God be the Judge of others, we appeal to Him to be our own Judge as well.





This petition functions as a mirror for our hearts: *as* we forgive others who have sinned against us, so we apprehend the forgiveness of the LORD. Or, to put it the other way, our experience of the forgiveness of the LORD is revealed in the way we treat others who have wronged us.

If we merely hear this truth but fail to practice it, we are like someone who looks at their face in a mirror but soon forgets what they saw, thereby exempting themselves from the truth of their own condition (James 1:22-24).

If we have an unforgiving spirit toward others, we will not be forgiven (Matthew 6:15); if we are judgmental toward them, we ourselves will be put on trial; if we are cruel and ungiving toward them, we will experience life as hellish, miserable and mean.

This reciprocal principle of Kingdom life appears throughout Jesus' teaching. As you forgive, so you shall be forgiven (Matthew 6:14); as you judge, so you shall be judged (Matthew 7:2); as you show mercy, so you shall be shown mercy (Matthew 5:7); as you give unto others, so it shall be given unto you (Luke 6:38).

Beloved, let us love and forgive one another.

Veteran *60 Minutes* commentator Andy Rooney blamed political bias at CBS, and the fact the news business has been taken over by people he called moneychangers, for the network's decision to air forged documents on President Bush's National Guard service in September.

"I am very critical of some of the people at CBS who make it apparent what their political leanings are," Rooney said in a speech to Tufts University, in quotes picked up by RatherBiased.com.

"I am an atheist," Rooney told Tufts. "I don't understand religion at all. I'm sure I'll offend a lot of people by saying this, but I think it's all nonsense."

He accused Christian fundamentalists of being ignorant, saying "Christians turned to religion because of a lack of education."

"They haven't been exposed to what the world has to offer," he explained.

Rooney also admitted to being mystified over how men who work with their hands voted for George Bush.

"The labor force is conservative," he said. "How in the world did that happen?"

As to education, I hold three college degrees and I finished all the classwork for a fourth, and I have been a Christian fundamentalist for the past thirty-three years. Not only that, I know other Believers who can cross the street by themselves, spell long words correctly, and cast a sensible vote for president of the United States.

When will the anger over growing Christian influence subside? Rooney's remarks belong in a mosque or some other citadel of prejudice. Rooney ought to follow Rather into an ignominious retirement. — Zola

The truth would set us free....

"You, O America, Will Be Destroyed" By Patrick Cox, Contributing Editor

It's relevant, I think, that the man who came to symbolize the aspirations of a Palestinian

state, Yasser Arafat, was born in Cairo, Egypt, and died in Paris, France. Similarly symbolic is that the man for whom the UN flew its flag at half staff led a tragically bloody coup attempt against the government of a neighboring Islamic country, Jordan, and played a key role in the destruction of democratic Christian Lebanon.

Understandably, therefore, speculation had begun even before he was declared officially dead about the prospect for peace between Israel and the Palestinians. Commentators, journalists and politicians now speak hopefully about a "renewed peace process." The term "renewed," however, is a misnomer.

Arafat controlled policies toward Israel almost from the creation of the concept of a separate "Palestinian people." Though he often said to the foreign press that he wanted peace, he stated over and over in Arabic that his true goal was the destruction of Israel. Even while publicly signing on to the Oslo Accords, he assured a group of Arab supporters in Stockholm, Sweden, that he intended to use the agreement to drive the Jews from the Middle East. Arab confidants, hoping to remove the taint of his "collaboration" with Israel, have confirmed as much.

Moreover, his passing can only be interpreted as reason for hopefulness if we accept the assumption that Arafat was a singular roadblock to peace and that his successors are more willing to accept the presence of Israel. There is, unfortunately, no reason to believe this to be so.

Months before his death, various and sundry terrorist organizations, as well as their internal factions, had begun fighting for control of the lucrative Palestinian regime. Arafat had personally demonstrated the perquisites of rule, skimming a personal fortune from his own people that was estimated by *Forbes* to be \$300 million, but by Israeli intelligence at around \$700 million. The British National Criminal Intelligence Service says the PLO has earned well over \$10 billion through "extortion, payoffs, illegal armsdealing, drug trafficking, money laundering, and fraud."

With gun battles raging between opposing police forces, the assassination of competing leaders, and a scrambling for alliances with foreign funding, Palestinian politics resembled nothing so much as an internal mafia war. Only months before his death, almost 95 percent of Palestinians described their society (to Gaza-based pollsters) as one of

"lawlessness and anarchy." Interestingly, less than 30 percent blamed Israel for their problems, though support for the terrorist intifada ran at almost 80 percent of Palestinians, of which more than half stated its purpose should be the "complete liberation of Palestinian land" — meaning the destruction of Israel.

The violence continued at a memorial service for the deceased prime minister, when rivals from Arafat's own Fatah group tried to assassinate new PLO chairman Mahmoud Abbas, killing two of his bodyguards. Abbas, speaking to the Western media, voiced support for peace with Israel, just as his own organization announced that it was naming a new rocket, designed to hit Israeli communities from the West Bank and the Gaza Strip, the "Yasser-I."

When Israel proposed that the official incitement of violence against Israelis be banned as a precondition to reviving negotiations, the PLO refused and Israel backed down. More significantly, Abbas invited the participation in the new government of Hamas and Islamic Jihad, terrorist groups that have carried out hundreds of attacks on Israelis in the last four years. Both remain officially opposed to any policy regarding the Jewish state except its elimination.

Instead of using Arafat's exit as an opportunity for reaching out to Israel, the Palestinian leadership demanded that Arafat be buried in Jerusalem, knowing they would be refused, and then ramped the Arab conspiracy machine up to promote the theory that Arafat had been poisoned by "the Jews."

As alarming as are events in the Palestinian territories, they do not bode so ill for peace as events taking place thousands of miles away.

In the same week that Arafat was declared dead, Theo van Gogh, a filmmaker and the great-grandnephew of the famous painter, was shot and nearly decapitated by a Dutchborn Muslim. Van Gogh had earned the wrath of his mur-

derer by producing an English-language film, written by a Somali-born woman who is now a Dutch legislator, criticizing Islamic customs regarding the treatment of women.

After shooting him multiple times, the assassin used his knife to pin on van Gogh's body an eloquent pledge that included: "...Hair-raising screams will be squeezed from the lungs of the nonbelievers ...I surely know that you, O America, will be destroyed. I surely know that you, O Europe, will be destroyed. I surely know that you, O Holland, will be destroyed."

In the days that followed, three Hague policemen were wounded by a grenade thrown by members of an Islamist cell that has threatened to kill several prominent politicians who have spoken out against the growth of radical jihadism in their country. In their own country, top Dutch politicians have been forced into hiding. Their own intelligence service reports that at least 20 Dutch mosques, most funded by Saudi money, are encouraging Islamist attitudes. Ten percent of the Netherlands' one million Muslims are said to support such views.

A mini-civil war, grossly underreported by the American media, followed van Gogh's death. A score of mosques and Muslim religious schools were attacked or destroyed by angry Hollanders. Almost as many churches were attacked by Muslims in a country that, until the death of van Gogh, was widely considered the most liberal and tolerant country in the world.

In neighboring Belgium, the court system, controlled by the French-speaking political faction, outlawed the majority party of the Flemish-speaking Belgians on the basis of "racism." Alarmed by a growing Islamic population that is openly opposed to democracy and assimilation, the party had called for an end to Muslim immigration.

The only thing unique about the situation in the Netherlands, however, is that it is taking place in a liberal Western democracy. Only weeks earlier, a Buddhist leader was beheaded in southern Thailand by Muslim extremists who are demanding either their own state or the imposition of Shariah law on the entire country. Dozens of Buddhists have been murdered there since October and more than 500 people died in fighting in 2004.

In the same time period, mosques and churches burned on a weekly basis and hundreds died in fighting between Muslims and Christians in the Ivory Coast, Liberia and Nigeria. Spain, despite withdrawing its troops from Iraq after the Madrid train attacks, has foiled major Islamist terror attacks since then, as has Great Britain. Muslim assaults on French Jewry take place on an almost daily basis. In Chechnya, the Philippines and even China's western province of Xinjiang, separatist Muslims are growing bolder and more adamant in their refusal to share power with "the infidel."

Intelligence agencies have revealed that many of these local movements are communicating and cooperating, and have been doing so for many years. No one, especially moderate Muslims who oppose them, is spared their wrath.

Radical Islamists are involved in an international war to destroy the "nonbelievers" — to use the term of van Gogh's murderer. They are dedicated to the destruction of Hindu India, despite the fact that they were given their own Islamic country in Pakistan. They are intent on destroying the Netherlands, a country that welcomed Muslims with open arms. It is simply naive to imagine that their counterparts in the Palestinian territories will suddenly turn from the jihad that has been taught for decades even in kindergartens and on government television stations.

Onward Christian Voters

By now it should be clear that George W. Bush wasn't the only big winner to emerge from November's US presidential election.

In terms of flexing political muscle and shaping the outcome of the vote, no group proved more successful than America's evangelical Christians. They flocked to the polls, boosting the incumbent and helping to set the country's political agenda for the next four years.

While some American Jews view this development with mounting concern, my reaction is far more sanguine, even upbeat: Israel should be thanking God for the rise of the Christian Right. They are the best hope for ensuring long-term US diplomatic support for the Jewish state in an increasingly hostile world.

Sure, American Jews still wield a great deal of political power, thanks to their concentration in key states and their extensive involvement in the political process. But the American Jewish community is in the throes of a protracted demographic decline and their power will inevitably diminish over time.

By contrast, US evangelicals, many of whom proudly refer to themselves as Christian Zionists, are clearly on the upswing.

According to the Pew Research Center, evangelical Protestants accounted for 23% of the entire American electorate, or nearly one out of every four voters, in the recent election.

And, as *The Los Angeles Times* noted, Christian evangelicals provided much of the passion and manpower for President Bush's reelection.

Indeed, political guru Arthur Finkelstein was even more blunt, telling the Israeli daily *Ma'ariv* that Bush's strategy secures the power of the American Christian Right not only for this term. In fact, it secures its ability to choose the next Republican president.

A recent study by the Scripps Survey Research Center at Ohio University found that an astonishing 38 percent of all Americans describe themselves as being born-again Christians.

In places such as the southern United States, the survey revealed that a majority of residents, or 52 percent, fall into this category.

And because of their attachment to the Bible, more and more evangelical Christians are stepping forward to

embrace Israel, demonstrating a level of commitment and support that is both sincere and deeply-rooted.



Netherlands Braces for "Jihad"

The Dutch government has vowed tough measures against what a leading politician called the arrival of jihad in the Netherlands after a death threat to a Dutch lawmaker was found spiked with a knife to the body of a slain filmmaker by his radical Muslim attacker.

A five-page letter released by the justice minister forced political leaders — including Amsterdam's Jewish mayor and members of parliament — to take on bodyguards.

The document, attached to the body of filmmaker Theo van Gogh, was titled "An Open Letter to [Aayan] Hirsi Ali," referring to a Somali-born member of parliament. She had scripted Mr. van Gogh's latest film, *Submission*, which criticized the treatment of women under Islam.

Miss Hirsi Ali, who calls herself an ex-Muslim, has gone into hiding.

Mr. van Gogh, a descendant of 19th-century Dutch painter Vincent van Gogh, was fatally shot and stabbed while cycling down an Amsterdam street.

The slaying is testing already strained relations between the ethnic Dutch population and the Muslim community. There are about 300,000 Moroccan immigrants in the Netherlands out of a population of 16 million.

Will we dither over the Muslims until Americans are murdered in our own streets? — Zola

They're B-a-a-a-a-c-k!

Millions of locusts swarmed through Israel's Red Sea resort town of Eilat in mid-November, devouring crops and flowers in the country's south.

Israeli agriculture officials sent crop dusters into the air to spray against the locusts that swept in from North Africa in the first such invasion since 1959. Eilat residents reported clouds of locusts eating palm trees bare and wiping out entire gardens. "You watch as trees that are covered with flowers are devoured. They ate everything, even a grassy roundabout which is covered with locusts," said Meir, an Eilat resident.



Curious residents swatted locusts as long as 10 cm (3.9 inches) which filled the air as they walked outside to inspect the damage. "It's like the plagues of Egypt," said one resident.

In the Bible, locusts were the eighth of 10 plagues that God inflicted on the ancient Egyptians before Pharaoh, their leader, let the Israelites go.

Locusts ventured across the Negev desert as far north as the Dead Sea where farmers worried that larger numbers of insects said to be heading their way might eat through their crops. The last major invasion of African locusts 45 years ago ravaged crops in the Jewish state.

Some Israelis as well as laborers from Thailand, where locusts are a delicacy, made the best of the current outbreak by collecting the insects and taking them home for dinner.

"Delicious," said one Israeli man in Eilat, licking his lips after picking a locust off the ground and eating it raw. They're a delicacy fit for a king.

The locust is the only type of insect that is kosher and permissible for religious Jews to eat under Jewish law.

Adios, Network News

Nobel Prizes vs. Bombs

The recent news that two Israeli scientists, in addition to an American, won the Nobel Prize in chemistry, should be read with interest in the Arab world.

This win says a lot about the state of affairs of the Middle East.

While Israel builds its future with Nobel laureates, the Arab world fills its future with suicide bombers.

Ever since the inception of the State of Israel, Arabs have had this romantic notion that through wars and revenge we can return to our past glory.

Of course, they don't tell us which past they are referring to. Was it when we were governed by the Ottoman Empire or by England and France?

Or was it more like 1,300 years ago when spears ruled the battleground?

Ever since 1967, Arabs from all countries — but especially Syria, Jordan, Lebanon, and Egypt — have lived this fantasy that we can throw the Israelis into the sea.

With the 1973 near-win against Israel, Arabs concluded that one more loss is not reason enough to stop and think. One more loss, with so many lives lost on both sides, is not enough for us to understand that the continued struggle is destroying us from within.

Even after Anwar Sadat came to understand the value of peace and coexistence, it seemed that more and more of our energies were diverted toward destruction.

The downfall of the Soviet Union, the longtime ally of the Arab world, seemed to spur us to seek justice with the barrel of a gun rather than through pragmatic understanding.

The Oslo Accords produced a willing Israel and exposed fraudulent Palestinians. Again, we watched as Arab leaders mounted a campaign of deceit to divert our attention away from our own oppression. We, the obedient Arab sheep, followed. We carried banners, objected, revolted and in the end, we created a new cadre of school children with strong arms to throw stones, but without the education, discipline or brains to produce Nobel prizes.

Ever since the Intifada, a term that truly spurns our sense of justice, we have achieved the lowest point of our self-esteem. Arab children that throw stones seem to feel an invisible power that is not available to the children of the State of Israel.

That power to revolt consequently predisposes to a low self-esteem, which inevitably helps to build the mentality of a suicide bomber. Suicide bombers feel nothing, understand little, and cannot see the future.

They go on automatic pilot, with the brain functioning as a guiding tool to self-destruct literally, as a person, and against the society that developed them. Suicide bombers represent the lowest of our self-esteem as people of Arab descent.

We are in an Intifada, but it is one that is seen through the eyes of the Israeli Nobel laureates. We, as people of the Middle East, are dying and we cannot even feel it. We have reached the bottom and we do not even know it.

Because of oppressive regimes that give us no chance to think for ourselves, we have no hope, no future, and certainly no Nobel prizes in science awaiting us.

What very few people know is that an Intifada is also attributed to the last movement by a human body upon death. Could that be this understanding of Intifada that is the true symbol of a struggle that should have ended long ago? All Arabs are in an Intifada, still moving, yet not truly alive as citizens of the world.

Every time the Syrian Ba'athists call for armed resistance, secretly support groups like Hezbollah and Hamas, and propagandize Arab unity, we fall further and further into oblivion. The funny thing is that very few Arabs care to understand why we do not have Nobel laureates.

They blame it on Imperialism and Zionism. In their minds, absent these two forces, we could be raking in those Nobel prizes.

So while Israel survives Intifadas, wars, hate, and oppressive Arab rulers, we, the Arab people, must wake-up.

If we pursue the same policies that drove us to the lowest point in our history (Asr al-Inhitat or Era of Despair as opposed to Asr al-Jahyliah or Era of Ignorance that preceded Prophet Mohammed), only we lose.

If we listen to our rulers, we will always be kneeling on the sideline watching Nobel Prize winners produced by the Middle East — but not by us or for us.

A California teacher has been barred by his school from giving students documents from American history that refer to God — including the Declaration of Independence.

Steven Williams, a fifth-grade teacher at Stevens Creek School in the San Francisco Bay area suburb of Cupertino, sued for discrimination, claiming he had been singled out for censorship by principal Patricia Vidmar because he is a Christian.

"Williams wants to teach his students the true history of our country," he said. "There is nothing in the Establishment Clause (of the U.S. Constitution) that prohibits a teacher from showing students the Declaration of Independence."

Principal Vidmar could not be reached for comment on the lawsuit, which was filed in U.S. District Court in San Jose and claims violations of Williams' rights to free speech under the First Amendment.

Williams asserts in the lawsuit that since May he has been required to submit all of his lesson plans and supplemental handouts to Vidmar for approval, and that the principal will not permit him to use any that contain references to God or Christianity.

In June, the U.S. Supreme Court refused to hear the case of a California atheist who wanted the words "under God" struck from the Pledge of Allegiance as recited by school children. The appeals court in California had found that the phrase amounted to a violation of church and state separation.

Putting on a Happy Face www.agapepress.org

A freelance writer from Virginia is protesting what he calls the Islamic indoctrination of grade school students in one of the country's largest public school districts.

During the month of Ramadan, children in the third through fifth grades in Herndon, Virginia schools are being taught about the Muslim holiday and about other Islamic customs and practices.

With the help of so-called multicultural trainer Afeefa Syeed, the young students are reciting Muslims' sacred words and imitating their faith practices. Prayer rugs are given out, Islamic prayers are recited, and as columnist Dave Gibson recently commented, a happy face is put on the most dangerous religion the world has ever known.

Gibson, who writes for American Daily.com, is outraged that the Fairfax County school district prohibits recitation of the Lord's Prayer but encourages students to pray to Allah. We have chased those Christian ideals out of our school system, and now we're bringing in Muslim ideals. It's most troubling that these children are not being given the whole story — the true face of Islam.

The conservative columnist says secularists who want God removed entirely from schools are also noticeably silent about the Islamic indoctrination occurring in the Virginia public school system. Where, he wonders, are the American Civil Liberties Union lawsuits and the public indignation so often unleashed on any expression of Christian faith in the public schools?

What angers me, Gibson remarks, is the ACLU has not been heard from on this. I can guarantee you, if someone had brought in Christian Bibles or wanted to teach about Judeo-Christian beliefs, the Herndon school district would be sued immediately.

Instead of showing indifference toward the brainwashing of their children, Gibson says Herndon parents should be pulling their kids out of the city's schools and suing the school district over its Islamic indoctrination program. Jack Dale, chief of Fairfax County Schools, declined to comment.



A New Era of Brutality

Nazi and communist murderers killed in the name of their respective ideologies, but certainly not in the name of God. The Iraqi hostages are killed in an act of religious ritual — before Eugene Armstrong's head was chopped off, the murderers called him a Christian dog.

This is a return to the darkest era in human history.

The second difference is even more significant: The Nazis and the communists hid the massacres they committed. Nazi Germany considered the extermination of the Jews a Reich secret. It denied reports of the destruction of European Jewry — indeed, described them as atrocious propaganda — and sought to mislead the world by a staged visit of the International Red Cross to the Theresienstadt concentration camp.

Stalin and his gang also staunchly denied all rumors of the killing of the Kulaks and the reality of the Gulags, even inviting gullible observers to refute them.

Cambodia was completely closed to the international press so that the murders there could proceed in secrecy.

The Islamic terrorists have opened a new page in the history of human barbarianism. They film their murders and broadcast them to the world. In that respect, the killers of hostages — just like Palestinian suicide bombers who tape themselves boasting about the murders they are about to commit — surpass the Nazis and communists in their atrocities.

Granted, nothing must ever be compared to the crimes of the Nazis. Nothing is equal to the industrial murder of millions. One *can*, however, compare the level of barbarianism of different acts of murder.

But the most shocking phenomenon has to do not with the killers, but with the people for whom the tapes are intended.

How is it that no popular protest movement has arisen among religious Muslims against those who have hijacked Islam — with its glorious past — and harnessed it for nefarious purposes?

Why are not Muslim clerics from Marakesh to Jakarta crying out against this hijacking?

Even more amazing, and monstrous, is the phenomenon of acclimating to monstrosity. *The New York Times* dropped the words "Christian dog" from its report on Armstrong's murder. Ed Koch, the former New York mayor, bitterly protested that omission, but don't expect the paper to change its politically correct reporting.


Moreover, Western enlightened forces play a major — albeit unintended — role in transforming what the Islamists are doing into something normative.

Take the Reuters news agency. In its reports on a recent suicide bombing in Jerusalem, for instance, I could not locate a word about the victims or their families. In contrast there was plenty of focus on the suffering of the murderers' families.

And, in thinking about how the media has been conditioning us to acclimate to violent Islamist behavior, let's not ignore the semantic angle: AP insists on calling the killers of the Iraqi hostages "insurgents."

But if the murder of unarmed civilians for political purposes is not terrorism, what is?

We had better understand how insidious it is to imagine that the new barbarism is an improvement on the original.



Which Side is Evil?

It might seem odd to compare and contrast two recent news stories — the resignation announcement of Attorney General John Ashcroft and the Paris death of Palestinian terrorist Yasser Arafat. But an examination of the two demonstrates the degree to which the "news" media's compass of objectivity is so terribly misaligned. To read the coverage, you'd think Ashcroft was the tyrant, and Arafat the liberator.

On November 10, *The New York Times* front page put the two stories side by side in the top left-hand corner. Reporter Elisabeth Bumiller told readers the "polarizing" Ashcroft was resigning after a "tumultuous tenure" in which he was praised for his aggressive fight against terrorists but "assailed by critics who said he sacrificed civil liberties" in the wake of September 11. Bumiller noted Ashcroft was praised by President Bush, then added his critics were "caustic," citing the radical-left Georgetown professor David Cole, who strangely called Ashcroft "a disaster from a civil liberties perspective but also from a national security perspective."

But right next door on the front page, reporter Elaine Sciolino found far less controversy in the camp of Arafat. The dying terrorist has accumulated a long and blood-spattered resume of violence that fills a cemetery, a filthy legacy of innocent Olympic athletes and airplane passengers and Israeli schoolchildren massacred. But the *Times* didn't even use the word "terrorist." Instead, Sciolino referred to Arafat as a cult hero, "the guerrilla fighter and Nobel Prize winner who has symbolized the Palestinian struggle for statehood for four decades." Of his potential successors,

Sciolino warned they had "little of the street credibility and aura that surrounded Mr. Arafat." A big chunk of that aura is created in Western capitals by left-wing correspondents.

Is it any wonder the liberal press doesn't understand why a majority of Americans didn't want a president with the media's moral vision elected? Liberals just don't really get the concept of a "war on terrorism." They like declaring war on nebulous, romantic concepts like poverty and rainforest logging, but can't see the mortal threat in front of their faces on TV, people screaming their desire to bring death to Americans. Liberals are not

just soft on the terrorists, they're not really sure which side is evil. That's dangerous.

The American majority wanted a government which will protect them from the Arab fanatics who whooped and cheered as 3,000 of our own people had their civil liberties forever removed on 9-11. It's Time for U.N. Secretary-General Kofi Annan to Resign


Over the past seven months, the Senate Permanent Subcommittee on Investigations, which I chair, has conducted an exhaustive, bipartisan investigation into


the scandal surrounding the U.N. Oil-for-Food program. That noble program was established by the U.N. to ease the suffering of the Iraqi people, then languishing under Saddam Hussein's ironfisted rule, as well as the economic sanctions imposed on Iraq by the U.N. after the first Gulf War. While sanctions were designed to instigate the removal of Saddam from power, or at least render him impotent, the Oil-for-Food program was designed to support the Iraqi people with food and other humanitarian aid under the watchful eye of the U.N.

Our Investigative Subcommittee has gathered overwhelming evidence that Saddam turned this program on its head. Rather than erode his grip on power, the program was manipulated by Saddam to line his own pockets and actually strengthen his position at the expense of the Iraqi people. At our hearing on Nov. 15, we presented evidence that Saddam accumulated more than \$21 billion through abuses of the Oilfor-Food program and U.N. sanctions. We continue to amass evidence that he used the overt support of prominent members of the U.N., such as France and Russia, along with numerous foreign officials, companies and possibly even senior U.N. officials, to exploit the program to his advantage. We have obtained evidence that indicates that Saddam doled out lucrative oil allotments to foreign officials, sympathetic journalists and even one senior U.N. official, in order to undermine international support for sanctions. In addition, we are gathering evidence that Saddam gave hundreds of thousands — maybe even millions — of Oil-for-Food dollars to terrorists and terrorist organizations. All of this occurred under the supposedly vigilant eyes of Kofi Annan and the U.N.

The Camera Doesn't Lie

During the past four years of conflict, the Israeli army has been harshly criticized by the Western press, which has gone out of its way to portray the military as a ruthless war machine. To combat the lies of Palestinian propaganda, the IDF is training its soldiers to film confrontations with armed Palestinian terrorists.





is conducted under the auspices of the Army Spokesman's office. Soldiers from elite units learn the ins and outs of video and still photography to capture what really goes on during clashes.

"Though we have long reported that Palestinian terrorists use children as human shields, this was never captured on film by the Palestinian cameramen in the field," said a statement by the Film and Photography Unit of the Army Spokesman's Office. "Now, we can present the confrontations from a soldier's perspective."



"Women at the Wall"

Israel's Supreme Court has hammered out a compromise after a series of confrontations between Orthodox Jews and "Women at the Wall," a liberal group that advocates equal rights for men and women at the Western Wall in Jerusalem, Judaism's holiest site. Insisting the women be allowed to blow the *shofar*, (ram's horn) and wear *tallitot* (prayer shawls) and *kippot* (skullcaps), the group also believes that men and women may pray together. For Orthodox Jews, this is abhorrent.

ISRAEL: HATED

A compromise provided an alternative place of prayer near the wall, along the pathway that leads to the Temple Mount. The site, which cost 2 million shekels (\$470.000), accommodates up to 40 people. There is a separate entrance to avoid further confrontations.

The "Women at the Wall," however, rejected the compromise, saying they feel even more ostracized than before by being moved off to the side. They plan to continue their struggle for equal rights at the traditional place in front of the *Kotel* (Western Wall).

Water Wizard

At an international science fair in Stockholm, 18-year old Ron Neuman of Ramat Gan near Tel Aviv received second prize in water technology. The young scientist has developed a warning system for contaminated water. By age 15, Neuman developed genetically engineered bacteria that can trace pollution in water without expensive laboratory testing. The cash prize was awarded to him personally by the Queen of Sweden.

Fine Feathered Friends

Every year, a half billion birds migrate across Israel. In the fall, they fly south for the warm winter in Africa, and in the spring they return, enroute to Europe. Among the flocks are some

500,000 storks that fly through the Jordan River Valley. An international treaty signed by Israel requires protection for the migrating birds. Accordingly, Israel's Electric Company covered the tips of its electric pylons with plastic tops.

Breakthrough in Cancer Treatment

Scientists at the Weizmann Institute of Science in Rehovot have developed a biological "computer" that not only identifies different types of cancer cells, but also emits the appropriate medications to destroy them. Professor Ehud Shipiro surprised participants at a conference in Brussels with this stunning scientific breakthrough.

The new computer goes a step further than the molecular version developed in 2001, which creates synthetic DNA and various enzymes, but which has not proven successful. It will take scientists a few more years to improve and perfect the biological computer.

The computer analyzes the number of mRNA (messenger RNA) molecules in the fluid surrounding it. Any deviation of the numbers from the norm indicates the presence of cancer cells, which are identified. The computer then emits the most potent medication against that particular cancer to eradicate the malignant cells.

OF ALL NATIONS

Clever Cops

With budget cuts resulting in severe manpower shortages, Israeli police are trying a novel approach to reduce the daily toll of traffic accidents. Lifesized replicas of police officers have been placed at strategic locations on the highways. "The cars racing by won't notice it's not a real police officer and will automatically



reduce speed," said Ronen Ben-Amo, spokesman for the traffic division. Inflatable patrol cars are also planned.

The Only Democracy in the Middle East

People say that Israel is the only democracy in the Middle East, but Arabs do not enjoy equal rights.

Whoever makes statements like this does not understand the Knesset (parliament). In Israel, every citizen can freely vote or be elected. Currently, there are 12 parties represented in the Knesset, among them three Arab factions. Out of the 120 parliamentarians, nine are Arabs. In fact. Arab Knesset members made the most speeches in the plenum last year, including Abdul malik Dehamshe, who made 330 speeches, followed by Taleb al-Sana with 243. By contrast, Prime Minister Ariel Sharon spoke 13 times, and Defense Minister Shaul Mofaz seven.

The fact that PM Sharon has worked hard to form a broad coalition government shows how important it is for him that all sectors of the population are involved in the decision-making process that shapes the state of Israel. This is especially difficult in a nation composed of so many ethnic backgrounds and religious beliefs. Every honest politician from other nations respects this and salutes Israeli democracy — the only democracy in the Middle East.



From Sweden to the Wild "West Bank"

Leaving her friends at the University of Göteborg in Sweden, 21 yearold Talia Meir immigrated to Israel. For Talia, this was the first step toward fulfilling her dream of serving in a combat unit. "I want to support my people," she said. Meir joined the Karakal (wildcat) unit, in which men and women serve together. After basic training, her unit deployed in Palestinian-ruled Kalkilya in Samaria.

FDA approves Israeli Drugs that Fight Alzheimer's, Parkinson's

Excess iron that causes the brain to rust is the target of three new drugs developed at the Technion-Israel Institute of Technology to treat and perhaps prevent neurodegenerative diseases such as Alzheimer's, Parkinson's and Lou Gehrig's disease (amyotrophic lateral sclerosis or ALS).

The trio of drugs known as VK-28, HLA-20, and M30 which were recently patented worldwide and in the U.S. by the Israeli developers and approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration — mop us excess iron before it can trigger chemical reactions between oxygen free radicals and iron, a hallmark of many neurodegenerative diseases.

Unlike other drugs currently used against these disorders which try to replace the functions lost by dying neurons, these drugs halt the neuron destruction itself. The research, by Prof. Moussa Youdim of the Technion's faculty of medicine and colleagues Prof. Avraham Warshawsky (now deceased), Prof. Mati Fridkin, and doctoral student Hailin Zheng from China, was published in the November issue of Nature Review Neuroscience.



Leading Israeli archaeologists strongly protested the illegal construction of an underground mosque for 30,000 people on the Temple Mount in Jerusalem. The archaeologists charged that during construction, 12,000 tons of rubble were removed, some of which contained archaeological treasures that could be lost forever.

The Temple Mount is a world cultural heritage site, but the U.N. has been silent about this destruction, even though it protested vehemently when statues of Buddha were destroyed by the Taliban in Afghanistan. By destroying artifacts, the Muslims hope to wipe out all traces of the Biblical Temples — to underscore their claim that they never existed!




