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### 8,000 Years!

An outrageous editorial appeared in *The Washington Post* on February 20. Writer Robin Shepherd specified that anger in Europe toward Israel is reaching "new and disturbing levels." A recent poll of 3,000 Germans showed more than 50% responded equating Israel's policies toward the Palestinians with Nazi treatment of the Jews. 68% of those polled specifically thought that Israel is waging a "war of extermination against the Palestinian people."

Well, let's examine that thought. Israel is obviously policing



the Palestinian murderers in the manner that we Americans police our drug dealers, the Los Angeles gangs, etc. We have said that many times. But the comparison to the Holocaust—that the Israelis are "exterminators"—is a new and dizzying low point in this propaganda.

Let's assume for the moment that the Israelis maliciously caused every single reported Palestinian casualty. And let's accept the Palestinian figure of something like 3,000 people killed since their self-imposed intifada began four years ago. And let's suppose that everyone killed was an innocent civilian, not a terrorist, not a suicide bomber, not someone shooting rockets out of his yard at schools and synagogues in a neighboring settlement. And finally, let's ignore the hundreds of "collaborators" killed by their own people. Let's, in short, assume the Israelis are trying to exterminate the Palestinian people, as two-thirds of the Germans believe, and let's examine whether that compares to the Holocaust.

At this rate of "extermination," it will take the Israelis another **8,000** years to accomplish the casualty figures of the Holocaust! Work it out for yourself. The Germans killed six million people in two or three years in their concentration camps. The Israelis are just beginners at extermination, if you believe that they are conducting extermination.

The truth is that the ongoing Muslim influx into Europe has caused the typical Islamic lies to prevail. It's remarkable that with only 5% of the population being Islamic, two-thirds of them believe a whopper like this one. The article goes on to point out, unfortunately, that "Germany is not alone in these shocking sentiments. They have been expressed elsewhere and often by prominent figures." In 2002, the Portuguese Nobel Prize winning writer Jose Saramago said, "What is happening in Palestine is a crime which we can put on the same plane as what happened at Auschwitz." Mairead Corrigan, the Irish winner of the 1976 Nobel Peace Prize, compared Israel's suspected nuclear weapons with Auschwitz, calling them "gas chambers perfected."

This lunacy, given by Nobel Prize winners, shows how far anti-Semitism can go. Obviously, there's no correlation whatever between Auschwitz, a concentration camp in which millions of people were methodically gassed and burned in ovens, and Israel, where terrorists are eliminated in exactly the same manner as we eliminate them in Iraq, or in the US, for that matter.


The article goes on: "Moreover, in a poll by the European Union in the year 2003, a majority of Europeans named Israel as the greatest threat to world peace." This notion—that a tiny democracy of five million Israelis, less than the population of a large European city, and allowing freedom of the press and of assembly for all, including the Palestinians—is a threat of any kind, is inexplicable. But it's vintage Muslim stuff.

Because they hate the Jews and want them out of the Middle East, the Islamists never stop preaching that the world would be peaceful if only Israel were gone. Actually, the opposite is much more true. If the only freedom-loving and peaceful nation in the Middle East were eliminated, things would simply get worse, and that's obvious.

The article continues: "Perceptions of Israel in the United States meanwhile contrast sharply. A poll... taken in December 2003 for the Anti-Defamation League, had Americans putting Israel tenth place on a list of countries threatening world peace, just ahead of the United States itself." Are Americans becoming a bunch of Ward Churchills, the loony fake Cherokee professor fuming at his fellow citizens from the University of Colorado? (see page 24) Our country is no threat to peace whatsoever. Our country promotes peace, and that's all there is to that. I'm amazed that even one American could say such a thing about America, let alone Israel.

The article goes on concerning the Holocaust: "This faltering awareness of the most vivid example of racist mass-murder in the 20th century is accompanied by enduring anti-Semitism... The left-leaning apathy toward Israel is moreover buttressed

## Stringers Who String Us Along

On the occasion of the recent car bomb in Lebanon, the front page of the *Orlando Sentinel*, and probably any number of other newspapers, had a dramatic photograph by Muhammed Muheisen and a story by Mohamad Bazzi, both of the Associated Press. It occurred to me, as a former newspaperman, that we should lay some stress on the idea of using "stringers" —local "newsmen and photographers" —to get our facts.

You see, the Associated Press, an American news agency, pretends that its reporters are everywhere at once and that they cover all news personally, but the fact is they rely on local suppliers, especially in countries where freedom of the press is limited.

And, obviously, these local news people come with local biases. The story of the car bomb is objective enough, but what really happens in Iraq or in Israel is open to some interpretation.



Those areas contain American news people, since Israel proper and occupied Iraq have freedom of the press. But areas within those countries where the press is shackled, say Fallujah or areas outside of Baghdad and certainly "Palestine," have to be covered by locals.

All news from Palestine is originally submitted by Palestinians, along with their views, which usually include a carefully schooled hatred of Israel.

In Egypt, a supposedly moderate Muslim nation, the press is rigidly controlled by the dictator. All that we have said here applies to television networks as well, so that the news we watch from any Muslim nation carries with it the personal prejudices of whoever happens to be broadcasting.

And it gets worse. There are a lot of areas in the Muslim world from which there is practically no news at all. There is little press, free or otherwise, in Sudan, Indonesia, Saudi Arabia, Iran, and on and on. I mention places that happen to be in our news because of world-shaking events going on where information slips out via UN workers, foreign medical helpers, or occasional government dissidents. But as to dayto-day coverage in Muslim nations, you might as well cross out over a billion human beings—20% of the world—from accurate news reports. Add to those the same number of souls controlled by communism, including all of China, and we have nearly half the world under at least "managed news." Some borderline democracies also suffer from control of their news, as do certain mature democracies like our own.

If I mention a list of Muslim nations. most Americans have hardly heard any news of them. What's going on today in Tunisia, Bangladesh, the United Arab Emirates, etc.?

We complain about American reporters being biased, and some of them surely are biased. Reports from The New York Times, CNN, the major networks, and probably your hometown newspaper are almost laughable. The Times always requires special mention, since its fabrications are copied by other newspapers far and wide, and even read on television by folks with handsome faces who we are supposed to believe are real news reporters. That's bad. But it's a whole lot worse when newspapers are closed or utterly suppressed as in Muslim and communist dictatorships throughout the world.

We reported last month that the king of Nepal had deposed his entire government and shut down the press in his nation (where he owns all the land and all the people). Most tyrants are smarter than that. But know that in this world there are despots who arrogate to themselves this kind of power over their fellow human beings.

We may as well count among them some clergymen, including some Catholic priests, some rabbis, and the General Assembly of the Presbyterian USA Church. While they don't close down media outlets, they are all, in their own minds, little kings of Nepal riding roughshod over whatever flock they can control.

As to born again Believers, we have a certain amount of this problem from pompous seminary professors and famous Bible teachers, but it is generally understood that the True Church has no hierarchy. After all, there are only two levels of Christians: one Who was perfect went on to His father some 2,000 years ago, and the rest of us are works in progress. — Zola

Dear Friends:

e all know the song, "Chicago, Chicago, That Toddlin' Town," but Chicago is a city where liberal churches give their sanctuaries to Muslim congregations to hold their Friday services, and where both local newspapers viciously criticize Israel. It is also the nation's murder capital, having something like the same number of murders per year as those who suffered under Arafat's four-year intifada.

In their coverage of the "summit" where Sharon and Abbas met in Cairo, the *Chicago Tribune's* Joel Greenberg and Cam Simpson submitted a masterpiece of gibberish in a February 8 article. Utilizing wishy-washy words does reporting a great deal of damage. I'm going to go through the article below and correct all the weasel words.

In their first paragraph, the reporters say that Sharon and Abbas are expected to declare a halt to violence, after more than four years of fighting. That expression is rather biased. There hasn't been any "fighting" in Israel, but merely the policing of murderers. I've said it a thousand times and people in Chicago should certainly know the difference. Does the Chicago Tribune, when their reporters submit stories about the policing of Chicago's drug dealers, call it "fighting?" In Israel, Palestinians murder Israeli civilians. That's not "fighting." The Israelis attempt to stop the onslaught. That's not "fighting" either.

The *Tribune's* next paragraph contains the innocent-sounding words cease-fire and truce. Again, there's no cease-fire in the sense of two armies calling an armistice. The Israelis will never fire another shot if the Palestinians stop the murders. It's that simple. A "truce" is not necessary, as there is no war.

The article goes on to specify that the two sides are expected to "declare a halt to violence." Once again, there's

no "violence," there are murders, just like in Chicago, except there are far fewer of them. The next paragraph talks about a similar summit in 2003, where "several weeks later a 'cease-fire' fell apart." Cease-fires don't "fall apart," they are broken, and in every case they have been broken by the Palestinians, who cannot resist killing innocent civilians, even when they have signed an agreement not to do so.

Another paragraph of the story states that Abbas has persuaded "militant" groups to suspend attacks until the declaration of a formal truce. This awful word "militant" is used for these murderers, and any declaration of a truce is, of course, meaningless when Palestinians are involved. The Israelis, on the other hand, are prepared to "release Palestinian prisoners." In other words, what the Palestinians say they want in return for stopping the murders is the release of previous murderers. I wonder why they want them back. What work do they have for them to do?

The *Tribune* supplies that "militant groups" have killed "hundreds" of Israelis during the current conflict. The newspaper knows very well that there have been over 1,000 Israelis murdered, but it's nicer to minimize casualties caused by the Palestinian murderers.

The story quotes a Palestinian "Cabinet Minister" saying that "the violence is a product of the occupation and settlement expansion." This is the Big Lie on which the Palestinians hope to get rid of all the Israelis. If the world would believe that the Jews—who were given Israel 4,000 years ago and who have occupied it continuously since the time of Abraham—are occupiers and settlers, then I guess the illegal aliens called Palestinians (since 1964) get the land.

It's a good thing that the Native Americans haven't utilized the same argument against us immigrants to this continent. After all, we really were occupiers, and we really were settlers. We won the land in a battle, fair or foul, but there's no question of who the original natives are.

The only difference between the Indians and the Palestinians is that the Indians wouldn't be lying if they claimed all that. It's good to remember that in Israel, the Israelis, and not the Arabs, are the "Indians."

The article goes on to say: "The Bush administration has backed Israel's demand to an end to violence first..." Obviously, the Israelis would like to have fewer of their people killed as they're sitting in peace negotiations.

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What a silly idea—the people are only Jews, after all—but it is distracting to have to leave the negotiating table for repeated funerals.

It is well that we notice that in past negotiations, the Palestinians, other than for a few periods of quick rearming, have never stopped murdering innocent Israeli civilians.

Toward the end of the story, Secretary of State Condoleezza Rice is quoted as calling the present time "the most promising moment for progress in recent years." That, of course, is because of the death of the dictator Arafat. But this moment is no more promising than any previous one. The point is to get the murders stopped.

I can't say it enough times, but that is the only problem in Israel. The irony is that if the Palestinians would simply accept the Israelis as neighbors and cooperate in their democracy, they would be far and away the bestoff Arabs in the whole world. As it is now, the Palestinians are richer in terms of possessions and 21st-century conveniences like medical care, clean water, good roads, automobiles, telephones, etc., than nearly any other Arabs in the Middle East (well, the Saudi "royal family" with its billions probably has a few of those conveniences, but they usually leave their country to visit doctors—or prostitutes, for that matter).

Rice, appearing with Abbas in Ramallah, said: "It is time for both parties to make their maximum efforts to give this chance for peace a real chance." It's not necessary for the Israelis to do anything at all. If the murders would stop, they would stop policing the Palestinians. If the Palestinians would cooperate with them, the above paragraph would apply.

The Chicago newspapers, like *The* New York Times, Los Angeles Times, Washington Post, and probably your hometown newspaper, use "iffy" words to keep a pot boiling in Israel, and the reasons are several: there is, of course, anti-Semitism, the mindless hatred of the Chosen People and the Promised Land; there are liberal politics, which, for some reason, always tout Muslim causes and denigrate Israeli ones; and there's just good old garden variety ignorance. Since these reporters are products of our pitiful school systems, they don't know anything about Israel or its enemies. I'm afraid we really are rapidly approaching the moment when the Lord's prophecy "Ye shall be hated of all nations," will be applied to those it was spoken to—the people of Israel.

I have reported that we were breaking even on PAX, and that was true for a couple of months. But my son, Mark, an experienced business comptroller, sees the day-by-day expenses and anticipates problems ahead.

All I can add to his definitive conclusions is that we just need better support from more of our audience.

Please ask the Lord what He would have you do about this ongoing need. — Zola

The December tsunami's first wave, though notable, was not a major destructive force. If only its subsequent waves had come days or weeks apart rather than within minutes of each another! If only the tsunami's victims had known beforehand how many waves were coming. Though the tsunami killed many times more innocents than the WTC attack, it is easier for some of us, on this side of the planet, to forget the force that took so many more lives than the savages who murdered 3,000. A force that came in waves.

**Question:** What 30-minute TV airtime could compare to the force of a tsunami?

**Answer:** PAX on Thursday mornings – 8:30 or 9:30, depending on your time zone.

But, *The Jerusalem Post* has reported that two of the largest wire services—Agence France-Presse (AFP) and Associated Press (AP)—have employed journalists with inappropriately close ties to the Palestinian Authority. Majida al-Batsh was a Palestinian affairs correspondent for AFP for many years, while simultaneously being on the payroll of the Palestinian Authority as a reporter for the PA's official organ, *Al-Ayyam*.

If this is not evidence enough of impropriety at AFP, last year Batsh announced she would actually run for the presidency of the Palestinian Authority. *The Post* reports:

"Her colleagues claim that shortly before she joined the race [for PA president], Batsh resigned from the news agency, saying she wanted to devote her time to the election campaign. However, they add, this did not prevent her from seeking the agency's help in her campaign."

"One day she showed up and asked to use the fax machine to send some documents," reports one coworker. "The agency did not object."

Batsh isn't the only AFP reporter receiving a PA salary on the side:

One of the agency's correspondents in the Gaza Strip is Adel Zanoun, who also happens to be the chief reporter in the area for the PA's Voice of Palestine radio station.

The AFP bureau chief in Jerusalem, Patrick Anidjar,

refuses to discuss the issue, saying: "I don't understand why you have to have the name of our correspondents." Pressed to give a specific answer, he says: "I don't want our correspondents' names to go into print. I don't want to answer the question. What is this, a police investigation?"

Meanwhile, Muhammad Daraghmeh—who turns out near-daily reports from Ramallah or Jerusalem for the Associated Press—also works for the PA's Al-Ayyam, according to The Jerusalem Post (and a pro-Palestinian website).


This is the equivalent of a network's Washington correspondent getting paid on the side by the Democrats or Republicans. Imagine the scandal that would produce. Yet with their coverage of the Israeli-Palestinian conflict, AFP and AP don't seem to have a problem with it.

HonestReporting has repeatedly demonstrated that the local staff employed by western news outlets contributes in no small way to the problem of anti-Israel media bias. The major media outlets rely on Palestinian cameramen and stringers to tell the tale from the West Bank and Gaza, as *The Jerusalem Post* reports:

"AFP is not the only member of the international news media to employ 'journalists' who see themselves as 'foot soldiers' serving the Palestinian cause. Other parts of the foreign media frequently allow their stories to be filtered through such fixers-consultants."

"I will never work on a story that defames my people or leadership," boasts a Palestinian "fixer" (mediator/guide/translator) who works on a regular basis with many foreign journalists. "It is my duty to protect my people against Israeli propaganda."

All this calls to mind the declaration by Fayad Abu Shamala, the BBC correspondent in Gaza for the past 10 years, at a Hamas rally in May 2001: "Journalists and media organizations [are] waging the campaign against Israel shoulder-to-shoulder together with the Palestinian people."

## **Less Terror**

According to data published by the Israel Defense Forces, there was a 40% decrease in terrorist attacks this past year from the previous year. Of 2004's 118 terror victims, 75 were Israeli civilians and 43 were soldiers. In 2003, there were 116 suicide attacks, while in 2004 "only" 14. The number of terrorist attacks in areas where the security fence is already erected decreased by an impressive 94%.

without our staff at least briefly revisiting: "Was this a wise move? Can we stay on PAX until the Rapture?"

So far, we believe we can. But we couldn't have come this far without some unexpected concessions from PAX, some breaks they may not be able to give us this year. It is risky to test the water with suppliers or vendors, who already have cut their prices to the bone, because they might conclude that we have asked too much and decide to move on to customers who can pay full price. Other organizations would offer a pretty penny for our PAX timeslot—which alone costs us, each month, the total price of a decent house in the suburbs. We have comparatively analyzed our other stations and networks and made sure that PAX is giving us the best value we can reasonably ask.

Now our ministry is facing ripple effects from the PAX airtimes—increased mail, telephone calls, customer service issues, and administrative challenges. We have added two full-time mail clerks, replaced our telephone system, upgraded our computers, and better trained our employees. We are out of space in our office and may have to start a second shift. These are healthy problems or challenges to have. But meanwhile, the waves—the monthly airtime invoices—continue coming and eroding our cash on hand.

You know your weekly expenses are high when you become uniquely aware of which months have five weeks. If only there were fewer than four five-week months every year! Those powerhouse five-week months hit us, airtime-expense-wise, with 25% more force than four-week months. Just our January '05 airtime costs alone surpassed our total budget of a few years ago—includ-

ing television production, newsletter printing, product duplication, postage, personnel, rent, answering service, long distance, office equipment, maintenance/repairs, supplies, etc.

Our traditional spring slump has the impact of a little wave compared to what we can expect this summer. We really need to shore up our reserves now, before the ebb and flow of our regular supporters' contributions drops through the summer until fall. I sincerely wish that I could project reliably that sufficient PAX viewers will catch up with us to carry us until August, but I can't. We are still

adding them, but they stay on our mailing list awhile before lending a hand.

Human nature requires that our ministry must be patient through the process of *Zola Levitt Presents* viewers becoming *Levitt Letter* readers. Then it takes months, and sometimes years, for those readers to become supporters. We never hear from many readers. Others make a single purchase and then disappear. After a year, we enclose a note with our newsletter plus a postage-paid envelope that offers to continue their subscriptions free for the asking. Some, who love this outreach, believe that small purchases alone should suffice to keep us going. If only that were true!

Still, this is not an emergency plea. Just a reminder to remember us. There are no victims here—unless you count Satan's objectives. We are warriors in the midst of a battle. We are making our needs known. We *knew*, seventeen months ago, that if we could make it this far, we would be fine. We are fine. But the waves keep hitting. So please stay with us. Thanks.

## "Don't Say Jesus"

Recently, at a Messianic congregation which I have visited before, I was censured for using terms like Jesus and Church instead of Yeshua and Assembly, or whatever. These terms automatically came out of my mouth since I teach all the time about these things.

I also noted that certain Messianics were keeping rabbinical laws that run counter to Scripture, both Old and New Testament alike. Galatians 2:16 says: "Knowing that a man is not justified by the works of the law, but by the faith of Jesus Christ, even we have believed in Jesus Christ, that we might be justified by the faith of Christ, and not by the works of the law: for by the works of the law shall no flesh be justified."

I was invited to one Messianic congregation on a Friday evening, but was told that I had to be there by 4:30 pm in order to give people time to prepare for the Sabbath before dark! Colossians 2:16 admonishes us: "Let no

man therefore judge you in meat, or in drink, or in respect of a holy day, or of the new moon, or of the sabbath days..." Now that we have Christ with us, we do not hold to the Old Covenant laws. In fact, we have "credit" for having kept them with belief in Him. (We can keep any Biblical law that we wish to keep, but we should understand that there is no special reward for that behavior. Our salvation is complete with simple faith in the Messiah, and not any performances we may do. On the other hand, keeping rabbinical laws, unless they happen to be Biblical, is no different than keeping any other unbelieving tradition.)

One Messianic rabbi asserted that Scriptures like those given above "have been changed." When we are willing to defame the Scriptures and give them meanings of our own, we are simply leaving the Word of God.

It breaks my heart, but I'm going to have to study each Messianic congregation as invitations come, because some are very difficult for me to deal with. — Zola



#### **Hebrew**Lesson

#### **Transgressions Forgiven**

#### Hebraic Insight:

The Hebrew word most often translated as "sin" in our English Bibles is the word chata'ah, which means "missing the mark," as an archer might miss his target when shooting an arrow. Chata'ah is an error, a mistake, or a case of "missing the target."

There are other words in Hebrew that convey more serious misdeed than chata'ah. One of these words is pesha, a willful transgression done to spite God. This word suggests defiance, rebellion and a casting off of God's authority. In most Bibles, pesha is translated as "transgression," meaning "going beyond the limits" of God's Torah (law).

Another such word is avon, usually translated as "iniquity" in our Bibles. Avon is connected with the idea of perversion, or a willful twisting and distorting of the will of God for selfish ends. In this verse, King David describes the happiness of the one whose pesha is "forgiven."

Interestingly, the word translated "forgiven" comes from a root word (nasa) that means "to lift up, to take up, or to carry." In other words, happy is the one whose rebellion against the Lord has been "taken up" and whose chata'ah

has been covered. Happy is

the one whom the Lord does not hold guilty of selfish perversion (avon).

Isaiah chapter 53 tells us more about how our transgressions were "taken up." The Lord Jesus was wounded for our transgressions (pesha), crushed for our iniquities (avon), and bore the sin (chata'ah) of many. For those of us who are trusting in His sacrificial death as a sin offering (asham) before the Father, we are indeed made happy and given His shalom.



Blessed is he whose transgression is forgiven, whose sin is covered. (Psalm 32:1)



Whoever commits sin transgresses also the law (Torah), for sin is the transgression of the law. 1 John 3:4

#### The Rest of the Story

Sixty-nine percent of Americans have a favorable view of Israel, according to a new Gallup poll. The figure is 10 percentage points higher than it was in February 2004. but shy of the 79% who had a favorable of view of Israel during the 1991 Gulf War. Twenty-five percent of Americans said they had an unfavorable view of Israel.

A large majority of Americans—62%—said they viewed the Palestinian Authority unfavorably. Twenty-seven percent said they had a favorable opinion of the PA,

> the highest recorded by Gallup since it began measuring the item in 2000.

> Fifty-two percent of Americans said their sympathies were with Israel in the dispute with the Palestinians, while 18% said they were more sympathetic to the Palestinians.

The survey of 1,008 adults was conducted by phone in early February and had a margin of error of 3 percentage points.

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
#### Do as We Say...

George W. Bush promised he could make the earth move, and everyone would wake up satisfied on the morning after.



The wise guys, a quart or two low on studly charisma and always ready with reasons why not, only laughed at the cowboy enthusiasm. No one is laughing this morning, and a lot of Arabs are cheering.

An Iraqi election and a big blowout in Beirut do not an Islamic revolution make. A crackdown could cool the sudden ardor for democracy in the flash of an exploding canister of tear gas (or worse). But there's enough going on in the most miserable corner of the world to give a mullah misgivings, to make an ayatollah anxious. If those aren't the sounds of the tectonic plates of the old order breaking up, the suspicious tremor is enough to send the rich and corrupt evildoers of the old order, long accustomed to ignoring the cries and whispers of everyone, to start looking through the real estate classifieds for retirement villas in France.

The Lebanese masses have taken up the cry for democracy, just like the masses in the Ukraine a fortnight and more ago. A tent city grows in Beirut's Martyrs Square at the tomb of Rafik Hariri, the former Lebanese prime minister who was slain by a person or persons unknown—believed by nearly everyone to be a person or persons of sinister Syrian ancestry and citizenship.

The demonstration has taken on the air of fiesta, with thousands vowing not to budge until the Syrians pull their 14,000 troops out of Lebanon. Troops assigned to keeping a semblance of order have given up trying to keep the crowds away, and waved the demonstrators on. Demonstrators handed long-stemmed red roses to cops and soldiers.

#### "Tell Bush to come here."

"I love America,"

one of the demonstrators at Martyrs Square told reporters and anyone else who looked even vaguely American. "Tell Bush to come here. Thank him."

Heady times. For once there was an administration in Washington that ignored the clearing of throats in Foggy Bottom and the counsel of the Nervous Nellies who are always frightened more by rufflers of the status quo than

by disturbers of the peace. The White House, blithely ignoring such fears, put another log on the pyre.

"We are closely watching developments with great interest," the president's press spokesman said. "The resignation of the Karami government represents an opportunity for the Lebanese people to have a new government that is truly representative of their country's diversity."

Lebanon, perhaps more than any other country in the Middle East, deserves a lot better than what it's got. Once a gem of a city (if not necessarily "the Hong Kong of the Middle East," as it sometimes called itself), Beirut hummed and crackled with commerce and culture, a place where nearly everybody got along. Lebanon was traditionally governed by a Christian president and a Muslim prime minister, a happy acknowledgment of what everyone agreed was fiction, that the country was equally divided along religious lines. That was before militant religionists demanded that the Muslim majority get the whole country. The civil war lasted 15 bloody years.

But it's not only what's happening in Beirut. The Israeli government summoned ambassadors in Tel Aviv to a meeting to listen to the evidence that Syrian-client Hezbollah, the Palestinian terrorist cartel, was responsible for the February 25th bombing that killed five Israelis in Tel Aviv. For once, the Israelis had an audience that was not necessarily hostile to facts. In Damascus, Bashar Assad finally understands what it feels like to buckle under pressure. He looked through the inventory of available bad guys, and threw up one of the scurviest of the lot, one Sabawi Ibrahim al-Hasan al-Tikriti. Saddam Hussein's half brother, and as a director of the Iraqi insurgency, the author of a list of evil deeds as long as his name. There was speculation in Beirut that he was captured to order, perhaps inside Iraq, as a sacrifice to the Americans. Assad and the Syrians are scared.

Democracy can do that to tyrants, and this is what George W. has been trying to say over the tumult of an election campaign at home and the static of the media noise machine everywhere. Official Washington has been abuzz in recent days over a commentary in *Der Spiegel*, a German newsmagazine of some repute. "Germany loves to criticize George W. Bush's Middle East policies," writes Claus Christian Malzahn, "just like Germany loved to criticize former President Ronald Reagan. But Reagan, when he demanded that Gorbachev remove the Berlin Wall, turned out to be right. Could history repeat itself?"

Only a radical cowboy like George W. Bush could come up with an idea like that.

but Nell seems to be from


the one in Moorhead, MN, where she is—we kid you not—a photographer for the student newspaper.

Television personality Bill Maher, host of HBO's Real Time with Bill Maher, says Christians and others who are religious suffer from a neurological disorder that "stops people from thinking."



Appearing as a guest on MSNBC's Scarborough Country, Maher told host Joe Scarborough: "We are a nation that is unenlightened because of religion. I do believe that. I think that religion stops people from thinking. I think it justifies crazies. I think flying planes into a building was a faith-based initiative. I think religion is a neurological disorder. If you look at it logically, it's something that was drilled into your head when you were a small child. It certainly was drilled into mine at that age. And you really can't be responsible when you are a kid for what adults put into your head."

The former host of *Politically Incorrect* said the lack of enlightenment of so many Americans means the nation actually has more in common with its enemies than one might think.

Said Maher: "When you look at beliefs in such things as, do you go to Heaven?, is there a devil?, we have more in common with Turkev and Iran and Svria than we do with European nations and Canada and nations that, yes, I would consider more enlightened than us."

Maher explained that he was not singling out evangelicals, but was targeting all "religious" people.

"I think the vote in Missouri [rejecting same-sex marriage] and a lot of other states is because people are religious," Maher said. "They don't have to be evangelical, but they're religious. They believe in religion, which as —I think it was Jesse Ventura who had that quote about religion is a crutch for weak-minded people who need strength in numbers."

The television host told Scarborough he was convinced evangelicals' influence will wane.

Said Maher: "When people say to me, 'You hate America,' I don't hate America. I love America. I am just embarrassed that it has been taken over by people like evangelicals, by people who do not believe in science and rationality. It is the 21st century. And I will tell you, my friend, the future does not belong to the evangelicals. The future does not belong to religion."

Later in the interview, Maher returned to the childhoodreligion theme, comparing fairy tales to Bible stories: "When you were a kid and they were telling you whatever you believe in religion, do you think if they had switched the fairy tales that they read to you in bed with the Bible, you would know the difference?

"Do you think if it was the fairy tale about a man who lived inside of a whale and it was religion that Jack built a beanstalk today, you would know the difference? Why do you believe in one fairy tale and not the other? Just because adults told you it was true and they scared you into believing it, at pain of death, at pain of burning in hell."

## Persecuted! 80 Million Christians

*National Review* magazine recently ran an article about the situation of Christianity in Red China, which is not good, to say the least.

While we see Christians murdered in Darfur, Sudan pushed around in Iraq, despised by Muslims around the world (and by most every type of government), China may suffer worst of all. It is a nation containing some 80 million Christians, all of whom have to operate more or less underground (and therefore are probably full of true faith).

The article begins by saying how Believers keep their emails short and vague and use initials for the words Christian and Bible because the communist government screens computer messages for those words deemed politically sensitive. There are house churches among the Protestants and Catholics in China, and in view of the fact that they have more Believers real Believers—than the United States, the fact that they are persecuted is something to think about. The verse (Matthew 24:9) which I usually apply to Israel, applies, of course, to Christians as well. You will be hated of all nations for my name's sake.

The article states that because China's communists remain hostile to anything that posits a source of authority higher than the political, they carefully control what is taught in these official churches to assure that the realm of the divine is subjugated to the "authority of the Party."

The article states that some Christians have been treated with a kind of benign neglect. "The government knows where our church meets. They leave us alone" claimed a Mr. Yang, a Christian. If they put everyone in prison, there won't be enough room in the jails." That's a heartening testimony for Christ!

The government ignores those who keep a low profile.

"If we go to Tiananmen Square and preach that Jesus Christ is coming, they'll give us trouble. But we don't do that." Last September, the pastor of Yang's church, Cai Zhuohua, was arrested. Police from China's security bureau discovered that some people in the church's neighborhood had a printing press. The owners of the press had cooperated with Cai to print up 230,000 Bibles and religious tracts. There were arrests, obviously, and in some cases severe punishments, including one instance of several young women being beaten to death by the police.

But such persecution does not defeat the spirits of China's Christians. Remarkably, Cai's church continues to meet under the direction of Yang Jie, who says that he is not intimidated and that Cai's example is a motivation for

> his service. If anything, the crackdown seems to have strengthened Yang's faith: "That we are able to continue under these circumstances shows that God is with us."

One can't help but be reminded of the Christians of Rome, who suffered so under the emperors and, of course, the Christians in our own country, being persecuted by the media, by the liberal opposition to everything we believe, by Hollywood, and by the ongoing Islamic takeover of the United States.

On that last matter, it occurred to me that one reason the United States is ineffective in End Times prophecy, is that after the Rapture, it will be probably something like a Muslim nation in the Tribulation period. Muslim nations are notoriously ineffective and unimportant in world affairs. They do a lot of protesting, yelling and murdering, but as to their effectiveness in commerce, battle and in world

affairs in general, they fall far behind. I'm afraid the United States, heavily burdened by the immigration of Muslims to this country, will become an Islamic-controlled society by that time.

This world is due for another "flood," and the only hope is for another "ark." As our Lord once said: "It will be as it was in the days of Noah."

We received a very formal letter from what I initially thought was a Catholic priest (by all the letters after his name, etc.). Actually, we learned that this priest was Episcopalian. I run his letter below, interspersed with comments on most of what he said. — Zola

## Letter from a Priest

Dear Dr. Levitt:

Recently, a parishioner gave me several copies of your *Levitt Letter* and asked me what I thought of the contents... I decided it would be better to ask you the questions that trouble me.

As you know, the majority of the Church is not, by any means, given to excessive interest or entanglement with Dispensationalism or Fundamentalistic interpretations leading to Millenarianism or a chiliastic view of the time I am told is called "the eschaton." For us the Creed ("...and He shall return to judge the living and the dead and of His Kingdom there shall be no end...") is sufficient.

The way I read your paragraph, you are simply saying that you and your church are unfamiliar with Scripture and you have decided to do away with the study of prophecy. Applying fancy theological terms is not an excuse for being ignorant of the stuff. As to the rest of your letter—the anti-Israel statements and the support of the Palestinians—I would say I've heard it all before. I'll deal with certain statements point by point.

It is popular to assume as you do that "the expulsion of thousands of Palestinian refugees in 1948" was the fault of Israel, but to the extent that it occurred, it was caused by the invading armies. You could at least report that five nations attacked the fledgling country of Israel virtually on the day of its independence. Truly, it was an act of God that the European refugee Jews were able to hold off these armies. As to the refugee camps you write about, they are UN sponsored and administrated. No one, least of all the Israelis, prefers them.

You go on to say, Our parish has helped the Holy Family Hospital in Bethlehem over the years and the horror stories we hear about the difficulties some of the patients have even getting to the facility because of Israeli obstructions is heart-rending. I'm sure you hear even worse horror stories, but it's better to go to the Holy Land and see if they are true. I've spent about 20% of my time there for the past thirty-two years, and am very familiar with the situation. I'm aware, for example, that Bethlehem is entirely in Palestinian hands, and there are no Israeli

obstructions in that city. The nearest presence is on the road to Jerusalem to try to "obstruct" the parade of suicide bombers that have murdered so many civilians in the Jewish capital. I'm sorry you didn't mention the slightest Palestinian contribution to the unrest in your entire letter.

We know that St. Phillips church in Gaza (it also has an eye hospital which treats everyone needing its care) was strafed and attacked by IDF missiles three years ago. That violation of international law hurt many people and the pain was compounded by the fact that the airship and the missiles were both gifts of the American government. None of this (or other events like it) feature in any of your material. This is troubling.

America gives Israel necessary military aid, not gifts, just as we do for Egypt and Saudi Arabia. Israel has not strafed anyone, let alone a hospital, nor have they attacked any medical facility with missiles or anything else. How do you account for the fact that Israel has always been first to send doctors and field hospitals to Muslim areas like Bosnia, Kosovo, and Turkey, not to mention the recent tragedy of the tsunami? Is it even reasonable that the same people kill stricken Muslims in their own nation? The fact is, Palestinians receive free medical care from Israelis at any of their hospitals and always have. When you say "This is troubling," what is really troubling is your misinformation and your willingness to lash out at the Chosen People and the Promised Land.

If your story were true in any way, it would have been featured on front pages across the world and on CNN daily since then. Israeli Army rules of engagement certainly forbid any attack on civilians. While there are collateral casualties in any armed operation, the situation with the Palestinians amounts to a self-inflicted wound.

I was amused by your Hebrew lesson in some of the material. Seminary for me was a very long time ago and I am hard-pressed to remember Latin, let alone Greek or Hebrew.

You might be more than just amused by a knowledge of Hebrew. My own readings in the Hebrew Bible have contributed to my understanding of Israel and prophecy. You might even come on one of my tours. It is not like a liberal Christian tour that goes from church to church; it really looks at the places where the prophets and our Lord visited. (Israel is offering a generous discount to pastors at the moment, if you qualify.)

Finally then, in light of Nostra Aetate, what is your group's plan for the Holy Land if you could have your "wish come true?"

## Not Crazy Horse, Just Crazy

University of Colorado professor Ward Churchill has written that "unquestionably, America has earned" the attack of 9/11. He calls the attack itself a result of "gallant sacrifices of the combat teams." That the "combat



teams" killed only 3,000 Americans, he says, shows they were not "unreasonable or vindictive." He says that in order to even the score with America, Muslim terrorists "would, at a minimum, have to blow up about 300,000 more buildings and kill something on the order of 7.5 million people."

To grasp the current state of higher education in America, consider that if Churchill is at any risk at all of being fired, it is only because he smokes.

Churchill poses as a radical living on the edge, supremely confident that he is protected by tenure from being fired.

# "College professors are the only people in America who assume they can't be fired for what they say."

Tenure was supposed to create an atmosphere of open debate and inquiry, but instead has created havens for talentless cowards who want to be insulated from life. Rather than fostering a climate of open inquiry, college campuses have become fascist colonies of anti-American hate speech, hypersensitivity, speech codes, banned words, and prohibited scientific inquiry.

Even liberals don't try to defend Churchill on grounds that he is Galileo pursuing an abstract search for the truth. They simply invoke "free speech," like a deus ex machina to end all discussion. Like the words "diverse" and "tolerance," "free speech" means nothing but: "Shut up, we win." It's free speech (for liberals), diversity (of liberals) and tolerance (toward liberals).

Ironically, it is precisely because Churchill is paid by the taxpayers that "free speech" is implicated at all. The Constitution has nothing to say about the private sector firing employees for their speech. That's why you don't see Bill Maher on ABC anymore. Other well-known people who have been punished by their employers for their "free speech" include Al Campanis, Jimmy Breslin, Rush Limbaugh, Jimmy the Greek, and Andy Rooney.

In fact, the Constitution says nothing about state governments firing employees for their speech: The First Amendment clearly says, "Congress shall make no law... abridging the freedom of speech."

Firing Ward Churchill is a pseudo-problem caused by modern constitutional law, which willy-nilly applies the Bill of Rights to the states—including the one amendment that clearly refers only to "Congress." (Liberals love to go around blustering "'no law' means 'no law'!" But apparently "Congress" doesn't mean "Congress.")

Even accepting the modern notion that the First Amendment applies to state governments, the Supreme Court has distinguished between the government as sovereign and the government as employer. The government is extremely limited in its ability to regulate the speech of private citizens, but not so limited in regulating the speech of its own employees.

So the First Amendment and "free speech" are really red herrings when it comes to whether Ward Churchill can be fired. Even state universities will not run afoul of the Constitution for firing a professor who is incapable of doing his job because he is a lunatic, an incompetent or an idiot—and those determinations would obviously turn on the professor's "speech."

If a math professor's "speech" consisted of insisting that 2 plus 2 equals 5, or an astrophysicist's "speech" was to claim that the moon is made of Swiss cheese, or a history professor's "speech" consisted of rants about the racial inferiority of the n——s, each one of them could be fired by a state university without running afoul of the Constitution.

Just because we don't have bright lines for determining what speech can constitute a firing offense, doesn't mean there are no lines at all. If Churchill hasn't crossed them, we are admitting that almost nothing will debase and disgrace the office of professor (except, you know, suggesting that there might be innate differences in the mathematical abilities of men and women).

In addition to calling Americans murdered on 9/11 "little Eichmanns," Churchill has said:

"The U.S. Army gave blankets infected with smallpox to the Indians specifically intending to spread the disease."

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Not only are the diseased-blanket stories cited by Churchill denied by his alleged sources, but the very idea is contradicted by the facts of scientific discovery. The settlers didn't understand the mechanism of how disease was transmitted. Until Louis Pasteur's experiments in the second half of the 19th century, the idea that disease could be caused by living organisms was as scientifically accepted as crystal reading is today. Even after Pasteur, many scientists continued to believe disease was spontaneously generated from within. Churchill is imbuing the settlers with knowledge that in most cases wouldn't be accepted for another hundred years.



## 400 Million "Christians" Curse Israel

The World Council of Churches Central Committee, meeting in Geneva, has encouraged its members to economically divest from multinational corporations which continue to support the "occupation." The World Council of Churches (WCC) represents some 340 churches in over 100 countries, and approximately 400 million Christians, mainly in Europe and North America.

According to WCC official statements, they encourage members to use economic means as a weapon against perceived Israeli crimes. "Notable among these are initiatives within churches to become better stewards of justice in economic affairs which link them to ongoing violations of international law in occupied territory. The Central Committee takes note of the current action by the Presbyterian Church USA which has initiated a process of phased, selective divestment from multinational corporations involved in the occupation. This action is commendable in both method and manner, uses criteria rooted in faith, and calls members to do the 'things that make for peace' (Luke 19:42)."

They explain the rationale for targeting multinational

corporations by saying: "Multinational corporations have been involved in the demolition of Palestinian homes, and are involved in the construction of settlements and settlement infrastructure on occupied territory, in building a dividing wall which is also largely inside occupied territory, and in other violations of international law being carried out beyond the internationally recognized borders of the State of Israel determined by the Armistice of 1949."


In case one might perceive the Council as being anti-Semitic because of their statements, they remind you that: "In 1992, the WCC Central Committee stated that 'criticism of the policies of the Israeli government is not in itself anti-Jewish'."

While there is nothing wrong in criticizing the Israeli government, it is interesting which policies of the government the WCC chooses to criticize. When speaking of the borders of Israel, they talk of the 1949 Armistice Line (Green Line) and not of the lines that God mandated in the Bible. The WCC, supposedly a Christian organization, chooses to side with the secular world in legitimizing the claim of God's enemies to His Land.

This policy is most certainly "anti-Jewish," and beyond that, is anti-God and totally un-Christian.

Yes, as children of God, the Israelis need to treat the individuals sharing the land, the Arabs, with decency and human respect, which I believe that they try to do. However, the WCC refuses to recognize that the Land does indeed belong to Israel, making in their eyes all Israeli actions there illegal. 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

In addition to decrying Israel, the WCC also went after the US in full force. They praised the International Criminal Court and urged the US to join, which we have refused to do because of the potential for the court to be used as a political weapon against US political leaders, soldiers and businessmen. If the US agreed to join the court, then any citizen of another member nation who doesn't like George Bush (and I understand that there are a few of those) could file a case against him for human rights violations. The court allows people with political grievances to allege serious crimes, and is therefore totally irresponsible and unsuited in its current form to perform the role of a genuine world court of justice.

The WCC also criticized the US for its execution of the War on Terror, particularly in regard to Iraq and the Guantanamo prisoners. "Leaders who used the false pretexts of terrorist connections and weapons of mass destruction in Iraq to bolster their case for war will be judged by history. Time will also bring acknowledgements of the actual loss of life in Iraq and record how democracies respond appropriately to acts of terrorism."

For a "Christian" organization, it seems that the WCC is playing out of their sandbox. They should refocus their efforts on matters of church and spirituality, not leftist, secular world politics. If they were to focus on these subjects, perhaps even read their Bibles, then maybe they would realize their "oversight" when it comes to God's Land. Perhaps then, instead of suggesting that divesting from Israel would be good stewardship, they would find the verse that says: "As each one has received a gift, minister it to one another, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God." (I Peter 4:10).

#### **Does Congress Meet in New York?**

In last month's Personal Letter I found it necessary to cite *The Washington Times* for a careless paragraph of misinformation and bias. I believed that that was an anomaly because that newspaper is one of the fairest where Israel is concerned.

But in its National Weekly Edition, Feb.28-Mar.6, a front page story by Rowan Scarborough starts this way:

#### "Enough Rope"

I have been racking my brain as to why reasonably informed people like Condoleezza Rice and George Bush would favor the creation of a Palestinian state. Obviously, there are no people in the world less qualified than the Palestinians, who basically have no economy, no trade, and almost no skills to operate a new nation.

Palestinians are very dangerous people. The majority of them have committed themselves to murdering their Israeli neighbors

"As of the last week of February, Russia has officially declared that it will supply Iran with nuclear materials and knowledge. Russian President Vladimir Putin claims that Iran will not use nuclear materials to build weapons."

Everyone in the world doubts that, especially Israel, which is keeping a close eye on the situation. Iran has promised publicly that it intends to destroy Israel. It's not the first nation to make such a declaration, but the others in Biblical history —Babylon, Persia, Greece and Rome — all those empires are extinct. #### Syria Out! Syria Out!! The Washington Times

"Tens of thousands of protesters—Muslims, Christians and Druze—flooded Beirut on February 21st in an antigovernment demonstration unprecedented in the Middle East, but reminiscent of the human waves that toppled governments throughout Eastern Europe," *The Washington Times* reports from Lebanon's capital.

"Syria out. Syria out," they shouted as Arabic pop music blared, amid calls for a "peaceful intifada" or "uprising" against a government that was put into place and remains controlled by neighboring Syria.

"We are with the Muslims, the Druze, together for a free Lebanon," said one member of a Christian militia. "Tell America we are waiting for them to invade, all of us."

The assassination of former prime minister Rafiq Hariri, widely blamed on the Syrian regime, was the proximate cause of the Beirut demos, but these aren't the only Arabs taking to the street to protest a dictatorship. Agence France-Presse reports that "more than 500 people rallied in Cairo to protest against a new term in office for Egyptian President Hosni Mubarak and against moves to enable his son Gamal to succeed him afterwards."

"That's enough" and "Down with Hosni Mubarak" shouted protestors who gathered in front of Cairo University, while around 50 trucks packed with police were deployed nearby.

Organized by the Egyptian Movement for Change, the demonstrators also included Marxists, Nasserites, liberals, and Islamic dissi-



dents from the Muslim Brotherhood.

One is tempted to view the Iraqi election as the equivalent of the Berlin Wall's fall and hope that freedom spreads rapidly in its wake. Of course, in the same year the wall fell, the Red Chinese government crushed a freedom movement at Tiananmen Square, and today it remains one of the few remaining communist regimes. Except in Iraq and the Palestinian areas—liberated from dictators by America and God, respectively—the Middle East has regimes that presumably will fight back to maintain their power, something Mikhail Gorbachev decided not to do in 1989.

One difference between China in 1989 and the Middle East today, though, has to do with the George Bushes. The administration of "41" took a conciliatory approach to China's bloodstained octogenarians, whereas "43" is giving moral support to Middle Eastern democrats. Bucking up dissidents may or may not prove sufficient to topple dictators, but it will certainly make their lives more difficult.

My group is the Christian Church, and our plan for the Holy Land is God's plan. I wish I could give you some simple Bible instruction from which you would see that all of the unrest, including the propaganda you repeat, is a part of that plan in a way. But unless you read Scripture, you cannot understand the future.

What proposal do you have for the return to their ancestral lands of the many numbers of Palestinian refugees cruelly driven from them in 1947/1948? What about compensation to their families for the years spent in refugee camps? I do not see much concern for the indigenous people of the Holy Land in your *Levitt Letter*.

Ancestral land in Israel belongs to the Jews, according to God, Who gave it to them. They are "the indigenous people of the Holy Land." The ancestral lands of all Arabs are in Arabia.

Holy Scripture tells the ancient Hebrews that they are to "pray for the peace of Jerusalem," and many Christians over the years have not without good heart joined in that "orison ad altare dei."

The Scripture intends you, too, to make this prayer, not just the "ancient Hebrews." You're not actually helping the Holy Land very much, it seems to me. When you call the subjects of Israel's targeted assassinations "leading Palestinian figures," you betray the fact that you admire these terrorists. Do you also admire the Muslim terrorists who destroyed the World Trade Center?

You remonstrate further on in your letter about "great sums of money" given to the Israelis and "a small amount of money (with strings attached)" given to the Palestinian Authority. The fact is that Arafat was able to steal amounts estimated at 3 billion dollars, while the rest of "Palestine" lived on pocket change that he dropped. The strings we attached to gifts to the Palestinian Authority were that they would stop murdering their neighbors. They never did and have not to date.

Have you heard about those murders? Over a thousand Israeli civilians were blown up by lunatic Palestinian suicide bombers. Those innocent civilian casualties—women and children, passengers on buses, etc.—have escaped your notice.

Then you make a statement which, after half a lifetime of listening to bigoted liberal Christians, is still amazing to me. Let me quote you: "The Palestinian mainstream has tried within the limits of their ability to work towards a peace with justice in their homeland. They have reached out over and over again, but have usually been harshly rebuffed. Even the Church has been persecuted in the

way that she has been treated, and the settlement long overdue for the ancient rights of the Church to be recognized and protected formally by the Israeli authorities remains unsigned after many years. This too is very troubling to many of us."

The statement takes my breath away, but I'll deal with the part about the Church. The Israeli authorities have honored and protected rights of Episcopal and other churches in the Holy Land since 1948. There has been no damage to a single site in all that time. As to Palestinians, I can tell you that in most Muslim villages you would be lucky to live through a single night as a Christian. Christians are so detested by the people you are championing, that if they had their way, there would be none left in this world.

I will await with interest your response to these questions. The late Pope Paul VI said that the way to achieve peace was to work for justice. Few can disagree with that sentiment. Do you think that your *Levitt Letter* aids that end?


#### **Casting Stones**


