arious Arab armed forces these past decades have resorted to military means to eliminate Israel from the world's map. All have failed. More than that, the wars each time strengthened Israel, and the Arabs have thus achieved the very opposite of their ambitions. This opens the way to the alternative approach of psychological warfare, a familiar element in all modern wars. PW, in the shorthand the experts use, mobilizes allies and undermines enemies. What is required is a master idea, and people to propagandize in words clever enough for the general public to accept it as the truth.

The master idea in this case is simplicity itself: Jewish nationalism, or Zionism, is an absolute evil, Palestinian nationalism is an absolute virtue. To establish this, the Jews must be shown to be wicked and wrong in every matter great and small, so that the Palestinians appear victims through



no fault of their own — innocent people in special need of redress and rescue. With skill and persistence, the Palestinians and their Arab supporters have built up a worldwide PW lobby with helpers in the United Nations, the European Union, the Red Cross, the churches, the universities, and so on. One step at a time, they are subverting the legitimacy of Israel. Their multiple voices and pressures have persuaded the worldwide Left to believe that Israel is a state that ought to be dismantled forthwith. At the very least, they sap Israeli will to survive, and fortify Palestinian will to prefer armed struggle to the necessary compromises of peace.

## Appeasement's Fatal Attraction

I recently reported President Bush's shocking change in attitude toward Israel. Now I want to show you why this should be of great concern to Americans.

According to the dictionary, the word "appeasement" means "to prevent further disagreement in arguments or war by giving to the other side an advantage that they have demanded."

Perhaps the pressure from Bush's domestic enemies has been too intense. Or maybe he has been receiving bad advice. For whatever reason, some of the Bush administration's policy reversals fit the definition of "appeasement" so closely that it's the only accurate way to describe them.

Like much else, the Palestinian master idea is rooted in the Cold War. Backing the Arabs, the Soviet Union suffered a major defeat in the Six Day War of 1967. Trying to recover, the Soviet leadership immediately began to equate Israel with Nazi Germany, its deadliest foe. Hitherto tending to sympathize with Israel, the Left everywhere and unanimously swung against it. Here was a manipulation of opinion of the kind immortalized by George Orwell in 1984 as a "Two Minute Hate." The Marxist lexicon — "imperialism," "colonialism," "occupation," "settler society" — was deployed to curse Israel. By 1975, the United Nations was declaring that Zionism is racism, and a state built on racism can only be a focus of outrage, the proper target of sanctions and boycotts. Successful American pressure on the United Nations rescinded that resolution. The Left's inherent anti-Americanism then joined forces irrevocably with the pro-Palestinian PW.

It has been commonplace to portray Israeli leaders like Moshe Dayan and Menachem Begin as Nazis. Selfappointed bodies, including the BBC, have proposed—and sometimes staged—a trial of Ariel Sharon as a war criminal. Posters in Paris today declare, "Hitler has a son—Sharon." Over half of those questioned in a recent poll in Germany equated the Israel Defense Force with the Nazi army. José Saramago, winner of the Nobel Prize for Literature, considers that Israelis are treating Palestinians as Jews were treated in Auschwitz. A Nobel Peace Prize winner, Mairead Maguire, compares Israel's nuclear arsenal to Hitler's gas chambers.


Smearing Jews by attaching to them the label of their chief persecutors and ultimate murderers is not as recent

a phenomenon as one might think. The very first person to compare Zionism to Nazism seems to have been the French ambassador to Warsaw in the Thirties, when the government there was already practicing an anti-Jewish policy. Jews then and after tried to emigrate to what became Israel in the hope of surviving the Holocaust, but Gen. Sir Edward Spears, Churchill's wartime representative in the Levant, and the historian A. J. Toynbee were among prominent British personalities who blackguarded these unfortunates as Nazis.

The deadlock between Palestinian nationalism and Zionism led from the 1980s onward to a new set of comparisons, this time between Israel and South Africa. This was PW of a malign brilliance. Politically and socially, the two countries had nothing in common.

Apartheid does not exist in Israel, where Arabs are represented in parliament and in the Foreign Service; Druze and Bedouin serve in the army; there are no pass laws or anything like them, and all Arabs enjoy freedom of speech and assembly, indeed more political rights than Arabs anywhere else in the Middle East, except possibly for the new Iraq. Visiting Israel in 1989, Bishop Desmond Tutu secured this new comparison in all its falsity, saying that what he had seen was "much like what happened to us black people in South Africa." Its triumph was the U.N. gathering at Durban in September 2001, when 3,000 assembled non-governmental organizations passed a resolution calling Israel "a racist apartheid state."

The white population of South Africa could see no way either to reform or to stay in power. To significant numbers of Palestinians, including both Fatah and Hamas, the simple and unconditional surrender of power by South African whites is an example for Israel to follow. Nelson Mandela always made a point of supporting Yasser Arafat, and excusing Palestinian terror.

Once their will is sufficiently sapped, runs the argument, the Israelis will disappear on the ships that once brought them and a pristine Palestine will rise up in their place. More than anyone else, Edward Said, the prominent Palestinian spokesman, fashioned this wish-fulfillment into a PW weapon with the claim that Palestinians have a moral monopoly, and therefore are bound to be the ultimate victors. Less sophisticated than Said, other Palestinian publicists, preachers, and educators incite violence directly when they describe Jews as bloodsuckers, descendants of pigs and apes, treacherous, and much else of the sort. Israelis are held to be masters of America, and simultaneously its hireling tools, just as once Jews were simultaneously capitalists and Bolsheviks. When they defend themselves against terror, they are accused of crime and even of committing a massacre at Jenin when no such thing occurred a PW coup if ever there was one, given that gullible Western journalists were spreading the fiction.

The burning of books and the boycott of Jewish businesses organized by Hitler and Goebbels are models of PW designed to rally supporters and intimidate enemies.



The approaching violence was evident, and so was what Einstein at the time called the "psychic illness of the masses." Under cover of the Palestinian cause, irrationality toward Israel is diffusing into irrationality about Jews generally, sweeping one country after another. Palestinian psychological warfare has already created conditions for a fresh eruption of the psychic illness of the masses.

### **Appeasement's Fatal Attraction continued**

History demonstrates that appeasement does not bring peace—it simply defers war. It leaves the problems for a future administration. Worse, appeasement only encourages the aggressor to reach for more. The most famous case was that of British Prime Minister Neville Chamberlain. His appeasement of Adolf Hitler in 1938, left his successor, Winston Churchill, to fight a war for which his country was unprepared and ill equipped.

During the 1967 Six Day War, Israel captured the West Bank from Jordan, and the Gaza Strip from Egypt. During the 1973 Yom Kippur War, Israel chased Egypt back across the Suez Canal and captured and annexed the Sinai all the way to the canal. That was a territorial gain larger than Israel itself.

Using foreign aid as a lever, former President Jimmy Carter was able to persuade Israel to return the Sinai to Egypt in exchange for "peace." To get Egypt to sign the peace treaty with Israel, he made Egypt the second largest recipient of U.S. foreign aid in the world, after Israel. Israel got nothing it didn't already have, except an essentially meaningless piece of paper. The Carter deal created a new foreign policy term—"cold peace."

Then, President Clinton launched the "land for peace" initiative between Israel and the Palestinians with the signing of the 1993 Oslo Agreement. The "land for peace" initiative was a textbook example of appearement in action.



To appease the first Palestinian uprising, Clinton convinced Israel to accept Yasser Arafat as a "peace partner." As with Egypt, Israel got nothing it didn't already have. Arafat got whatever he wanted.

By 1998, the Clinton administration had brokered a deal whereby Israel would give up virtually all of the territory it gained in 1967 in exchange for peace with a future Palestinian state.

By 2000, the deal collapsed into what Israel calls the "Oslo War." The constant drumbeat of appeasement has now apparently infected the Bush administration, although it took a second term in office to accomplish it.

President Bush's recent pronouncement that the final status in Israel will be based on the 1949 armistice lines was essentially an appeasement offer to Palestinian Authority President Mahmoud Abbas. Abbas has not dismantled or disarmed terror groups. He has not ended incitement. He has not closed bomb factories. He has not disarmed or arrested terrorists. And all of this was to be done before peace negotiations even began.

The Palestinian foreign minister wasted no time taking advantage of Bush's declaration of the 1949 armistice lines being the base from which all negotiations must proceed. He announced on Palestinian TV that "Israel must withdraw from all occupied territories before anyone will be disarmed." The "occupied territories" refer to all land outside the 1949 armistice lines, including East Jerusalem.

On the other hand, Israel has made one unreciprocated concession after another.

At a recent meeting in the White House, Mahmoud Abbas demanded that Israel stop all building in the territories. He demanded that Israel stop constructing the security fence and hand over Jerusalem to the Palestinian Authority. President Bush backed virtually all of Abbas' demands despite the fact that Abbas and the Palestinians have done nothing in return. Even the alleged ceasefire that prompted Abbas' invitation to the White House was totally phony.

Hamas and Islamic Jihad met in Gaza recently to discuss ending "the ceasefire." Hamas leader Khaled Mashal brazenly referred to the ceasefire as a "rest for the warriors." Peace was never seriously contemplated.

Mahmoud Abbas appeared on Palestinian television to promise Hamas, "If everything falls apart, they (Hamas and Islamic Jihad) can return to the path of armed struggle." On this tenuous basis, the Bush proposal to increase aid and establish a Palestinian state is the ultimate in appeasement. So is the incredible turnaround in which President Bush promised Abbas that the final status would be based on the 1949 armistice lines.

Abbas has apparently agreed to an arrangement to share power with Hamas. So the Bush administration now finds itself indirectly aiding Hamas itself.

Winston Churchill, describing his opposition to the appeasement policy of predecessor Neville Chamberlain, famously observed, "Those who appease the crocodile will simply be eaten last." Churchill also had some clear advice for future leaders —advice that both the White House and the appeasers on the Left would do well to take to heart before it is too late.

He said,

# "You must look at the facts for the facts are looking at you."



A couple of recent news stories caught my eye. One concerns the Fundamentalist Church of Latter Day Saints, a sect that broke with the better-known LDS, or Mormon, church in 1890 over the issue of polygamy,

In heart-rending detail, Utah state officials are speaking about the thousand or so teenaged boys who have been forced out of their homes by the polygamous elders of the FLDS. As young as thirteen, many of these unfortunate adolescents have been abandoned along roadsides in Arizona and Utah — ordered never to return.

The explanations given to these traumatized teenagers are typically vague, generally involving adolescent, though unremarkable behaviors. According to the British *Guardian*, an investigator in the Utah attorney general's office describes the banishments as "part of the ruthless sexual arithmetic of a polygamous sect." Only by increasing the ratio of females to males, after all, can FLDS men marry the three to four women required by their church.

The effects of banishment on these "lost boys" are profound, ranging from an understandable rage to a hopeless, confused pining for the mothers who rejected them. One young man, expelled in large part for having attracted the affections of a girl apparently intended for a church elder, told a reporter of his unsuccessful attempts, after expulsion, to understand why his mom had refused his Mother's Day gift.

Despite the emotional anguish inflicted on these poor kids, their integration into normal society brings with it the hope, and even the expectation, that they will one day find a wife and family outside the reach of the FLDS.

The other story is of a twelve-year-old Ethiopian girl who was kidnapped by seven men and held for a week in the wilds, during which she was beaten repeatedly in an attempt to force her to marry one of the group. Eventually, if the pattern typical in the predominantly Islamic region held true, she would have been violated in front of the group by her "suitor." Then, thus spoiled, she would be shamed into marrying the rapist, as no one else would marry her.

According to news reports, the whimpering girl's tormentors were driven away by three female lions, who stood by her until rescuers came — at which time the big cats simply wandered away. Though similar stories of maternally-based interspecial behavior have been documented by scientists, there is no way to know if the story is true.

What is beyond doubt, however, is that many fundamentalist Islamic societies accept various forms of forced marriage. As I've written here before, Egyptian Copts have frequently appealed to the world to help end the abduction, with forced marriage and conversion to Islam, of Christian girls. The hallmark, in

fact, of these societies, is the practice of polygamy.

Imagine how it must be for boys growing up in a society where the richest, most powerful ten percent of men take as many as four wives. In reality, however, many men have far more women at their disposal, as easy Islamic divorce often leaves ex-wives completely at the mercy and disposal of their former husbands.

It doesn't take a mathematician to understand that, for all men but those with substantial wealth or political power, the prospects of having even one wife fall rapidly as economic and social status decrease. For many, the choice is to submit to a deprivation of affection and family, or find some way to break into the ranks of theocracy.

The privileged and powerful minority who run fundamentalist Islamic societies have developed the perfect means, expertly exploiting this imbalance between single men and available women. They have built a system that rails against any threat to the sexual exploitation of women, while offering those who heed their call at least a chance to join their polygamous ranks.

simply ignored by the mainstream media—it was boycotted by the mainstream media. Since nearly every aspect of this remarkable story contradicts everything the mainstream media has been trying to tell us about the Israeli-Palestinian conflict, they just opted for the easiest way to handle it—denying it ever happened.

Not covering it meant not having to show that Israel's planned unilateral withdrawal from Gaza will not decrease terror — it will increase terror. Had the Israeli army not been in Gaza, dozens of Israelis would have been killed and hundreds wounded at Beer Sheva's Soroka Medical Center.

Ignoring the story meant the networks didn't need to tell viewers that the homicide-bomber was not sent by terrorists of Islamic Jihad or Hamas, groups opposed to President Abbas, but was in fact working for the Al Aksa Martyrs Brigade, which is controlled by the political party Fatah, whose chairman is none other than President Abbas himself!

Ignoring the story meant not having to reveal that the would-be-murderer had been traveling regularly to Israel for years on a valid medical pass, which granted the woman free treatment for burns she received in a home cooking accident, and was thus ruthlessly exploited by depraved terrorists whose shameless capacity to cynically manipulate goodness, in their pursuit of murder and death, knows no bounds.

Granted, none of this prevented the ultra-left wing terrorist coddlers at the UN-supported "Physicians for Human Rights" to warn Israel against using what it called "the unfortunate incident" as an excuse to toughen restrictions on the issuance of medical passes. Terrorists target Israeli hospitals, and UN support-groups respond by admonishing Israel.

Ignoring the story meant not having to cover comments the female-terrorist made in a rare army supervised press conference in which she revealed what her mission was and who sent her. "I believe in death," she said on Israeli TV. "All my life, I have been preparing to be a martyr. Mother, please forgive me for failing in [my] mission." Sentiments not exactly consistent with the line long peddled by the liberal media, and more recently even by the Bush administration, that Israel is the obstacle to "peace."

Frustrated young men, the very group most likely to rebel against such a society, are urged to wage war against non-Islamic democracies, especially those in the Middle East. Israel, of course, is the nearest and most dangerous example of a nation in which women have full legal rights.

Today, Muslims from many nations are doing their elders' bidding, fighting "the Jews and Crusaders" in Afghanistan and Iraq. If the jihadists succeed in defeating or even delaying the forces of democracy and equal rights, Islamofascism's polygamous perquisites are protected. If the young men who fight for that system

happen to die in the process, they've still done their bit to increase the ratio of women to men anyway.

The whispers of discontent have, in fact, been growing louder as Islamic women have learned, despite the best efforts of their leaders, that women in the modern world have full legal rights, including the freedom to choose their own husbands and reject the indignity of polygamy.

Today, Middle Eastern women are speaking up, often at great personal risk, against the customs of forced marriages, honor killings and polygamy. Nawal Al Saadawi, perhaps the most vocal of these critics, is an Egyptian writer who was imprisoned during President Sadat's tenure for suggesting that sex, rather than God,

is behind the practice of polygamy. Though careful to maintain her distance from America and other Western nations, her entry into the first Egyptian election for presidency has infuriated much of the Islamic world, and threats against her life are routine.

I am not suggesting, of course, that all the problems of Islam are caused by polygamy. Rather, I am only noting that Western journalists have no problem pointing out, and properly, the human tragedies engendered by polygamy when it exists, illegally, in Utah, Nevada and, most recently, Texas. It is interesting that we have seen few such exposés and condemnations of polygamy as it is widely and legally practiced in the world of Islam.





## "Shameless and Without Honor"


A Letter to a Senator (From a circulating Internet email)

## The Gaza Dilemma

The Israeli administration of Ariel Sharon is on the verge of forcing the Jewish settlers in the Gaza area from their homes and moving them into the defensible territory of Israel. There is much opposition to this forcible move among many Israelis and many evangelical Christians, on the grounds that God has given all the Land of Israel to the Jewish people, and that it is disobedience to God and against Scriptural principles to give up any portion of the Land to the Palestinian Arabs.

Nevertheless, there have been several votes in the Israeli cabinet and the Knesset on the issue, and the majority has always approved the controversial policy about the Gaza settlers. Furthermore, the United States policy has consistently been to encourage, even to urge, Israel to pull back the Jewish settlers from Gaza in order to further a peaceful settlement with the Palestinian Arabs. Many evangelical American Christians outspokenly support Israel's ownership of the Land, and believe Israel's return to the Land is an integral part of Bible prophecy and the Second Coming of Christ. Should we then oppose the removal of the Gaza Jewish settlers, the decision of the majority of the Israeli people, and the policy of our own government? Neither the Israeli nor the American government is always right, but if we oppose them we need to have very solid grounds for doing so.


#### It is good to review the Scriptural facts in making a decision about this matter:

- 1. God has given the Jewish people a perpetual and unconditional grant to the Land, which provides ownership to Israel as long as the world stands.
- **2.** Israeli possession of the Land is conditioned upon either Jewish obedience to the Lord or His grace and mercy to His Chosen Nation.
- **3.** It was necessary for Israel to return to the Land in unbelief in Christ before the Tribulation, in order to confirm the treaty with the Antichrist and to undergo the

Time of Jacob's Trouble, and finally to receive the Lord Jesus upon His return.

- **4.** Inasmuch as most of Israel does not yet know Messiah Jesus, the current possession of the Land must be by God's grace, which should be enthusiastically supported by all Believers in the Lord.
- **5.** When Jesus was here on earth, Israel was occupied by the Roman government and military. It was therefore little more than a puppet state. He did not oppose this at the time, but rather taught that the Jews, including His own disciples, should *render unto Caesar the things that are Caesar's*.
- **6.** When Christ returns to the earth, Israel will be liberated, will be "the head of the nations," and Jerusalem will be the capital of the world under the King of Kings.
- 7. Between now and then, the Lord prophesied that *Jerusalem will be trodden down of the Gentiles, until the Times of the Gentiles be fulfilled.* Luke 21:24. That is, the Lord is going to allow the Gentiles to have considerable presence and influence in Jerusalem until He returns to make Jerusalem His capital.

How does all of the above relate to this issue of the Gaza settlers? I believe that we should support and encourage the settlement of Jewish people throughout the Promised Land. However, as we move toward the Rapture of the Church and the Tribulation, we must realize that the Scriptures teach that along the way there may be many setbacks to the full Jewish occupation of the Land the Lord has promised to them. We may rest assured, though, that He will give all the Land to Israel completely when He returns.

## **Rewarding Terrorism**

President Bush has given away the Israeli store to Palestinian Authority leader Mahmoud Abbas.

There's hardly anything else to say about it.

By proclaiming that the new starting point for future negotiations between Arabs and Israelis is the 1949 armistice line, Bush actually took a more anti-Israeli position than most of the hostile, Jew-hating Arab states have in recent years.

What is it about Abbas and the Palestinian Authority that Bush finds so encouraging? Quite simply, Abbas has not lived up to a single agreement he has made with the Israelis:

- He has failed to arrest Palestinian terrorists:
- He has refused to dismantle terrorist cells or to seize weapons from those identified as having attacked Israel;
- He has not only failed to stop incitement, his new schoolbooks remove all Jewish and Israeli references, except those that demonize Jews;

Asked about his relationship with the terrorist group Hamas, Abbas said: "Hamas is not a threat for us." Hamas exists to destroy Israel. It does not believe in any compromise. It has been declared a terrorist organization by the U.S. State Department.

So, as my friend Hal Lindsey wryly observes, "Helping Hamas can either get you 20 years in U.S. prison or an invitation to the White House."

Now do you understand why Abbas is not renouncing terrorism or abiding by any of his earlier pledges? Why should he? Bush has confirmed that terrorism works.

Bush has adopted the hard-line of the anti-Jewish radicals of the left and the anti-Jewish zealots of Islam who maintain there are some pieces of land on which Jews are just not welcome.

He has accepted the hate speech of the Arab extremists as a legitimate bargaining position. The Arabs say Jews are not permitted to live within the future home of Palestine. It doesn't matter whether they are peaceful civilians who mind their own business. It doesn't matter how long they have lived there. It doesn't matter

that they did not replace any Arab population in the area.

None of that matters. All that matters is that they are Jewish — and they have to go. Not just from Gaza, apparently. But, according to Bush, they need to go from Judea and Samaria, too — the entire West Bank. Oh, and don't forget East Jerusalem. No Jews permitted there either — because that part of the city needs to be returned to the Arabs in accordance with the 1949 armistice line. The Temple Mount? No way. It belongs to Muslims only, no Jews allowed. The Western Wall? It's going back to the Arabs.

That's what Bush told the world last week and I'm still waiting to hear some outrage about it.

There were many of us who doubted that former Secretary of State Colin Powell really understood the Arab-Israeli conflict. There were many of us who welcomed his retirement and his replacement, Condoleezza Rice. I'm beginning to wonder if Powell may have been a voice of reason within this administration, because there hasn't been any since he left — at least not with respect to the Middle East.

I keep hearing Rice's name mentioned as a possible presidential candidate in 2008.

I've got news for you. Unless this administration changes its disastrous course on the Middle East, Rice won't get elected dog catcher in this country.

What are we fighting for in Iraq and Afghanistan? I thought it was freedom. What are we fighting against? I thought it was Islamic terrorism. So why are we undermining freedom and supporting Islamic terrorism in our dealings with Israel and the Palestinian Arabs?



#### **Heart to Heart**

Recently we had the opportunity to have a U.S. Army captain, a wonderful Believer, on our TV program. He was between hitches in the Iraq war, and he certainly had a lot to say. The captain had the first half of the program and I took the second half. Below is a transcript of what I said on that program, lightly edited for clarity:

I mentioned in the beginning of the program about two soldiers having battles and you met the good captain. We're all Christian soldiers, and I'm involved in a battle of my own I wanted to share with you. Besides the battle against principalities and powers which is ongoing, my heart condition seems to have returned.

About 20 years ago, I wrote a song called, "Father, I'm Coming Home" because I was convinced that I was. And I didn't mind. A promotion to the front office in Heaven would have been fine with me and a trip to the Kingdom and finally a righteous government and everything else. No more wars — no complaints about that.

But, it's kind of a thoughtful song. I had some chest pain after a bypass operation and I thought, "Well, I'm not going to make it." I was only in my 40s, of course. A stress test at the local aerobic center had showed some chest pain and I was, at first, in denial. I'm telling all this so that people who are in this condition understand you cannot deny this chest pain and get away with it. I was teaching at Dallas Baptist University at the time. I went and taught my 3-hour evening class and ran up 3 flights of stairs to do it. And all this with an occluding artery

because I just didn't want to admit to it. But, finally I did have to admit to it. The pain got awful. So,

be careful. If you have any pain in your chest, especially when you're exercising, go straight to your doctor or an emergency room. Do something. Preferably, get a stress test and find out what that pain is about.

Fortunately, on one of our fall tours back in October of 1982, we had a cardiologist. He was watching my actions and the fact that I could barely walk up a hill and I would hand people things to carry for me. Finally, Dr. Randall Byrd, still a good friend of mine, said, "You know, you've got some serious stuff going on and you need to take care of it." He paid close attention to my case, and with his advice, I undertook an angiogram. Randy looked at those films along with my Dallas cardiologist and decided they had to do a bypass operation. It was a triple bypass with six grafts. Back then, they took a vein from the leg and sewed it from the aorta to the coronary arteries three times over. It's a long complicated operation. But it lasted. I'm told the procedure is much improved now.

Randy, a Christian brother, who has always told me the truth, said he thought those bypasses would be good, with the knowledge they had then, for about fifteen years. That would have taken me to 1997. And I thought, well that's probably long enough. I thought the Rapture would come before that, but, you know, it didn't. In 1994, I had two more procedures, angioplasties to improve the circulation. It seems those bypasses were closing again in my heart. The disease was filling the bypasses with cholesterol, or the way Randy puts it, "you have to live with the arteries you're born with and the situation you have."

In '94, they were able to clear those out again with the angioplasties, but in my own mind, what was really curative was the intercessory prayer that I received from our very large television audience. We just don't begin to estimate the power we have with prayer. Let me digress a moment to say what I usually say in the churches about this: you know, God is our Father. Jesus said pray this way, "Our Father which art in heaven." And if He's our Father we have a special "in" with Him. I mean, when your child asks you for something —your five year old asks for some ice cream and you don't want to say no and he appeals to you and he talks to you — it's not how wonderful his argument is for that ice cream, it's the fact that he's your five year who moves your heart and makes you buy that ice cream.

We have our Father's ear. We know that we're made in God's image. That means not only that we're like Him, but that He's like us. He has compassion and he is forgiving. He has a tender heart. The prophet Daniel prays, in effect, "Use your compassion and spare Israel the punishment for its sin," and so on.

#### "Turn the Cat Around"

In preparation for my bypass operation in August, I wanted to lose some weight. My cardiologist friend told me that would be the best way to confront the difficult convalescence. So, I got the book *Quit Digging Your Grave With a Knife and Fork* by Mike Huckabee, the governor of Arkansas.

It was a thoroughly enjoyable and effective book to read and live by. (I also read my own book from 1976 called *How to Win at Losing.*)

Huckabee, who grew up in church, wrote a couple of paragraphs that impressed me very much:

"The word repentance is familiar to people who have been brought up in or regularly attend church. It essentially means a person makes a 180 degree turn, repenting from a life of "sinful behavior" to a life of "righteous behavior." You might say that a successful change of health habits is true repentance.

Billy Sunday, the famous and flamboyant evangelist of the last century, was known for his powerful sermons and clever rejoinders to critics. One day, a lady offended by the bluntness of one of his sermons stomped up toward him and declared: "Mr. Sunday, I do not like what you are preaching. You've rubbed the cat's fur the wrong way." Billy Sunday simply replied: "Then lady, turn the cat around."

with intercession on the part of the witnesses, we move God to compassion and we bring that person closer and both ideas work. That's the way I used to answer it when people called me on the radio about it. Believe me, the Bible has no unanswerable questions.

Well, with all that said, I've gone this far, nearly 23 years on these bypasses, which one doctor told me had a warranty of 10 (Randy said 15). But anyway, I got nearly 23! Thank you very much for your prayers! They work. And I'm not taking it easy. I'm going like a house afire.

I mean, I go to Israel and back. I go on speaking engagements. I drive a trailer around. I play golf. I'm not sitting in a chair and I'm not getting any younger, but I love this work and I want to continue it.

Recently, I had some of those old familiar pains return, and this time I went for an angiogram and found that two of three coronary arteries are blocked again and the third one is 70% blocked. So, I'm in a situation. It's not an emergency, but it's not something I can go on and on with.

The diagnosis is that I need another bypass operation and I plan to have it about mid-August. We haven't really scheduled it yet, but I wanted to tell you right away as soon as this decision was made. The recovery from that operation will be about three months. In reality, it's not that serious an operation. It sounds very dramatic, but as many women have told me, it's not as painful as having a baby, and I don't think it's as bad as having an

appendix out. But, it's incapacitating for a while. For about six weeks, I won't be able to work on newsletters or effectively make television programs, and so on. But, I should be alright for the November tour. At the very least, I will go to New York, see off the folks, and have the usual orientation session at the JFK chapel. We did that this past spring and everyone enjoyed it very much. The fact is, we had more time together for questions, photos, autographs, etc., than we would have had on our rather fast-moving tour, where the native guides do most of the talking.

Why am I telling you all this? Well, I covet your prayers first of all. Please don't send flowers and stuff. I want prayers. And, frankly, we'll need support. When I drop out, maybe the newsletter will get slightly less effective. The TV programs we make well in advance. There are programs "in the can" all the time. It doesn't matter if I make them on the spot, but if I'm not there when an event happens, I obviously can't cover it in that period. And sometimes donations are depleted a little bit at a time like that. Over the huge audience, that's what happens.

So, if you would, we covet your support always, but this is a pretty special time and it will really make me feel a lot better if I know the ministry is in sound shape and we're remaining on PAX and paying for our air time, and so on.

But, don't pray just for me. Pray for everybody that you need to intercede for. You know, in a church, there are all kinds of people with all kinds of gifts. There are people who sing songs beautifully and a preacher who may speak so eloquently, and deacons who have the talent and the patience to run the operation and make it go.

But I'm always impressed by the quiet people in the back of the church who rarely raise their hand in a question period and so on, but who volunteer to set up chairs and do tasks and drive people around, who pick me up for an engagement and drive me there, wait for me and drive me back. It's good works like that that especially appeal to God. And I tell you if you set up chairs for the church, then set them up to the glory of God, because God said the soldier in the back of the army is as important to him as the field marshal.

This is a different kind of army, the Christian army, and your contribution is very important, whatever it is. Every soldier, like this wonderful captain we had, has specific training. The captain is able to drive a tank. He's able to operate many guns. He knows what to do out there. But he doesn't steer a ship and he doesn't fly an airplane. He wasn't trained for those things. Do your works the way you're supposed to do them and make your prayers for everyone in need, me and everyone who has a request. There are sicker people than me out there. Lord Almighty, I go to visit people in hospitals and I get there barely in time. Go ahead and pray for those as well. Don't let prayer desert you at a time like this.

You know, I always ask you to pray for the peace of Jerusalem at the end of every program. That's absolutely necessary, and it's necessary we get over there. One reason I'm having this bypass is that the surgeon told me, 'Without it you might go on three or four years, but with it you could get ten or twenty.' I want to visit Israel many more times. I'm just beginning to under-

stand the place and my love for it always grows. I want you to go. I want to take you.

I will lead these tours in the future, It's so important at a time like this. I have the feeling that our time is limited, if you know what I'm saying. That's the way things look and my experience with the place tells me we should be praying for it, especially at a time like this. Pray for the decent-hearted Palestinian people who do want peace. #### Roadmap to Nowhere

Palestinian Foreign Minister
Nasser Al-Kidwa has set off a storm
by declaring that his government has no
intention of cracking down on terrorist groups, as
demanded by the "roadmap" peace plan.

"The dismantling of armed organizations is not on the table because weapons are legal as long as the occupation exists," Al-Kidwa told Palestinian Television. "Possession of weapons is a strategic issue as long as there is occupation." It was the first time a senior Palestinian official openly acknowledged that the government would not fulfill its key commitment under the roadmap. Until now, Palestinian leader Mahmoud Abbas said he prefers to negotiate with militant groups, with the long-term goal of collecting illegal weapons.

Israel Reacts Angrily

Israeli officials are furious over Al-Kidwa's remarks. "The refusal of the Palestinian Authority to disarm the terror groups drops a cluster bomb on the process that could lead to negotiations and quiet," Deputy Prime Minister Ehud Olmert told Israel Radio. "Very simply, either they will fight terrorism or we will fight terrorism." Officials say Israel will not begin peace talks until the Palestinians dismantle terrorist groups like Hamas and Islamic Jihad. Al-Kidwa's remarks "place doubt on the Palestinian intention to enter the roadmap framework acceptable to the entire international community," said Deputy Defense Minister Ze'ev Boim.

In Iraq, half the population, according to one poll, believes that a man has a right to beat his wife if she disobeys him (and the Koran gives this sanction). In Iran, women continue to be stoned to death for the crime of adultery. The size of the stones to be used in such executions is specified by law. "Penal Law in the Islamic Republic of Iran: Article 116: Stones used in stoning should be neither so big as to kill the adultress at the first or second blow, nor as small as a pebble." Other punishments meted out by the Islamic Republic include cutting off hands, arms and legs, and plucking out the eyes.

In Saudi Arabia, an Australian man has been sentenced to 16 months in prison and 300 lashes for a crime his wife may have committed (stealing equipment from a hospital). His flogging, inflicted 50 strokes at a time, by a guard with a Koran under his arm, has already begun. "The lashing," he wrote to a friend in Melbourne, "is to

humiliate and control, and I draw a large crowd as I am one of those Western ungodly people, but they shall never hear me yell." In Saudi Arabia, the punishment for Muslims who convert away from Islam is death.

Palestinian Authority (PA) Chairman Mahmoud Abbas said in an interview aired on May 29 that the era of suicide bombings may be over.

"We have started to deal with the culture of violence," he said. "We stopped the culture of violence and the Palestinian people have started looking at it as something that should be condemned and it should stop." Asked on ABC whether the suicide-bombing era had ended, he said, "I believe it is over."

But he warned that if progress toward a peace agreement was not achieved in meetings with Prime Minister Ariel Sharon, "despair and loss of hope will come back and a return to the old ideas" of armed resistance.

Earlier on May 29, Sharon expressed skepticism over Abbas' ability to quell terror even as he bolstered the Palestinian leader by pushing the Cabinet to approve the release of 400 Palestinian prisoners.



Sharon told the Cabinet that "anyone who thinks there will be a straight passage from disengagement to the Road Map is wrong." There are a number of things that need to happen first, including the cessation of terror, he said.

His words ran counter to United States President George W. Bush's statement on May 26 after his summit with Abbas, which spoke of disengagement as an "opportunity to lay the groundwork for a return to the Road Map."

Still, Sharon defended the need to support Abbas now in spite of warnings by his security experts that Abbas could be doing more to stop terror.

Finance Minister Binyamin Netanyahu, Health Minister Dan Naveh, and Agriculture Minister Yisrael Katz voted against the prisoner release.

"The Palestinians have failed in their activities against the terrorist organizations; therefore, I do not see any reason to reward terror at a time when the Israel Defense Forces (IDF) chief of general staff and others are warning that Hamas is gaining strength," Netanyahu said.

Sharon, however, said Israel had to hold fast to the commitment it made in February at the Sharm-el-Sheikh summit to release 900 prisoners, 500 of whom were let out of jail that same month. Some 7,000 Palestinians are in Israeli custody.

Sharon said the gesture is "part of Israel's efforts to assist Abbas and the moderate forces in the PA."



A prominent national Islamic advocacy group has called on judges in North Carolina to allow use of the Koran, Islam's revealed text, when administering oaths.

The Washington-based Council on American-Islamic Relations (CAIR) said the current exclusive use of the Bible may be an inappropriate state endorsement of religion.

CAIR issued its call after
Guilford County judges
said they would not
allow use of Korans in
their courtrooms. "An
oath on the Koran is not
a lawful oath under our
law," said W. Douglas Albright,
Guilford's senior resident
Superior Court judge. State law
only refers to swearing an oath
by putting a hand on the "Holy Scriptures." Those
who do not wish to take an oath using the Bible may
instead make an "affirmation."

A preliminary opinion by North Carolina's Administrative Office of the Courts said that state law allows people to be sworn in using a Koran rather than a Bible.

"By stating that only one book qualifies as 'Holy Scriptures,' the court may be making an inappropriate endorsement of a single set of religious beliefs," said CAIR Legal Director Arsalan Iftikhar. "Eliminating the opportunity to swear an oath on one's own holy text may also have the effect of diminishing the credibility of that person's testimony."

Iftikhar said CAIR will offer a free copy of the Koran to any judge in North Carolina or throughout the United States for use in oaths or for personal awareness of the "holy text."

While Secretary of State Condoleezza Rice is pushing the Middle East roadmap to both Israelis and Palestinian Arabs, former House Speaker Newt Gingrich says it's time to abandon the plan.

"Diplomacy is important and has a vital role to play, but its function must be different than the Oslo process and the roadmap suggest," he writes in a paper in the summer edition of *Middle East Quarterly*.

"The focus on Israeli-Palestinian diplomacy cannot work when one side has a leadership that does not deliver on its word."

In a paper titled, "Defeat Terror, Not Roadmap Diplomacy," Gingrich, like Rice, a potential presidential candidate in 2008, says talks with the Palestinian Authority should stop until it fulfills its promise to dismantle all terrorist infrastructures.

"Diplomats, by their nature, believe in talk and in paper," he wrote. "They value meetings and agreements. But in order for diplomacy to work, negotiators must be honest brokers willing to keep commitments."

The roadmap, developed by the Bush administration during early 2003 in cooperation with Russia, the European Union, and the United Nations, makes clear that all sides must make tangible steps toward a two-state vision. But, so far, says Gingrich, the Palestinian Arabs have failed to meet the test.

Gingrich called for less restraint by the Israel Defense Forces and a more aggressive military response to attacks on Israeli civilians.

"When a neighborhood shelters terrorists, it should not be surprised at a violent response," he insisted.


"When a rocket or mortar is fired from a neighborhood, people should expect retaliatory fire. When someone advocates killing Israelis, they should expect to be killed by those they plan to kill."

Gingrich added: "The primary requirement for peace should be the destruction of the terrorists. This inherently is not a diplomatic task. Smoke and mirrors will not work."

#### Women's Lib?

It was a small, but nonetheless important step in the struggle for liberty in the Middle East: Kuwait's parliament decided, by a vote of 35-23, to grant Kuwaiti women full political rights. The change confers longsought-after recognition of Kuwait's well-educated and socially powerful female population, and grants them access to one of the country's most important political bodies. The Islamist parties, which opposed the measure, have tried to spin the vote as a victory. For one, the new law stipulates that women candidates must "abide by Islamic law," and some fear the Islamists will pressure women to vote as a bloc in their favor. The risk of Islamist groups gaining power is probably inevitable in any transition to greater democracy in the Middle East. The challenge is to counter that risk by establishing institutions that guarantee freedoms and by working to change public opinion—as Kuwaiti women, to their credit, have already started and will continue to do.

#### "A President Without Brains"

"We have a president without brains" wrote the country's leading historian George Bancroft. Bancroft was, admittedly, a

Democrat, but many self-respecting Republicans were also concerned about the implications of having an untried, self-educated "rail-splitter" as a leader in time of grave national crisis. Charles Francis Adams, a leading Republican and the son and grandson of presidents, wrote of the new president-elect in his diary: "Good

natured, kindly, honest, but frivolous and uncertain." The doubts and fears of many Americans were expressed by a newspaper editor who asked, "Who will write this ignorant man's state papers?" Wall Street lawyer George Templeton Strong wrote in his diary after their first meeting that the president was a "barbarian," a "yahoo."

P.S. The president under discussion here in *Time* magazine, July 4, was Abraham Lincoln.

#### The Fear of Christianity

...In the spirit of full disclosure, I confess to belonging to a generation of elementary school children who were

asked each day to choose a psalm to read at the opening of class. I can still recite a few of them by heart. I never saw a child, atheist or otherwise, who suffered for it. Lincoln called the Bible "the best gift God has given to man," but he was self-taught.

The Bible Literacy Project, a nonprofit organization, has just published the result of a survey, conducted by Gallup, to answer the question: "What Do American Teens Need to Know and What Do They Know?" The sad answer is, they don't know much. "Substantial minorities lack even the most basic working knowledge of the Bible," and 40 of 41 teachers report that few pupils know enough Biblical references to qualify for "a good education."

No one proposes teaching the Bible as a sacred text or to promote religious faith in public schools. With three kinds of Jews, a dozen varieties of Methodists and countless flavors of Baptists, just for starters, we could never agree on what, exactly, should be taught as doctrine even if that's what we set out to do. But in a less-than-perfect world, there can be no harm, and a lot of good, in well-informed surveys of the Bible as literature, showing how the Bible has shaped history, philosophy, the law, art, and other subjects, inspiring our earliest settlers, Founding Fathers and presidents unto the modern day.

"It's a perfect reflection of the nation's origins that the very first freedom in the Bill of Rights... should be religious freedom," writes David Gelernter in *The Weekly Standard*. It was never meant to be used "as a weapon against religion."





#### **American Dollars Well Spent**

National Review

Israel and Egypt are the two largest recipients of U.S. aid. For its "participation" in the Gulf War, Egypt was forgiven its indebtedness of \$9 billion. Israel pays its bills. It receives \$2.8 billion every year. Of that amount, \$2.0 billion is for military aid and \$800 million for economic aid. It's fair to ask whether this is a good deal for the American taxpayer.

#### What are the facts?

### Israel is the only genuinely democratic state in the Middle East.

Israel is committed to freedom and equality, and the rule of law. It embodies the fundamental values that are in tune with those of America and that America has traditionally supported. Israel's military and political importance in the Middle East and its strategic position stabilize the entire area, including the oil fields of the Persian Gulf. During the cold war, it was America's indispensable rampart against the inroads and expansionist ambitions of the Soviet Union. It is now a western bulwark against the aggressive intents of Iran and other bellicose nations that threaten the interests of the United States. It is a most reliable partner in the promotion of Western strategic interests and in the stabilization of the Middle East. Over 20% of its budget goes for defense, compared to, for example, less than 1% in Japan. Israel has one of the best armies in the world. Its navy and air force are the major deterrent forces in the eastern Mediterranean.

Israel effectively secures NATO's southeastern flank, without having a single American soldier stationed in its territory. Still, the superb military installations, the air and sea lift capabilities, the equipment and food storage capacity, and the trained manpower to maintain and repair sophisticated U.S. equipment are instantly at hand in Israel. It is the only country in the region that makes itself available to the United States, in any contingency.

### Only a fraction of aid stays in Israel

By far the largest share remains with American defense contractors. Peter McPherson, former administrator of the Agency for International Development, estimated that every billion dollars of aid to Israel creates 60,000 to 70,000 jobs in the U.S.





Compared to the \$2.0 billion yearly military aid to Israel, the U.S. contributes more than \$130 billion to the defense of Europe and more than \$30 billion to the defense of Japan, Korea and the Far East. Over 300,000 U.S. troops are stationed with NATO and over 30,000 U.S. troops in the Far East. In contrast, not one single U.S. soldier needs to be stationed and put at risk in Israel. U.S. military analysts estimate that the U.S. would have to spend the equivalent of \$150 billion a year in the Middle East to maintain a force equivalent to Israel's.

There are many other benefits that the U.S. military derives from Israel. Israel is the only country that has gained battlefield experience with U.S. weapons. This experience is immediately conveyed to the U.S. Enormous quantities of captured Soviet weapons and defense systems were turned over to the U.S. military for analysis. Israel, in the light of its experience, continually modifies U.S. weapons systems. For instance, Israeli scientists have made over 200 improvements in the F-15 alone, and similar improvements, mostly in avionics, in latergeneration planes. It would be more in line with reality if military aid to Israel was classified as part of the defense budget, rather than as "aid".


### **Dreadlocks Unlocked** *Israel Today*

### **Hebrew**Lesson

#### The Lord's Covering of Love

Hatred stirreth up strifes: but love covereth all sins. (Proverbs 10:12)





Hebraic Insight: Love covereth...

Hatred actively seeks contention and strife. The Hebrew word *medanim* comes from the root word *din*, meaning to judge, as in a court of law. Hatred looks with ill will at the transgressions of others and prosecutes at the bar of judgment for conviction. When we hate others, we accuse them before justice, but excuse them before mercy.

Love, on the other hand, seeks to "cover" the transgressions of others. The Hebrew word *tekhaseh* comes from the root *kasa*, meaning to conceal or hide something entirely from view, like the flood waters that "covered" the whole earth (Gen. 7:19) or the Shechinah cloud that covered the Tabernacle (Num. 9:15). When we love others, we lose sight of that which leads us into accusation.

The ultimate "covering of love" comes from the Lord Himself, who sacrificed His only Son so that our transgressions and sins would not be charged against us (Rom. 4:7-8). God's love overlooks our misdeeds and sees us as a reconciled and redeemed people. Since God forgives us, we likewise ought to forgive others for whom the Lord Jesus shed His blood.

Of course, not all hatred is bad, since the Scriptures command us to hate evil (Psalm 21:5, 139:21-22, etc.). However, the hatred, aversion, and malice that men habitually express for their fellow man demonstrates the radical depravity of the human condition. The Lord Jesus Himself taught us to love our enemies and do good to those who hate us, thereby promoting the message of God's "covering love" for a fallen and hurting world (Luke 6:27-35).

#### The Pathology of Hatred



Israel's late foreign minister, Abba Eban, once said: "If Algeria introduced a resolution at the UN declaring that the Earth was flat and that Israel had flattened it, it would pass by a vote of 164 to 13 with 26 abstentions. Indeed, at Durban, in early September 2001, the United Nations international conference against racism became a platform for anti-Israel propaganda, resurrecting every evil image and myth of a thousand years of anti-Semitism. Israel, not Iran, Iraq, Sudan, or Libya, was accused of ethnic cleansing, genocide and crimes against humanity.

On May 14, 1948, the day the State of Israel was born, while it was being attacked on every one of its borders, David Ben-Gurion made the call for peace part of Israel's Declaration of Independence: "We extend our hand to all neighboring states and their peoples in an offer of peace and good neighborliness." That call for peace still stands, yet remains unanswered. To accuse Israel, a country that continues to seek peace after 57 years of terror and war, of being racist, or of being an apartheid state engaged in ethnic cleansing, is akin to declaring that Israel has flattened the world.

So the question is this: What is really at the heart of Arab leaders demonizing Israel?

#### The Earthquake

On Dec. 26 2003, a massive earthquake in Bam, Iran tragically killed over 40,000 Iranians. The government of Iran announced that help was welcome from every country in the world except Israel. Think about it: Israel is the world's expert in quickly finding survivors in bombed out buildings, and is a mere two-hour flight from Iran. Yet the Iranian government chose to let men, women and children die or lie buried under rubble rather than be saved by a Jew from Israel. Apparently, they hate Israel more than they love life.

The vast majority of Muslims are peaceful people, yet hate toward Israel is a basic tenet in much of the Muslim world today. Tens of millions of children are taught that alone among nations, Israel has no right to exist. All the old myths, from the blood libel to the *Protocols of the Elders of Zion* are being recycled among the Muslims. Parents celebrate the suicide terror of their sons, because the joy of killing Israeli families outweighs the death of their own. Not since the Nazi hatred of Jews has humanity witnessed such animosity.

#### **Hitler's Obsession**



To Hitler, eradicating the Jews was a greater priority then winning World War Two. In July 1944, when the Germans desperately

needed every train to begin the evacuation of Greece, not a single train was diverted from taking Jews to death camps. When the Germans ordered a ban on all non-military rail traffic in order to free trains for a summer offensive in southern Russia, the only trains exempted were those transporting Jews to death camps.

Hitler's policy of murdering the Jews actually undermined the Nazi war effort; it would have been more pragmatic to use the Jews for slave labor. Yet even those who were used for slave labor were so mistreated that many of them died within months. When a Nazi general, Kurt Freiherr von Grienanth, suggested in September 1942, that "the principle should be to eliminate the Jews as promptly as possible without impairing essential war work," he was demoted and his proposal denounced as a subtle effort to help the Jews.

#### **Moral self-confidence**

What should be our response to this hatred?

Mordechai understood that compromising with Haman was futile. Mordechai didn't say, "The Jews will evacuate half of Shushan (the capital city of the Persian Empire)," so that Haman will be able to live in a *Judenrein* (free of Jews) city. Mordechai understood that the obstacle to peace was not the Jewish presence in one particular city, but their presence in any city. It was not the one who was hated, but the one who hated who needed to change, so Mordechai did not bow. As a result, redemption and peace ultimately came for Jews and Persians.

Today, too, Israel ought to stand up to the pathological hatred with moral and political self-confidence and determination. they must let the world know that peace will come not when Israel will give away more land, but when Israel's neighbors will stop destroying themselves in their attempt to destroy Israel.

#### Why we blame ourselves

Sadly, in spite of the overwhelming evidence, the Jewish reflex is to "bow" and deny our enemies' aggressive impulses. We tend to blame ourselves for the Arabs desire to destroy us. Perhaps it is the fear of knowing what it is too painful to know.

## of All Nations

This proclivity toward self-deception was described by Jean-Francois Revel, in his book *How Democracies Perish:* 

"Democracy tends to ignore, even deny, threats to its existence because it loathes doing what is needed to counter them. It awakens only when the danger becomes deadly, imminent, and evident. By then, either there is too little time left for it to save itself, of the price of survival has become crushingly high."

Let it not be said by future generations that Israel saw raging fires of hate and destruction, and did nothing.

#### Jewish Anger as Church Votes on Israel

Jewish groups reacted angrily June 25 against a motion passed by senior Anglicans urging all provinces around the world to reconsider their investments with Israel.

At a meeting of the Anglican Consultative Council in Nottingham, members voted unanimously in favour of the resolution concerning the Israeli and Palestinian conflict.

It called for the 38 provinces which make up the Anglican Communion globally to look carefully at any business dealings they may have with Israeli companies.

Bishop John Paterson, the New Zealand chairman of the ACC, said the council commended "the resolve of the Episcopal Church (USA) to take appropriate action where it finds that its corporate investments support the occupation of Palestinian lands or violence against innocent Israelis."

The ACC went on to encourage "investment strategies that support the infrastructure of a future Palestinian state."

The council, which meets every three years, called for "peace, justice and co-existence in the Holy Land."

But the resolution was met with anger by Jewish organisations in the UK.

Rabbi Barry Marcus, the spokesman on Israel for Chief Rabbi Jonathan Sacks, said: "Moves towards divestment represent a flawed and disastrous course." "They will do nothing to advance the twin causes of security for Israel and statehood for the Palestinians."

"The report itself took a one-sided and subjective view of the situation, and did not reflect the present reality."

Jon Benjamin, chief executive of the Board of British Deputies of British Jews, told *The Guardian:* "That Israel alone should be singled out for such treatment, particularly at a time when dialogue is beginning to prevail, shows an inequality in the treatment of the Jewish state which must raise concerns about the Church's relationship with our community.

"Once again, the outrageous falsehoods levelled against Israel are used by the enemies of peaceful co-existence to undermine the genuine goodwill of those who want to see an end to conflict in the region."

#### **An Unprecedented Military Achievement**

If our current debate about the military transcends proportionate costs and relative sacrifice, perhaps our



unhappiness derives from the terrible loss of 1,700 combat dead in Iraq. Yet this discontent arises not from numbers alone. After all, at catastrophic moments in our history, far more were killed, either in a single day or in a few weeks, than all those we have lost since September 11 in Afghanistan and in Iraq.

Between 5,000 and 6,000 Americans were killed on September 17, 1862 at Antietam. D-Day cost around 3,000 Allied dead, and another 6,000 were wounded. During the Battle of the Bulge, some 19,000 Americans died and another 60,000 were wounded, missing or captured. In the first few minutes of Pearl Harbor, about 2,400 Americans perished. So far, the 1,700 killed in action in Iraq equal about 60% of those lost in the attacks on the Pentagon and the World Trade Center.

Going 7,000 miles across the globe, toppling two fascistic governments, and establishing democracies in their places, and doing so at a cost (albeit a painful one) of less than 2,000 soldiers is, by historical standards, an unprecedented military achievement.

# Disengagement After the Disengagement?

Will Sharon's plan actually bring disengagement from Gaza? As much as certain politicians and groups would like you to think that it will, all signs point to the opposite.

In place of the Jewish settlements, several terrorist groups such as Hamas and the PLO have stated their desire to open offices in the area, at the invitation of the Palestinian Authority. The terror campaign against Israel that is for now coordinated from Damascus, Tunis, and Iran will move shop to Gaza, only a Kassam's shot away. And what will the IDF do after disengagement when the Kassam rockets continue to fall on Sderot and other cities? Will the IDF do nothing because Israel is "disengaged" from Gaza?

Another major issue is that of border crossings and ports. Israel's own Supreme Court justices have said that if Israel retains control of all border crossings, access from sea, and airspace, then the "occupation" of Gaza is not terminated. However, imagine the weaponry, technology and terrorists that would pour into the area if border control were given over to the PA. As some legal experts see it, Israel will still be "occupying" the Gaza Strip even after all the Jewish settlers are forcibly removed. If this is the case, what does Israel gain from "disengagement" if the world still sees her as an occupying power?

In late June, the IDF conducted an operation to demolish several unoccupied houses along the Gaza seacoast near Shiryat Hayam that they feared could be used as shelters by extremist settlers during the disengagement. Although no Jews were forcibly expelled from their homes, the demolitions did produce the first case of refusal by a soldier during a military operation related to disengagement. The soldier in question, Avi Bieber, refused to carry out orders after he saw how the IDF and the police were allegedly beating and mistreating some of the settlers who came to protest the demolitions. What is even more amazing about his refusal is that it was not the result of calls from rabbis or

other religious leaders, but rather out of his love for the state and desire not to see harm come to Jews by the hand of other Jews.

Many reserve officers have previously signed letters stating that they would not participate in the disengagement, and several other regular soldiers have been disciplined for refusal to take part in disengagement related training. However, Avi Bieber's case is the first of a soldier refusing orders during an actual military operation in the areas to be evacuated, and could only be a prelude of more refusals to come.

The issue of disengagement has brought to the forefront of Israeli culture the question of God versus the secular Israeli Government, Eretz Israel versus the Green Line, and which is more important to follow. This dilemma is especially hard for religious soldiers who are caught between following the orders of their Army and the policies of the state as approved by the Knesset, and following what is written in Scriptures about preserving the Land of Israel.

The rift in Israeli society caused by the disengagement will not easily be healed, nor will the security of the state be enhanced. The terrorists will dance on the rubble of the Israeli settlements, and Israel will still be an occupier according to the world. Sharon's unilateral disengagement is just that, a clear one-sided victory for the terrorists with nothing in return for Israel. God's plan for Israel and His people has been laid out for thousands of years in the Scriptures, and we just have to trust that He indeed is in control.


