Recently, Palestinian Authority (PA) Minister of Religious Affairs, Mahmoud Al-Habbash, delivered a paean to Sheik Ahmad Yassin, founder and leader of Hamas, the terrorist organization in Gaza that has murdered hundreds of Israelis in scores of suicide bombings, calling him a Palestinian "icon." How can peace talks with Israel and glorifying a terrorist chieftain coexist in the Fatah-controlled PA?

Al-Habbash gave us the answer last summer when he linked the peace talks to the Treaty of Hudabiyyah (628 A.D.).

Hudabiyyah was a peace agreement between Mohammed and the Meccan Quraysh tribe. But when a Quraysh tribe breached the treaty by attacking a Mohammed tribe, Mohammed, who had organized a huge army, used this pretext to attack the Qureishis. The Qureishis surrendered.

In August 1953, Greece was hit by one of the worst earthquakes in its history. The devastation was most pronounced on the islands of Cephalonia, Zakynthos, and Ithaca. At the time, Israel's navy, on its way to becoming the high-quality military force it is today, was wrapping up exercises in the Mediterranean. When they received the distress call from Greece, several ships rushed to the scene.

Israeli soldiers labored for three days, commanding American and British teams, and cooperating to save hundreds of lives and extend medical care to tens of thousands. At the time, Greece did not have diplomatic relations with Israel, but the Greek king conveyed his heartfelt thanks and appreciation.

This approach, says Al-Habbash, has "brought us to where we are today."

"The world recognizes the [Palestinian] state. This never would have happened ... only through the wisdom... exactly like the Prophet [Mohammed] did in the Treaty of Hudabiyyah....This is the model," he said.

In short, the Hudabiyyah strategy—working towards the weakening and eventual elimination of Israel through negotiations—has been the operative Palestinian strategy since the Oslo Accords 20 years ago.

When Arafat told a confidential meeting of Arab ambassadors in Stockholm in January 1996 that the aim of Oslo was "splitting Israel psychologically," and "eliminat[ing] the State of Israel and establish[ing] a purely Palestinian State" that would "make life unbearable for Jews," the revelation was ignored, even by Israel.

Arafat's successor, Mahmoud Abbas, has made it clear that not only has he not accepted Israel's right to exist as a Jewish state ("I do not accept the Jewish State, call it what you will.") but he also intends to set up a Jew-free state ("When a Palestinian state is established, it would have no Israeli presence in it.").

Questioned on the need for recognizing Israel, Abbas replied that, while official recognition was unavoidably necessary to obtain vital Israeli concessions, "It is not required of Hamas, or of Fatah, or of the Popular Front to recognize Israel." And, indeed, Abbas's Fatah has never altered its Constitution that calls for the destruction of Israel and the use of terrorism to achieve it.

Words and bombs are thus the Fatah/PA strategy, a strategy made possible only by duplicity. That's why the late Palestinian leader Faisal Husseini once dubbed it the strategy of the "Trojan Horse," in which the Palestinian regime installed via

negotiations would serve "our final aim: the liberation of all of historical Palestine, from the river to the sea."

That's why senior PA figure Abbas Zaki told an Arab audience, "If I say that I want to remove [Israel] from existence, this... is not a [stated] policy. You can't say it to the world.

You can say it to yourself."



That's why the PA claims to be interested in a negotiated peace, even while it tells its people repeatedly that the Jews have no historical connection or rights in Jerusalem or anywhere else.

In short, the PA has a long-established policy of duplicity about its anti-peace intentions.

Nor did Greece forget what Israel had done, paying homage with a special ceremony 37 years later. The Greek rescue was the first in a long line of relief operations that established the State's humanitarian and ethical character as a "light unto the nations," a country that was always among the first to help others in distress. Since then, this has become a tradition. Saving lives and choosing life is a founding ethos of Judaism and the State of Israel, not only because it is a basic human value, but because it is part of our tradition, as stated in Deuteronomy 30:19: "And you shall choose life."



Over the last 60 years, Israel has extended its hand, saved lives, and provided humanitarian aid in places all over the world where natural disasters have occurred: not just Greece, but Turkey, Haiti, African countries, and now the Philippines. It is not just the Israeli government and Israel Defense Forces doing God's work, but Israeli volunteer organizations, including citizens who drop everything to volunteer in places where nature has turned cruel.

This humanitarian strain is expressed within Israel as well. For instance, Israeli hospitals treat wounded victims of the Syrian civil war. Israel also provides "Palestinians" with medical aid, despite the fact that Palestinian terror operatives do everything they can to hurt Israelis. This was blatantly manifest when Gaza/Palestinian terrorists bombed Ashkelon's Barzilai Medical Center at the same time that doctors and nurses in the hospital were treating Gazan wounded.

Despite Israel's outstanding humanitarianism, the country's delegitimizers and haters try to make the country look evil. We're not just talking about the inflammatory material produced by the Palestinian Authority and Muslim Arab countries, but also the fact that while Israel was helping earthquake victims in Haiti, a video appeared on YouTube claiming that Israel was stealing organs from patients.

Next, David ran through this area when King Saul was trying to kill him. By the time David wrote Psalm 63, he was running from his own son!





A Son of Covenant Comes Home

Last summer, my friend Todd and I set out on an overseas adventure, participating in Birthright, a gift to Jewish young people of an all-expenses-paid tour of Israel to connect us to our roots. After an exhausting 12-hour flight, I peeped out the window to see that we were approaching Tel Aviv. The Hasidic (Orthodox) Jewish passengers broke out their prayer gear and began a constant bob of their torsos up and down, reciting prayer after prayer. Thunderous clapping filled the plane as the wheels touched down safely in the Holy Land. After meeting with our group, we boarded the bus and hit the road.

Our first day consisted of long hikes and historical talks in the burning July heat. Our group seemed uncomfortable, with everyone trying to energize after the beginning of a lazy summer. The group didn't click initially. Instead little cliques formed, setting some on edge toward others. Our young counselors tried to spread enthusiasm about the trip, but they were quietly disappointed in the group's attitude. This tension continued for four days.

On day five, our bus added more passengers, and the atmosphere changed dramatically. The newcomers were Israeli soldiers on active duty with the IDF (Israel Defense Forces). A new energy filled the bus. Conversations peppered the air as we pestered the soldiers with questions. When we went rafting on the Jordan River, each raft included a soldier whose presence helped us to bond with our new friends during a fun activity. A newfound excitement and appreciation for Israel's culture overtook our hearts and minds.

After the river trip, we visited **Mount Herzl**, a national military cemetery west of Jerusalem and also the burial site of many great Israeli heroes including Yitzhak Rabin, Golda Meir, and Theodor Herzl. Our group's outlandish conversations and irreverent joking abruptly halted and we stood in silence, realizing where we stood.

We visited four particular graves and learned about the lives of the heroes lying there. I looked around at other headstones. I couldn't read the Hebrew, but I saw the numbers 18, 19, 20, 21, 19, 20 displayed on most. My guide said that I was seeing the ages of the fallen soldiers. The numbers shocked me! My stomach churned as I realized that I was older than some of these brave

soldiers. The passion I felt was overwhelming. Mount Herzl dramatically affected our Israeli companions too, and we could see their eyes tear up. The graves belonged to soldiers who were kids just like them, and well could have been them.

I felt insignificant—disappointed in my life thus far. Of course, I am happy to be alive and very blessed. But these kids had given their lives for their country—a country that blesses the world. The awesome meaning of the restoration of Israel became personal for me.

"I need to do something with my life," I thought.

I want to change the world too.

My name is Ben Levy. I was born with cerebral palsy and I'll be 20 in a month. From a young age, it was clear to me that I wanted to be a soldier. My dad is a policeman, and my brother is a paratrooper. At home, they always taught me to serve the country and to give of myself as much as I can. Two years ago, I got an exemption from the army, but my affair with the IDF had only just begun.

Recently, I enlisted in the IDF for a full two years of service.

I wish other Israelis had been with me in Ireland. In the tiny town of Cahersiveen, they would have been reminded of what we face in the international community and why it has nothing to do with how we conduct ourselves, how many concessions we make at the expense of our physical safety, or how much we sacrifice our rights to our historic homeland. It's all beside the point. Distortions about us are disseminated to folks who know next to nothing about the Mideast and its complexities. Still, they are convinced that we are the bad guys.

Picturesque Cahersiveen straddles the Ring of Kerry, a tourist trail in southwestern Ireland. On the town's main street, three boisterous teenagers in Santa hats, car-

rying a collection box and signs reading "Free Palestine" solicited my contribution.

I asked: "Free Palestine from whom?"
The cheery trio's swift answer: "The Jews."

I pressed on: "Do you know where your money would go?" The boys: "To plant olive trees."

"Are you sure," I continued, as little old ladies generously dropped coins into the

collection box, "that this money wouldn't fund terrorists and murderers?" Their retort threw me for a loop: "What do you have against Palestinians? They are only against Jews."

I asked what they knew about the conflict. Only that Israel is the ogre and the Palestinians are worthy of compassion. The boys never questioned any of this.

I asked if they knew of the Palestinian Authority's persecutions of Christians, but they had never heard of the Palestinian Authority and didn't know that Palestinians are overwhelmingly Muslim. There was little point in lumbering them with elementary information.

Their teacher said that he'd brought them out during school hours to do a pre-Christmas Christian deed "to further a humanitarian goal." The goal: collect money to enable the Palestinians to replace olive trees because "Jews stole their lands."

This was a sanctioned school event, part of inculcating in the children a commitment to charitable work. I wondered aloud if something else wasn't being inculcated. When I told the teacher what the three boys had said about Jews "always being villains," and one youngster's aside that "they crucified our Lord," the teacher nodded in agreement.

"Isn't there another side to this story?" I asked. The squawk was all about rights, but not the rights of Jews. The bottom line for Cahersiveen's juveniles was that the Israelis are the tyrants and the Palestinians the sainted victims. It's black and white with no grays, no background. And herein lies our problem: We, as a people, face bias we can do nothing about.

The powerful predisposition against us is not fueled by our behavior, because nobody knows much about how we behave, and nobody cares to learn.

The Cahersiveen youngsters will surely grow into decent adults, but ingrained in their psyches will be the notion of Jewish villains and Palestinian martyrs. This bias, because it was formed so early, is intangible and impervious to all Israeli public relations, and historical dissertations are too convoluted to dispel preconceived antipathy.

Facts are irrelevant.

Sadly, the blind acceptance of such anti-Israel propaganda is commonplace. —Myles

Ireland Marks Israeli Products with Yellow Stickers

A pro-Israeli activist residing in Dublin, Ireland was shocked this week when he discovered that a Boycott, Divestment, and Sanctions (BDS) organization had taped yellow stickers on Israeli products reading "For justice in Palestine, Boycott Israel."

Among the many items found carrying the yellow boycott sticker was a pack of dates from the Jordan Valley. One of the stickers read: "Organic dates—produce of West Bank; Israeli Settlement Produce."

The call for boycott is directed not only at products made in Israeli settlements but at Israeli products altogether—even though the sticker notes the product was made in the West Bank. Similar stickers were placed on other products in the Tesco supermarket chain.

Tesco is a British chain originally established by Jewish businessman Jack Cohen, the son of Jewish immigrants from Poland. Cohen's grandchildren and great-grandchildren reside in Israel. The chain operates 142 grocery stores in Ireland and over 6,000 stores in 11 other countries.

The BDS activity in Ireland is one of the most serious anti-Israel movements in Europe. It joins the Irish policy that pushes for marking all products from the West Bank in retail stores all over Europe.

Sources in the Foreign Ministry in Jerusalem said that the phenomenon is severe and it is not by chance that the BDS organization chose to express its protest with a yellow sticker, which is reminiscent of yellow Stars of David during dark days of Nazi racism and incitement.

Unfortunately, BDS seems "normal" to the modern world. Such repetition of history is lost on world leaders and policy makers ... or is it? —Myles

Trailblazing Educators & Israel's Rebirth

Perched on the crest of the Mount Carmel ridge, overlooking Haifa, are two of Israel's finest schools—the Technion (known as the Israeli M.I.T.) and University of Haifa. A lesser-known college produces superb teachers who enter the kindergartens, grade schools, and junior/senior high schools of Israeli neighborhoods. Gordon College is named for A.D. Gordon (1856–1922). Gordon was an early Zionist pioneer who helped lay the foundation for the modern State of Israel.

A charismatic educator and community activist, **Aaron David Gordon**arrived in Israel at age 48. He believed that the transformation of the Jewish people from oppression to liberation



could only come through honest labor, linked to the land. This love for the land and its cultivation led him ultimately to settle in the Galilee. He felt that a healthy society could be more effectively built through family and community than through political parties and government.

Concerning Israel as a nation resurrected in the 20th century, he wrote:

We are engaged in a creative endeavor the like of which is itself not to be found in the whole history of mankind: the rebirth and rehabilitation of a people that has been uprooted and scattered to the winds. ("Our Tasks Ahead" 1920)

Like A.D. Gordon, **Katya Morrison** (1950–2013) arrived in Israel in her 40s. And like him, she saw the need for training young people in order to

build a new society. Katya and her husband, Moshe, joined Connie and me in 1994 to establish the Tents of Mercy network of congregations and humanitarian aid centers in the Galilee. Work-


ing largely with families of new immigrants in the context of Messianic Jewish education, she created lessons in three languages (Hebrew, Russian, and English) in order to serve the



needs of new Israelis. A dedicated follower of Yeshua from the age of 22, Katya impacted hundreds of young people and their families through her determined, unheralded labors to train them in the Scriptures and in living an Israeli Jewish life in Messiah.

The resurgent Messianic Jewish community in Israel is still young. Without true pioneers like Katya Morrison, we would not be able to build a movement of sufficient quality and strength to make Yeshua known to His own nation. A.D. Gordon and those like him brought a dead nation back to life physically. Katya and those like her are bringing the nation back to life spiritually.







History of the Middle East from a Moderate Palestinian Muslim CLASSIC ZOLA: 1982—32 years ago



I want to try to give a balanced perspective of how we got to the present state in the Middle East. Some people aren't aware of the background of the combatants. Many confuse the PLO with the Palestinian people in general, and many suppose the Israelis are a part of some legendary Jewish movement to overthrow the world. I'm going to try explaining this difficult situation from the perspective of a Palestinian Muslim and an Israeli Jew.

As a Palestinian Muslim, my goal is to reoccupy what I regard to be my homeland.
My father lived in Israel and his father before
him. We had property, schools, shops, etc.
We were not part of the Holocaust or of
World War II and we owe nothing to the
Jewish people. When the Israeli Jew tells
me that Israel is really his land because his
Holy Book says so, I tell him that I don't
believe in his Holy Book. I have a holy book
of my own that tells me the Jew is an infidel.

In 1948 when the United Nations partitioned Israel and gave a big part of it to the Jewish people, they gave away my fields, my roads, my towns, and all the rest that I had made. The Jewish people who came to occupy the land under that UN mandate told me that I could stay but I preferred to fight them. After all, it was my land and I didn't want to become a citizen of some strange foreign state. I lost that war, and the Israeli Jews occupied even more of my land. I then had

to live under their rule for many years. I cannot say that they were difficult to live with; in all fairness, they improved the land, made it productive, and defended it against superior Arab forces. But they were immigrating in greater and greater numbers and I still yearned for my independence.

Then certain factions among my people formed an army. It was called the Palestinian Liberation Organization (PLO). The PLO sought to free us from occupation and get our land back. It was definite in its aims and condemned the Jewish State of Israel. It wanted to wipe them out. But my army proved no match for the Israeli Jews; its only effective weapon became terrorism. Yet I think it was justified because Jews were occupying my land. I'm sorry for all the killing and all the sneak attacks, but what else could I do? My army at first operated out of Jordan and, when we were put out of there, from Lebanon.

This might be the view of an average Palestinian Muslim. More-radical and more-conservative opinions of this complex situation exist. A Palestinian Muslim might say, "Kill them all" and another might say, "Leave them alone; I never had it so good." I have attempted to characterize a middle-ground point of view. Next month, I will try to characterize a middle-ground Israeli Jewish point of view.



In both Revelation 2:9 and 3:9. our Lord Jesus Christ through Apostle John addresses the apostate religion of the Synagogue of Satan (those who claim to be Jews but are not) and warns the Church of this false doctrine. At the drugstore, a young Orthodox woman named **Michal** accepted a Complete Bible and commented that

she was open to reading it, although her husband would not be. I smiled as I thought how the Holy Spirit waters the seeds that we plant here

That first day, the four of us handed out seven Complete Jewish Bibles.

In Tiberias—in the Galilee on the shores of the Kinneret (Sea of Galilee)—our witness met with resistance. Because of the large Orthodox community there, many are closed to the Gospel of Jesus. We did, however, give Bible tracts to a security guard and a woman at a shoe store. Robin and I discovered that, in general, the people we came across seemed receptive, taking our pamphlets about prophecy. Todd and Harvey were blessed to give away several Bibles in Tiberias, one to a cook at a pizza parlor!

Before we drove to Mount Hermon in the northernmost part of the country where Israel meets Lebanon and Syria, we prayed for divine appointments with IDF soldiers stationed there. On the road to the mountain, we enjoyed vistas of Capernaum (the Village of Comfort)—"Now when Jesus heard that John had been put in prison, He departed to Galilee. And leaving Nazareth, He came and dwelt in Capernaum, which is by the sea" (Matthew 4:12–13)—the Jordan River, Megiddo, and the Bashan area.

Our journey to Mt. Hermon was fruitful: Two IDF soldiers gladly received the Complete Bibles. On our way to Kiryat Shmona, we stopped in Nimrod at a shuk (farmer's market) where we met a man from France. When we shared the Gospel of Yeshua, he said he was glad to have fellowship with Americans.

As a result of divine encounters in bookstores, shopping centers in Jerusalem, Eilat, and at the beach in Tel Aviv, we distributed a grand total of 63 Complete Bibles in Hebrew, plus a lot of *The Promised Messiah* tracts.

One of Israel's sources of pride is the enormous number of inventions and innovations that have taken root on its soil over 65 years — despite challenges of geography, size, and diplomacy. The ever-churning Israeli mind has brought us drip irrigation, the cherry tomato, the electric car grid, the Diskon-Key, and much more.

The Bloomfield Science Museum in Jerusalem exhibited and demonstrated 45 indispensable Israeli inventions. Curator Varda Gur Ben-Sheetrit said that hundreds of ingenious inventions were considered for Inventions, Inc. She emphasized that many other Israeli inventions were deserving of being included. "We were, of course, constrained by space limitations, and also not every company we invited to exhibit responded," she said.

We continue our series of the top 45 inventions highlighted at the exhibition, in no particular order.

6. BabySense is a non-touch, no-radiation device designed to prevent crib death. Made by HiSense, the device monitors a baby's breathing and movements through the mattress during

sleep. An auditory and visual alarm is activated if breathing ceases for more than 20 seconds or if breath rate slows to less than 10 breaths per minute.

7. **EpiLady**, the first electric hair remover (epilator) secured a permanent place in the international beauty-care market in 1986.

8. 3G Solar pioneered a low-cost alternative to silicon that generates significantly more electricity than leading silicon-based PV solar modules at a lower cost per kilowatt hour. 9. MobileEye combines a tiny digital camera with sophisticated algorithms to help drivers navigate more safely. The steering system-linked device sounds an alert when a driver is about to change lanes inadvertently, warns of an impending forward collision, and detects pedestrians. MobileEye has deals with GM, BMW, and Volvo, and others.

10. Leviathan Energy innovated the Wind Tulip, a cost-effective, silent, vibration-free wind turbine designed as an aesthetic environmental sculpture that produces clean energy at high efficiency from any direction.





11. Ray Bariach introduced the steel security door that has become Israel's standard. Its geometric lock, whose cylinders extend from different points into the doorframe, is incorporated into doors selling on five continents.

Wisdom and Folly Classic By John J. Parsons

In Western culture, there is an optimistic tendency to assume that the more knowledge someone has, the better. Such an assumption is based on the ideal of technology. which seeks to control the environment for the supposed good of mankind. The wise man, according to the Greeks, is the worldly man of knowledge and power.

In Hebrew thinking, such a humanistic viewpoint is insufficient, since the fear of the LORD —yirat Adonai — is the starting point for knowledge. Yirat Adonai is the reverential awe at the glory of God's Presence, the first principle for all sound reasoning about the universe (and all that is in it). Without this underlying principle, even the most sophisticated human reasoning will be based on nothing more than the "yada yada" (from yada, the Hebrew verb "to know") of a fool. There are different types of fools described in the Bible, each of which exhibits a lack of moral character and discipline (musar). Here are some of the most common terms:

First, there is "the simple one" (peti), described as someone who is immature, easily seduced, and unaware that sinful actions have consequences (Psalm 19:7, Prov 1:22, 14:15). Next, there is "the dullard" (kesil), described as someone who is obstinately opinionated and *slow* to realize that sinful actions have consequences. Third, there is "the fool proper" (evil), described as someone who insolently mocks at sin and doesn't care that sin has consequences (Prov 14:9, 1:22). Then, there's "the boor" (naval), a shameless and profane person who is a practical atheist (Psalm 14:1). Finally, (and worst of all), there is "the scorner" (leitz), a person who cynically and bitterly mocks (yalitz) everything in the world (Prov 21:24, 22:10). The end of the scorner is destruction (Prov 9:7, Isa 29:20).

The Western ideal of knowledge is ultimately foolish, because it repudiates the very idea of the "fear of the LORD," and scorns the idea that moral discipline is important to understanding reality (just check your public school system for details). If the fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge, then the lack of such results in vanity, ignorance, depravity, and stupidity.

As followers of Jesus in a society darkened by such vain imaginations, we are called to "walk circumspectly, not as fools, but as wise, redeeming the time, because the days are evil" (Eph 5:15-16). May God help us walk so wisely today.



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
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




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

In the early days, we rented a full-scale studio to produce our TV programs. However, prior owners of Zola's house, where I now live, enclosed their whole backyard to make a huge den. That den now serves as our production studio.



You may not realize the impact of *Zola Levitt Presents* on viewers seeing it for the first time. But your support immeasurably benefits transient TV viewers and online readers. Imagine how many seeds we've planted by teaching the Bible on location from Israel over the airwaves in all fifty states and globally!

What's Your Calling?

Dear ZLM.

Please help me with an issue I am having in discussing Messianic Jewish life. I understand that saved Jewish people are to continue in Jewish traditions. Others counter that everything changed at Jesus' cross and resurrection.

Exodus and Leviticus repeat "This is a perpetual regulation" and "through all your generations." I have tried to tell them that this is not for their salvation, but because they are God's Chosen Ones.

Any help with this matter would be greatly appreciated. —K.B.

Dear K.B.-

1 Corinthians 7:17–20 makes clear that once saved, you are to live as you are called. A Jewish person who believes in Yeshua does not need to be a gentile, nor does a saved gentile have to become a Jew. A Messianic Jew does not give up his racial and cultural identity in order to appear like a gentile follower of Yeshua. Culture, race, and social order have no bearing on salvation or spiritual life as long as they do not violate Scripture. For more, see "Should Gentiles Keep Torah?" by Ron Cantor in the November 2013 Levitt Letter, p. 33. —Todd

Will Moses or Elijah Return?

Dear ZLM,

I am studying the Old Testament. Malachi says that Elijah will usher in the Messiah. I read Malachi and can see how Jewish people in the past might not have recognized John the Baptist as Elijah. In the New Testament, John even said he wasn't Elijah. However, Jesus said (Matthew 11:14) that John was, but the way He put it is confusing to me: "And if ye will receive it, this is Elias, who is to come." Can you please explain this perplexity for me?



Also, my Bible says that Moses died. The historian Josephus writes that he did not, but that the people were told that in order to get them to follow Joshua. Isn't Moses supposed to return also? If so, how could he have died? However, Our Father would not tell his children to lie no matter what. This really is confusing to me. Thanks in advance for any help on both of these questions. —S.S.

Dear S.S.-

Elias is the Greek form of Elijah, in case the names confused you.

Your other questions can be untangled by looking at related New Testament passages that deal with the same theme. John was not the physical person of Elijah come to Earth from Heaven. Rather, he came in the "spirit and power of Elijah" (Luke 1:17). Had all of Israel received Yeshua at His first coming, then John would have been the spiritual fulfillment of Malachi 4:5–6.

Elijah (who did not die but was taken up in a whirlwind with a chariot and horses of flame) will return from Heaven in person. He will be one of the Two Witnesses prophesied to come during the Tribulation Period (Revelation 11:3–6) before the great and terrible day of the Lord's wrath on the Earth, prior to the second coming of Jesus. Scripture tells us that Moses did, in fact, die in the land of Moab, and the Lord Himself buried him (see Deuteronomy 34:5–6). —Todd

Supporting More Than Appearances


Dear Mark,


Israelis Find Cure for Stem Cell Debate

By now, the fact that Israel is the world's innovation hub is no longer a hot newsflash. But a recent medical/scientific breakthrough emanating from the Weizmann Institute illustrates the significance of Israeli ingenuity beyond the obvious benefits. The important and widely publicized revelation, conducted by a research team headed by Dr. Yaqub Hanna, involves the production of stem cells.

More specifically, it is the key to releasing the "brake" that holds back the reprogramming of mature stem cells to make them immature and pluripotent—capable of developing into all tissues of the body—a process whose discovery by scientists John B. Gurdon and Shinya Yamanaka led to their joint 2012 Nobel Prize.



The trouble with the reprogramming procedure was that it was neither quick nor efficient, which made it unusable for actual medical purposes. And herein lies the reason that the current Israeli team's findings are being treated with such fanfare: They have solved the problem of speed in the process of inducing the kind of stem cells needed to treat and cure a variety of diseases—without the need to destroy human embryos.



It was Gurdon and Yamanaka who discovered that embryonic-like stem cells can be created from adult skin cells. This was a great discovery, prior to which the only way to harvest stem cells was to remove the inner mass of an embryo. This practice raised moral and legal questions that are still being argued across the world.

The Israeli team has figured out how to avoid using embryos altogether. It is a huge accomplishment as it not only takes a scientific breakthrough to the next level, but is likely to eliminate a whole series of ethical dilemmas hindering medical progress. It is truly the start of something big and gives new meaning to the promise of "a light unto the nations."

DNA Testing On Your Smartphone

Genetic sequencing is no longer for the uber-wealthy and uberpatient: The option to sequence the human genome is available to anyone who has \$3,500 to spend and is willing to wait the 24 hours it takes to do the job. Pretty soon, the cost for sequencing is going to come down to about \$1,000.

So what can you do with your genomic DNA sequence? Soon you will be able to whip out your smartphone and analyze it, using an app developed by researchers at Tel Aviv University. Their app (and website) GeneG makes genetic analysis as simple as sending a text message or making a phone call.

"For the first time you can take your genome home and look at it whenever you

want," said GeneG creator Noam Shomron. Shomron developed the GeneG app and website with TAU graduate students Ofer Isakov and Gershon Celniker.

GeneG has the potential to make genetic testing as routine as a blood pressure test. Currently, someone who wants a DNA test needs to donate a separate sample of DNA for each test, as clinics that process the DNA generally test for only one specific item. The process involves traveling to the clinic to



have blood drawn, sometimes more than once, and takes weeks to complete.

But for those who have had their genome "done," the process is much simpler. GeneG users upload their genome (in the standard VCF format used for gene sequence variations) to the site. Once online, they can submit the information in their account to standard digital genetic tests developed by organizations like the National Institutes of Health, Stanford University, and the European Bioinformatics Institute. There are currently hundreds of tests that can check for all sorts of information, such as diseases, the possibility of specific traits (hair and eye color), and

But GeneG is about more than DNA testing, said Shomron. Many scientists predict that as more people get control of their genetic data, they will demand solutions that are tailor-made to their needs and guided by the results of DNA tests. Naturally, said Shomron, the information uploaded to GeneG accounts will be kept secure, and users will have full control over the data, including who has permission to look at the test results.

so on. All of them can be done remotely just by clicking on a smartphone screen.

In an era of such personalized medicine, for example, pharmaceutical companies could compound medications to order for specific patients based on their genetic data, ensuring that any potentially harmful elements that are generally found in off-the-shelf medications are kept out. Doctors will be able to develop more successful treatments for a range of maladies, from cancer to sleep disorders, based on the information yielded by GeneG's easy genetic testing system, said Shomron.

"If we give this power to the general public," he said, "it will put pressure on the medical field to catch up with this information."



Cyber-Attacks Current Method of Warfare

Massive traffic congestion in and around the northern Israel city of Haifa last fall was the result of a targeted cyber-attack. An unnamed Israeli cyber-security expert speaking on condition of anonymity told the Associated Press that computer problems that caused major traffic jams for two days straight were more than just standard "technical difficulties."

According to this official, a Trojan-horse attack targeted security cameras in a tunnel, prompting officials to close the thoroughfare for 20–30 minutes. The next day, the system was hit again, resulting in an eight-hour shutdown and causing an estimated hundreds of thousands of dollars in damages.


The matter had been classified, with Israeli officials publicly stating that the unusual snafu had been caused by a mere "computer glitch." Earlier, IDF Chief of Staff Gen. Benny Gantz warned that the next war against Israel will include major computer attacks aimed at bringing the Jewish State to a standstill.

A year ago, Israeli officials revealed that the Jewish State is targeted by as many as 1,000 cyber-attacks per minute. In addition to the thousands of low-level cyber-attacks Israel fends off every day from individual hackers, there are also a regular number of attacks by foreign government agencies.

That was believed to be the case last summer when 140 Israeli officials holding sensitive positions in the defense establishment received an email containing a Trojan-horse virus designed to send information back to its creators. Security officials said that the virus originated in China and was possibly sent by elements within China's defense establishment. Israel's security systems detected and removed the virus.

Apartheid? Here's the Reality

You'll find Israeli-Arab physicians on staff at every Israeli hospital. But only Carmel Medical Center in Haifa can boast that its newest Israeli-Arab obstetrician-gynecologist, Dr. Mais Ali Saleh, recently graduated No.1 in her class at the Technion-Israel Institute of Technology, one of the country's top medical schools.

Just getting admitted to one of Israel's five medical schools demands near-perfect test scores and a dazzling personal interview. Graduating at the top of the class is quite a feather in the cap of this 27-year-old Muslim from a village near Nazareth, who was not fluent in Hebrew when she began her studies.

Though she won an academic award of excellence from Israel's parliament in her first year of medical school, Ali Saleh says, "I didn't just learn material right before a test. I was constantly reviewing. If you study little by little, you internalize it better. And I made time to have fun. At four or five o'clock I'd finish studying, close the books and go to the sea."

Considering that she held down jobs all through seven years of medical school and internship, time management was critical.

She was hardly the only Israeli-Arab to make the grade. "The Technion medical school has about 35 percent Israeli-Arab students," she says.

Last year's Technion valedictorian was Arza Haddad, a Christian Lebanese woman who earned a master's degree in aeronautical engineering.

Technion biology student Lina Mahoul, a 19-year-old Arab Christian from Acre, last year won *The Voice Israel* television singing contest.

Prof. Hossam Haick, a Christian Arab chemical engineer at the Technion's Russell Berrie Nanotechnology Institute, grabbed headlines for inventing the Na-Nose device that detects serious diseases by analyzing breath samples. (See October 2009 *Levitt Letter*, p. 29.)

And Arab-Christian couple Reem and Imad Younis, who met as students at the Technion, run an international neurosurgery products business, Alpha Omega, from Nazareth.







Last Jew in Afghanistan

Zabulon Simintov (top) always removes his kippah, the skullcap worn by Jewish men, before entering his cafe in a dilapidated building that also houses Afghanistan's last synagogue.

"Let me take off my cap, otherwise people will think something bad about me," Simintov says cheerfully as he descends grime-caked stairs to the ground-floor cafe.

In his 50s, Simintov is the last known Afghan Jew to remain in the country. He has become something of a celebrity over the years and his rivalry with the next-to-last Jew, who died in 2005, inspired a play.

Mindful of Afghanistan's extremely conservative Muslim culture, Simintov tries not to advertise his identity to protect the Balkh Bastan (Ancient Balkh) kebab cafe he opened four years ago, naming it after a northern Afghan province.

"All food here is prepared by Muslims," he says.

Now the cafe, neat and shiny, faces closure because kebabs are not selling well—largely because deteriorating security in Kabul has made people frightened to eat out or visit the city.



Soviets Engineered Islamists' Hatred of America

Lt. Gen. Ion Mihai Pacepa (below), the highest-ranking defector from the former Soviet bloc, fled to the U.S. in 1978 when he was the deputy chief of Communist Romania's foreign intelligence service. He was also a top advisor to Nicolae Ceausescu, the country's Soviet-allied leader.



Pacepa: Because they have another, more important thing in common: anti-Semitism. Long before we had the Holocaust in Germany, we had the Russian word pogrom, defined as the "government-organized mass slaughter of some element of the population as a group, such as the Jewish pogroms in tsarist Russia." And long before we had Hitler's Mein Kampf, we had the Protocols of the Elders of Zion, a tsarist Russian anti-Semitic forgery that became the basis for much of Mein Kampf and for today's new anti-Semitism.

The KGB community, when I was at its top, spent many years and huge amounts of money to turn the Islamic world into an explosive enemy of the United States. Islam and the Arab

world, [KGB chairman Yuri] Andropov told me in 1972, were a petri dish in which we could nurture a strain of America-hate, grown from the bacterium of Marxist thought. Islam's doctrine of soul-purifying *jihad* was the twin to our own soul-purifying romance with revolutionary nihilism.

The Muslims' anti-Semitism ran deep. We had only to keep repeating our disinformation: that the United States was a war-mongering, Zionist country financed by Jewish money and run by a rapacious "Council of the Elders of Zion" (the KGB's derisive epithet for the U.S. Congress), the aim of which was to transform the rest of the world into a Jewish fiefdom.

The cumulative effect of over 20-plus years of disseminating millions of copies of the *Protocols of the Elders of Zion* throughout the Islamic world and portraying the United States as a criminal Zionist surrogate should have made some dent. Witness the 1979 takeover of the U.S. embassy in Tehran, the 1983 bombing of the U.S. Marine barracks in Beirut, the 1993 bombing of the World Trade Center in New York, and the 1998 destruction of the U.S. embassies in Kenya and Tanzania.

September 11, 2001 is another heart-rending proof of that. Few people noted that on that same day, the KGB was celebrating 124 years since the birth of its founder, Felix Dzerzhinsky. A videotape depicting the grisly decapitation and dismembering of Wall Street Journal reporter Daniel Pearl in 2002 offers further evidence that Andropov's strategy succeeded. Pearl was gruesomely murdered only because he was an American Jew.

This is a significant look behind the scenes at strange bedfellows. ZLM has an obligation to expose these unholy alliances wherever we find them. —Myles



5,000-Year-Old Leopard Trap Discovered in Israel

Archaeologists recently unearthed a 5,000-year-old leopard trap in Israel's Negev Desert.

The trap was found near a 1,600-year-old trap and was originally thought to be just a few hundred years old. It is almost identical to traps used by the nomadic Bedouins as recently as a century ago.

"The most exciting thing is the antiquity of these carnivore traps, which suggests that farmers in the area were much more advanced than originally thought," said study co-author Naomi Porat, a geochronologist with the Geological Survey of Israel.

The tests that proved the age of the traps used a technique called "optical dating." It determines how much time has passed since a material was exposed to sunlight—in this case, how long the underside of the trap had been shielded since being built. Radioactive energy is absorbed over thousands of years in the shade, but is released when touched by sunlight. By comparing this absorption measurement with background levels of radiation in the area, a date for the trap could be calculated.

The trap was designed to lure leopards (or other predators, such as foxes, hyenas, and wolves) in through the front with some bait, before slamming shut behind it. This would have been an essential method for ancient farmers to keep the hungry hunters away from the sheep and goats they raised for milk, clothing, and goods. Credit: Naomi Porat





Jews Indigenous to the Holy Land

As a Native Canadian, I take strong issue with Palestinians' appropriation of the Native cause. To begin, though Palestinian propagandists love to characterize Zionism (that is, Jewish nationalism) and the re-establishment of Israel in 1948 as colonial enterprises, it is the Jews who are aboriginal to the Holy Land. Jews' language, history, culture, and folklore were born and forged in the Holy Land. There is no statute of limitations on being indigenous. Accordingly, to claim the Jews are colonizers in the Holy Land delegitimizes all indigenous peoples.

In stark contrast, Arabs arrived in the Holy Land only in the seventh century when Muslim armies colonized the Middle East. Longstanding presence may generate rights, but it is not synonymous with being indigenous. For example, Europeans have been on American soil for centuries, but that does not render them indigenous in the political sense. Tellingly, Palestinians are silent with respect to the rights of indigenous peoples still dominated by Arab states from Morocco to Iraq.



Second, there can be no comparison of the Palestinians' experience to that of Native Canadians. North American indigenous peoples suffered unprecedented genocide. Our people were obliterated through massacres, disease, starvation, and forced assimilation in an attempt to remove us from the pages of history. (This, ironically, was the declared aim of the Arab armies that attacked Israel in 1948.) Sixty-five million people were reduced to fewer than three million.



The Palestinians, on the other hand, have grown from a population of approximately one million in 1948 to more than six million today. The average Palestinian under Israeli rule lives in conditions that our people could have only dreamed of and that are often better than those on reservations. Moreover, the Palestinians have received approximately \$30 billion in international aid since 1993. This, despite Palestinian nationalism's preferred method of expression being terrorism.

Third, I am offended that my people's cause appears to serve merely as a prop for Palestinian propaganda. For example, I have seen material juxtaposing Native-American symbols — the feather, a symbol of peace — to AK-47 assault rifles, a symbol of Arab militarism. And yet, unlike most Palestinian nationalist groups, Native rights movements seek to be peaceful and inclusive. Palestinian groups who are otherwise too eager to wrap themselves in the indigenous mantle systematically ignore this crucial difference.

Zionist activists, on the other hand, seem genuinely motivated to help, and have shared innovative agricultural techniques with Native groups. They have highly relevant water technology to share as well. They are democratic and don't exaggerate the tragedies they have suffered. And they listen. The importance of this cannot be overstated.

For too long, we Natives have let an uncompromising and reactionary Palestinian narrative substitute for facts. But today, the stakes are too high for that. Natives cannot let themselves be used as ornamentation for often-damaging Palestinian propaganda.

Spectre of Islam Haunting the Free World

"A spectre is haunting Europe—the spectre of Communism," Karl Marx once famously wrote. Today, another spectre is haunting the entire world—the spectre of Islam. And yet, many politicians seem to fail to notice.

On the last day of September, 50 students of an agricultural college in Nigeria were gunned down in their dormitories by terrorists from the Islamic organization Boko Haram. They share this goal with the Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC), which counts 57 member-states and forms the largest voting bloc in the United Nations. In 1990, it superseded the 1948 Universal Declaration of Human Rights with its own Cairo Declaration on Human Rights in Islam, which explicitly states that all human rights and freedoms "are subject to the Islamic Sharia."

Islamic law is barbaric and cruel.

Flogging, stoning, and even crucifixion are permitted penalties under sharia law. It discriminates against women and non-Muslims. In 2003, the European Court of Human Rights declared, "Sharia is incompatible with the fundamental principles of democracy." And yet, few Western leaders seem to worry about attempts to replace our basic liberties with sharia law.





On the contrary, when confronted with atrocities, Western leaders downplay the role of Islam. They claim that "nothing in Islam justifies these dreadful acts." However, the justification of the dreadful acts is in the Koran. Sura 8:12 leaves followers of Islam in no doubt about what to do with nonbelievers: "Strike off their heads, maim them in every limb!" Mohammed's book is full of similar verses that incite its Islamic readers to commit violent acts against non-Muslims.

Winston Churchill once quoted Alexander the Great, saying, "The people of Asia were slaves because they had not learned how to pronounce the word 'no'." 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
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
