A Letter From Moishe Rosen

Founder, Jews for Jesus

Dear Zola:

I never thought that you would get ahead of me in our race to be with the Lord, but for the moment, it seems that you might. I think that He's looking forward to perfecting you and seeing you enjoy the greater consciousness of His presence. Now we see through a glass darkly, but then we shall know even as we are known.

It's strange, but I see you telling jokes to God, and someone says to the Almighty, "You're omniscient. You know the punch line already." Then I can hear the Lord answering, "Yes, but I like the way Zola tells it."



I think God has told us so little about Heaven because if we knew more, life here on Earth would be intolerable. So my advice to you and all of us traveling in that direction is: "Get ready. Buckle up. You're really going to enjoy it, even though the ride to get there might be bumpy."

I remember when we met. It was 1972. Campus Crusade brought thousands of young people and Bible teachers to Dallas. I told Daniel Fuchs, Missionary Secretary

for the American Board of Missions to the Jews, that I didn't want to go. He leaned on me and said, "Do me a favor. Just go because I'm asking you."

So I went. I don't like Christian extravaganzas. I like to meet Believers, but I feel much more comfortable if I'm not getting thronged. Well, you were in that throng, and we met. We didn't talk much, but I did remember you.

The following year, you asked to interview me on your radio program when I was in Dallas.

As a veteran of more than a hundred radio and television interviews, I was impressed by your ability and meticulousness. You were on point.

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A Way to Lose

Elsewhere in this issue, I have pointed out that there is little military threat from any Islamic enemy, and that's true. But with that said, there is another way we can lose this war, and it almost seems as if we're trying as hard as we can to lose it. Our hearts and minds are turning so that we don't want to be bothered with a fight, and we'll sit back and let them just march in, without any military prowess, a little at a time over a long period, and simply take our country away. It's not that this is unprecedented. Twenty-two nations of the Middle East, including powerful Egypt, went down to these people pretty much without a fight. They chose to stay in their chairs and spend their money and listen to their local media, or whatever, rather than throw the attackers out.

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You didn't talk much, but you steered our conversation, and I found myself saying things that I wanted to say, that I had never said before on radio. After that hour, I said to myself, "I want this man to be my friend."

We got together, and I found that we were kindred spirits. Then, as now, I appreciated your wonderment about God: the sense of awe I felt that simply could not be put into words.

We also shared a holy impatience and a holy intolerance — impatience in knowing that matters often could be expedited, and intolerance in resisting the nonsense of polite pieties that usurp meaningful communication and communion between people. In Heaven, we'll all relax. There will be no need for holy impatience and holy intolerance. We'll only need to know how to enjoy all the good things God has for those who love Him.

Zola, through the years, you've been a great friend to me. You've often taken the burden of maintaining our friendship, and when I've been neglectful, you've called me in a friendly tone.

I've probably eaten more meals with you than anyone outside of my family or the Jews for Jesus staff. Food always tasted better when I ate it with you, because you enjoyed it with such gusto.

I appreciate that you are the kind of person who is courageous enough to speak his mind when he has something unpopular to say, or to leave a restaurant because they won't turn off music that you find annoying. And along those lines, I wonder how long you'll be transfixed with wonderment at the music of Heaven before you have a few suggestions on the arrangements. Of course, you'll work in a good oboe part, too!

Zola, I would rather have a friend like you with whom to disagree, than most of the Christians who are so agreeable with me.

Yes, Zola, I did go on a diet as you've been suggesting for so long. I will try harder to lose weight. But, no, Zola, I'm not going to take up golf, no matter how much you love it. I've enjoyed seeing you love golf, so I don't have to play it.

We've been close friends, and one thing I appreciate in you is all of the sweet things you've said about Sandra, and how you appreciate her son Will, and the respect you

have for Sandra's mother. Not enough men have kind words about their mothers-in-law.

Though your sons might not hear it from you, you've often boasted to me of your pride in their abilities and how very bright your grandchildren are. It's rare to see a man get so much benefit and pleasure out of a marriage between two mature people and out of his family in general. I'm going to make it a policy as much as I can to tell your family the kind things you've spoken about them.

You are the best-known and best-loved messianic Jew in the world. At this point, I don't think I need to tell you that you're greatly loved by those who watch your television program. There are even those Jews who don't know *Yeshua* who love you because of what you've done for the Jewish people and for Israel. And don't be surprised if, when you get to Heaven, there are some Arabs there who regard you as being a beloved brother.

I've seen certain TV personalities put on their "television faces," but you never do that. I so appreciate that when you go on television, you are the most "Zola," even more of what I have experienced of you in person. Your sincerity, kindness, and yes, even righteous indignation are so genuine.

Zola, I want to thank you for all that you've given to me and all the ways you've helped me with advice and your personal generosity to Jews for Jesus. You taught me things about ministry. For example, the way that you love the supporters of Zola Levitt Ministries should be an example to all Christians everywhere.



The friendship of Believers endures because we are part of the "Forever Family." I pray for the many families and friends you've loved who haven't quite seen what you see in Jesus, that they too might be part of that forever family.

I think that all of us, family and friends, owe it to you to make sure that the ministry you've built keeps on telling people about *Yeshua* until He comes. There is no one to replace you, and that's why we need to keep your message in a place where it continues to be heard.

Zola, you're always for me — certainly for Israel, and most of all, for *Yeshua*. You've asked little for yourself, and given us all much. If there are tears in the hearts and minds of people around you over your illness, it's more for ourselves than for you. Difficult as your journey may be, your destination is glorious; but for the rest of our lives, we who are kept a while longer on this earth will miss you and the way that you've upheld us.

Dear staff:

I took a summer tour with Zola over twenty years ago and felt so blessed and privileged to actually be in the Holy Land.

As we visited the many well known sites, I was deeply impressed with Zola’s knowledge of the Bible, his love of the Land, the places, the people — he really made the Bible come alive. He also made it clear that the New Testament fulfills the prophecy and the purpose of the Old, thereby linking the two in a very understandable manner. Moreover, he made the connection between Passover and the Last Supper. These two examples were eye-openers for me. I decided that since we both lived in Dallas, I should get better acquainted. Obviously, Zola had a lot to offer.

I invited him to lunch and he brought his assistant with him to observe. For openers he said “I don’t like lawyers.” Needless to say, we got off to a rather rocky start. Subsequently, however, I have participated in his ministry as a friend, advisor and Board member for many years.

Over the years, I have seen firsthand God’s blessings at work. The ministry has grown from a couple of assistants to a staff of about fifteen people. Through the years, Zola has continued to write, compose, produce his TV shows, and teach — a man of many talents — always giving full credit to the Lord.

I asked him one time how he goes about composing his music. He said “I just hear it and go from there,” always crediting Divine guidance.

Aside from being so multi-talented, Zola is a regular guy, always full of life, playing golf, laughing, and telling a few jokes along the way. His jokes were always appropriate, enhanced the occasion, and often times with a Jewish connection. He could always mimic the accents of the characters of the joke be it Jewish, Arabic, country, Yankee, etc. Here’s one I always liked:

There was a restaurant in Jerusalem with a sign out front “NO ARABS ALLOWED.” An Arab in full dress came in, sat down and ordered. The waiter

As I look back over the years, I realize just how productive Zola has been. For example, you can look at the order form in the *Levitt Letter* to consider the albums of music and the videos, each containing multiple parts. It is wonderful that he has created so much, thereby blessing so many. And when you add the Holy Land tours, so very many Believers have come to a much better understanding of the Bible and our Lord and Savior.

Another thing I’ve learned from Zola that has been most meaningful in my walk is that the New Testament has been so anglicized. For example, I never knew that the Hebrew name for Jesus is *Yeshua*.

I find it more meaningful when I use it in prayer. As you know, all the characters referred to in the Bible were Jews and had names such as *Yochanan* (John), *Mattityahu* (Matthew) and Sha’ul (Paul). Of particular interest is *Abba*, one of the Jewish words to be found in the New Testament.

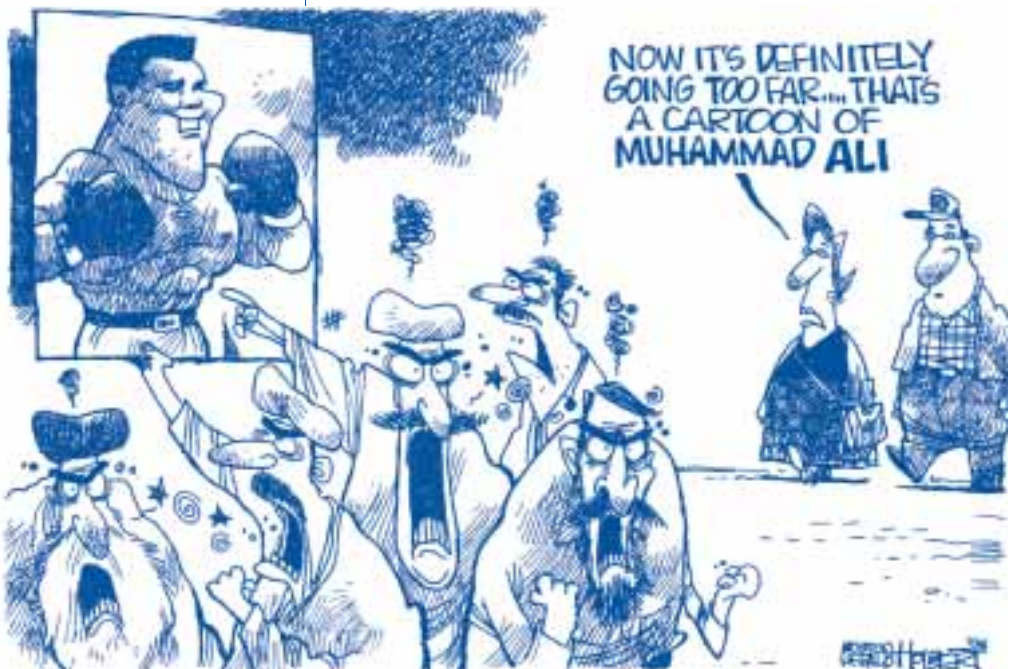

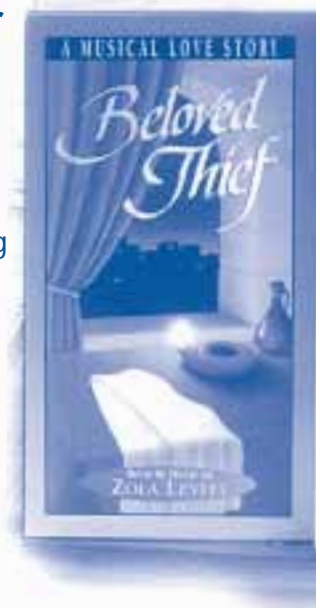
I never got the chance to thank you on the tour or express what a difference your caring to spread the good news of the Jewish Messiah to others has made in my life.

Reply from World Vision:

Dear Mr. and Mrs. B.:

Thank you so much for inquiring about sponsorship in Jerusalem/West Bank/Gaza. After researching your request, I have found that we do not have any Jewish children for sponsorship. All of the children in program are Palestinian.

World Vision has worked in the Holy Land since 1975, with children at the center of our programs. Today, World Vision cares for more than 9,000 sponsored children in 23 schools and programs in East Jerusalem, the West Bank and the Gaza Strip.

We search for justice and seek to understand the situation of the poor. In this specific context, the Palestinians are the ones we work with the most.

We also work in the Old City of Jerusalem where the density of the population and social problems are worse in the Muslim and Christian Quarters. We do work with both Jewish and Arab [sic], but only in small and specific capacities, and not sponsorship.

Dear friends,

To tell you the truth, lung cancer has not changed my attitude, or wish to minister, or zeal to work. I expect I'll be slowing down in the future and the Lord will let me off the job. It's honestly a testimony to this faith itself that it does not make the slightest difference whether you're in good shape or you're diagnosed with fourth-stage metastatic lung cancer.

So, one day I made a list of the good points, and there are some, of having a disease like this. Number one, of course, is that I will see the Lord soon. I will go to Heaven. I hope that I have run a good race. I think that'll be the Lord's judgment. There's no question that seeing the Lord sooner rather than later is a better thing. Paul said as much, and in the end, we Believers are all going to end up in the same place.

Of course, there's always a "rescue by Rapture" that I have to think has a real possibility, not in light of my sickness, but the sickness of the world. It's entirely believable that the invasion of Gog and Magog is right up ahead and that takes care of all my troubles and yours. The Rapture will occur before it.

Next, this is a time you experience real love starting with your wife and reaching out to the people you know and the people you don't know. I am absolutely bowled over by the magnificent letters and emails and commendations from church people everywhere. The disease tends to concentrate the mind on one's work and, to tell the truth, I wasn't totally aware that it was going this well. Imagine, I have been notified that whole churches have changed their doctrines to support Israel. Liberal pastors have been replaced. People have moved to better churches in droves. Our little program has made quite an impact because it has the truth about Israel and prophecy in the face of a cacophony of nonsense being put out in so many other sources.

And that's another point. The 35 years of being assigned to Israel and the truth about it gives me a deeply satisfied feeling. In the end, when all prophecy is accomplished, the one surviving city even in eternity will be Jerusalem. And I'm so honored to have been able to explain that through all these years.

Another point is that God obviously knows when each person should report to Heaven. King Hezekiah was granted an extension of fifteen years on his life, but King Josiah was taken at age 26 so that he would not have to view Jerusalem's upcoming penalties. God knows where I should report and when. Also, in a simple earthly way, there's comfort in knowing approximately how much

We have a great many friends, knowledgeable, and more so than me, to teach these Israel and prophecy doctrines. My wife has been on the program two times, and I'm very impressed with how well she does. My son Mark, who writes the State of the Ministry articles, will probably do those verbally as part of our programs. My younger son, Aaron, supplies any number of skills and may in the end also be a valuable ministry helper. That's a great blessing.

And when you think of it, no matter how drastic a disease you might come up with, it spares you from further diseases down the road. I have a dear friend whom I have loved for some ten years who has Parkinson's disease. He has deteriorated each day for all those years, and now is led around by his wife since he can't open his eyes. He came to a church engagement of mine and when placed in front of me reached out with his hand and shook my hand so hard he almost broke it. It may have been the finest testimony of them all. I'm afraid he has a long way to go. Well, I won't be suffering that, or Alzheimer's or heart attacks or whatever.

It occurred to me that I may have not thought of all the possibilities of good things happening. Some of our readers think of the most brilliant things, and all of you are welcome to bring up other advantages of my situation. Please feel free. You'll only cheer me up.

I was going to say we all know the downside of this, but when I get done reading this entire list, I don't know that there's a serious downside. It's easy to say I need more time, but that's up to the Lord. I just work here. And, of course, the amazing reward to come seems better as it gets sooner.

If I could continue to lead the tours I certainly would, but some of our very talented people will always be available to you. Our June tour, which we now call our "**Discovery Tour**," is scheduled for June 6-16, and will be led by my wife, Sandra. She has become quite the expert, in her own right, when it comes to Israel, and you will have a memorable tour.

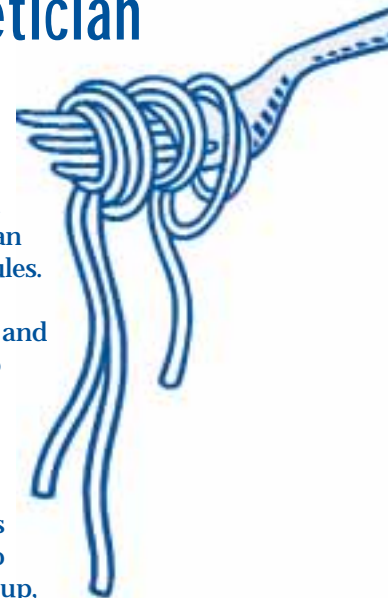
The Reverse Dietician

Military vs. Civilian Control

Several security experts in the new Kadima party have publicly stated that they feel the next disengagement from Judea and Samaria should only be civilian, and not military. This raises the questions of what are the differences between the two, and how will that impact the status of the territories evacuated?

During the disengagement that took place last year, Israel demonstrated examples of both kinds of withdrawal. In Gaza, Israel uprooted some 8,000 civilians from 21 communities and destroyed their homes, schools and greenhouses. When this had been accomplished, Israel then removed its army bases and soldiers, and abandoned the strategic Philadelphi Corridor and Rafah border crossing to the terrorists. Gaza was a complete civilian and military withdrawal.

In northern Samaria, Israel withdrew from four settlements, and also removed army equipment and bases. However, the IDF still conducts occasional patrols in the area, and effectively retains military control of the evacuated territories. The withdrawal from northern Samaria was therefore only civilian, not military.

Israel has made it clear that the major settlement blocs will be included within its final borders, and President Bush's letter of April 2004 states the need to recognize the changed realities on the ground. In the next disengagement, security experts have stated that they want to evacuate civilians from isolated settlements and strengthen the larger blocs by moving them there. If Israel chooses to undertake a solely civilian disengagement from Judea and Samaria, how will they maintain military control over the evacuated territories?

The security fence that Israel is constructing in Judea and Samaria serves as an effective barrier against Palestinian terrorists seeking to enter Israel and carry out deadly attacks. It is widely assumed that the fence will become the de facto border, and that most, if not all, settlements on the other side of the fence will be evacuated. In addition to the fence, the evacuated areas can be monitored through electronic means, such as cameras, unmanned aerial vehicles, and listening posts. Finally, IDF troops can conduct on-the-ground patrols in the areas to react to any potential threat, as well as respond with artillery fire and targeted killings of terrorists, such as in Gaza. But with Israel retaining military control, are they still occupying the territories?

Currently, the status of the territories is not "occupied," but rather disputed. The legal difference being that Israel

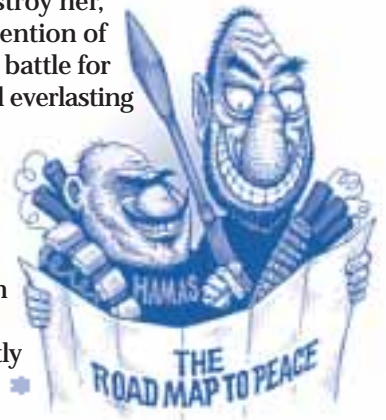
is not an aggressor required to withdraw from illegally occupied territories, but that Israel has legitimate claims to the territories and, as a party in a dispute, must negotiate their status with another party who also lays claim to them. Any territory that Israel evacuates will continue to be disputed until its status is resolved through final status negotiations.

The option of civilian evacuation recognizes the reality that Israel will likely not be able to hold on to every settlement once an agreement is finalized, while the decision to retain military control of the territories provides Israel with an extra layer of protection as they wait for those final status negotiations. With the terror group Hamas at the helm of the Palestinian Authority, it may be a very long time before a serious Palestinian partner for peace emerges.

Israel is operating within the confines of UN Security Council Resolution 242 by withdrawing from territories (not *the* territories) captured in the Six Day War and by continuing to seek peace agreements with the nations involved in the conflict. However, most Arab states have preconditioned any peace agreement on a full Israeli withdrawal to the 1967 lines. With the Arabs waiting for Israel to withdraw before peace talks can begin, and Israel waiting to negotiate the scope of their withdrawal with the Arab nations, the current waiting game continues. Jordan and Egypt have both seen the territorial and economic benefits that come from a negotiated peace with Israel, but they are the exceptions.

In the absence of a party to negotiate with, unilateral action is perhaps Israel's only course of action. It is completely in keeping with the UN Security Council resolutions, and allows Israel to dictate terms favorable to itself. If the Syrians, Palestinians, or others want to achieve peace and negotiate a recognized and legitimate end to the conflict, then the onus is on them to talk with Israel. Until that time, the territories remain disputed and the stalemate continues.

The Bible, however, tells of a different road map to peace. Israel will become such a burdensome stone and hated of all nations, until the time when the nations will gather against Israel and try to destroy her, and only through the intervention of the Messiah's return will the battle for Jerusalem be won and a final everlasting peace achieved. This means that while we have a rocky road ahead of us, peace will be achieved in the Land, only not by man's terms and not through negotiations. When you pray for the peace of Jerusalem, understand exactly what you are asking for. *

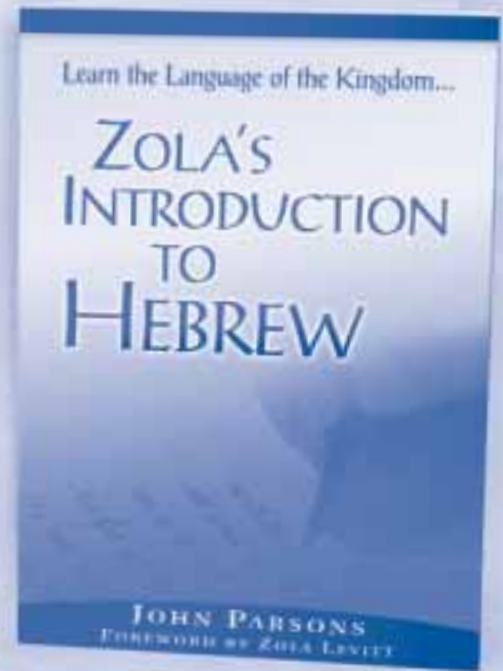

Henry Ford's Disease

The Protocols of the Elders of Zion pretended to be the minutes of an all-powerful Jewish conspiracy, discussing plans for world domination along with the Masons. It circulated for decades in relative obscurity before American automaker Henry Ford serialized, in 1920, an English version in his newspaper, *The Dearborn Independent*. Along with other vicious anti-Semitic charges, including the infamous "blood libel" that Jews kidnap and kill Christian children to acquire blood for special holiday pastries, Ford republished the materials in book form titled *The International Jew: The World's Foremost Problem*.

The motives behind the attacks on Jews by the industrial genius, who invented the production line and enabled unprecedented manufacturing efficiencies throughout the world, are darkly fascinating. Ford was an "anti-war" activist whose fervor only increased after having lost the argument over America's entrance into World War I. Ford's views, that the entire conflict had been orchestrated by Jewish masterminds for their own profit, reflected the growing sentiment among the losers of the first world war that their defeat was the fault of the minority among them.

Anti-Semitism was common in Germany and Austria, but it was completely institutionalized within the Islamic Ottoman Empire, the third part of the imperialist triumvirate. The defeat of the Ottoman Empire, home of the last Islamic Caliph, was due in part to uprisings against the legal institution of dhimmitude, the Koranic imposition of a humiliating and subservient status on non-Muslims. In fact, the Armenian genocide at the hands of the Ottoman Turks, resulting in the deaths of approximately a million Christians, was carried out mostly in the second year of

WWI as part of Turkish effort to keep the dhimmi under Islamic control.

The final crumbling of the Ottoman Empire, due to its defeat in the "Great War," did however present the opportunity for Jews, persecuted throughout the Islamic world as well as Europe, to return to their homeland in Palestine — territories owned mostly by the then defunct Ottoman Empire itself. The international community approved, and homelands were similarly created for other groups displaced by the Ottomans over the centuries.

In part because it fit with views put forth in the *Protocols*, conspiracy-prone anti-war activists decided that the entire horrific war had been fought for one reason — to produce the conditions necessary for the rebirth of a Jewish Palestine. Within a year of Ford's publication of the work, the *Times of London* had completely debunked the *Protocols*. Others did the same, and even Russian intelligence officers admitted their hand in its creation.

The lie, however, had been embraced and promulgated by Adolf Hitler and his Islamic, irredentist ally in Palestine, the Grand Mufti of Jerusalem. Upon his appointment as representative of the Arabs by the British in 1920, the Mufti almost immediately initiated a terrorist rampage that led to the deaths of five Jews, the injury of hundreds and four days of looting and burning in the Jewish section of Jerusalem.

Ford eventually issued an apology for publishing the seminal anti-Jewish slander, but his company's German automotive works produced vehicles for the Nazi war machine throughout the second world war and donated money directly to Hitler, who kept a picture of the company founder in his office.

Ultimately, of course, Hitler adopted Ford's industrial innovations, bringing new efficiencies to many of his projects, including his Final Solution.

Today, the ridiculously fraudulent work persists on best-seller lists throughout the Middle East. A 30-part Egyptian television series based on the book was produced in 2001 and shown in Muslim nations across the world. A radio version has been aired even on Arabic radio in the United States.

The legal charter of Hamas, the terrorist organization democratically elected to govern Arab Palestine, specifically endorses the *Protocols* as a justification for its official goal — the complete destruction of Israel as a first step toward a world-wide Islamic Caliphate. In the last few weeks, Hamas has gained the full-fledged support of critical Islamic organizations such as the Arab League and the Organization of the Islamic Conference.

The irony is startling. Hamas and its supporters openly proclaim that they want to put a theocratic cabal in charge of the entire world, but simultaneously claim they have the right to kill Jews and their allies because of a fictional novel that attributes the same motive to Jews.

Unfortunately, much of the modern anti-war movement has also been afflicted by Henry Ford's disease. While they know better than to specifically endorse the *Protocols*, their fundamental view of Jews as superhumanly clever manipulators of history is disturbingly similar. Having failed to keep the U.S. out of Iraq, they focus now on the apparent benefits to Israel of Saddam's ouster, and are claiming that the entire American foreign policy establishment has been duped by a tiny minority of cunning Jews.

Recently, a paper co-authored by the academic dean of Harvard's Kennedy School of Government, Stephen Walt, and John Mearsheimer of the University of Chicago has gained international attention.

Titled, *The Israel Lobby and U.S. Foreign Policy*, the Harvard paper makes the case that Israel has taken over American foreign policy in ways that no other country ever has. It ignores the U.S. commitment to go to war if China invades Taiwan as well as the historic "special relationship" with Great Britain that led America to enter the European front in the second world war.

More importantly, it ignores monetarily greater efforts on the part of Muslim countries to influence American opinion, including a \$20 million gift from Saudi prince Alwaleed to Harvard only months before the paper's publication. Alwaleed is the same man whose \$10 million check to New York City, after the 9/11 attacks, was rejected by Mayor Giuliani as it came with a statement implying that the U.S. had brought on the attacks through its support for Israel.

Though filled with easily refutable errors, the paper is being distributed by various American anti-war organizations as well as neo-Nazi David Duke and Islamic terrorist organizations ranging from the PLO to Egypt's Islamic Brotherhood. Does any more need be said? ❖

Intifada and Iraqifada

Things are sure working out in the Middle East, aren't they?

It didn't seem preposterous, cruel, barbaric and uncivilized when we were fighting for our lives against the Nazis and imperial Japan to do whatever it required to win. And it is no more preposterous, cruel, barbaric, and uncivilized to destroy evil people and evil regimes now.

I say this as an American of Arabic heritage and a journalist who has covered this part of the world for 25 years. It's time to stop pussyfooting around and destroy the enemy. Yes, in the short run, it will mean more lives lost. In the long run, it is our only chance for peace and freedom and the preservation of many more innocent lives.

There has been a lot of talk about spreading "democracy" in the Middle East and around the world.

"Democracy" is not the answer. "Democracy" should not be the goal. But free republics that respect the rule of just laws and the will of the people are the answer. Israel can be counted among those — perhaps the only one in the Middle East. That's why it should not be carved up and reduced in size as a means of achieving peace.

Israel needs to follow a course of protecting its own national security. It needs to adopt sane policies of protecting the lives of civilians. Jews and Christians have only one place in the Middle East where their lives and rights are respected. It is the nation of Israel. To ignore this fact is to place the lives and rights of Jews and Christians in greater jeopardy.

There's an old saying that the definition of insanity is doing the same thing over and over again and expecting different results. That is exactly what Israel has been doing in the Middle East for too long. It's time for Israel to wake up — before it's too late.

It's also time for some new thinking in Washington. No more concessions. No more appeasement. No more giveaways. No more invitations to further violence. No more incentives to terrorism. No more encouraging vile hatreds. No more self-flagellation. The same rules should apply in Israel and Iraq — and certainly in Iran as well.

It's time to seek out the bad guys and destroy them. There is no substitute. We cannot win the wars in the Middle East with peace talks and treaties and accords.

That's my peace plan. Anyone have a better idea? ✪



Universal Bird Flu Vaccine

An Israeli company hopes to have a “universal flu vaccine” on the market in the coming months that could cure “bird flu” and other flu epidemics that might develop.



The flu vaccine is based on two decades of research by Professor Ruth Arnon of the Weizmann Institute. An Israeli company, BiondVax, is set to begin human clinical trials of the new vaccine, which has already proven effective on animals.

According to one of BiondVax’s founders, Isaac Devash, the company planned to bring the flu vaccine to market in three to five years, but they are speeding up the project due to recent outbreaks of bird flu.

“Obviously, when this threat emerged, we knew we had to test our vaccine on it,” said Devash.

Iranian Promotes Israel on the Web

Iranian Muslim Hossein Derakhshan embarked on a trip to Israel to learn for himself just what Israelis are like. And now, he is sharing his experiences over the Internet so his fellow countrymen can discover what they were never taught in Iran.

“This visit was a very good introduction to Israel, a name I couldn’t even find on the maps when I was in Iran,” he writes on his web blog. “It now exists for me and I’ll be able to come back and visit it calmly.”

Derakhshan, 31, however, was told by Iranian officials he was never to return to his homeland. He was a student in Tehran and wrote regularly for a reform-minded newspaper until crackdowns against such publications and the bad economic situation forced him to immigrate to Canada in 2000. This student turned “civilian journalist” traveled to Israel on his Canadian passport.

In 2002, he created a Persian language blog, airing his criticism of the Iranian regime (www.hoder.com). He also encouraged other Iranians to set up their own sites. Within a month, hundreds sprang up. Now, he estimates

that there are about 700,000 Persian language blogs, a tool, Derakhshan says, for democratic change in Iran.

On his website (in both English and Persian), he writes that he wants “to show my 20,000 daily Iranian readers what Israel really looks like and how people live there. I’m also going to show Israelis that the vast majority of Iranians do not identify with [President Mahmoud] Ahmadinejad’s rhetoric, despite what it looks like from the outside.”

Derakhshan visited Israel for almost two weeks. He spoke at the Tel Aviv University, met several Iranian Jews and spent time talking with Israelis about their cultural differences and similarities.

Saudi Arabia Continues Israel Boycott

American ally Saudi Arabia continues to boycott Israel despite commitments to the United States [U.S.] and World Trade Organization [WTO], and has recently hosted an international conference to broaden the boycott of the Jewish state.

Saudi Arabia promised the Bush administration in November of 2005 that it would end its economic boycott of Israel. That commitment was made in order to enter the WTO, but the Saudi regime continues to bar the entry of any Israeli products or even products with parts made in Israel.

Two weeks after the November 11th signing of the WTO agreement, Saudi officials assured Arab nations, through the Arabic press, that the boycott would continue unhindered. It is unclear what steps the WTO or U.S. will be willing to take to enforce the Saudi commitment, in light of the financial power of the oil-rich country and the close ties between the Bush administration and the Saudi royal family.

Hebraic Insight: The Light of His Countenance

Ha'ira faneykha al-avdekha... “Make thy face shine upon thy servant”

In his appeal to the Lord for deliverance, King David recalled the words from *birkat kohanim* (the priestly blessing) found in Numbers 6:23-37, and asked God to cause His face to “shine” upon him — an idiom that meant to show favor or grace (as a face lit up with a smile). “My times are in your hand,” David pled (v15), but be gracious unto me and look upon me in love because I am your servant.

Hoshieini v'chasdekha... “Save me in your mercy”

King David understood that salvation — *yeshu'ah* — came from the *chesed* of the Lord, one of the thirteen *middot* (attributes) of God that the Jewish sages derived from the study of God's revelation to Moses (Exodus 34:6-7). Often translated as “mercy,” “lovingkindness,” “steadfast love,” or “compassion,” *chesed* implies love and grace based on God's faithfulness to His covenantal promises.

The greatest expression of God's *chesed* was the gift of His Son as the sacrifice for our sin (2 Cor. 5:21). It was

by the wounds and sacrificial death of Jesus that we have been healed from the power of death — that is, our eternal alienation from the “light of God's countenance.” Indeed, Jesus tasted death for every man (Hebrews 2:9), the just for the unjust, and overcame the power of death itself as demonstrated by His resurrection life.

Because Jesus is forever the Lord and Master over Hell and death (Rev 1:18), the one who trusts in Him “dies” only that he might rise again and live forever with God. As Jesus Himself said, “I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live, and everyone who lives and believes in me shall never die” (John 11:25-6). Indeed, even in the dark face of death we can boldly say, “Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! According to his great mercy, he has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, to an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in Heaven for you” (1 Peter 1:3-4). When we put our hope in the *chesed* of God as shown through our Lord Jesus, we can be assured that God's face indeed shines upon us. Amen.

This is not necessarily confined to Muslim takeovers. The magnificent societies of Greece and Rome fell to the most incompetent barbarians by simply not opposing them when they came. Both of those societies remain terribly reduced. It wasn't really about religion, but it didn't have to be. The backward societies want what the developed societies have, and the rich get so terribly full of themselves that they finally give it all away.

In this country, we virtually work on the side of the barbarians. We are actually fighting each other harder than the Muslims are fighting us. I once asked Moishe Rosen, founder of Jews For Jesus, about anti-Semitism. He said, "We don't need them. We have each other." I hold most of the American media terribly responsible for this. It is utterly asinine the way they continue to attack the president, defame the war and denigrate their own nation. Now they have become sneaky killers who do their darnedest to kill the Jews. And that's all there is to that. The Peasant Rebellion

In the Middle Ages, peasants who worked the land and turned most of their produce over to their landlords would from time to time become exceedingly frustrated and sometimes even march on their town bearing pitchforks and screaming and threatening all sorts of things, while the absentee landlord continued to enjoy the proceeds from their work.

These peasant rebellions usually came to nothing because the peasants were not armed enough or smart enough or dedicated enough to really carry through with a force that had some effect. Later on, with revolutions and huge numbers of people, sometimes they would prevail.

In like manner, I think, the Muslims of the world are frankly not very dangerous. I know it's almost a sacrilege to say that since we're in a war on terror, but looking straight at terror dispassionately — its casualties, its total effects on nations — its almost like a popgun battle.

Consider the cartoons from Denmark. The Arabs have certainly not attacked Denmark, in which case they would have a real fight on their hands. But, instead, they march up and down their own streets, as long as there is a cameraman available, and they burn flags and indeed they attack empty buildings, and they cause a great stir. But again, it's like the peasant rebellions. They simply don't have the means, and they bring little danger to the Western world.

The World Trade Center is another matter since there were so many casualties. But this was not a frontal assault either. It was basically trickery which happened to work out very well for them. But competent airport security would have changed history. The trick simply would not have worked. Everyone was convinced that they would return, destroy more towers and attack America, but nothing like that has happened. And, frankly, even taking all the casualty figures, including the World Trade Center, Spain, Britain, Bali, all of the bombings in Iraq and so on, we really don't have anything that adds up to a war of some sort. The real truth is that the United States lost over 400,000

soldiers in World War II and over 58,000 in Vietnam. These figures dwarf world Islamic terrorism by a huge margin. And so, the present situation, at least in its present form, should be looked at with a more level gaze.

Hamas, which recently won the Palestinian election, is a good example of the kind of paper tiger that is represented by the Muslims. No one can march up and down the street with more formidable weapons in hand, tighter ski masks or longer strides. More can yell and scream, more can march and threaten, but when I calculate the actual numbers of casualties by Hamas, they're almost meaningless. Yes, they shoot passing motorists from behind a tree. Yes, they get a young kid to blow up something. But this is not war. This amounts to, what they call in Los Angeles, gangs. Gangs can be dangerous, but they very seldom go out of their own neighborhoods. They march up and down their own streets, they burn their own neighborhoods, and they stay a healthy distance from the police or anyone else who would stop them. So, we have kind of a worldwide gang. And it's mostly caused not by religion, I think — there's not much real religion going on, in my experience — it's caused by jobless young men who haven't got a dime in their pocket, no girlfriend, and no future. It's caused by people who are frustrated, lonely, pathetic, and want to be looked at and celebrated for at least something.

Likewise in Iraq, the same gangs prevail, blowing up their neighbors willy-nilly, but staying a healthy distance from the U.S. Army and to some degree, the Iraqi army. I kind of have the feeling that all this will not grow at all, but

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eventually peter out simply because we are better armed, we are protected, and we are beating them in a land war in Iraq. There's nowhere else that they have caused enough trouble to get our attention. Afghanistan is more or less settled. And the others of them are simply trying to enjoy their usual perks of office, stealing the fruits of other people's labor, like the landlords of medieval times, their daughters, their sons, and living off the fat of the land. The United States finds itself in the embarrassing position of trying to call people like those "friends".

The editorialist Mortimer Zuckerman pointed out weeks ago that all this marching and bombing has no real purpose: "After all, the insurgency is not destined to succeed. They are not fighting for a clear ideology; they lack any great power backing; they lack a positive agenda; they lack a charismatic leader; they have no territory of their own; they lack the support of the Shiites and the Kurds, as well as a significant portion of the Sunni population. When America has prevailed in foreign ventures, it has been in the places where it stayed — in places like Bosnia, Kosovo, East Timor, Afghanistan, never mind Germany, Japan, and South Korea; in the places where America left too soon — Haiti, Somalia, and Vietnam — the results speak for themselves."

Editorialist Thomas Sowell believes that our media are so committed against the war, President Bush, cherry trees, blue skies, anything else good in America, that they would wish somehow we would lose this war. But once again, he specifies that there really isn't much of a war compared with our past experiences: "On the

contrary, the American deaths in Iraq are a fraction of what they have been in other wars in our history. The media have made a big production about the cumulative fatalities in Iraq, hyping the thousandth death with multiple full-page features in *The New York Times* and comparable coverage on TV.

The two-thousandth death was similarly anticipated almost impatiently in the media and then made another big splash. But does media hype make 2,000 wartime fatalities in more than two years unusual?

The marines lost more than 5,000 men taking one island in the Pacific during a three-month period in World War II. In the Civil War, the Confederates lost 5,000 men in one battle in one day."

Obviously, the media do not have a case against this war and are simply sowing confusion and dread over very little. We are winning. It's not an overnight job (January's *Levitt Letter* specified a 50-year-stay), but we have demoralized our enemy and reduced him to basically a peasant rebellion.

As to some forecasts of civil war in Iraq, suppose that happened. We had a four-year civil war in our own country. And, in any case, it's simply a larger picture of Muslims fighting Muslims. In the end, we will win and they will at least quiet down. But in no case that I can see now are we in any real danger of any real war.

Franklin Graham Reaffirms Scorn for Islam

The Rev. Franklin Graham, who outraged Muslims in 2001 when he said that Islam “is a very evil and wicked religion,” told an interviewer for ABC News *Nightline* that he hasn’t changed his mind about the faith.

Asked by ABC correspondent John Donvan whether Muslim groups had succeeded in altering his outlook about Islam, Graham said “No.”

“Do they want to indoctrinate me? Yes. I know about Islam. I don’t need an education from Islam,” he said. “If people think Islam is such a wonderful religion, just go to Saudi Arabia and make it your home. Just live there. If you think Islam is such a wonderful religion, I mean, go and live under the Taliban somewhere. I mean, you’re free to do that.”

Franklin Graham is the successor to his father as head of the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association, based in Charlotte, N.C. He was interviewed in New Orleans, where Franklin and Billy were leading an evangelistic festival.

The younger Graham angered Muslims following the Sept. 11, 2001, attacks when he told NBC News: “We’re not attacking Islam. but Islam has attacked us. The god of Islam is not the same God. He’s not the son of God of the Christian or Judeo-Christian faith. It’s a different god, and I believe it is a very evil and wicked religion.”

In a subsequent *Wall Street Journal* piece, Graham wrote that he doesn’t think Muslim believers “are evil people because of their faith. But I decry the evil that has been done in the name of Islam, or any other faith — including Christianity.”

That article said, “the persecution or elimination of non-Muslims has been a cornerstone of Islamic conquests and rule for centuries.” Graham said the Koran “provides ample evidence that Islam encourages violence in order to win converts and to reach the ultimate goal of an Islamic world.”

Some of Graham’s fellow evangelicals subsequently expressed concern that his comments might endanger Christian missionaries working in Muslim countries, strain interfaith relations and make America’s war

on terrorism seem to be a Christian crusade against Islam.

Billy Graham has avoided such comments about Islam, and President Bush has consistently depicted mainstream Islam as a religion of peace.

Another U.S. evangelist, the Rev. Pat Robertson, said of militant Muslims on a recent telecast: “These people are crazed fanatics, and I want to say it now: I believe it’s motivated by demonic power. It is satanic and it’s time we recognize what we’re dealing with.

The goal of Islam, ladies and gentlemen, whether you like it or not, is world domination,” he said. ★

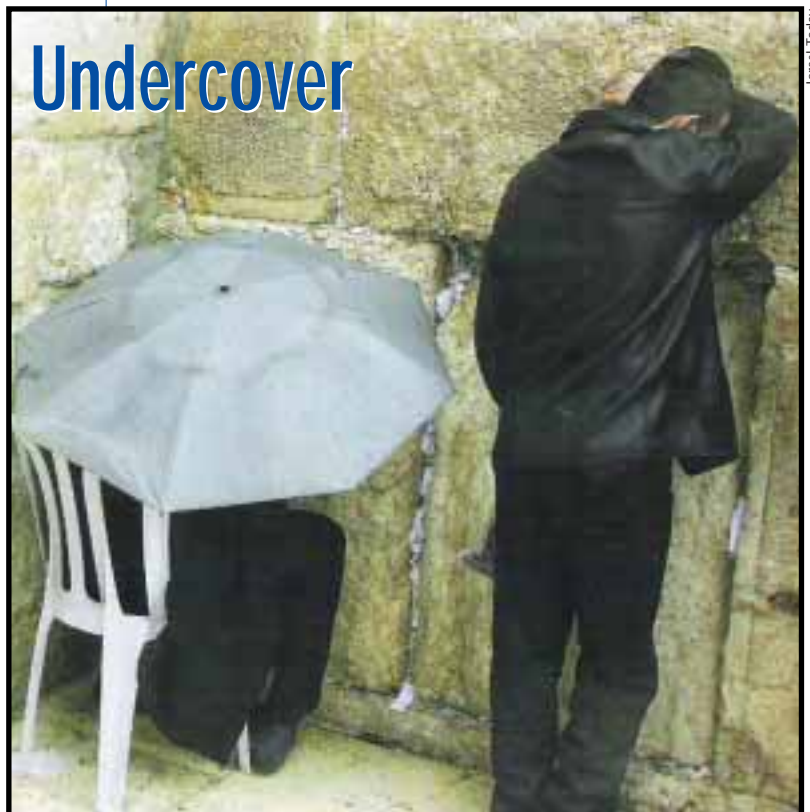
In Australia, amidst anger over an Islamic man's rape conviction and the bashing of two Aussie life savers, working-class locals erupted

U.S. Airport Screeners Fail

Federal agents tested security screeners at 21 U.S. airports by carrying bomb-making materials — and not a single would-be “suicide bomber” was detected.

“In all 21 airports tested, no machine, no swab, no screener anywhere stopped the bomb materials from getting through,” according to a report from NBC Nightly News that cited government sources.

“Even when investigators deliberately triggered extra screening of bags, no one stopped these materials.”

For security reasons, NBC said it would not name the airports nor the ingredients involved in the tests, which were conducted by the Government Accountability Office, the watchdog arm of Congress.

Congress had requested the investigation to gauge the vulnerability of U.S. airlines to suicide bombers using easy-to-obtain materials, NBC said. The Transportation Security Administration had no comment on the report, but acknowledged in a statement that detecting explosive materials at checkpoints was the agency's top priority. ✦
