Jews and Christians have become very good at itemizing what divides them and dwelling on the differences. But I wish that we could focus, rather, on what unites us. Evangelical author Joel C. Rosenberg did that recently with a clear and generous testimony for Jesus in a Modern Orthodox synagogue.

Rosenberg discussed researching World War II Europeans who helped the Jews and how it led him to discover the incredible actions by the French village of Le Chambon-sur-Lignon whose residents resolved to save Jewish people from the Nazi furnaces. They risked their own lives, and many lost them when they were taken to the camps with the Jews. But to the villagers, saving the Jews was "the most natural thing to do!"

Rosenberg expressed fear that a second Holocaust would take place, especially if Iran goes nuclear. It is a real fear because Iran wants the eradication of Israel more than anything. Even though Iranian president Hassan Rouhani sugarcoats his anti-Semitism to the West, his goal is the total annihilation of Israel. Will there be Christians to stand for Israel?


If a Christian is defined by a commitment to follow Yeshua's teaching based on the Bible, then the boundaries are clear. Christians are forgiven, not perfected (at least not yet). Christians can and will make mistakes, wrong judgments, and even biased decisions. Yet, in Leviticus 19:18 we read: "You shall not take vengeance, nor bear any grudge against the sons of your people, but you shall love your neighbor as yourself...." Yeshua repeats this in Matthew 5:43–44, taking it one step further: "You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you."

On one hand, Rosenberg claimed that while some Christians have made mistakes about the Jews, even mistakes that led to the death of some, this cannot disqualify them as born-again Evangelicals. On the other hand, he stated that genuine Bible-believing followers of the Jewish Messiah are not characterized by chronic hatred leading to a constant desire to destroy the Jews or any other human being.

One of the most important aspects of true Christianity is the ability to love unconditionally. Christians who love Jews ought to love them regardless of their willingness to embrace Yeshua. Anything short of that kind of love falls short of what Christian love is. Period!

Fellow speaker Rabbi Shlomo Riskin didn't share Rosenberg's belief in Yeshua as Messiah but recognized the common obligation of followers of the One True God: They must be driven not only by their convictions but also by a constant desire for human decency and justice.

Christians and Jews *are united* by the Jewish Scriptures and their love for Israel! Christians and Jews *can be united* by Yeshua the Jewish Messiah!

# A Hidden Hero—Haym Salomon By Myles To Go By Myles Weiss ZLP Host



The Bible holds stories of people who affected world events while functioning behind the scenes. Mordecai convinced Esther (Esther 4:14), his orphan niece, to stand before the king on behalf of Israel. Rahab (Joshua 2) hid the spies of Joshua and helped the Israelites take Jericho. Nicodemus (John 19:39) came to Jesus by night and became a disciple who influenced his generation. Lydia (Acts 16:14), Onesimus (Philemon 1:10), and Epaphras (Colossians 1:7) all helped Apostle Paul accomplish his mission.

In the history of America, one can see God's intervention and His desire for us to be a light to the Nations. The very roots of this nation connect to biblical thought, and Scripture informed the foundation of our country.

One hidden hero, Haym Salomon (1740-1785), led a brief and difficult life, but his impact on America was significant. Polish-born Salomon knew Polish, French, German, Russian, Spanish, and Italian. When the British captured him and learned of his language skills, they "lent" him to their Hessian mercenaries to assist in German translations. Instead, Salomon covertly encouraged the Hessians to desert the British army.



Salomon marshaled his personal fortune on behalf of Washington's suffering army, giving all he had in a crucial moment when money made the difference. Escaping another British capture, Salomon fled to Philadelphia where he advanced from penniless fugitive to successful businessman, effectively brokering bills of exchange to meet federal government expenses.

While in Pennsylvania, Salomon helped lead the successful fight to repeal the test oath that barred Jews and other non-Protestants from holding public office in Pennsylvania. He died in 1785, leaving a wife and four young children with debts larger than his estate. It would be fitting if future writers of American history acknowledged as the real financier of the American Revolution "the little Jew" (so named by the fledgling nation's Superintendent of Finance Robert Morris).

This remarkable behind-the-scenes activity prompted dear friends Jim and Rosemary Schindler Garlow to trumpet Salomon's benevolence at the "Washington—A Man of Prayer" event in Washington, D.C. Rosemary, grandniece of Oskar Schindler, eloquently recounted Salomon's loyalty to America. She explained his sacrificial contributions to the Continental Army and the significant loans that




he made to the newly formed government that were never repaid.

As Genesis 12:3 has never been rescinded by the Almighty, only good can result when Believers recognize the generous deeds of American Jews and provide acknowledgement to them and their descendants. For more than three years, Myles and I have been privileged to serve with ZLM at biblical sites in Greece, Turkey, and of course, Israel. What a wonderful way to expand on the anointed teaching we have done together for fifteen years.

Studying God's Word with an emphasis on the Hebrew roots of Christianity connects *Zola Levitt Presents* viewers, *Levitt Letter* readers, *Zola Tours* pilgrims, and levitt.com web-surfers with the scenic locations where the Scriptures unfolded and enhances their spiritual journeys. As you probably have noticed, we are careful not to commercialize or trivialize God's Message.

In God's "coincidence," we began our partnership with this international television ministry just when the series *Ruth: Your People Shall Be My People* came up on the production schedule. This TV series' teaching topic was a kiss from God! For a husband-and-wife team, Jewish and gentile, and with Myles a licensed marriage therapist, it was, well, a *Moed* (Hebrew for Kairos moment)—a Holy appointed time. Ruth's story is OUR story. We've used the Book of Ruth for years in our marriage seminars and to help couples from different traditions find the Lord together.

When we and the film crew landed in Israel at *Shavuot* (Pentecost), the whole nation was celebrating the harvest and reading the Book of Ruth. As the Holy Spirit's arrival at Pentecost began the Church Age, it was a perfect time to produce the series about Jesus' apostles, *Acts: Then and Now...the Story Continues*. To hear present-day testimonies of leaders in Israel's Messianic community is to remember that the Jewishness of the Gospel is not new; it is 2,000 years old but most certainly alive and well today. Myles loves to recount his first "Jews for Jesus" NYC summer campaign. We were courting, and he called me to share the building's inscription: "Jews for Jesus—Established 32 A.D., Give or Take A Year"!



After the *Ruth* and *Acts* series, we began laying the Abrahamic foundation. Although Zola and Jeff Seif had created remarkable programs on seemingly all the Bible stories, producer Ken Berg felt led to broadcast more-detailed teaching on Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. We heartily signed on for *Abraham: Father of Faith* followed by *Sons of Promise: Isaac and Jacob*. Taken together, these programs confirm the Abrahamic Covenant and explain the difference between God's blessing Ishmael and His covenant with Isaac. These lessons assume increased importance with the "new" Replacement Theology pressing to displace Jewish history, covenant, Land connection, and legitimacy.

It is imperative for this ministry to speak God's truth in love and to invite "whosoever" (Revelation 22:17) on this Journey of Restoration. We cannot do this without your gifts of funds. No gift is too small—or too large. We know that you value God's Word. Please help us illuminate it. # 5 Ways to Stand with Israel in Crisis

As anti-Semitism grows and Israel's neighboring countries set their military sights on the Holy Land, it's increasingly imperative that we stand with the Jewish people. Here are five ways to do so:

1) Pray for the peace of Jerusalem Prayer can move mountains, bring down governments, and do what seems impossible in the natural realm. Only through prayer can peace be sustained in Israel's capital. Yet when Believers quote Psalm 122:6 and mention praying for the most important city on Earth, too often it translates into an occasional one-sentence prayer. That won't cut it considering the forces of darkness warring against humanity's centerpiece.

How should you pray, then? Start by asking God to reveal His heart for Jerusalem to you. Ask the Holy Spirit to give you a burden for Jewish people. Then step back

and watch your prayers change for this critical area and people.

2) Recognize the importance of Israel One of Satan's cleverest end-times deceptions—that's working even among Christians—is that Israel is just another country. This diminished view has yielded everything from Replacement Theology to complete apathy for Israel's current dilemma






with its jihadist neighbors. Amid the enemy's lies, Believers must wake up and realize the vital role Israel has played and will continue to play in human history until Jesus returns.

- 3) Honor our Hebraic roots As gentile Believers, we have been grafted into the tree of God, the "root" of which is Israel (Rom. 11). Paul warned gentiles to not boast but to "remember that you do not support the root, but the root supports you" (v. 18). Even Jesus pointed out that "salvation is of the Jews" (John 4:22). It's astounding how Western Christianity downplays this truth, usually under the pretext that Believers now live under God's grace and mercy. But let's not forget to honor the avenue through which that grace and mercy—and every blessing from God—first came.
- **4) Understand the complexity of Israel** Many Christians avoid "the Israel conversation" because it mingles politics with faith. Our call to stand with Israel is not political but inevitably involves politics. And because politics involves people groups, we must resist the temptation to make this a black-and-white, Palestinian-vs.-Jew feud. God's love extends to every person in Israel. No matter how many politicians try, this conflict can't be resolved except through Jesus. Because of that, we must...
- ...5) Join with Messianic Believers in furthering the Gospel Our call to stand with Israel is not conditional upon Jews being saved. Yet, why not support those ministries of Messianics whose vision is to see their Jewish brothers and sisters come to meet Yeshua HaMashiach?

# The Gates of Jerusalem PICTORIAL SERIES / The Golden Gate

The gates of Jerusalem were more than passageways. They served as places for personal business and civic affairs. Some gates took their names from the distant cities they faced, like Jaffa, Damascus, and Shechem. Other names reflected purpose, like Fountain and Dung. We will examine these ancient passages for their historical attributes and spiritual meanings.

During Nehemiah's time (5th century B.C.), the gates into the city numbered 12. Seven of eight gates open into the Old City today. And Revelation describes 12 in the New Jerusalem.





The Golden Gate, the oldest of all Jerusalem's gates, was built by Byzantine Emperor Heraclius around 627 A.D. atop the ruins of previous gates. The stones in the wall just above the ground date to the 6th century B.C.

Located on the eastern side of Jerusalem's Old City wall (thus also known as Eastern Gate), it faces the Mount of Olives. The New Testament mentions it as Beautiful Gate.

The double-arched Golden Gate consists of the only two gates that lead directly to the Temple Mount. The southern arch is Gate of Mercy (Sha'ar HaRachamim). In ancient times, Jews would pray in front of the gate asking Almighty for mercy. The northern arch is Gate of Repentance (Sha'ar Teshuva)—the closest entrance to the Temple of Solomon.

Spiritual significance: Jesus entered Jerusalem on a donkey through the Golden Gate on Palm Sunday, thereby fulfilling Zechariah's prophecy of 9:9. Jews and



Christians expect Messiah to enter Jerusalem through the Golden Gate. The gate also features in end-times prophecies. Zechariah claims that when the Messiah passes through the gate, He'll blow a ram's horn and all the dead in the Jewish cemetery on the Mount of Olives will rise from their graves (14:4). Ezekiel in 44:1–2 describes his vision: "Then He brought me back to the outer gate of the sanctuary which faces toward the east, but it was shut. And the Lord said to me, 'This gate shall be shut; it shall not be opened, and no man shall enter by it..."

Jewish rabbis describe the Messiah as a great military leader who will enter the Eastern Gate and liberate the city from foreign control. To prevent this, around the time when Caliph Abdel-Malik built the Dome of the Rock on the Temple Mount (692 A.D.), Muslims also sealed the gate with a 15-foot-thick stone structure. Then they put a Muslim cemetery in front of it believing that Jesus as High Priest would not defile Himself by walking through a cemetery. Little did they know, they were fulfilling Ezekiel's prophecy.

Watch for: Damascus Gate, Lions' Gate, Zion Gate, and others.

### Why Are Native Israelis Called "Sabras"?

My son lives in the Mount Tabor region of the Lower Galilee, where the sabra cactus is prolific. In Hebrew, the plant is called *tzabar*, meaning "to accumulate, amass, store, collect." This makes sense, observing the sabra's pattern of growth. It expands rapidly, creating a clump of large paddle-like "leaves." Sabra make an intimidating fence, the long sharp spines discouraging any would-be intruder. You couldn't pay me enough to walk through one of those mean looking natural barriers!

Why are native Israelis called sabras? To understand, we need to explore another feature of the plant—the fruit that it produces. Known elsewhere as "prickly pear cactus," the sabra produces a tasty "pear-like" fruit. These buds appear on the edge of the cactus's pads and take on a striking bright red to burgundy color. Once the thick, inedible skin is removed, the sweet jelly-like interior of the sabra fruit can be enjoyed. In Central America, the sabra's native habitat, prickly pear fruit is a popular market item.

O.K. So, the fruit is prickly and daunting on the outside, but sweet and tender on the inside. This combination of qualities is the classic answer for why native Israelis are called *sabras*. In general, the Israeli who is born in

Israel and raised in this feisty environment develops a tough exterior while maintaining a softness within. Often, this tenderness is accessible only after a few encounters, once the sabra knows you are "for real," i.e. not taking advantage of him.


Millennia of rejection, expulsion, mass extermination, and

terrorist massacres created an element of suspicion in the Jewish psyche. This protective "spiny skin" plays out within Israeli society, and not only in relationships with outsiders. Every day, I experience the defensiveness and quickness to feel "put upon" of my fellow Israelis toward each other. Simultaneously, I see my neighbors' readiness to help someone in need and to open their homes to those they've only recently met.

Living in this land nearly 22 years, I can affirm the sabra reputation. While Israelis refuse to judge people by stereotypes, understanding legitimate national and cultural characteristics helps us relate to and appreciate one another. How can this be applied to Israeli friends, acquaintances, and the shopkeeper you might meet during a visit to this amazing land? First, be patient. The initial reaction you get rarely indicates the sabra's heart. If you extend genuine respect and interest, and stand your ground, the sabra eventually reveals that tender, sweet soul. It is this Israeli soul that Yeshua, Israel's Shepherd King,

they are not a threat. In any case, few Palestinians have ever been unsafe in Israel, and as I have pointed out, it is Israelis who are unsafe because of Palestinian



# Ask the Chaplain

Do you have any teaching materials on speaking in tongues? I believe that miracle occurred for a time, according to Paul, but then discontinued. Also that it constituted different languages at Pentecost, and occurred so that the diverse people there heard the Gospel, spoken by Peter and the apostles, in their own languages. Does this agree with your understanding?

A few of my friends believe that they have this special gift, yet what they speak doesn't sound like a language to me but rather babbling. I suspect their "gifts" to be more likely Satan up to his old tricks of counterfeiting.

Acts 2 and other parts of the New Testament appear to define the gift of tongues as languages that are otherwise foreign to the speaker being supernaturally spoken without previous learning.

The controversy surrounding this gift is so entrenched that the opposing camps have names: Continuationists

believe the gift is still present today, while Cessationists believe the gift ceased after the Apostolic Age (~100 A.D.)

I think that the gift is still in limited use where needed, for example in the mission field, until The End when we see Jesus face to face and that which is "perfect" has come (1 Cor. 13:9–10).





Todd Baker, Eric Oler, and my husband, Robin, and I formed last spring's **To The Jew First** outreach team. Every outreach energizes us as we take God's Word back to His people who first shared it with us.

Yonathan tended a juice kiosk where I ordered a small pomegranate, celery, ginger, and carrot drink. A young man, he had immigrated to Israel (made *aliyah*) at a very early age with his parents. His interest piqued when I told him about Yeshua as the Messiah, and he eagerly accepted some informational tracts and a complete Hebrew Bible, which includes both the *Tanakh* (OT) and *B'rit Hadashah* (NT).

Witnessing to Israel Defense Forces (IDF) soldiers on Mount Hermon is always a major highlight for me. Mount Hermon, whose summit straddles the border between Syria

Next month, Todd will report on one of the six IDF soldiers who received complete Bibles in Hebrew. As Eric drove us "up to Jerusalem," we read Psalms 120–134, the Songs of Ascent.

Robin gave 200 shekels to Alexander, an Israeli man who was down on his luck. Then when Robin handed him a complete Bible and *Isaiah 53 Explained*, both in Hebrew, Alexander said with amazement that God had just answered his prayer.

### **Israel: Separated for Security**

Walls, barriers, fences, call them what you will: Some are thousands of miles long and designed to keep criminals, illegal entrants, terrorists, and would-

be conquerors out—a good idea.

So why is Israel's wall singled out as "apartheid" when its purpose is simply to protect Israel's citizens? You have to see the singling out as **nothing but anti-Semitism**.

While security fences/barriers are common throughout the world, Israel's decision in 2003 to construct one generated international protests and a hearing at the International Court of Justice. No other security barrier has ever met with such resistance.

The city of **Jericho** built one of the earliest and most famed protective walls. **Uruk** in ancient Sumer (Mesopotamia), **Babylon**, and **Cartagena** were also well-known walled cities.

Medieval Britain built walled villages. The entire population of the village—including animals—lived within walls with heavy doors that closed at night for protection. The picturesque city of **York** (below) boasted such a wall.




Rio de Janeiro In 2009, Rio de Janeiro started building walls around some of its "favelas," shanty towns that crowd the hills around the city. Said to prevent communities from spilling over into the forest of the Tijuca Park, some critics

think Rio's walls are an attempt to separate the poor from the rich. Others say they are intended to limit drug trafficking, as part of a planned regional government clampdown. (below)



China – North Korea Fears of a catastrophic famine in North Korea have China topping 10′–13′ fences with barbed wire along an eight-mile stretch of the Yalu River.

### **Israelis Living Longer, Economy Flourishing**

Israeli average life expectancy is 82, among the world's highest. Israel's economy is expected to grow 3.2% in 2014 and 3.5% in 2015. According to a recent report by OECD (Organization for Economic Co-operation and Development), Israel's economy "will be buoyed by a gradually improving external environment, the benefit of which should be amplified by expanding gas

production and persistently low interest rates." By comparison, OECD figures show that the U.S. economy is expected to grow by 2.6% in 2014 and by 3.5% in 2015. Israel's unemployment rate is also expected to remain impressively low: 5.9% in 2014 and 5.8% in 2015.

### **Hebrew**Lesson

#### Trusting God's Heart

יוֹם אִירָא אֲנִי אֵלֶיךְ אֶבְטְח

"When I am afraid, I put my trust in you." (Psalm 56:3)



"There is no fear in love," and therefore over and over the Spirit of God says, "don't be afraid..." When we are afraid, we are believing the lie there is something beyond God's control or reach, and therefore God is "not enough." In times of testing—in "the day you are afraid"remind yourself of what is real. God formed you in your mother's womb, breathed into you nishmat chayim (the breath of life), and numbers all your days. Every breath you take, every heartbeat in your chest is ordained from Heaven, and indeed, there is not a moment of your life apart from God's sovereign and sustaining grace. So what, then, are you afraid of? Dying? Judgment in the world to come? Being left unloved, bereft of home, abandoned, consigned to outer darkness? King David said, "If I make my bed in Hell, behold, You are there" (Psalm 139:8). Look, the LORD God is not only present in your "happy moments," when you feel "put together" and respectable, but He is present in your desperate moments, in your hunger, your thirst, and in your secrets. If you can't detect God's hand in your circumstances, then trust His heart. May you never lose sight of God's love, especially in times of distress and trouble, since He is always working all things together for your ultimate good (Rom. 8:28).

The Name of the LORD (יהוהה) means "Presence" and "Love" (Exodus 3:14; 34:5–7). Yeshua said, "I go to prepare a place for you," which means that His presence and love are waiting for you in whatever lies ahead (Rom. 8:35-39). To worry is "practicing the absence" of God instead of practicing His Presence. Trust the word of the Holy Spirit:

"For I know the plans I have for you, declares the LORD, plans for healing peace and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope (Jer. 29:11). The Word always speaks hope.

Take comfort that your Heavenly
Father knows when the sparrow
falls; He arrays the flower in its hidden

valley; and He calls each star by name. More importantly, the Lord sees you and knows your struggle with fear. Come to Him with your needy heart and trust Him to deliver you

from the burdens of your soul (Matt. 11:28). Heed these words of encouragement spoken from our Savior: Come to Me; I love you, I accept you; I receive you; please, be welcome with Me; I will take your hand, I will be with you.



Psalm 134 Sandra and Jeff conclude this series having seen many "coming up" to




### **The Stones Cry Out**

Twelve 30-minute TV programs (3 DVDs)

Recent archaeological discoveries validate the biblical record. To film "dig" sites and interview the experts, Zola journeyed to Israel and Jordan. Just as our Lord said about this remarkable Land, *The Stones Cry Out*.

**The Tunnel** Zola walks the tunnel under the western edge of the Temple Mount. We get a journalist's perspective of the Palestinian uproar that erupted when the tunnel was opened to the public in 1996.

**A Tale of Two Temples** An unearthed marketplace shows the Roman destruction of the Temple. Mount Gerizim to the north hosts the excavation of a Samaritan temple patterned after the Jerusalem Temple.



**Rulers in Stone** Caesarea, on Israel's Mediterranean coast, has yielded first-century finds such as the first extra-biblical reference to Pontius Pilate, and a full-size Temple replica. At Tel Dan, the "House of David" has been confirmed archaeologically.

**The Jerusalem That Was** Bible Lands Museum houses a model of Jerusalem ca. 586 B.C. In the City of David, we examine a four-room house, typical architecture for ancient Israelites.


**Past and Future Destruction** Ongoing excavations at Hazor have unearthed Canaanite idols and confirmation of the city burning as recorded in Joshua 11. The Valley of Armageddon holds prophetic archaeological significance.



**Archaeology and the Scriptures** In Jerusalem, Zola explains the history of the Citadel, also called "David's Tower." We talk with the Israel Antiquities Authority.

**Cities of the Past** Zippori was a thriving cultural center in Galilee that probably influenced Jesus as a boy in Nazareth. Ekron was one of five prominent Old Testament cities of the Philistines.

**Shadows from the Past** A chamber of tombs, near the Garden Tomb but dated to the time of the First Temple, helps us understand burial customs of that day. We visit the Qumran cave where the first Dead Sea Scroll was found.



**A Tale of Three Cities** In biblical times, a business relationship existed between three Jordan Valley cities: Beit Shean, Rehovot (west of the Jordan River), and Pella (east of the Jordan River). We visit excavations in each city.

**The Rose Red City** The ancient Nabataeans were famous for their skill in rock carving. Petra, their capital southeast of the Dead Sea, is the "rose red" city known for its magnificent buildings carved into the native rock.

**A Man Crucified** On display at the Rockefeller Museum in Jerusalem, a man's heel bone that was pierced by a nail is the first archaeological proof of Roman crucifixions in Israel.

**Truth from the Stones** Zola discusses how the artifacts shown throughout this series illuminate Scripture, and how Believers can be encouraged when *The Stones Cry Out*.

#### WISE AS A SERPENT / By Mark Levitt

### Your Best Bet...

... is not to gamble, ever. Any temptation to try your luck with wagering on games of chance probably stems from overestimating not only the odds of winning but also the likelihood of knowing when to stop in order to keep your winnings.

The Wall Street Journal recently answered the question, "How Often Do Gamblers Really Win?" An unprecedented trove of public data details the behavior of thousands of anonymous Internet gamblers over a 2-year period. Over the full period, just 11% of players ended up in the black, and most of those pocketed less than \$150. Losers of more than \$5,000 outnumbered big winners by a whopping 31:1.

The analysis concerned 4,222 Internet gamblers who played casino-style games such as blackjack, roulette, and slots. European online-gambling giant "Bwin.Party Digital Entertainment PLC" made the raw data available to gambling-addiction researchers affiliated with Harvard Medical School.

A different database of gambling in the northwestern U.S. produced similar patterns and similarly skewed ratios of big losers to big winners. Jim Kilby, a former professor and now author of three books on casino management, said the scant number of winners surprised even him. Although gamblers know the house has an edge, he said, "the average person doesn't understand the math" of the multiplier effect: "Casino games are nibbling machines, and the more nibbles you have, the bigger your losses."

Joachim Haeusler, Bwin's oxymoronic "responsible gaming" manager, said the company provides entertainment and people shouldn't gamble "based on the idea to get rich, because they won't." Unfortunately, "gambling for entertainment" ushers unsuspecting patrons to addiction.



An Indiana University report on addictive behaviors related the "thrill" gamblers talk about. As in other addictive behaviors where beta-endorphins in the brain cause individuals to repeat a behavior to obtain the pleasant feeling, the treatment for compulsive gambling involves withdrawal symptoms similar to those suffered by addicts of depressant drugs: headaches, abdominal pain, diarrhea, cold sweats, tremor, and nightmares.

Proverbs 13:11 explains, "Wealth gained by vanity will be diminished, but he who gathers by labor will increase." Statistical data and neuroscience prove that regret is the most likely "prize" in games of chance.





Seniors are particularly vulnerable to problem gambling for several reasons, including loneliness, time on their hands, access to money and casinos, and greater disposable income. While not every senior who visits a casino is a problem gambler, gambling can be a bad bet against their retirement.

As a matter of stewardship, investing in the Kingdom of God consistently yields eternal winnings. (Matthew 6:20–21) With Zola Levitt Ministries, what you see is what you get. 
#### Women Serving Yeshua

And that's what we feel about women's role in the Church. —Myles






# The Wheel Gets an Israeli Update

When Israeli farmer Gilad Wolf broke his pelvis in 2008, he resolved not to let his crops wither on the vine and became determined to turn his wheelchair into a workhorse. After suffering the pain that came from traversing the bumpy rows of his field in a stock chair, he began developing new designs better suited to off-road applications. He experimented with solutions based on farm equipment and ultimately took his concepts to the Rad-BioMed Technology Accelerator in Tel Aviv where he got the help required to transform a concept sketch into a patent-pending product called **SoftWheel**.

In traditional wheelchair designs, up to 30 percent of expended energy is lost because they lack suspension, leaving only 70–80 percent of the energy put into the chair for propulsion. This creates uncomfortable rides and fatigued drivers. "Most of the time, the user is driving a rigid wheel with no suspension, and it breaks his back and shakes his fillings loose," says SoftWheel CEO Daniel Barel.

SoftWheel addresses this problem with its symmetric and selective technology that uses three compression cylinders to absorb shocks within the wheel before the shocks are transferred to the rider. The goal is to make the wheel's hub essentially float in mid-air while suspending the chair's mass. Practically, this means riders can traverse stairs and curbs nearly as easily as gliding down a



SoftWheel is novel, backward compatible, and has applications in other product categories, like bicycles. "We bought off-the-shelf bicycles, and within 10 minutes we put SoftWheels on them; it was just plug and play," says Barel. This modular aspect of the design also makes switching out wheels relatively simple, a fact that has attracted interest in a number of industrial and aeronautic applications. Barel ultimately believes his product

could be applied to cars, trains, cranes, and even airplane landing gear—basically anything that has a wheel.

There are no fundamental breakthroughs in materials science or physics in the SoftWheel; the pieces are all commonplace, just arranged differently. It's clever, and fairly cool looking, but not a reinvention of the wheel.

SoftWheel has a full production setup in Israel and plans to start selling wheelchair wheels later this year priced about \$400 over a standard set of wheels.







### **Control Colon Disease**

A team of scientists from the Faculty of Life Sciences at Bar-Ilan University has used genetic engineering to create a strain of mice with reduced sensitivity to colitis, chronic inflammation of the colon.

The results of the team's research have led to new understanding of ways in which human sensitivity to chronic diseases like colitis can be controlled. Some five million people worldwide suffer from infectious and chronic intestinal disease. This type of disease has a severe impact on patients' quality of life, and can also lead to the development of fatal intestinal diseases such as colon cancer.

**Prof. Uri Nir** (below right) headed the study. Doctoral candidate Shai Bel identified a gene known as TMF that controls the mucous structure in the colons of mammals. Bel found that a defect in this gene that prevents it from operating properly leads to a change in the mucous structure, which in turn causes a significant increase in the amount of probiotic bacteria in the intestine.

These bacteria keep the colon from developing colitis. The trait of resistance to disease can be transferred from the genetically engineered mice to regular mice by exposing the control group to the intestinal bacteria of the genetically engineered ones.

The results of the study were published recently in the journal *Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences.*

# The Netanyahu-Pope Spat That Wasn't

At the end of the Pope's Holy Land visit, the press reported a sparring match between Pope Francis and Benjamin Netanyahu that never really transpired. To judge by media reports, the Israeli Prime Minister had a testy exchange with the Supreme Pontiff over whether or not Jesus spoke Hebrew. Reuters broke the story with the headline "Pope, Netanyahu spar over Jesus' native language." Using the language of verbal combat, the piece reported the Israeli leader as saying, "Jesus was here, in this land. He spoke Hebrew." The Pope was said to have "interjected" with a correction: "Aramaic." To this, Bibi "shot back" that Jesus "spoke Aramaic, but he knew Hebrew." The Chicago Tribune soon dubbed the incident a "spat," and by the time it made its way to The Age in Australia, Netanyahu was said to have "publicly bickered" with the Pope, evincing the "sour undertone" of the Catholic leader's entire visit to Israel. The Forward tweeted "#Jesusgate spat over Hebrew ends testy #PopeFrancis visit with Benjamin Netanyahu."

But unfortunately for headline writers hoping to gin up controversy for clicks, there is video of this supposed smackdown, and it shows nothing of the sort. Pope Francis is laughing throughout the entire exchange, which to a normal observer would appear to be an amiable conversation between friends (albeit one mediated by a translator), not a "spat." As New York Times Middle East reporter Liam Stack tweeted, "not sure this counts as sparring."

Perhaps the reason the Pope is chuckling when he quibbles with Netanyahu is that he knows they are both right. As the scholar quoted by Reuters in their own piece explains, "Jesus was a native Aramaic speaker, but he would have also known Hebrew," which was spoken by "the kind of people he ministered to." Whatever language Jesus may or may not have spoken, it is clear that despite attempts by some media outlets to imply otherwise, the incident is not indicative of any hostility Francis harbors toward the Israeli Prime Minister.

This can be seen not only from the  $\underline{\text{video}}$  of their exchange, but from the photo (at bottom left) from the Pope's farewell ceremony, where the two parted on warm terms.

But the real shame here is not that the media got something wrong. It is that they missed the powerful and poignant significance of this unscripted moment between Israel's leader and the Pope.

Throughout Jewish history, there have been profoundly consequential public disputations between renowned Jewish thinkers and Catholic interlocutors, most famously in Paris (1240), Barcelona (1263), and Tortosa (1413–14). Typically, these debates were rigged, with the Jew forced to participate and preordained to lose. And if the Jew performed too well in representing Judaism, he sometimes had to flee the country afterward for his safety. Other dire consequences for Jews and their communities were common—after the Disputation of Paris, for instance, in which the Jew was tasked with "defending" the Talmud from charges of blasphemy, thousands of copies of the Jewish text were seized and publicly burned.

The playful chat over Jesus between Francis and Netanyahu, then, is more than just a momentary media story. It underscores just how far Jewish-Catholic relations have come. Today, the Prime Minister of a reconstituted Jewish state can rib good-naturedly about Jesus with the Pope, and the only fallout is a few hyperbolic headlines. No longer subject to the whims of Christian rulers in Europe, compelled to participate in a theological game they cannot win, Jews can now dialogue with Christians as peers, not adversaries. Seen in historical context, the Francis-Bibi exchange is a heartening sign of interfaith progress and reconciliation, and a testament to the transformative success of the Zionist project in elevating Jews as religious and political equals.

Or put another way: by hyping a fight between the Pope and the leader of the Jewish state, the media missed the remarkable real story—that there wasn't one.







### Camels Transmit Deadly MERS Virus To Humans

Nasal discharge of camels could transmit the deadly Middle East Respiratory Syndrome (MERS) coronavirus to humans, alarming research has indicated.

The MERS coronavirus that has already cost about 200 human lives is currently spreading very rapidly in the Arab world. [At least three cases have been reported in the U.S.]

The researchers found that viruses from infected humans and Arabian camels from the same geographical region have nearly identical RNA sequences.

"This indicates transmission between animals and man. The process is referred to as zoonosis," said Norbert Nowotny from the Institute of Virology, University of Veterinary Medicine in Austria.

For the study, the scientists investigated nasal and conjunctival swabs taken from 76 camels in Oman. Virus levels were surprisingly high in the nasal mucosa and conjunctiva of camels. The transmission from animals to humans most likely occurs through these contact sites, especially through nasal discharge, the scientists presume.


"Vaccinations of camels are currently being discussed," Nowotny added.

Saudi Arabia has told people to wear masks around camels. People are taking photos and videos of themselves kissing camels in defiance of a

warning from Saudi health authorities that the animals have been linked to the deadly MERS virus.

In one video, a man stands between a pair of camels and asks one to sneeze. "Look at me! Sneeze, sneeze! They say there's Corona in this," the man says, while hugging and kissing his two camels. Then he shakes one of the camels' heads and says, "She says no. Is there Corona in you? She says no."









### Israel Guide Dog Center for the Blind

Training service dogs is serious business, and at the Israel Guide Dog Center for the Blind, that seriousness is treated with respect. It turns out, however, that training service dogs can also be fun.

"The mission is to train guide dogs for people who are blind and disabled, and to provide them independence, mobility, and confidence," said Dennis Allon, director of resource development at the Center.

"We organize a lot of activities for the sighted and blind alike, and we do a lot of outreach in the community."

The Center prides itself on its intensive training program, which works with about 80 dogs a year and partners at least 35 dogs and clients annually. New puppies live with foster parents, typically college students, in their early months before training with skilled professionals dedicated to their craft.

"The idea is mobility. The dogs are trained to work in the Israeli environment, to get used to the traffic and the buses and the noise in the cities," Allon said. "They learn to refuse demands if they sense danger."



He added, "The dogs are basically opening a blind person up to a whole new world. It's still the best mobility option for a blind person."

Once a dog has finished training, it is paired with a human. The Center takes into consideration the person's lifestyle — do they run marathons, or do they prefer a slower pace?

After the dogs and humans are matched, the Center stays involved with check-up visits and medical care. And once the dogs have fulfilled their duties, they are retired to live their last days in the comfort of a loving foster home.

From start to finish, thought is put into ensuring that the process is warm, accommodating, and in the spirit of *tikkun olam* (healing the world).





# King David's Citadel

An Israeli archaeologist claims to have found the legendary citadel captured by King David in his conquest of Jerusalem, rekindling a longstanding debate about using the Bible as a field guide to identifying ancient ruins.

Eli Shukron joins a string of Israeli archaeologists who claim to have unearthed palaces of the legendary king. Religious tradition reveres David for establishing Jerusalem as the central holy city, though clear-cut evidence of David's existence and reign eludes extra-biblical historians. [A written reference to the "House of David" was found in an archaeological site at Tel Dan in northern Israel in 1993.]

Speaking of the discovery at the City of David, Shukron, who recently left the Israel Antiquities Authority to work as a lecturer and tour guide, says, "The whole site compares perfectly to the Bible."



feet wide. Pottery shards helped date the fortification walls to 3,800 years ago. They are the largest walls found in the region from before the time of King Herod 2,100 years ago. The fortification surrounded a water spring and probably

protected the ancient city's water source.

The fortification was built 800 years before King David captured it from the Jebusites. Shukron says the biblical story of David's conquest of Jerusalem provides clues that point to this particular fortification as David's entry point into the city.



In the Second Book of Samuel, David orders the capture of the walled city by entering it through the water shaft. Shukron's excavation uncovered a narrow shaft where spring water flowed into a carved pool (where city inhabitants would gather to draw water).

Critics say that some archaeologists are too eager to hold a spade in one hand and a Bible in the other in a quest to verify the biblical narrative either due to religious beliefs or to prove the Jewish people's historic ties to the Land. But

respected Israeli archaeologists say recent finds match the biblical account more than naysayers claim.

The City of David archaeological park emphasizes the biblical connection, where the "Spring Citadel" (the excavation's official name) includes a movie projected on a screen in front of the fortification to illustrate how it may have looked 3,800 years ago. The City of David, located in east Jerusalem, is one of the most popular tourist sites in Jerusalem.

"We see how archaeology and the Bible actually come together in this place," said Doron Spielman, vice president of the nonprofit Elad Foundation, which oversees the archaeological park. He carried a softcover Bible in his hand as he ambled around the excavation.

When the Tel Dan Stele was unearthed, Zola broke the news in the television series *The Stones Cry Out*.



### Israeli Lunar XPrize Team

At a Tel Aviv University laboratory, a team of 20 Israelis is building a space-craft they believe will make Israel only the fourth country—after the United States, Russia, and China—to touch down on the moon.



The project, known as **SpaceIL**, aims to launch a three-legged hexagonal craft that appears too puny for interstellar travel, measuring just 3 feet tall and 2 feet wide. SpaceIL is competing against 17 other teams to be the first private spacecraft to land on the moon.

From its origins to its endgame, SpaceIL is a quintessential story of Israel's upstart high-tech sector. Its three founders came together with little preparation and no money—only one holds an academic degree beyond a bachelor's, and they attracted funding through personal connections to pre-eminent scientists. And they say they will win the \$20 million Google Lunar XPrize not by being the biggest or richest team, but by redefining how to send a spacecraft to the moon. "Only superpowers have managed to land on the moon," co-founder Yariv Bash said. "SpaceIL is doing it as a nonprofit."

Launched by Google in 2007, the Lunar XPrize has straightforward rules: The first team to land an unmanned spacecraft on the moon, move it 500 meters (1,640 ft.) — about the length of  $5\frac{1}{2}$  football fields — across the moon's surface, and transmit high-definition photos and video back to Earth wins



\$20 million. The mission must be complete by the end of 2015. Nearly all of the other contenders plan to launch tank-like rovers to roll across the moon's surface. SpaceII's craft is the size of a dishwasher and weighs just 300 pounds, two-thirds of which is fuel. Rather than drive across the moon, it will take off again after landing and jump 500 meters. Its navigation system will double as a camera and its steering thrusters will quide its landing.

"We're taking cameras for HD video transmission, so the best thing is to reuse those cameras instead of taking a bulky radar system," Bash said. "If I can just write more code for my camera, code doesn't weigh anything."





Yonatan Winetraub, a project co-founder, connected up with Israel Space Agency head Yitzhak Ben Yisrael, who gave the group three minutes on stage at a space technology convention in Tel Aviv. It was enough to convince philanthropists at the convention to give SpaceIL its seed money and lure Ben Yisrael to join the group's board. SpaceIL has since received support from Rona Ramon, the widow of Israeli astronaut Ilan Ramon.

The Penn State Lunar Lion Team, an XPrize team housed at Pennsylvania State University, also is building a small craft that will jump the 500 meters. Team director Michael Paul said small projects like theirs and SpaceIL could complement large government initiatives and broaden the reach of space exploration.
