The Worst of Times

SRAEL'S RIGHT TO EXIST IS NOW DEBATABLE, according to op-ed page editors at *The New York Times*, where, it seems, no column excoriating Israel is too extreme or factually flawed to pass muster.

Michael Tarazi's recent piece entitled "Two Peoples, One State," calling for the dissolution of the Jewish state, was particularly shrill and mendacious.

Certainly, as a legal advisor to the PLO, Tarazi's argument in favor of terminating Israel is of interest. The problem is that the argument relies on patently false assertions. In a publication that claims to be committed to accuracy, not only in its news coverage, but on its opinion pages as well, the falsehoods should never have gotten by editors — and would not normally do so.

Invoking the most odious comparison in the modern lexicon — to apartheid South Africa — Tarazi's premise, stated and restated, is that Israel is a racist country that oppresses non-Jews, blocking them from citizenship rights, and, as such, is morally illegitimate and should be done away with and transformed into a big.



mate and should be done away with and transformed into a bi-national state. There, presumably, all people would be treated equitably.

We were greatly heartened by the positive results of the Iraqi election. The *Levitt Letter* long ago specified



that we invaded Iraq and Afghanistan in order to surround the more dangerous Iran. Now, democratic elections have succeeded in both countries.

The South African smear is a standard trope among European Israel-bashers and radical campus agitators, but has generally remained in the fever swamp fringes of American debate. Its recent emergence in opinion writing in *The New York Times, The New Yorker*, the *Los Angeles Times*, and other mainstream publications is a matter of note.

So receptive are they to the Israel-as-South-Africa allusion that *Times* editors ignore such obvious refutations of the slur as the fact that 23% of the country is non-Jewish, mainly Arab Muslims and Christians, that they are the freest "non-Jews" of the Middle East, and that members of these communities serve in the Israeli parliament, the armed forces, and the Supreme Court.

In his indictment of Israel, Tarazi makes various false statements, including the following:

More than 400,000 Israelis live illegally in more than 150 colonies, many of which are atop Palestinian water sources.

Israel is offering 'independence' on a reservation stripped of water and arable soil...

[West Bank and Gaza] Palestinians must drive on separate roads, in cars bearing distinctive license plates, and only to and from designated Palestinian areas. It is illegal for a Palestinian to drive a car with an Israeli license plate. These Palestinians, as non-Jews, neither qualify for Israeli citizenship nor have the right to vote in Israeli elections. In South Africa, such an allocation of rights and privileges based on ethnic or religious affiliation was called apartheid.

All these statements (and others) should have raised alarms for *Times* fact-checkers, but none did. Beginning with the first, "colony," of course, is another modern curse word implying an alien community established in

foreign territory by an imperial power. None of this applies historically, legally, or logically to the Israeli presence. Yet the *Times* apparently believes it does, and concurs that the Old City of Jerusalem — including the ancient Jewish Quarter, the Western Wall and the Temple Mount, as well as the Mount of Olives, Hebrew University, and Hadassah Hospital on Mt. Scopus — are part of illegal Israeli "colonies," for all are in areas of eastern Jerusalem whose residents are encompassed in Tarazi's reference to 400,000 Israelis living in illegal "colonies."


Tarazi's various references to water use are also factually erroneous, including his charges that Israeli communities in the West Bank and Gaza sit "atop Palestinian water sources" and that Israel is "strip[ping]" Palestinian areas of water.

Jewish settlements, which have been built almost without exception on uninhabited land, are not "atop" private or town wells belonging to Arabs. The PLO writer evidently refers here to a familiar propaganda charge that Israel is appropriating Arab water from aquifers under the West Bank.

The geological facts and Israel's actual policies, which were of no interest to the Times, are relevant. Rain water that falls on the mountains of the West Bank and percolates through porous surface rock into the aquifer far below then naturally flows downwards toward the Israeli coastline. There, as has been the case for generations, water collects, rising close to the surface in natural springs, such as Rosh Ha'ayin, inside Israel. Even in the 1950s — before Israel controlled the West Bank — it used 95 percent of the Western Aquifer's water, and 82% of the Northeastern Aguifer's water, because it was in Israel that the waters were easily accessible.

Nor is there a rationale on legal grounds to suggest Palestinian ownership of such West Bank water. Israel's development of the water resources, including the draining of swamps where such water accumulated at ground level, and its long prior use of the water give it rights in the same way Egypt has internationally recognized rights to the

Scripture and Israel

Review of Paper Presented by Dr. David Hocking at the Pre-Trib Study Group Conference December 6 – 8, 2004

The Pre-Trib Study Group led by Dr. Tim LaHaye and Dr. Thomas Ice had its recent annual meeting in Dallas, and the theme was "Israel in Prophecy." The conference has always been interested in Israel as it relates to the Rapture of the Church, the Tribulation and the Millennium, but this is the first time Israel has been the primary subject, and all the presentations were very pro-Israel. Is this an indication that the pro-Israel forces are gaining momentum in the battle for the hearts and minds of evangelical Believers in Christ?

Leading Biblical and prophetic scholars and authors from around the world gathered to present papers on the theme of the conference. This year, one of the speakers was Dr. David Hocking, leader of the Hope for Today Ministries. His title was "The Importance of the Modern State of Israel." In making his case, Dr. Hocking presented a study of the word *Israel*.

Some people think that either the church has replaced Israel or that Israel will have no significance until Christ returns to establish His kingdom on earth. Therefore, they relegate the current State of Israel to a position of little importance in theology or eschatology. However, Hocking shows that the Biblical promises make the current Israel necessary and important in God's prophetic plan.

The Promise of a Land. Hocking argues that God promised to the

Jews a specific Land which they would own for all time.

- (1) The word "Israel" refers to a new name for Abraham's grandson Jacob Genesis 32:28; 35:10.
- (2) The word "Israel" refers to the twelve tribes who descended from the sons of Jacob Genesis 49:28.
- (3) The Bible refers to the "children of Israel" 644 times, of which 14 usages are in the New Testament.
- (4) The word "Israel" refers to the "nation" that was given the 613 commandments of God Deuteronomy 4:1, 7-8.
- (5) The word "Israel" refers to the "Land" which was promised to the descendants of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob Genesis 17:8; 26:3; 35:12; Psalm 105:8-11; Ezekiel 37:11-14.
- (6) The term "Israel" is used for the ten northern tribes that separated from the tribes of Judah and Benjamin in the days of King Rehoboam, the son of Solomon I Kings 12:16-24.
- (7) The term "Israel" is also used in the New Testament to describe those

Jews who became Believers in the Messiah; they are called "the Israel of God" — Galatians 6:16. Interestingly, God refers to Himself as "the LORD God of Israel" 108 times and as the "God of Israel" 203 times.

Thus, there are many uses of the term "Israel" in the Bible, but one of the uses of the term Israel includes a reference to the Land, which has been given to the people of Israel, as long as the earth stands. This Land is part and parcel of the grand Messianic program, which involved not only the death, resurrection and ascension of Christ, but also His glorious return.

The Problem of Unbelief. Just because the nation of Israel was unfaithful and did not believe in Jesus as the Messiah/Redeemer, Hocking states that God has not cancelled His promise of the Land.

One proof of this is the future resurrection of the nation Israel described in Ezekiel 37:I-I4. Some interpreters believe that the Dry Bones resurrection of Ezekiel is identical with the resurrection of Old Testament individual Believers mentioned in Daniel I2, and not to the nation. However, the con-

text and the terminology demonstrate that this is the restoration of the nation described in Isaiah 66:8.

Hocking points out that the phrase "the whole house of Israel" is used 5 times including Ezekiel 37:11 – cf. Leviticus 10:6; Jeremiah 13:11; Ezekiel 39:25; 45:6. The simple phrase "the house of Israel" is used 152 times (6 in the New Testament) — and refers repeatedly to Israel as a nation and as an unbelieving and rebellious nation.

Another argument is the national **REPENTANCE** of Israel — *Ezekiel* 39:29; *Zechariah* 12:10. If Israel referred to saved people in this instance, then Israel would not need to repent. The fact is that the covenant nation remains largely in unbelief until very near the time when the Lord Jesus returns as the Savior Redeemer of Israel.

The Prediction of Israel's Survival

God has predicted Israel's survival throughout all time and through the worst time in its future, until its ultimate redemption and inheritance of the Land. Jesus Himself predicted the survival of the nation of Israel through the horrible holocaust of the coming Great Tribulation — Matthew 24:34-35, cf. Jeremiah 31:35-3. Hocking reasons that the generation of Israel that sees the Great Tribulation will survive to the Second Coming, and therefore Israel must survive until then. He presents two interpretations of the prophecy about "this generation."

I. A reference to those who were listening to this prophecy of Jesus (preterist view) and saw the destruction of Jerusalem in 70 AD. However, it is clear that whoever is meant by the words "this generation" — they will exist until "all these things" are fulfilled. That cannot refer to the destruction of Jerusalem because some of "these things" did not occur at that time.

2. A reference to the nation of Israel during the future Great Tribulation. Luke 11:50-51 — Why would the words "may be required of this generation" apply to first century Jews who were not responsible for the death of the prophets mentioned? It would make sense if they apply to the nation of Israel.

ISRAEL'S SURVIVAL IS BASED ON THREE MAJOR ISSUES:

I)GOD'S FOREKNOWLEDGE Romans 11:2

2)GOD'S FAITHFULNESS Deuteronomy 7:9; Psalm 89:30-37

3)GOD'S **FORGIVENESS** Jeremiah 31:31-37; Ezekiel 39:22-29; Romans 11:25-2, cf. Isaiah 63:7

The following is Dr. Hocking's conclusion on all of the above, with which we heartily concur:


CONCLUSION: It is clear from the Biblical evidence that the modern State of Israel is a fulfillment of Bible prophecy. The Bible makes it clear that God will NEVER cast away or forsake His people — the nation and its land will exist forever!

Dr. McCall represented our ministry at this important conference while I was speaking out of town. He was effusive when he gave his report to me. It seems that our ministry and others have made some headway against the odd prophecy teachings prevalent in many of the seminaries today.

Tom was delighted with a wonderful presentation on the book *Hosea* — *The Story of God's Unending Love for Israel* — presented by none other than Dr. Mark Bailey, President of Dallas Theological Seminary. This newsletter had strongly objected to an article by Dr. Bailey advising Christians not to get involved with Israel's problems.

Another change was the appointment of Dr. Paige Patterson, a fine dispensational Bible professor as president of Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary in Fort Worth. Taken together with the resignation of Joseph Stowell from Moody Bible Institute, we are starting to suspect that the theological pendulum could be swinging back toward real scriptural accuracy and real Christian love for Israel.

I would like to think that our programs and articles played a small part in these encouraging developments. Stay tuned. We will keep you posted. — Zola





"Covenants of God" Video Series, Music Tape and CD

The covenants made by God with men and nations throughout the Bible are guideposts for understanding scripture. This series illustrates, through testimony of expert teachers and analysis of the actual verses, the great covenants of God. We now live under the last of them, the New Covenant, which will be totally fulfilled at the time of the return of our Lord.

Edenic Covenant

This program explores the Mosaic Covenant of commandments, judgments and ordinances given to Israel: "For all have sinned." Zola interviews Dan Hendrickson, Gary Cooperberg and David Tel Tsur, a Messianic Believer, about the significance of the Mosaic Covenant.

Land Covenant

Zola teaches about the Land Covenant, which secures the final restoration and conversion of Israel. He interviews former Prime Minister Shimon Peres about the peace process. He also talks with David Bar-Illan, media adviser to then Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu.

Davidic Covenant

The Davidic Covenant established the perpetuity of the Davidic Kingdom and furthered God's plan of redemption through the future Messiah. Zola interviews Uzi Landau, Israel's then Minister of Foreign Affairs, about the threat Muslim fundamentalists pose to the security of Israel.

New Covenant

The New Covenant rests upon the sacrifice of Christ and secures eternal blessedness for Believers. It is absolutely unconditional. Zola interviews Rabbi Henri Noach, Gary Cooperberg and Rev. Benjamin Berger, a Messianic Believer, regarding the relationship of Jews and Christians.

homas Friedman recently reported in *The New York Times*: "When the fascist insurgents are forced to confront the fact that their tactics have not only failed to prevent the elections, but have also dug the Sunnis of Iraq into a deeper hole..." Friedman is making the assumption that Muslim terrorists think reasonably and logically and realize that if things are getting worse for them, they are on the wrong path. That is not true of Muslim radicals and not of Muslims in general.

An example would be the Palestinians, who, given the opportunity to live in a democracy in 1948, resisted the Israelis with everything they had, and in 1967, and 1973, when they (with Egypt, Syria and Jordan) were soundly defeated in shooting wars by the modern, well-equipped army of Israel. Although their fortunes continued to get worse and worse, they sank into the "Children's Intifada" in 1987 — simply an exercise in throwing rocks at armed soldiers until the soldiers had to respond. Then, with their society in utter disarray and poverty, they declared "Arafat's Intifada" (September 2000) and reduced themselves to utter paupers.

All they got for their efforts was the murder of about 1,000 innocent civilians out of an Israeli nation of five million people and total degradation, poverty and misery for themselves. (With 80,000 Americans murdered during the same period, we should ask the Israelis to bring us a peace process.)

But they have not yet changed their tactics one iota. Friedman is wrong. Fanatic Muslims do not think reasonably or logically, and that goes for the whole of their societies in their continuing war against the United States.

A book entitled The Sword of Islam

A Note From Zola

says that Islam is an "international psychosis." Author Serge Trifkovik gives a very thorough history of the Muslims, very bloody, I'm afraid, and at times very advanced, and brings us to the present day where Muslims seem very hostile.

Now our government and many people around us tell us that there are moderate Muslims. I honestly have dealt with Muslims for some thirty years. It's hard for me to apply the word "moderate" to them. Muslims are very intense and passionate in their feelings, and when their feelings, run counter to an idea, a person or a nation, they seem edgy and hard to handle. I don't have to develop that point beyond the fact that we have been attacked already by Muslims.

There are fields in the Golan Heights where land mines left over from the wars of 1967 and 1973 still remain in the soil. Marked by an internationally understood symbol, an orange triangle, they are fenced carefully, so that people and animals don't walk into them and get blown up. When one drives past one of those fields, it seems like peaceful farmland — green, fertile and pleasant to see. It's too bad it would take such trouble and expense to clear those land mines, as the soil would otherwise be quite usable.

And that makes an analogy for me with Islam.

The people can seem quite peaceful and moderate (like those pretty fields). Mohamed Atta, who flew an airplane into the World Trade Center, seemed



previously to that day a good citizen — clean shaven, handsome and an inoffensive taxpayer. But when called by his homeland to murder thousands of innocent Americans, he responded instantly, like a land mine that is stepped on.

I've said it and said it: We must take these people very seriously. The two wars coming up are obvious to political observers: The whole Islamic world vs. democracy and then the Chinese ("Kings of the East") vs. the United States in a final showdown over who is the real world power.

Prophecy is written exactly that way. The upcoming Tribulation begins with the (Islamic) invasion of Gog and Magog (Ezekiel 38, 39), and ends with the enormous army of the Far East attacking the Western world in the form of the Antichrist's administration of Israel. China, and perhaps other allies, will march 200 million men to the Middle East for that ultimate showdown with what will survive of democracy under the Antichrist, ostensibly to decide the new superpower.

So we see it all forming before our very eyes. I wish I could say better for Islam, but I don't see that it will be in any way helpful or constructive in the future. We have made an election happen in Iraq and perhaps that will cause the people to feel

as though they have a voice in their government. But the terrorists will still exist, they will still be angry, and I don't think things will get much better. Maybe over a long period of time we can influence that nation toward at least a little more peace and perhaps an absence of terrorism. But if the election in "Palestine" is any example, there will be ongoing unrest.

It should be borne in mind that Egypt and Jordan have both pretended to be democracies for decades, but both remain under the thumbs of despots. It bears noting that in a recent Egyptian parliamentary election, sixty people were killed at the polls because of whom they did or didn't support.

The elections don't exactly free the people, but they at least demonstrate to a society that they can have some small voice in their government. The American election was an encouraging message that Believers have some clout, and when pushed to the brink, are able to use it. That bodes well for the future, but unfortunately, the Rapture is going to really split this country. When the Believers leave, the rest of America will be not


In any case, every Believer who possibly can, should take a look at Israel in this age, because when you're there for the thousand year Kingdom, you'll

"Very Interesting Times"

Months after the Indian Ocean rose up to inundate the Southeast Asian rim of the seismological "Ring of Fire," the enormous

geopolitical and historic importance of the disaster is only beginning to be felt and understood. To garner a glimpse of the future impact of the disaster that has taken the lives of approximately a quarter million mostly Muslim people, we need to look backward in time.

Ironically, it was an earlier geological event that is credited by many historians for the dominance of Islam in the region today. In 1883, the Dutch controlled much of the region and Christianity was steadily growing. Then, the volcano Krakatoa, located off southern Sumatra, erupted with such force, it was heard in Australia and India. Approximately 40,000 people died from waves as high as 120 feet, and so much ash was thrown into the atmosphere that the entire global climate cooled noticeably for several years.

One superficial, though fascinating, indicator of the enduring impact of the Krakatoa eruption is "The Scream" — Edvard Munch's iconic painting of a panic-stricken face beneath a crimson sky. Art historians tell us that the image, associated today with the fright mask in the Wes Craven "Scream" slasher movies, was inspired by the spectacular blood-red sunsets and the dread they inspired internationally for several years after the eruption.

The most profound long-term impact came, however, from the successful efforts by Muslim leaders to convince

local peoples that the eruption and resultant killer waves were divine punishment for accepting Dutch Christian rule. This first historical appearance of radical Islamism in the region led to a wave of assassinations aimed at administrators and Christians that virtually ended the Dutch presence.

Today, of course, the area is overwhelmingly Muslim, which has made the interpretation of the recent undersea earthquake and resultant tsunami problematic for Islamists. Still, a high-ranking adviser to Saudi Arabia's justice minister quickly stated, on government controlled Al-Majd TV, that the affected countries were being punished for their sins. "There is one reason," he said, "They lied, they sinned, and [they] were infidels."


This explanation did not sit well with many Muslims, as the earthquake was centered just offshore of Indonesia — the world's most populous Muslim country and the hardest hit of all the nations affected. Many Southeast Asian Muslims begrudged the idea that Islamic countries, full of and ruled by Muslims, are more sinful and deserving of a Sodom and Gomorrah type cleansing than kaffir, or non-Islamic, countries.

A slightly more palatable interpretation arose, voiced by many clerics and scholars, but put forth succinctly by Sheik Mudeiris in the official Palestinian Authority TV Friday Sermon. In a word, he blamed the tragedy on "tourism," which he believes is a Zionist conspiracy, despite the fact that the vast majority of foreign vacationers who frequent Indian Ocean resorts are European, as are the sources of international investment there.

"The oppression and corruption caused by America and the Jews have increased," Sheik Mudeiris proclaimed to the Palestinians in the name of their government. "Have you heard of these beaches that are called 'tourists' paradise?' You have all probably heard of Bangkok. We read about it, and knew it as the center of corruption on the face of this earth. Over there, there are Zionist and American investments. Over there, they bring Muslims and others to prostitution. Over there, there are beaches, which they dubbed 'tourists' paradise,' while only a few meters away, the locals live in hell on earth."

This explanation, as well, failed to thrill the Muslim masses who chafe at the notion that the lives of more than 200,000 of their fellow believers, and the livelihoods of millions, were acceptable collateral damage

in the otherwise admirable goal of killing off several thousand beach-goers and shutting down their resorts for less than week.

Another inconvenient complication for those who hold this view is that the Indonesian province hit hardest is also the most zealously Islamic. Aceh, located on the northern tip of Sumatra, is about 80 miles from the epicenter of the sub-oceanic earthquake, and suffered between 80,000 and 100,000 deaths. Christians have long been persecuted there and churches regularly burned. Only two years ago, Aceh officially adopted Islamic shari'a law.

Moreover, many of Aceh's most radical jihadists, separatists who support the complete Islamization of the Indonesian government, were hiding out in island bases along the coast, that were even closer to the center of the tsunami. Few, if any, survived the deluge. As the Muslim world began to understand the details of the tsunami, an entirely new explanation began to spread throughout Muslim communities around the world — showing up even on American streets.

Out of Egypt and onto the Web came the theory that a secret experiment involving Indian nuclear weapons, facilitated by Israel and the United States, caused the earthquake and tsunami. There are, of course, Muslims who are mortified by the bizarre, science-fiction conspiracies coming out of the official media of the Middle East's tyrants. Given the risks entailed in speaking out against these forces, we probably should not be too harsh in our judgment of their silence.

The most irritating development for those who want to blame geological activities on the Jews and their American accomplices, however, is the ongoing and overwhelming domination, by these "Zionist conspirators," in the rescue and relief efforts. While the UN twiddled its thumbs and Middle Eastern leaders maintained their focus and spending on supporting anti-democratic terrorists, the American and Australian militaries acted immediately — bringing lifesaving aid to millions of survivors who would have otherwise died of starvation and disease.

These were already trying times for Muslim tyrants and their enablers. Then, however, the President of the United States put forth, in his inaugural speech, the most radical, revolutionary policy declaration in modern history. Here are just two paragraphs from that speech:

"We are led, by events and common sense, to one conclusion: The survival of liberty in our land increasingly depends on the success of liberty in other lands. The best hope for peace in our world is the expansion of freedom in all the world.

"America's vital interests and our deepest beliefs are now one. From the day of our founding, we have proclaimed that every man and woman on this earth has rights, and dignity, and matchless value, because they bear the image of the Maker of Heaven and earth. Across the generations we have proclaimed the imperative of self-government, because no one is fit to be a master, and no one deserves to be a slave. Advancing these ideals is the mission that created our nation. It is the honorable achievement of our fathers. Now it is the urgent requirement of our nation's security, and the calling of our time."

Without question, history is on the move and Muslim tyrants know that another sort of tidal wave is headed even now toward the Middle East. We live in very interesting times.

A Conference on Window Dressing

On February 5, Saudi Arabia opened a fourday international conference on counter-terrorism. According to the Saudi Embassy in

rorism. According to the Saudi Embassy in Washington, the aim of the conference will be to "develop specific proposals for improving bilateral, regional and international cooperation on counter-terrorism," while also focusing on "improving capabilities to combat terror financing, money laundering and drug trafficking."

There are some 50 nations participating in the conference, including Syria, Egypt, Sudan, Pakistan, and Iran. Several international organizations will also be represented, including the EU, the UN, INTERPOL, and League of Arab States.

The official conference website outlines why Saudi Arabia decided to organize and host this conference, saying, "The Kingdom of Saudi Arabia is concerned with mobilizing international efforts to confront and uproot terrorism, prevent its growth, and stop its funding sources."

Conference themes include:

- Origins, sources, culture, and ideology of terrorism.
- Relationship between terrorism, money laundering, arms and drugs trafficking.
- Lessons learned from experiences in combating terrorism.
- Terrorist organizations and their compositions

For the Saudis to be hosting a conference on counterterrorism is like putting prisoners in charge of the jail.

This is merely a window dressing act for the Western world, an attempt to convince them that Saudi Arabia genuinely isn't involved with terror support and financing. However, documents captured by the IDF in Operation Defensive Shield, the closure of several Saudi based "charities" in the U.S., the 9/11 hijackers, and Saudi-born Osama bin Laden speak otherwise.

The Concluding Doxology

Jesus taught us to pray in an entirely Jewish manner. The first three phrases of the socalled "Lord's Prayer" mirror the Jewish Kaddish and the sanctification of God's Name. The middle phrases summarize the essential petitions of the ancient Jewish Amidah prayer, and the climactic conclusion mirrors the praises King Solomon offered at the dedica-

tion of the first Temple (1 Chronicles 29:11-13). All in all, this is an entirely Jewish prayer given to us by ourJewish Lord and Savior.

Like most other Jewish prayers, this one ends with the adverb "amen" meaning "truly" or "surely." Amen comes from a root word (aman) meaning to nourish, support, and to make sure and strong. The Hebrew word for faithfulness, emunah, comes from this same root.

The Jewish sages teach that "amen" can be thought of as an acronym for el melekh ne'eman, "God is a faithful King," a phrase said every day before the Shema is personally recited. And indeed the Lord Jesus is "the Amen, the faithful and true witness" (Revelation 3:14) who has shown us the power and the glory of the One who is to be worshipped forever in Spirit and in truth.



For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever. Amen. (Matthew 6:13b)



The very first word of Scripture is b'reishit (Genesis 1:1) and the last word is amen forever and ever Amen (Revelation 22:21).

Puting these words together we obtain, "In the beginning was Amen." Likewise, putting the very first and last letters of the Scriptures toegether yields the word ben, meaning "a son." From beginning to end, then, we see that the Scriptures point to the Lord Jesus as the Faithful and True Son of the Father, the rightful King of the Kingdom of God.



Israel was ranked the number one country where British people would least like to live or visit on holiday. Out of several other criteria measured, Russia alone scored lower overall than Israel.


Israel gained the title of the world's least beautiful country and New Zealand the prettiest.

A middle school teacher has been suspended with pay while officials investigate a report he told his students that Bedouin Arabs used the Quran as toilet paper.

The teacher is on the faculty of Woodworth Middle School in Dearborn, a Detroit suburb of 100,000. About 30,000 Dearborn residents are Arab-American.

Bedouins are members of historically nomadic tribes and make up about 10 percent of the population of the Middle East. The Quran is the Muslim holy book.

Parents complained to the American-Arab Anti-Discrimination Committee and the Council on American-Islamic Relations. Imad Hamad, Michigan director of the American-Arab Anti-Discrimination Committee said the teacher should apologize.

"I only wonder what was in his mind when he looked into their eyes and stated such an ugly description and such painful words," he said.

Superintendent John Artis transferred the unnamed teacher to a different school.

Return of the Sanhedrin Israel Today

It's been nearly 1600 years since the Sanhedrin, the highest court of Jewish Law which used to meet in the chambers of the Temple, last convened in 425 AD. An attempt to revive the tribunal in the ancient Galilean city of Safed several centuries ago was rejected by many of the leading rabbis of that time.

Now, the Sanhedrin has finally been revived in Tiberias, on the Sea of Galilee. According to the Talmud, the Sanhedrin was convened in ten separate cities after the destruction of the Second Temple. Because the last city was Tiberias, it's appropriate that the Sanhedrin has been reinstituted there. Later, the court will move to Jerusalem, according to Rabbi Yisrael Ariel, head of the Temple Institute.

The Sanhedrin is composed of 71 rabbis from all streams of Judaism.

In the Talmud (Oral Law), it is written that the prophet Elijah will appear before the Sanhedrin to announce the coming of the Messiah: "The Messiah will be a king of Israel, and as such, he can only be recognized by a duly ordained Sanhedrin" (Tosefta, Sanhedrin 3:2; Yad, Sanhedrin 5:1). We are living in prophetic times!

A verse to the wise...

"Today Is The Day of Salvation."

The evidence for the soon return of Jesus Christ is overwhelming. It could be at any moment. One scholar lists 167 converging clues just in the last few years of the last millennium. Here are eight:

Prayer Book for Rent

Simon Wiesenthal, the famous Nazi-hunter, once spoke at a conference of European Rabbis in Bratislava, Slovakia. The rabbis presented the 91-year-old Wiesenthal with an award, and Mr. Wiesenthal, visibly moved, told them the following story.

It was in Mauthausen, shortly after liberation. The camp was visited by Rabbi Eliezer Silver, head of Agudat Harabanim (Union of Orthodox Rabbis of North America), on a mission to offer aid and comfort to the survivors. Rabbi Silver also organized a special service, and he invited Wiesenthal to join the other survivors in prayer. Mr. Wiesenthal declined, and explained why.

"In the camp," Mr. Weisenthal said to Rabbi Silver, "there was one religious man who somehow managed to smuggle in a *siddur* (prayer book). At first, I greatly admired the man for his courage — that he'd risked his life in order to bring the siddur in. But the next day, I realized, to my horror, that this man was 'renting out' this siddur to people in exchange for food. People were giving him their last piece of bread for a few minutes with the prayer book. This man, who was very thin and emaciated when the whole thing started, was soon eating so much that he died before everyone else — his system couldn't handle it."

Mr. Wiesenthal continued: "If this is how religious Jews behave, I'm not going to have anything to do with a prayer book."

As Wiesenthal turned to walk away, Rabbi Silver touched him on the shoulder and gently said in Yiddish: "Du dummer (you silly man). Why do you look at the Jew who used his siddur to take food out of starving people's mouths? Why don't you look at the many Jews who gave up their last piece of bread in order to be able to use a siddur? That's faith. That's the true power of the siddur." Rabbi Silver then embraced him.

"I went to the services the next day," said Wiesenthal.

Christian missionaries hope to spread the Word of God along with relief supplies in South Asian nations devastated by the tsunami. But the religious outreach isn't going over well with some Muslims.

"We need to get past the death toll and get focused on the living — because that's where our ministry is going to be," the Baptist Press quoted its disaster relief coordinator in Aceh, Indonesia, as saying.

The coordinator — whose real name was not given for security reasons — told the Baptist Press: "We've got an opportunity to reshape the people's perception of Christianity. They've got us categorized in just one box [together with all Westerners].... We can reshape that."

The Council on American-Islamic Relations (CAIR), in a recent email to supporters, said Christian missionaries are "exploiting the tsunami suffering."

In its January 7 "American Muslim News Briefs," CAIR included a report from the Agape Press, which noted that a Virginia-based missions ministry has sent teams to South Asia "to fulfill disaster victims' needs even as it works to fulfill the Great Commission."

"When they're passing out a bottle of water, a blanket, a lantern, a candle, they're passing out gospel tracts with them," the Agape Press quoted that ministry spokesman as saying.

The spokesman said missionaries are seizing the opportunity "to be a witness of the love of Jesus Christ to the Hindus, to the Muslims, to whomever was affected, certainly fulfilling the commandment to take the gospel to everybody."

CAIR's newsletter also linked to a second report, this one in The Philadelphia Inquirer, saying that evangelical Christian groups plan to bring the Gospel to tsunami victims along with relief supplies.

The *Inquirer* quoted one missionary as saying that the tsunami disaster "is one of the greatest opportunities God has given us to share his love with people."

When disaster strikes anywhere in the world, Israelis can be counted on to help. So it's no surprise that within hours of the devastating tsunami in the Indian Ocean, the following humanitarian missions all departed from the tiny Jewish state:

An IDF rescue team to Sri Lanka. The Israeli organization *Latet* ("To Give") filled a jumbo jet with 18 tons of supplies.

A medical team headed by four doctors from Jerusalem's Hadassah Hospital arrived in Sri Lanka on December 27, carrying medicine and baby food. The doctors specialize in rescue operations, trauma and pediatrics.

An IDF rescue team to Sri Lanka with 80 tons of aid material, including 10,000 blankets, tents, nylon sheeting, and water containers, all contributed by the IDF.

A ZAKA rescue-and-recovery team arrived in the disaster areas on December 27, armed with its specialized equipment for identifying bodies.

A Health Ministry contingent left for Thailand on December 27 to aid in rescue efforts. The group included doctors, nurses and four members of the IDF.

Israel has also offered its assistance to India — a searchand-rescue team from the Home Front Command, as well as consignments of food and medicine.

Yet, with the exception of UPI, none of the major news outlets dedicated an article to this remarkable Israeli humanitarian effort. This, despite the fact that the IDF sent all Israel-based journalists a press release on December 27 inviting them to the airport to cover the departure of one IDF group.

This is all the more surprising given the fact that the major news agencies have entire teams of reporters in Israel, who submit at least one "Israel-article" each day.

So what did the Associated Press send out December 29 to its 15,000 subscribing news agencies? A dreary story about the construction of a new IDF base near Jenin. AP sarcastically remarked in this "news" story that the base's "elaborate color scheme and landscaping shows that the army is not planning to pull its forces out of the area anytime soon."

The lack of media interest in this Israeli humanitarian effort means that Israeli benevolence toward other peoples is not fairly conveyed to the western world. Perhaps if it were conveyed, observers would come to understand something else — that Israel's response to Palestinian violence is also motivated by the highest ethical concern for all human life, and is not (as the media so often portray it) driven by an oppressive, mean-spirited national ethos.

The Israeli help is in contrast to the negligible financial donations of the wealthy Arab states and their inability to help medically. — Zola

"The Parthenon Code"

Those ancient Greek "myths" we learned about in school, it turns out, weren't myths at all, but rather the


history of the human race told from the Greeks' unique religious standpoint. *The Parthenon Code: Mankind's History in Marble,* a new book by Robert Bowie Johnson, decodes Greek myth and deciphers the meaning of the sculptures from Athena's ancient temple, the Parthenon.

The author shows that Greek myth/art tells the same story as Genesis except from the standpoint that the serpent enlightened Adam and Eve in Eden rather than deluding them. "In their vase-paintings and sculptures, ancient Greek artists take us back through Noah and the Flood to a woman, a serpent, and an apple tree in an ancient paradise," Mr. Johnson said. "Greek artists tell us who they are and where they came from. Once you see the Genesis connection, Greek myth/art becomes easy to understand. Greek artists meant for us to understand it," he added.

Six ancient vase depictions of the Greek version of Eden and five sculptures relating to Eden appear in the book.

According to the author, an authentic ancient Greek artists' code, designed to clearly portray Greek religious history to the masses, first appeared in about 600 BC and reached its highest form with the sculptures of the Parthenon, the national symbol of Greece, completed in 432 BC.

The Parthenon Code reveals that the ancient Greeks rejected the Creator God of Noah in favor of "man as the measure of all things." Thus, Greek myth/art celebrated the re-emergence of the way of Kain (Cain) after the Flood, and the rebirth of the serpent-friendly Eve, whom the Greeks worshiped as Athena. The Greeks called Noah "Nereus," the "Wet One," and dated the beginning of their contrary religious outlook from the latter years of his life, depicting the patriarch's image on many vases, seventeen of which appear in the book.

"The Report is False"

French state-owned television is using intimidation and threatened libel lawsuits to quiet calls for an investigation of TV images that showed the alleged shooting of a Palestinian boy by Israeli soldiers in 2000.

The video from the TV channel France 2 has become famous around the world as a symbol for the current Palestinian uprising and shows a boy trying to take shelter behind a man during a gun battle in September 2000 between Palestinians and Israeli soldiers at the Netzarim junction in the Gaza Strip.

Independent media analysts in France and Israel have provided what they call conclusive evidence that the video of the incident was staged and at least one member of the French Assembly has called for an official investigation of the episode, but France 2 has so far refused to undertake a comprehensive inquiry.

France 2 Television did not respond to numerous requests for interviews by Cybercast News Service in Paris, choosing instead to provide copies of articles reporting it was filing a libel suit against unnamed individuals for defamation.

But Stephane Juffa, editor in chief of the Metula News Agency based in Israel, said he and two other colleagues carried out a thorough investigation, which included scores of interviews and scene-by-scene analysis of the video and other material filmed in 2000.

Juffa said he had no information about how the child in the morgue was killed, but doctors there said the boy arrived hours before the actual Netzarim gun battle described in the video took place.

According to France 2 Television reporter Charles Enderlin, the boy, 12-year old Mohammed al-Durra, was killed in the end by Israeli bullets and the father was severely wounded.

Enderlin was not present during the incident, but his Palestinian cameraman, Talal Abu Rahma, was the only cameraman to record the images of what Enderlin described as the killing of the child by Israeli bullets.

France 2, which is state-owned, distributed the video in a 55-second story to television stations worldwide at no cost, saying it did not want to make money on such a sad incident. But the report remains suspect as journalists investigating the video have uncovered evidence that the scene was staged by actors, hours before a real gun battle took place at the site.

"Bribes to Journalists"

Liberal media journalists are all aflutter about columnist Armstrong Williams being paid \$240,000 by the Department of Education to promote the No Child Left Behind program. They are whipping themselves into a moral dudgeon over a conservative black writer besmirching his journalistic ethics. It's a very sophisticated operation, and worldwide in scope.

Among the elements that reveal the forgery are a director ordering retakes of scenes, ambulances appearing within two seconds in an unedited shot after a Palestinian is said to be wounded, the child hoisting himself on his elbows after he is said to be dead, and no blood or bullet wounds on any of the victims.

French media have united in refusing to publicize the evidence by pressuring journalists who fear for their careers in a country where most television and radio journalism jobs are in the state media.

"The child we see during the shooting is not the same child that we see in the morgue in other footage, who has bullet wounds and is identified as Mohammed al-Durra by hospital staff," said Juffa.

That scope includes America — especially America. How many American reporters and columnists — liberal and conservative — are on the Saudi payroll? The best person to investigate this would be legendary journalist Arnaud de Borchgrave, whose deep contacts in both Saudi Arabia and throughout the entire global media community go back decades.


No one would be better than Arnaud at determining whether or not such prominent columnists as Robert Novak and Georgie Anne Geyer, who write consistently fawning columns on Saudi Arabia and blistering attacks on Israel, are beyond suspicion.

It would also be an excellent opportunity for Arnaud to dispel the persistent belief among a number of otherwise knowledgeable people in Washington that, given Arnaud's own rabidly anti-Israel columns, he himself is on the Saudi payroll — which I am sure could not possibly be true.

Why 265 Million Arabs Have So Many Problems

You may have seen articles in newspapers recently on the Arab-US summit held in Morocco. The event, cochaired by former US Secretary of State Colin Powell, featured speech after speech by Arab spokesmen blaming Israel and the United States for Arab nations' failure to fight terror, failure to democratize and failure to eliminate corruption. The problem, the Arabs contend, is Israel's conflict with the Palestinians and U.S. support of Israel. This Arab position displays consummate chutzpah on two counts: First, tiny Israel has no influence on the internal politics and policies of any of the 20 Arab nations in attendance; and second, the stated goal of most Arab states and organizations is the total destruction of Israel. Nonetheless, however implausible, Arab politicians have for decades blamed Israel for the ills of the Arab world.

Here's an example of how it works: In October 2002 a massive study commissioned by the United Nations a body that is virtually never sympathetic to Israel — on the social, political, economic, educational, and democratic progress in the Arab world was carried out by twelve Arab sociologists. They documented the Arab world's massive human rights abuses, wide-sweeping and brutal oppression of women and minorities, gut-wrenching child abuse, and whole populations subsisting in grinding poverty while Arab elites live in obscene luxury. In addition, a dozen wars throughout the Arab world have caused the deaths of millions and made millions more homeless. In most Arab countries, literacy and education opportunities remain at a lower level than most sub-Saharan countries, many have legalized slavery both for labor and sex, and their levels of technological achievement are lower than almost anywhere else in the world.

And to what does this U.N. study attribute such a massive failure of Arab governance and such deplorable levels of human rights, education, freedom, and opportunity? According to the study, the misery, poverty and suffering, from Mauritania through North Africa, to Egypt and "Palestine," Syria and Iraq, Yemen, Saudi Arabia — throughout all 21 Arab nations and all 265,000,000 Arabs living in those nations — are ALL due to "...the occupation of Moslem lands by Israel" — a country the size of Rhode Island with only about five million people.

So why should anyone expect any other explanation from Arab statesmen for the lack of freedom and democracy in the Arab world? Colin Powell, to his credit, exhorted Arab countries at the conference to stop stalling reforms. "Political and economic freedom go hand in hand," he said. "All of us confront the daily threat of terrorism. To defeat the murderous extremists in our midst, we must work together to address the causes of despair and frustration that extremists exploit for their own use." Amr Moussa, the head of the Arab League, replied, saying that while extremism must be fought, any reforms must be linked to a resolution to the Israeli-Palestinian conflict.

Just so we don't forget what the Arabs are talking about when they discuss "resolution of the conflict," Hamas spokesperson Moshir al-Masri underscored it for us again in his comments following the killing of five Israeli soldiers in a Gaza tunnel explosion: "This sends a message to everybody who tries to seek a peace settlement: Resistance is the only option for the Palestinian people."

The goal of Hamas, as of most Arab nations — and as it has been for decades — is not "peace," but the absolute destruction of Israel.

Thankfully, the current U.S. administration seems to understand the duplicity of the Arabs, and it will not let Israel's existence or its right to self-defense stand as an excuse for Arabs failing to clean up their act.

The point taken by those who say the Israel situation is to blame for all the problems in all those unsuccessful nations is absurd. Israel's five million people outperform the entirety of the Muslim world, let alone hundreds of millions of Arabs.

The irony is that the Palestinians are better off than any other Arabs. Egyptians are not permitted visas to visit Israel, because their dictator does not want them to see how well off the Palestinians really are.

After all, Israel has brought clean water, modern medical care, good roads, automobiles, computers, video technology, medicines for the whole world, and a democratic society to a land that was destitute. Palestinians, by simply living next to a successful, progressive democracy like Israel, prosper even though they hate the Israelis and try to murder them.

Most Arabs would find themselves better off if Israel were to *really* occupy their country, just as the Iraqis are better off with Americans in their land. In any case, Israel will finally take its place as the "head of the nations" in the coming Kingdom. — Zola

Politically Incorrect

An Indiana congressman is warning that an Iraqi-style democracy may not make much of a change there. Why? Because the Judeo-Christian ethic is critical to the success of such a venture, he says.

Republican Mark Souder was one of the speakers at a bipartisan prayer service before the opening of the 109th session of Congress. He told the audience that religious faith is the conscience of democracy.

"The United States was at its founding, and still is, not only a religious nation, but largely a Christian nation," Souder said. "Through Judeo-Christian beliefs that anchor our legal, our economic, our military, and our political system, the balance of powers and constraints upon the state — and thus upon the majority — assume the sinful nature of man and one that is not perfectable."

Without a faith grounded in such beliefs, the congressman said, democracy as it is known in the United States cannot work — and he believes that could well be the case in Iraq.

"John Adams said, 'Our Constitution is made for a moral and religious people," Souder noted. "Does democracy in Iraq mean the majority Shia, upon winning,

can deny rights to women and to religious minorities, not to men-

tion exact revenge upon the Sunni? Why *not* do these things if the only standard is democracy?"

He offered a recent demonstration of the nation's morality, whose

"premises rest at least upon the echoes and remnants of Judeo-Christian teaching," he says.

"Over 75 percent of the American people profess to be Christian, and an even higher percentage believe that they were created by God — not some randomly evolving blob of amoeba," Souder stated. "So when a tragedy hits Asia, we don't say 'Tough luck. It's social Darwinism. The fittest will survive.'"

He continued: "They are fellow souls, each one fearfully and wonderfully made by God. Our hearts ache; our hearts cry out at the pain and suffering we see; our hearts bleed."

In the period from 1967 to 1995, West Bank Palestinians increased their domestic water use by 640%, from 5.4 MCM to 40 MCM.

When the Palestinian Authority gained control of the territories, rampant uncontrolled well-drilling ensued, severely damaging water resources in Gaza and the Jenin area. While it is understandable that Tarazi would be silent about the dereliction of the Palestinians, preferring to blame Israel, the question is why *The New York Times* was a partner in this.

Just as false as Tarazi's allegations of Israeli colonizing and theft of natural resources was the brazen claim of

apartheid-like discrimination against Christian and Muslim Arabs of the West Bank. The argument is breathtaking.

In a column offering not a hint about the Palestinian terrorist onslaught originating from the West Bank that prompted Israel's erection of checkpoints and intensified screening of Palestinian travelers, the PLO writer claims the differing license plates of citizens of Israel compared to those of Palestinian residents of the West Bank demonstrates racist separation of non-Jews from Jews.

The *Times* was untroubled by conflicting information,

such as the fact that, except in emergencies, Palestinian Arabs moved freely in the West Bank on virtually any road and even across the Green Line prior to September 2000, which marked the launching of the new terror campaign against Israel.

Nor did the paper see a contradiction in the fact that Muslim and Christian Israelis driving vehicles with Israeli license plates have been among the victims of attacks on West Bank roads since 2000.

But the nub of Tarazi's charge regarding Israeli apartheid is the claim that Palestinians of the West Bank live in a "de facto" state with Jews yet, "as non-Jews," cannot vote and receive citizens' benefits.

Of course, they are denied these rights, not because of their religion or ethnicity, but because they are not citizens. The territory on which West Bank Palestinians live remains in dispute pending negotiations and agreement on "secure and recognized boundaries" under the terms of UN Security Council Resolution 242. Extending citizenship to the Palestinians would constitute annexation of the territory.

Israelis living in the West Bank, most of whom moved there in the context of bolstering Israel's claim to particular strategic locations, which tended to be locations sparsely populated by Arabs, retain their citizenship rights just as Israelis do who move to Rome or Los Angeles.

If and when an agreement is reached, including on borders, Palestinians living in Israeli areas might opt for Israeli citizenship or choose the status of resident aliens who are citizens of the Palestinian state. Jews living in areas that fall under Arab control would likely move to Israeli territory. In an ideal world, they would also have the option of remaining in their present homes as

either citizens of the Arab state or resident aliens, but the Palestinians have made clear that in the context of a two-state solution, all Jewish residents would have to leave, just as all Jews were expelled (or killed) in areas that came under Arab control after the 1947-48 war.

Yet, notwithstanding the gravity and falsity of Tarazi's accusations, his ultimately genocidal prescription for the Jews of Israel, and the many letters sent to the *Times* editor, expressing outrage, the paper initially ran only four replies. Of these, just one brief letter rebutted Tarazi, while the others were laudatory or non-responsive to the errors, half-truths and distortions in the piece.

Nor, when contacted by this author, would the newspaper itself correct the false statement that "as non-Jews" the Palestinians of the West Bank and Gaza were denied the rights of Israeli citizenship.

When a letter was then submitted citing just a few of the factual problems, the *Times* refused to publish it if the words "error," "distortion," "deceptive," or "incendiary" were not removed. These were words, a *Times* editor argued, that were not "in accord with the tone of the letters page." However, in the weeks immediately preceding, numerous *Times* letters had included many examples of these adjectives, as well as other strong criticism. Most of these were directed at the Bush administration, corporations or other entities.

A letter submitted without these words was then scrutinized closely by the *Times* letters department for accuracy, with particular focus on my verifying the percentage of Israelis who are "non-Jews." The scrutiny continued even after the letter was published, when the *Times* responded to a reader's request by asking me for proof that Palestinians had been allowed to use the roads of the West Bank along with Israelis.

The contrast in fastidiousness about the facts is striking. Why is a piece by Michael Tarazi that overflows with unfounded and extreme accusations against Israel readily published, while a letter responding to only a few of his falsehoods is subjected to rigorous "fact-checking"?

The answer seems all too obvious, especially in light of the *Times*' readiness to publish other op-eds of similar virulence. Noam Chomsky's tirade against Israel in February 2004 flung the apartheid charge and repeated similar claims about alleged Israeli water policy. Although Chomsky has long been favored in radical circles, his appearance in the *Times* is a troubling barometer of anti-Israel extremism on the opinion pages.

A piece by Jimmy Carter in November 2004 contained various factually absurd, anti-Israel distortions, including the claim that after the Oslo Accords there was "an absence of serious violence by either side" until "a Jewish nationalist assassinated Mr. Rabin." This would come as quite a surprise to the many families of Israelis slain in bombings and other acts of unprecedented terrorism between September 1993 and November 1995, families that considered the slaughter of scores of innocents "serious" indeed.

Carter's statement was patently false and should have been challenged, but the error was never corrected by the *Times* and was only addressed — without mention of the word "error" — in a reader's letter.

It's true the *Times* has in the last year published columns by Israel's defenders and former officials, such as Benjamin Netanyahu. But none of these were venomous and fallacious. There can be no claim that accurate commentary in defense of Israel "balances" propagandistic and false commentary assailing that nation.

The pattern is obvious: the *Times* has chosen to suspend the norms of fact-checking in op-eds attacking Israel, and in doing so has all too often allowed its editorial pages to be used as a crude anti-Israel propaganda sheet.

Politically Incorrect continued

According to Souder, almost all social change in the history of the United States has been driven by people whose deep commitment to moral views is based upon their personal religious beliefs. "To take religion out of the public arena would leave us with the mean-spirited, survival-of-the-fittest, social Darwinism of evolution," he said.

He concluded by urging his fellow lawmakers to let faith guide their service in Congress. "We should not abandon faith at the door to the House floor. We should not leave the Holy Spirit in the cloakroom. We need to reflect upon this."

He then asked: "Do you really want a world dominated by a United States not anchored in a moral view?"



Moshe and Avi Israel Today

The commander of an Israeli tunnel search unit, Captain Moshe Taranto, 23, of Ashod, Israel, died in a tragic accident during an operation in the volatile Rafah area of the Gaza Strip. Taranto was searching a tunnel, one of many used to smuggle weapons from Egypt to Palestinian terrorist groups, when it collapsed and buried him alive.

Taranto took command of the unit in May of 2004, after the former commander, Avi Hakani, was killed along with four other soldiers during a search for tunnels in Rafah. Moshe and Avi had been close friends since the second grade and served together in the same unit.

"Now Moshe and Avi are together again," said Moshe's mother. "This was a deep friendship, like the friendship between David and Jonathan."

Better Bone Marrow Transplants *Israel Today*

Dr. Samuel Fuchs, chief cardiologist at the Sharon Hospital, and his colleague, Professor Ran Kornovsky from the Rabin Medical Center, have developed a new and improved method of bone marrow transplants. The new procedure has already produced very good results with heart patients.

In this procedure, bone marrow cells from the patient's hipbone are scrupulously examined to ensure cell purity and suitability for transplant. If the results are positive, the number of cells is then reduced to prevent clot formations, after which they are injected where needed.

The new bone marrow cells produce healthy blood cells instead of the sick bone marrow cells. The procedure's advantage is twofold: there's no limit to the number of times it can be carried out and no danger that the body will reject the new cells.

The Bronze Award went to InSightec Image Guided Treatment, Ltd. of Tirat Carmen, Israel for "ExAblate 2000," a non-surgical way to destroy tumors by focusing ultrasound waves on them.

This is a wonderful achievement for Israel. From a world-wide search, Israel took two of the top three places. This should be celebrated by us and brought to the attention of the press worldwide. Israel often receives undeserved bad press. Let us counter this with some positive images. Well done. Israel!

Virtual Bypass Surgery

In another first at Tel Aviv's Rabin Medical Center, cardiologists "performed a virtual bypass operation" in a simulator. The simulator allows "operations" to be performed on a scale of I:I, offers varying levels of difficulty and provides the surgeon with a report that lists any mistakes and how to correct them.

Professor Ran Kornovsky, who developed the concept, wants his team of cardiologists at peak performance so they'll be able "to carry out such operations in their sleep." Personnel who assist in bypass surgery also tested their skills with the simulator to get a feel of how complex the operations can be.

With an average of 4,000 surgeries annually, the bypass department of Rabin Medical Center is the largest and most professional of its kind in the country. Even by international standards, it is one of the most state-of-the-art departments in the world.

Israeli Invention Provides Early Warning of Earthquakes

This home device is as small as a shoebox and will cost consumers less than \$200.

Israeli inventor Meir Gitlis developed the system, which has received much attention in the wake of the disastrous earthquake which caused tsunamis to devastate much of Southeast Asia's coastline. Gitlis told Israel21c that he doesn't claim his early warning system could have made a massive difference — but clearly even the saving of one life makes it worthwhile.

"Since the disaster occurred in the Far East, we've gotten requests from companies to take our sensor technology and develop an instrument against tsunamis," Gitlis said.

Gitlis's "Earthquake Alert" is based on the same seismological principles as earthquake monitoring systems used by weather centers and government agencies worldwide. It contains an array of pendulums that naturally react to vibrations, sending a signal through an electronic circuit to a chip. After analyzing the frequency, the computer chip determines — and notifies the user — whether the movement was caused by a sonic boom, or a bomb, or if it is indeed the tremors of an earthquake.

"An earthquake is like lightning or thunder," Gitlis said. "First comes the primary wave which runs through the ground very quickly. The instrument can sense the primary wave, which occurs tens of seconds before the secondary, destructive wave. The pre-warning of a half minute enables people to find cover."

Gitlis said that the Azrieli Towers in Tel Aviv — the country's tallest buildings — have installed the Earthquake Alert in the skyscrapers' elevators. In the event of a quake, the system will stop the elevators at the nearest floor, allowing people a chance to escape.

Researchers at the State University of New York (SUNY) at Buffalo tested the sensor recently and concluded that it is reliable and does not react to false alarms.



Baby Friendly

The Israeli firm Baby's Breath has developed a "children's hood" that makes it easier to administer aerosol-based medication to infants, even while the baby is asleep. This tent-like hood fits comfortably over the baby's head, without disturbing the infant.

It is ideal for treating asthma, bronchitis, tuberculosis, and other lung diseases, along with other illnesses. It replaces the face mask that's been used until now, which had to be in place for 15 minutes, exceeding the tolerance levels of most babies.

Dr. David Kotashevski of Ben Gurion University's Department of Biotechnology headed the research team, which included medical student Tal Shaked, Dr. David Broday from the Technion in Haifa, and Dr. Israel Amirav from Ziv Hospital in Safed.

The world still awaits any comparable scientific or medical achievements from the 265 million or so Arabs who surround this tiny nation of five million inhabitants.

In the Gulf War in the early 1990s, US soldiers fighting on the Middle Eastern battlefield sometimes found themselves using dressings dated from World War II to patch up their wounds. In the present Iraqi conflict, however, American forces are now using an advanced new bandage, developed in Israel, which can save lives by stopping traumatic hemorrhaging wounds, and can also be used as a tourniquet, or a sling.

The new bandage, called the Emergency Bandage, was developed by First Care Products, a tiny four-man Jerusalem start-up. The bandage marks the first major alteration to field dressings since the 1940s, and has already established its worth.

One of the major causes of death for soldiers at war is not the injury itself, but loss of blood on the battlefield. In the Vietnam war, for example, one in four soldiers killed in action died from hemorrhage bleeding or injuries to their extremities. In the current Iraqi war, only one in 10 deaths are attributable to this. One of the main reasons for this is that the US military has changed tactics. In the past, soldiers were taken off

the battlefield and then treated for their injuries. Today, they are treated on the spot, which improves a victim's chances of survival. Often it is the soldier himself who takes responsibility for dealing with his wounds.

The Emergency Bandage fits well into the new philosophy of military medicine. In the past, soldiers or medics treating wounds would have to use three or four different dressings to bandage a wound. It was time consuming and often it was difficult to achieve the right pressure on a wound to stop the bleeding.

Ofer Molad, First Care's VP of marketing in the US, remembers how he and fellow soldiers serving in the Israel Defense Forces (IDF), would wrap a rock into the

bandage to maintain the right pressure.

The Emergency Bandage, however, is an elasticized bandage with a non-adhesive bandage pad sewn in. The bandage has a built-in pressure bar, which allows the soldier to twist the bandage around the wound once, and then change the direction of the bandage, wrapping it around the limb or body part, to create pressure on the wound. Aside from this, the pressure bar also makes bandaging easier. A closure bar at the end of the bandage means that it clips neatly into place and will not slip.

The pressure bar also enables a soldier to use the bandage on complicated injuries like the groin and head, which require wrapping in different directions.

The bandage can be put on with one hand. "It's a very

The bandage can be put on with one hand. "It's a very versatile bandage," he says. "It can be applied quickly and easily by an injured soldier or non-medical personnel for immediate hemorrhage control. It saves time in an emergency situation where every second is crucial."

Certainly the US military thinks so. In 2003, the US Army purchased nearly 200,000 bandages for its troops. In 2004, the US Army purchased 800,000.

In the Vietnam war, one in four soldiers killed in action died from hemorrhage bleeding or injuries to their extremities.

The Emergency Bandage, nicknamed the Israeli bandage by US troops, was created by American-Israeli Bernard Ben-Natan, a former combat medic in the IDF, who was located for some time at the Jerusalem


