God has not turned His back on the Jewish people, according to **Bruce Mills** (above) of the Jerusalem Baptist Church.

Explaining that the Great Commission (Matthew 28:19–20) “came from a Jew to Jews,” Mills says that God still loves the Jewish people and that “all Israel will be saved” (Romans 11:26) when “the full number of the gentiles has come in” (Romans 11:25).

He also cites Jeremiah 29:11—“For I know the plans I have for you,” declares the Lord, “plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future.”

Bin Laden's One Mistake

One thing made Osama bin Laden public enemy #1. One thing—and only one thing—made his assassination justified and praised by world leaders. He didn't kill just Jews.

Had he limited his terrorism to Jews, he would not have been targeted. The same world leaders who today take pride in his death would have dined with him. He would have been invited to the United Nations. He would have had a worldwide speaking tour. He would have won the Nobel Peace Prize.

Think I'm crazy? Mahmoud Ahmadinejad is the president

Mills points to a crucial moment in Israel's history to illustrate that God still has a plan for the Jewish people. When Jesus was on trial before Pilate, the Roman governor said to the people, "I am innocent of this man's blood.... It is your responsibility!" (Matthew 27:24). The people then answered, "Let his blood be on us and on our children!" (Matthew 27:25).

This statement of apparent condemnation, Mills says, "can also be taken as a proclamation of salvation. After all, it is by the blood of Jesus that all of us—Jew and gentile—are saved." The blood of Christ is "the balm of Gilead" that can heal the sin-sick world, both Jew and gentile.

Affirming that the Jewish people are still very much alive in the plan of God, Mills urges the Church to make them a priority in evangelism.

"Salvation is from the Jews [John 4:22]," he says. "It's not from the English, not from the Germans, and not from the French. Salvation is from the Jews. It is a fact of history. And Jesus is the Messiah of Israel, the King of the Jews, and Savior of the world."

The message, Mills says, is clear: The Church should be evangelizing the Jewish people because they are the conduit through which Christ came into the world. "Jesus is the only hope for both Jews and gentiles."

Christians are called to share the Gospel with Jewish people. The Bible mentions two kinds of mission fields—not local and foreign, but Jew and gentile. We labor because of the promise that all Israel will be saved. Efforts to bring salvation to the Jewish people are proving fruitful as more Jews know Christ today than at any time since the first century.



Aussies Say No To Sharia Law

In its submission to the parliamentary inquiry into the government's new multiculturalism policy, The Australian Federation of Islamic Councils has called for Muslims to be granted "legal pluralism."

Attorney-General Robert McClelland stomped on the request. "There is no place for sharia law in Australian society and the government strongly rejects any proposal for its introduction," McClelland said.

Sharia (Islamic law) has faced repeated criticism. It is again in the headlines following an Iranian court's decision to delay a planned "eye-for-an-eye" act of justice against a man who threw acid at a woman's face because she refused his marriage proposal.

"As our citizenship pledge makes clear, coming to Australia means obeying Australian laws and upholding Australian values," McClelland said. "Australia's brand of multiculturalism promotes integration. If there is any inconsistency between cultural values and the rule of law, then Australian law wins out." McClelland is keen to assert Australia's position as a "stable democracy" where "rule of law" underpins society.

"People who migrate to Australia do so because of the fact that we have a free, open, and tolerant society where men and woman are equal before the law irrespective of race, religious or cultural background." ★

of Iran. He has stated—time and again—that he wants to destroy Israel, and he is feverishly working to build a bomb that will do just that.

Has he been targeted? Actually, the opposite is true. He recently spoke in the UN. He was a guest speaker at Columbia University. Why? Because he is interested in killing only Jews.

Khaled Meshaal is the leader of Hamas. Hamas is a sworn enemy of Israel. It has fired over 6,000 rockets into Israel, aiming for Jewish homes and hoping to kill Jewish children.

Is Meshaal on anyone's "hit list"? Actually, just the opposite is true. Russian President Vladimir Putin recently invited Meshaal to Moscow. Former U.S. president Jimmy Carter considers Meshaal a "partner for peace." Why? Because he is interested in killing only Jews.

Yasser Arafat led the PLO for almost four decades. He had more innocent blood on his hands than bin Laden. Yet this murderer was a guest at the White House. He spoke in the UN. He was accepted around the world as a leader and spoke in over 30 countries. He won the Nobel Peace Prize. Why? Because he was interested in killing only Jews. His successor, Abbas, is a Jew murderer as well.

I will give one final example: Adolf Hitler.

The world knew about his plans for the Jews as early as 1933. The world knew about *Kristallnacht* in November of 1938, and the concentration camps shortly thereafter. Yet the entire world recognized him as a leader. All that changed when Hitler invaded Poland in 1939. From that point on, he became an enemy. Why? Because until that day he was interested in killing only Jews.

Osama bin Laden violated the rule: In addition to killing Jews, he also killed non-Jews.

The message to Jews—and the State of Israel—is clear: Learn to defend yourself, to take revenge yourself. The world will not help you with Iran, Hamas, or the PLO/PA. Ahmadinejad, Abbas, and Meshaal will not make the same mistake as bin Laden. They will continue to be accepted and embraced by the world. Understand this, accept this, and deal with this.

We have no one on whom to rely, other than our Father in Heaven. May today's Jewish leaders—and the brave warriors of the IDF—engrave this on their hearts. And may they—very soon—do to these terrorists exactly what was done to bin Laden.

This takes on even more significance in light of Obama's May 19 speech. God Himself will defend Israel (Isaiah 8:10, Jer. 30:16, Gen. 12:3). Woe unto those who stand against Israel. —Myles ★

In time, I met numerous Jewish Believers in the Dallas area. Among them: Dr. Jeffrey Seif who served for a season on Zola's staff in the '80s, many years before his appearance on *Zola Levitt Presents*.

Zola's passing in 2006 was difficult. We had spent nearly 28 years together—sowing, watering, and reaping. Yes, I had moments of doubt. Could Zola Levitt Ministries continue? Could my own company, Berg Productions, survive?


Thankfully, the Lord's strength proved far greater. Jeff Seif stepped in with a gifting only God could have ordained.

The past five years with Jeff have been extraordinary in many ways. During this time, we produced award-winning programming that, in terms of production value, far surpassed anything the ministry had ever done. The Finger Of God... Or The Hand Of Man?

The day after President Obama voiced support for Israel, yet called for a return to pre-1967 Six-Day-War borders, Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu firmly called the borders “indefensible” (see video links below) and made it clear that Israel would not follow America’s advice.

As readers of the *Levitt Letter*, you know that no one can understand the outcome in the Middle East without the interpretation that comes from Scripture. Only the Bible yields an accurate view of that which is to come.

I remember a conference in Argentina several years ago where the Argentines repented of their Nazi past. As you may know, dictators Juan and Eva Peron exchanged blank passports for stolen Jewish gold. That is how some of the Nazi high command escaped into South America. Our conference met in Mar del Plata, the same city where the submarines with gold were said to dock. After I taught about these shameful alliances, marketplace leaders knelt before the small Jewish contingent and asked forgiveness for their countrymen’s dark complicity with the Nazis, a complicity that opened the door for Hezbollah by entrenching anti-Semitism in Argentina.

Before the public meeting where this repentance took place, there was a private prayer meeting. During that intercessory meeting, a leader stood up to say, “If America abandons Israel, there may be no Israel.” I stopped the prayer meeting.

“With all due respect to my brother,” I said, “If America abandons Israel, there may be no America.” We sat in silence as the Holy Spirit brooded over this confession.

God has restored the Jewish people, land, and language, and is in the process of restoring us Jews to our God (Ezekiel 36:24–28, Amos 9:15).

Zola often pointed to the four principles that support Israel’s right to the land: 1) prior possession—Jewish presence goes back to antiquity; 2) the Abrahamic Covenant, God’s Genesis promise to the Father of Faith; 3) the Balfour Declaration, the early 20th century resolution that the world agreed to; and 4) military might—ignoring it creates the absurd requirement that only Israel, among the nations, needs to return land won in battle.

God is fulfilling His own prophetic Scriptures in our day! It is time to pray afresh for America (Gen. 12:1–3), that the Almighty will grant us time to turn back to Him and be counted as a nation that blesses His people, Israel.

On a positive note, after PM Netanyahu’s chilly visit to the White House (<http://wp.me/pieUD-US>), “Bibi” entreated a joint session of Congress on Israel’s behalf. He received 29 standing ovations (<http://wp.me/pieUD-Va>). Although the Bible was not cited, its principles were employed. To God be the Glory! ★

Days of Independence: America & Israel

Growing up as Americans in the patriotic 1950s, we remember July 4th as a big deal. We were inspired by the heroism and wisdom of our founding fathers: Washington, Adams, Franklin, Jefferson, etc. In 1976 we celebrated 200 years of the special brand of U.S. freedom, which though imperfect, may be the most egalitarian society ever seen in world history.

With that blessed background, we have become an integral part of another nation that also commemorates its independence annually and energetically—Israel. Though Israel's origins go back to Abraham's conversations with God some 4,000 years ago, it was only 63 years ago, on May 14, 1948, that Israel was re-established as a modern state.

So, paradoxically, we are an ancient yet very young nation. In a population of less than 8 million, every family has either paid for national independence and survival with the loss of a loved one, or knows a family who has. Appropriately, Israel's "Memorial Day" always comes the day before our "Fourth of July." We'd like you to see our Haifa Bay town in the rich emotion of this juxtaposition.

Day turns to evening and the streets are blocked off, creating a large public area. A stage and screen are erected, with rows of chairs for the town dignitaries and the families who have lost loved ones in battles or acts of terror. Residents of all ages wend their way toward this center and gather by the thousands.

We arrive and, by chance, see our son-in-law and three of our grandchildren in the crowd. We stand together. At 8pm sharp, sirens sound simultaneously throughout the country. All



stand still, arms at their sides in sober reflection. Then, all of the soldiers from our town who were killed in action, from the beginning of statehood until now, are named with their rank and their parents' names, and their pictures are shown on the large screen. "*David Cohen, sergeant, son of Shlomo and Berta of blessed memory.*"

Young Israelis stand in formation, holding aloft flags of blue and white, their colors reflecting those of the prayer shawl. The program consists of songs, poems, and prayers eulogizing the fallen and lamenting their loss in the prime of life. These bittersweet stanzas enable us to express communally the loss we feel.



We recognize the local woman who sells yarn and the neighbor who built our porch. Our Ethiopian neighbors are there too, members of our congregation, out with their young daughters. It's a small town in a small country that, especially on occasions like this, comes together with touching unity of heart. After all, our Founder is not really David Ben Gurion, though he played a key role. Our Founder is our Father, the Living God of Israel.

The ceremony ends with the singing of our national anthem, *HaTikvah* (The Hope). "...then our hope, the hope of 2,000 years, will not be lost: To be a free people in our land, the land of Zion and Jerusalem." ★

Israel Is God's Timetable Part 1



Obviously, Arafat and the Palestinians could have had peace any time since the Madrid Conference in 1991 or the Oslo Accords in 1993. But they were busy gathering up as much land as possible under the “land for peace” principle, and they refused to close the deal. The terms offered by Prime Minister Barak in the Camp David meetings (2000) amounted to a very serious offer to conclude the endless negotiations. Arafat should have taken the deal; he would have gained practically all he ever dreamed of, including part of Jerusalem, practically all of the West Bank, and a new Palestinian state.

Instead, the Palestinians opted for some ghetto rioting they called the “War for Independence” or the “Battle for Jerusalem,” which was over in a few weeks with some 300 casualties, mostly on their side. They demonstrated that they were no better than the Somalis who murdered prisoners and dragged bodies through the streets. They attacked the mightiest power in the Middle East with rocks and assumed the world would jump in and help them. A Palestinian father suspiciously placed his 12-year-old child [Mohammed al-Dura] between himself and the gunfire, and after the boy was riddled with bullets (which were ultimately established as Palestinian bullets), asked the world for vengeance against Israel over the death of his son. The father survived.

CNN desperately tried to portray a war—they're in the war business, so to speak. During the Iraq war, they dramatically increased the prices of their commercials. They became wealthy covering the Bosnian war, but now, try as they would, couldn't make a major war out of what amounted to the same casualty rate any American city endures on a continuing basis. WFAA-TV, the ABC affiliate in Dallas,

called me during that week and urged me to testify that Israel was in grave danger and that the whole place was going up in smoke. I wouldn't say that; I said that what was going on in Israel amounted to the sort of rioting we had in Los Angeles and Detroit in past times. They, of course, did not quote me on the news.



The media bias against Israel is ubiquitous throughout the world. There seems to be a bias *toward* the Arabs, probably because commercials are purchased on a large scale by petroleum-using manufacturers. Ads for plastics, cosmetics, and similar products represent profitable business for the media, and they respond like any business, catering to their best customers. We've said all this before, but it certainly isn't getting any better. This time, CNN looked almost ridiculous, desperately trying to broadcast a war when there was truly little happening in the way of real hostility. The only true action worth reporting was the Israeli response to the murdering of prisoners in Ramallah. They demonstrated their skills to the Palestinians with razor-sharp surgical strikes on the police station where the prisoners were killed, a radio station, and, in effect, Arafat's front yard. Even the Palestinians could appreciate that they had a formidable enemy—patient but deadly. ★



Israelis Work On Every Problem The World Calls Insoluble

“For every problem in the world recognized as insoluble, there is one Israeli or more energetically working on it,” says Dr. Garry Neil, corporate vice president at the Corporate Office of Science and Technology (COSAT) at Johnson & Johnson (J&J). COSAT is responsible for J&J’s early stage cooperation with academic institutions and young companies. “The book *Start-Up Nation* sums it up well. Israelis aren’t afraid of technology and want to solve problems. Apart from that, because everybody knows everybody, they gladly exchange information. It’s wonderful.”

Johnson & Johnson is one of the most acquisitive American companies in Israel, the kind that Israeli start-ups love to be bought by, particularly because of its tendency to allow them a considerable degree of autonomy. Since the early 1990s, J&J has bought companies in Israel to the tune of more than \$1 billion: Biosense for half a billion dollars; ColBar for \$159 million; and Omrix for \$425 million. Biosense and Omrix remain to this day Israeli R&D centers.

J&J has many collaborations at the academic stage, and has good relations with the universities in Israel.

Sometimes, the collaboration proceeds directly from the academic institution to the industry via a PreVenture, a venture that COSAT builds with an academic researcher, in which J&J finances the researcher’s independent R&D, with the aim of setting up a joint company later on.

Areas of recent interest to J&J are biological markers and personalized drugs. “This will gather momentum very soon, together with improvement in computing capabilities and cheaper genome sequencing,” Neil says. “The change will start with cancer. In my opinion, the Pharma industry will improve treatment of the disease substantially in the next five years. The Pharma companies have 800 cancer drugs in clinical trials.” ★

The long and populated arc of the Arab-Muslim world from North Africa to Pakistan is in transition from a deeply troubled and divided pre-modern civilization to some sort of rendezvous with the modern world.


Her question allowed Kenny and me to explain and show her in the Hebrew Scriptures that Jesus fulfilled in the New Testament many of the Messianic prophecies of the Old Testament, which exclusively identifies Him as the Messiah of Israel! Alona informed us that she was struggling to raise her children without any support after her husband left her and her drug problem eight years ago. She asked how I came to believe in Yeshua—giving me the

Israel Opens Historic Gospel Trail

Israel hopes to attract Christian tourists with a new pilgrimage route unveiled this spring in the Galilee—a network of footpaths, roads, and bicycle paths linking sites central to the lives of Jesus and His Disciples.

Developing sites linked to Jewish history has long been a priority for Israel. But the Gospel Trail, inaugurated by tourism officials, is a nod to the growing number of Christians traveling to the country in recent years, outnumbering Jewish visitors.

More than two-thirds of the 3.45 million tourists in Israel last year were Christian, double the amount of the previous year, and about 40 percent of them defined themselves as religious pilgrims, according to the Tourism Ministry.

The 40-mile trail in northern Israel passes sites including Tabgha—the area in Galilee that is the traditional site of Jesus' miracle of the loaves and fishes and the Mount of Beatitudes where He delivered His Sermon on the

Mount. The trail ends at Capernaum on the shores of the Sea of Galilee, where Jesus taught.

The new trail includes New Testament quotes carved into stones along the path, and shaded rest areas and picnic sites.

Another hiking route in the Galilee, the Jesus Trail, was spearheaded independently by an Israeli hotelier several years ago and already attracts backpackers and other Christian tourists.

7 Survival Principles

Articles like the one excerpted below, by Scott Burns (AssetBuilder.com), inspire me to think in terms of being productive and thrifty. His secular principles over the years, more often than not, seem biblically rooted. Eccl. 2:24-26 —Mark

Borrow less or nothing. Reduce the amount of income committed to loan and credit payments. Eliminate credit card debt and pay off car loans, student loans, etc. The income going to them can then be used to build a cash reserve and pay down a mortgage. Our goal should be consumption without credit.

Deferring the purchase of a house or condo can make sense. Most of what we buy depreciates, including houses lately.

Spend less than you earn. This is easier for some households than others. As a certified senior, it's almost inevitable for me. It was not so easy when I was a 30-year-old dad. We gain strength from being able to get through the week, month, or year without leaning on a lending institution. We gain even more strength by having ready savings.

Search for maximum flexibility. Find strength in flexibility and adaptation, not in institutional guarantees. In the new edition of *The Black Swan: The Impact of the Highly Improbable*, investor Nassim Taleb nails it with this simple principle: **Compensate complexity with simplicity.** Our society may be very complex, but we can compensate with simplicity and adaptation at home.

Retain more of your investment return. Our financial institutions have proven a nasty truth: For them, we consumers are just red meat. Worse, our government has given them con-

tinued and protected hunting rights. So it's them or us.


Take back as much as possible of the return on your savings and investments. Use index mutual funds for your retirement savings. Move checking and savings accounts to a credit union.

Learn to share. Focus on local and family. It's very difficult to make the entire world a better place. So pick small projects that have a well-defined beginning, middle, and end. You'll discover the gigantic non-money economy of community. The more connected you are, the safer you and yours will be.

Expand your skill portfolio. The world of work encourages us to specialize. This reduces our flexibility and increases our dependence on others. But the more we have in our skill portfolio, gained through education or hands-on learning, the more things we can do to be helpful or earn a few dollars.

Get energy-efficient and energy-local. Help reduce consumption of imported energy by increasing your gas mileage or driving less. Oil, not imports from China, is the biggest single drain on our economy.

And remember the best definition of wealth I've ever heard: *You have enough money when more won't change where you live, what you eat, what you wear, what you drive, or who you come home to.* ★



High Schoolers' Civics Knowledge Waning

Three out of four U.S. students lack a basic understanding of democracy, of how the U.S. political system works, and what it means to be a citizen of this country, according to national test scores released in May.

That equals a failing grade in civics.

Fewer than half the country's eighth-graders were able to identify the purpose of the Bill of Rights on the 2010 National Assessment of Educational Progress. Most high school seniors couldn't identify a power granted to Congress by the Constitution or define the term "melting pot." Relatively few fourth-graders understood the concept of majority rule, as expected for their grade level.

The findings came from the national test, given every four years to thousands of the nation's fourth-, eighth-, and twelfth-graders.

Scores for high school seniors dropped to a 24 percent proficiency rate from 27 percent four years earlier. Eighth-graders held steady at 22 percent.

Fourth-graders posted their highest civics scores since 1998, 27 percent proficient in the subject, up three percentage points from the 2006 tests.

Former Supreme Court Justice Sandra Day O'Connor said the results from the Nation's Report Card show the predictable result of decades of neglect to civics education.

"These students will inherit our democracy, and we must empower them to preserve it and continue to perfect our union," said O'Connor, a supporter of civics education. "Knowledge of our system of government is not handed down through the gene pool."

Indeed, fewer than half of U.S. adults can name the three branches of government—executive, legislative, and judicial—according to national surveys.

There is a "civics recession," Charles Quigley, executive director of the Center for Civic Education, said in a statement. "We are all familiar with the anecdote about the woman who asked Benjamin Franklin as he left the Constitutional Convention what kind of government he and the other framers had created," Quigley said. "He replied, 'A republic, if you can keep it.'" ★

Israel: An Export Superpower

As Israel celebrates 63 years of being an independent state, it turns out that it is an export superpower.

According to figures published by the Israel Export Institute and presented by the *Globes* financial newspaper, since its establishment in 1948 Israel has multiplied the volume of goods it exports to the world by an astonishing 13,400.

The figures also show that Israel has gone from exporting a “modest” amount (about \$6 million) in 1948 to exporting no less than \$80.5 billion in 2010.

According to the report, the well-known Jaffa oranges, which were the pride and joy of Israel’s export industry for many years, have taken a few steps back. Israel’s high tech and R&D (research and development) sectors were at the top of the export list last year, totaling approximately \$28.5 billion and constituting about 35% of Israel’s exports in 2010. However, the oranges are not out quite yet, as figures show that agricultural exports also grew in the last year, totaling \$1.3 billion.

Israel has long been a leader in diamond

exports, according to the report. Since the founding of the state, Israel’s diamond exports have multiplied by 3,190. While in the early years of statehood the scope of diamond exports from Israel to the world stood at about \$2.8 million, in 2010 exports amounted to approximately \$8.9 billion.

The Export Institute said that an analysis of data since the founding of the state indicates that North America and Europe have always been the major export destinations of Israeli goods. Exports to Europe have declined over the years, said the report. While in the 1950s and 1960s about 70 percent of Israeli exports went to Europe, today the figure is at about 32 percent. The report notes, however, that the decline in the European market has been compensated by a rise in exports to Asia.

While Asia made up only one percent of total Israeli exports in the 1950s, today it makes up no less than 24 percent of Israeli exports. The U.S. market continues to be the central and largest market, with 33.5 percent of products exported from Israel going there.

As regards the future, the Israel Export Institute estimated that exports will continue to rise in 2011 by about another 7 percent. If these forecasts are realized, the total amount of Israeli exports by the end of the year will be a whopping \$86 billion. ★

Help, Lord!

Often the only prayer we have is “Help, LORD!” I use this one on a *daily* basis, that is, whenever I am confronted with the truth of my own condition.

The word translated “hasten” comes from the Hebrew word “chush,” which means to hurry, to act quickly, or to come quickly. The Psalms often plead urgently, “hasten to help me” (*chushah l’ezrati*).

An old Jewish prayer says, “O LORD, I know that You will help us; but will You help us *before* You will help us?” Although God sometimes tarries, He declares, “I am the LORD; *in its time* I will *hasten* it” (Isa. 60:22).

Is it time, LORD? Will You *now* restore the kingdom to Israel? But as Yeshua said, “It is not for you to know times or seasons that the Father has fixed by His own authority” (Acts 1:7). In a sense, we are all “living in the desert” as we await the final redemption. What are you learning as you walk with God through the wilderness of this world?

We live in an “already-not-yet” state of hopeful expectation. In Modern Hebrew the word *teshuvah*, often translated “repentance,” means “an answer.” It is the mind’s turning to a *sheilah*, a question, attending to it with honesty in the pursuit of truth.

Often trials in our lives function as God’s questions to us, and we are asked to answer them with the *teshuvah* of settled faith. Suffering produces endurance (Rom. 5:3), and God promises “to keep you from falling, and to present you faultless before the presence of His glory with exceeding joy” (Jude 1:24). The LORD “gives power to the faint, and to him who has no might he increases strength” (Isa. 40:29).

The last words recorded of Yeshua are: “Surely I come *quickly*” (Rev. 22:20). This is immediately followed by the last prayer given in the Scriptures: “Amen, come LORD Yeshua!”

The LORD will indeed help us, since He is faithful and true, and His salvation is secure. May you be strong and resolute as you wait for Him, and may He come speedily, and in our day. Amen.



Ask The Chaplain

Q. We have been “walking Torah” for about 8 years, under a rabbi’s teaching. We keep the appointed times, eat kosher, and keep the laws of *nidah* (menstruation). Where do you fall on the “Two Tribes” teachings? —D.H., (TX)

A. The whole kosher issue—to what degree it should be observed—is a nebulous subject that is debated by rabbis. Fortunately, the New Testament Believer is not under the dietary laws of the Old Testament (see Mark 7:14–23; Colossians 2:14–16). The whole issue of clean and unclean under Yeshua and the New Covenant is not what one eats and does not eat. Since food is merely physical, no one who eats it will defile his heart or inner person, which is spiritual. No physical pollution—no matter how corrupt—can cause spiritual or moral pollution. Neither can outward ceremonial rituals, like keeping kosher, cleanse a person morally or spiritually. Only the shed blood of Jesus can make us *kosher* (clean) as revealed in 1 John 1:7.


Leviticus chapter 11 lists the dietary restrictions God gave to the nation of Israel. The dietary laws included

prohibitions against eating pork, many types of seafood, most insects, scavenger birds, and various other animals. The food laws—never intended to apply to anyone other than the Israelites—were meant to distinguish the Israelites from all other nations. After this purpose had ended, Jesus declared all foods clean (Mark 7:19). God gave the Apostle Peter a vision in which He declared that formerly unclean animals could be eaten: “Do not call anything impure that God has made clean” (Acts 10:15).

When Jesus died on the cross, He fulfilled the Old Testament law (Romans 10:4; Galatians 3:24–26; Ephesians 2:15). This includes the laws regarding clean and unclean foods.

In the New Covenant of Grace, the Bible is concerned far more with *how much* we eat than *what* we eat. Physical appetites are an indication of our ability to control ourselves. If we are unable to control our eating habits, we are probably also unable to control other habits, and unable to keep our mouths from gossip or strife.

The Two Tribes or Two House theory is unbiblical in that it confuses Israel with the Church and tries to make gentiles to be Israel and Ephraim. There is no credible historical evidence to support this bizarre version of Replacement Theology. For a good critique of this false doctrine see Raymond Fischer’s book *Full Circle*, pages 239-288. ★


Cringes At “Christmas”



A Scholarly Question

Dear Todd Baker,

We are studying the relationship of the Passover and Jesus' death, burial, and resurrection. In the 20th chapter of John's Gospel, John saw the napkin that was about Jesus' face "wrapped by itself," and believed. Would you please explain the importance of the napkin lying by itself that would convey the truth of the Resurrection to a fisherman like John? I have found several explanations/commentaries that seem more like speculation than knowledge of the customs of the day.

Dear C. McD.—

The Greek text suggests that the linen clothes were not hurriedly thrown about, but rather lying in a cocoon-like state, as if the body of Jesus simply passed through the linen burial clothes. The head garment was not with the rest of the linen clothes but was set apart in its own place. Again, if the body had been simply removed, it was odd that the grave clothes were left behind, and even more odd that the napkin was so carefully arranged. This may suggest that the head passed through the napkin, leaving it in its circular shape, or that Jesus deliberately folded it up before leaving the tomb. —Todd ★

Is Pakistan A Terrorist State?

In the aftermath of the raid on Abbottabad, all the big questions need to be answered by Pakistan. The old flim-flam (“Who, us? We knew nothing!”) just isn’t going to wash, and must not be allowed to wash by countries such as the United States that have persisted in treating Pakistan as an ally even though they have long known about the Pakistani double game—its support, for example, for the Haqqani network that has killed hundreds of Americans in Afghanistan.

This time the facts speak too loudly to be hushed up. Osama bin Laden, the world’s most wanted man, was found living at the end of a dirt road 800 yards from the Abbottabad military academy, Pakistan’s equivalent of West Point or Sandhurst, in a military cantonment where soldiers are on every street corner, just about 80 miles from the Pakistani capital Islamabad. This extremely large house had neither a telephone nor an Internet connection. And in spite of this we are supposed to believe that Pakistan didn’t know he was there, and that the Pakistani intelligence, and/or military, and/or civilian authorities did nothing to facilitate his presence in Abbottabad, while he ran al-Qaeda, with couriers coming and going, *for five years?*

For a long time now America has been tolerating the Pakistani double game in the knowledge that it needs Pakistani support in its Afghan enterprise, and in the hope that Pakistan’s leaders will understand that they are miscalculating badly, that the jihadists want their jobs.

Pakistan, with its nuclear weapons, is a far greater prize than poor Afghanistan, and the generals and spymasters who are playing al-Qaeda’s game today may, if the worst were to happen, become the extremists’ victims tomorrow.

There is not very much evidence that the Pakistani power elite is likely to come to its senses any time soon. Osama bin Laden’s compound provides further proof of Pakistan’s dangerous folly.

As the world braces for the terrorists’ response to the death of their leader, it should also demand that Pakistan give satisfactory answers to the very tough questions it must now be asked. If it does not provide those answers, perhaps the time has come to declare it a terrorist state and expel it from the comity of nations.

Rushdie is no stranger to the jihadi onslaught unleashed in the world. He was an early, notable *fatwa* target in our era for his novel, *The Satanic Verses*. This is a succinct analysis of the situation with Pakistan. It can be maddening to see how slow the West is to understand the basics of these dynamics. Even the absurdity of “discovering” bin Laden in plain view seems not to be enough to recognize the double nature of Pakistan, which actually is not double at all, but squarely in the radical Muslim camp. —Myles ★

Swift Help For Epilepsy

Each year, it is estimated that several thousand epilepsy patients in the United States alone will die or suffer severe brain damage from an unattended epileptic seizure.


Epilepsy is an incurable condition that especially affects two vulnerable population groups—young children and people over the age of 65—and although it can be controlled by medication, seizures are often unpredictable and always frightening.

There is an urgent need for patients to be able to notify caregivers or medical staff about the onset of a seizure. Studies have shown that getting care during a seizure can prevent many more serious problems from occurring. However, someone in the grip of an attack, particularly a child, cannot call for help.

This could be about to change with the development by an Israeli startup company of a new medical device. EpiLert is a bracelet that automatically sends an alert signal to caregivers when the wearer goes into an epileptic seizure.

The EpiLert sensor detects the limb movements associated with an epileptic convulsion. The sensor uses a proprietary algorithm developed by a team led by electronics engineer Amos

“Although there have been many attempts in the past to develop an alert of this kind, the biggest challenge has always been to find a system that could distinguish between ordinary daily movements and those movements unique to an epileptic seizure,” explains Shaham. “Our breakthrough was in devising a technology that produces virtually no false alarms.”

Shaham is working closely with BioLert's co-founder, Prof. Uri Kramer, director of the Pediatric Epilepsy Service at Sourasky Medical Center in Tel Aviv. “Prof. Kramer was painfully aware of the need for a device of this kind, having treated many patients in his hospital unit and his clinic,” Shaham says. EpiLert consists of a small sensor (worn on the wrist or ankle) and a remote alert unit. The sensor detects and processes movements and vibrations specific to epileptic seizures, and transmits signals to the remote alert unit. That unit alerts the parent, caregiver, or medical assistance service within 20 to 30 seconds of the onset of a seizure. The EpiLert also records essential data of epileptic events for further medical analysis. ★

Israel: Third Nation on the Moon?

If all goes according to plan, by December 2012 a team of three young Israeli scientists will have landed a tiny spacecraft on the Moon, explored the lunar surface, and transmitted live video back to Earth, thereby scooping up a \$20 million prize (the Google Lunar X Prize), revolutionizing space exploration, and making the Jewish State the third nation (after the U.S. and Russia) to land a probe on the Moon. And they're doing it in their spare time.

The three engineers—Yariv Bash (electronics and computers), Kfir Damari (communication systems), and Yonatan Winetraub (satellite systems)—all have high-level day jobs in the Israeli science and technology world, and also both teach and study. They all had heard of the Google Lunar X Prize independently before being introduced by mutual friends who, as Yonatan puts it, “thought we were all crazy enough to do it, so we should meet each other.”

By the end of November 2010 they had sketched together a novel plan to win the prize and submitted it to organizers. Since then, they've recruited around 50 volunteers from across the Israeli science and technology community and have gained support from academic institutions, including the prestigious Weizmann Institute of Science (founded in 1934 by Chaim Weizmann, himself a successful chemist who went on to become Israel's first president). They're operating as a nonprofit, and any winnings will be invested in promoting science among Israeli youth... a cause close to these young scientists' hearts.

In the 1960s and 1970s, they say, many

young Israelis pursued careers in science, in part inspired by the American space program. Today that isn't the case, and the number of high school seniors majoring in science is constantly declining. “We want to show that science isn't just about sitting in a lab all day,” says Kfir.


The X Prize's organizers say their competition is intended to attract “mavericks” who “take new approaches and think creatively about difficult problems, resulting in truly innovative breakthroughs.” They see the Moon as a largely untapped resource, and believe that “inexpensive, regular access to the Moon is a critical stepping stone for further exploration.”

According to the X Prize organizers, the 29 competing teams will spend between \$15 million and \$100 million on the project, with the earliest launch not scheduled until 2013. The Israelis aim to spend less than that (around \$10 million) and to launch before 2013.

One way the team intends to keep costs down involves using existing technology that simply hasn't been linked to this purpose, rather than spending a new fortune. Naturally, the team isn't releasing specific details of



the technology they're using, but they're confident that they've got what they need. ★



Zachariah Church Mosaic Vandalized


Recently, a Byzantine church at Horvat Midras southwest of Jerusalem was discovered, containing well-preserved mosaic floors decorated with images of lions, fish, foxes, and peacocks. Now Alon Klein, one of the archaeologists who excavated the site, says the priceless mosaic has been vandalized. Describing damage to a section depicting fish and a flock of quail, he said, “It looks as though a grenade was dropped on it.”

The mosaic is now under wraps pending repairs. There is still no indication who the culprits were, but Arabs intent on erasing Israel’s cultural heritage are suspected. The maximum penalty for damaging ancient artifacts is five years in prison. Some 10,000 people had visited the site in the brief period that it was open to the public.



Col. West’s straightforward assessment: “This is not a perversion. They are doing exactly what this book (the Koran) says.”





The Nasty King's Speech

In the movie *The King's Speech*, King (Albert Frederick Arthur) George VI assumed the throne upon the abdication of his older brother David (King Edward) and overcame his stammer to deliver inspiring speeches to his subjects during World War II.



The movie offers flashes of his foppish brother's appeasement, but the abdication is painted chiefly as a love story. In fact, Edward was a Nazi sympathizer who commented in 1970 to an interviewer: "I never thought Hitler was such a bad chap." In October 1937, exiled Edward and his bride visited Nazi Germany, met Hitler, and gave a full Nazi salute. Oh, those Royals. That was not in the movie.

King George, however, is portrayed as a fine chap. He was not. The King rejected the entreaties of Winston Churchill, Anthony Eden, and others who advised against appeasing Hitler.

The White Paper (published on November 9, 1938 and approved by Parliament in May 1939) limited Jewish immigration to Palestine to 75,000 people over five years, effectively trapping Europe's Jews. The King not only supported the White Paper but also stated that he was "glad to think that steps are being taken to prevent these people leaving their country of origin."

He went further. He instructed Foreign Secretary Lord Halifax to make sure the Nazis cooperated. Halifax's office telegraphed Britain's ambassador in

Berlin asking him to encourage the German government "to check the unauthorized emigration of Jews." King George VI was stalwart and brave during the Blitz, but unflinching in his hostility to the Jews.

The notorious White Paper remained British policy after the war. A royal admonition might have prevented Britain's post war crimes against wretched displaced persons seeking haven in Palestine. Between August 1945 and May 1948, 65 "illegal" immigrant ships, carrying 69,878 people, arrived from European shores. The British shot them, crippled their engines, and interned those they caught in camps in Cyprus. Approximately 50,000 people were detained in the camps, 28,000 of whom were still imprisoned when Israel declared its independence.

In 1947, the famous ship *Exodus*, carrying 4,500 Jewish refugees, including 600 orphans, was attacked by five British destroyers. The ship limped into harbor, but prisoners were taken to Cyprus and southern France. When they refused to disembark, they were threatened with a return to Germany.

The international media, including British journalists, responded with outrage. The King and Queen, who visited orphans and soldiers and used their rations in a display of solidarity with ordinary people, were unmoved and silent. They did find time, that same year, to salute warmly Indian independence and deliver a message of congratulations to Pakistan, although both countries had engaged in armed resistance to British colonial occupation.

King George died in 1952. He overcame stammering but not his anti-Semitism.

I would like to suggest that the pre-'67 borders are OK with me—as long as we are talking about A.D. 67, not 1967.



The Hamas—al-Qaeda Official Alliance

While most of the world celebrates the U.S. military operation that killed al-Qaeda leader Osama bin Laden in Pakistan, the sentiment is not unanimous. In the Gaza Strip, Hamas leader Ismail Haniyeh has condemned the United States, accusing Washington of assassinating a “Muslim and Arabic warrior” and the “continuation of the American oppression and shedding of blood of Muslims and Arabs.”

Haniyeh’s reaction underscores the ideological roots Hamas and al-Qaeda share: Hamas was founded by Sheik Ahmed Yassin, a prominent Palestinian Muslim Brotherhood figure; al-Qaeda was cofounded, along with bin Laden, by Abdullah Azzam, another prominent Palestinian Muslim Brotherhood figure. But this only partially explains why Haniyeh and his ilk are now mourning the death of the most notorious terrorist in modern history.

While Hamas insists that it has no operational ties to al-Qaeda, in the early and mid-1990s Hamas members received paramilitary training and attended Islamist conferences in Sudan, alongside bin Laden and his supporters.

The operational ties were confirmed a decade later, when bin Laden reportedly sent emissaries to Hamas on two separate occasions (September 2000 and January 2001). While most analysts believe Hamas rejected al-Qaeda’s offer to coordinate violence against Israel, it appears Hamas never closed the door. In 2002, the *Washington Post* quoted official U.S. government sources as confirming a loose alliance “between al-Qaeda, Hamas, and Hezbollah.”


In 2003, Israel arrested three Hamas fighters returning from al-Qaeda training camps in Afghanistan. That same year, Jordanian security officials

confirmed to *TIME* magazine that two Hamas members went on a recruiting mission in Afghanistan hoping to bring al-Qaeda fighters back to the Palestinian territories.


Arab media also reported in 2006 that Syria-based Hamas chief Khaled Meshaal had met in Yemen with Abd al-Majid al-Zindani, whom the U.S. Treasury officially designated as a terrorist in 2004 for his ties to al-Qaeda. Zindani has openly boasted of providing funds to Hamas. Thus, over the course of two decades, Hamas has maintained a relationship with the al-Qaeda network. This explains Haniyeh’s lamentations after hearing of bin Laden’s death, and further explains, in part, why the United States has designated Hamas a terrorist organization.

But Hamas’s sympathies for bin Laden hold a deeper meaning more than ever before. **In May, Hamas entered into a unity government with the rival Fatah faction, the ruling party of the Palestinian Authority.** The deal immediately raised questions about whether Washington could recognize such a government.

If the group’s grisly record of suicide bombings and attacks against civilians since its inception in 1988 were not enough, the aforementioned ties between Hamas and al-Qaeda should serve as further warning to Washington about the terror group that now appears to have a controlling stake in the Palestinian Authority.



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
