Purim– We Need Modern-Day Esthers

This month, Jews around the world will celebrate Purim. It is perhaps the most festive holiday on the Jewish calendar, and though Christians do not usually celebrate it, many know the story behind it, as do Jewish children who grow up hearing it every year.

Purim recalls the deliverance of the Jewish people from their enemies nearly 2,400 years ago. The king of Persia chose a beautiful young woman named Esther to be his queen, unaware that she was Jewish. Esther heard from Mordecai, her uncle, that the king had entrusted the fate of Persian Jews to Haman, the king's top adviser. Haman may have been one of history's earliest anti-Semites: he hated the Jews and issued an order to kill them all.

At great risk to her own life, Esther revealed to the king that she was Jewish and pleaded with him to save her people. He agreed to do so, and, in a fitting twist, decreed for

Haman the death sentence Haman himself had planned to carry out on the Jews.

Relevant Lessons

Esther's story, though thousands of years old, teaches us several lessons that are relevant today.

The first is that, sadly, Haman is more than just a historical figure. In fact, it is not hard to find modern-day Hamans who are bent on causing harm to the Jewish people. Haman's presence lingers among current Iranian leaders who frequently call for Israel's destruction. [Recall that modern-day Iran encompasses most of ancient Persia.] We feel Haman's influence when we read about terrorists who carry out murderous attacks on Jews and Jewish institutions — as well as on Christians — around the world.

We sense it in the rising tide of anti-Semitic attacks. Not long ago, we saw it when an armed man barged into a synagogue in Colleyville, Texas, and held four hostages — including the rabbi — at gunpoint.

Considering the war in Ukraine, I realize that the Jewish community there is also suffering under the specter of Haman. Their plight has worsened during this precarious time of war and violence.

Yet the most important lesson from Esther's story is that God still calls brave men and women to protect others. Esther could have kept quiet and lived a comfortable life of luxury as the wife of the most powerful man in the world. But she willingly put her life on the line to save her people.

Others First

In our world, most people first look out for their own interests. Self-preservation is deeply ingrained in our human psyche. At times this instinct is beneficial as it helps us avoid danger, but it too can tempt us to survive at the expense of others.

Esther reminds us that God does not work that way. Often, He calls us to put the needs of others before our own. As I write, the faces of several brave women in Ukraine come to mind. One friend, Malcki Bukiat-who had five children of her own to care for and protect from the horrors of war-helped lead 60 orphan children west, on a dangerous journey through an unpredictable war zone to find shelter and flee Ukraine. As food and fuel were lacking, and chaos consumed her world, she found an Esther-like courage to think of others' safety and put the vulnerable and helpless before herself.

As we celebrate Purim this year in a world with no shortage of "Hamans," I pray that more "Esthers" will rise to protect the vulnerable. As Esther reminds us, even one brave person could save an entire nation.

Perhaps *you*, dear reader, were born for such a time as this to speak out against anti-Semitism today. — Kirsten

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

Who are the True Jews? (part 2)





Last month, in the wake of anti-Semitic comments and actions by Kanye (aka Ye) West and Kyrie Irving, the first part of this article noted the renewed focus on the "Hebrew Israelites" cult who claim that they are the only legitimate Jews, along with some long-standing, shameful accusations against Jewish people. Here is the conclusion of the article that looks at the true identity of God's Chosen People. — Editor

While all Believers* have been included into the commonwealth of Israel and the family of God, the New Testament maintains that Jew and gentile are distinct, just as male and female are. Being Jewish is an ethnicity and a people group with a communal history of faith, even though only a minority would call themselves observant today.

In the Bible, Jewish ancestry came through the paternal line. Today Jewish people consider the mother's line the way to determine a person's Jewishness, partly due to the Roman Era where rape was commonplace and paternity hard to determine. Either way, genetically we know that all varieties and colors of Jewish people (Sephardic, Mizrahi, Ashkenazi, etc.) have similar genetics to one another and much in common with the Levantine area from where they originally came. Some have the "Cohen" gene of the priests that can be traced all the way back to the Aaronic priesthood. More importantly, God sees all our genes and knows who's who.

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Israel, and the Church is the Church. Jesus said that He came for the "Lost sheep of the house of Israel" (Matt. 15:24), but He also stated that there were many more sheep He would include:

"I have other sheep that are not of this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to My voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd." — John 10:16

There is already a great overlap of the remnant of Israel and the billions of Believers in the nations, but one day all Israel will be saved. There will be one Bride brought before the Son of God, and a great wedding will take place.



If You Were Born Muslim

March is ZLM's tour month in Israel. Traveling to the Holy Land is the Bible study trip of a lifetime. It's also a wonderful opportunity to meet people from cultures that you may not often experience in the U.S. The Middle East opens your eyes to how people on the other side of the world live. Surprisingly, daily living there is not so vastly different from your everyday life at home.

I've often wondered, "Who would I be if I had been born in a different country to people of a different religious background?" Would I be the "me" that I am now? If I had been born in Iraq or Syria, would I still love Jesus without the years of involvement in Bible studies and Christian camps? Probably not!

Not So Different

When we take the Zola Tours extension into the country of Jordan, I always anticipate meeting our new bus driver and tour guide, because I have a unique opportunity to connect with people from a different culture. Between our guide sharing wonderful insights about the land that we are viewing from our bus windows, I ask questions about their personal lives: "Are you married? Do you have kids or grandkids?" What I typically discover is that most people everywhere basically want very similar things: to have a comfortable home for their families, for their children to succeed, and for their children *and grandchildren* to have better lives than they do.

Most, if not all, of our guides and drivers in Jordan are Muslim. Islam is what they know and practice most likely because that is how they were raised.

They followed the religion of their parents. In the same way, I came to know and believe Christianity largely because of my parents' beliefs and how they raised me.

Leaving Everything

But what if you had been born to Muslim parents? How would

you come to know the saving grace of Yeshua (Jesus)? Would you decide to go against your family and their practices, and perhaps leave your community to embrace a different religion? It would likely take a miracle for you to do so. But that decision would change everything for you.

If (or when) you meet someone of a different religious background, would you extend extraordinary kindness and generosity to them? Would you perhaps show them something *different*—the supernatural love of Christ? Loving and showing, not simply *telling*, is essential as we share the Gospel with those whom Jesus loves dearly, but have yet to experience His saving grace.

for Israel is waning. The group partners with Christian universities and colleges and plans to start working with public schools soon.

"We are at a unique moment in history, where Jews and Christians can come together for the first time and create positive and impactful experiences," said Rivka Kidron, co-founder of Passages. "Now more than ever, Jews and Christians have to come together around our shared values and stand up for what's right in this world."

Passages is an initiative by the Philos Project, an organization that seeks "to promote positive Christian engagement in the Near East by creating leaders, building community, and taking action in the spirit of the Hebraic Tradition."

This past winter, the organization brought 450 students to Israel from dozens of universities including the University of Chicago, Patrick Henry College, The King's College, Hannibal-LaGrange University, and Regent University.

"Unfortunately, anti-Semitism is on the rise, and I think we need each other now more than ever," Kidron added. "I feel very blessed to be here and living here at this moment and share it with you."

Hispanic MLB Players Visit Israel to Promote Christian-Jewish Relations

Several U.S. Major League Baseball (MLB) players and their entourage traveled to Israel in November. **Nelson Cruz, Cesar Hernandez**, and **Jeimer Candelario** visited through the Philos Project, a U.S.-based nonprofit that promotes Christian relations with Israel and other Middle Eastern countries. The Philos Project's Jesse Rojo said that the group toured Christian sites in Jerusalem and the Galilee and ran a baseball clinic for Jewish and non-Jewish youth in Ra'anana.

Rojo noted that the visit also aimed to "proactively" combat anti-Semitism, "to show our baseball players that they can make a difference, not wait for someone to come out with an anti-Semitic tweet to do something."

Cruz, from the Dominican Republic, is 39th on the MLB's all-time home run list. He recently signed a one-year contract with the San Diego Padres. Hernandez, with the Detroit Tigers, hails from Venezuela and is a former Gold Glove winner. Candelario, born in New York but raised in the Dominican Republic, recently signed with the Washington Nationals after playing six seasons for the Detroit Tigers. Cruz and Hernandez played together for the Washington Nationals last season.

On a minibus, before leaving for a day of touring, Cruz led a prayer of gratitude. In Jaffa, Candelario was excited to learn that the Prophet Jonah had departed by ship from the ancient city's port before being swallowed by a huge fish. At lunch, Candelario led the table in grace.

The players noted they had never heard anti-Jewish or anti-Israel views expressed by relatives, friends, or acquaintances. Most of their compatriots, they said, think that Israel is constantly under enemy attack, a view they added was dispelled by

their experience traveling around the country and feeling safe.

All attributed pro-Israel inclinations to their strong Christian beliefs, including regularly attending church services. They noted that their mothers were devout women who raised them with Bible stories.

"We love God and the Word of God. This is the land of our fathers," said Candelario. "Whoever blesses Israel will be blessed," he added, paraphrasing God's promise to Abraham.

"Anyone who's an opinion-maker from such countries helps us," explained Jonathan Peled, the Israeli foreign ministry's deputy director general for Latin America. "They become [goodwill] ambassadors."

Baseball is not a top sport in Israel, but Team Israel's periodic success on the world stage has helped promote the game.

At lunch, Hernandez noted that he "would live here" in Israel in the off-season if he could obtain a visa. Asked whether he meant it, Hernandez answered, "Yeah, because it's the Jesus country. I asked my wife, and she said yes."

Sitting beside him at the restaurant, Gabriela Hernandez nodded.

"Yes," she affirmed, "because of the significance it has for us." \Rightarrow



Oman Criminalizes Ties with Israel

In the two years since the Abraham Accords were signed, warmish ties between Israel and Oman caused speculation that the Sultanate might be next to follow in the footsteps of Bahrain, Morocco, Sudan, and the United Arab Emirates (UAE) to join the circle of peace with the Jewish state. Yet all hopes of a reconciliation were dashed when Oman's parliament passed a vote to criminalize any relations, ties, or interactions with "the Zionist entity."

Although details about the ruling are sparse, the law includes "severing any economic, sports or cultural relations, and prohibiting dealing in any way or means, whether it is a real meeting, an electronic meeting, or something else," said Yaqoub Al-Harithi, vice president of the Omani parliament, as reported by Oman's WAF news agency.


The decision comes as a bit of an about-face. In the years leading up the Abraham Accords, Israel's relationship with Oman was considered less frosty than with its neighbors. Although the Sultanate adhered to a royal decree that banned all "interaction with the Zionist entity for private and public figures," Oman has never faced Israel on the battlefield and the countries even established unofficial trade relations in the early 2000s. Moreover, between 1994 and 2018, the former ruler Sultan Qaboos bin Said even invited three Israeli prime ministers to his country, with Yitzhak Rabin's trip in 1994 making history as the first Israeli prime minister to visit a Gulf nation.

With all the factors pointing in a pro-Israel direction, why the turnaround? In a word: Iran.

According to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, 2020 marked a shift in Oman's foreign policy. After Qaboos died, his cousin, Haitham bin Tariq Al Said, was proclaimed the new sultan. Since then, Haitham has cozied up to Tehran instead of Jerusalem.

Does this mark the end of Arab nations normalizing ties with Israel? Hopefully not. With Oman out of the running, Mauritania and Saudi Arabia have been mentioned as potential future peace partners (as has Indonesia — a Muslim nation off the coast of Southeast Asia). Yet as unfolding events have frequently proven, in the Middle East, anything is possible and tides — and sentiments — can change as swiftly as the shifting desert sands.

Oman's Sultan Haitham bin Tariq Al Said is standing on the wrong side of history. He will regret his decision to oppose Israel. — David ☆


The Sign of the Prophet Jonah

I received some negative response to our program on ecology and my trip to Russia. It seems that I am not to "walk in the way of the ungodly," nor to be concerned about our planet and its deterioration. Many people reminded me that Carl Sagan and others who spoke at the conference I attended in Moscow are unbelievers. The responders painstakingly emphasized that unsaved people think nothing of value and have nothing of value to say.

Speaking The Truth

Friends, if you value our program because I tell you the truth, then all I can say is that sometimes the truth hurts. I did not quote Carl Sagan because of his virtues or vices, but because he is a knowledgeable scientist.

To Index

I wish born-again Believers were aware of what we are doing to this world through our pollution, selfishness, and our lack of care for the poor, the humble, and the dying. Instead, I'm ashamed to say that it's mainly unbelievers who are showing this kindness and compassion these days.

When I have to go to an expert for some reason, I choose the best available. If I'm to teach you anything, I'd better have good source material.

When I needed heart bypass surgery, I chose the best surgeon, not the best Believer. I would have preferred a Believer, but none was available. And in an emergency room with a bleeding child, I don't ask about the doctor's Biblical persuasions, but rather, about how many similar wounds he has stitched.

Many letter writers tried to educate me about the "New Age." But I have written a half-dozen books on it. I was exposing cults long before anyone thought of the clever term "New Age." Actually, there's nothing "new" about this godless thinking. Frankly, the term doesn't say enough. The thousand-year Kingdom of Christ on Earth will be a new age, too. What I need to know is, what kind of newness are we talking about when we describe a coming age?

When I see a Jew-hater, then I see the antiChrist's rightful prey. When I hear a man plead for the little children who are dying, I hear my Lord saying, "Suffer the little children to come unto Me" (Mark 10:14), or "If a son shall ask bread of any of you that is a father, will he give him a stone?" (Luke 11:11), or a hundred other hallmarks of the teaching of the One who said, "Inasmuch as you've done it unto one of the least of these My brethren, ye have done it unto Me" (Matt. 25:40).

Relating to Unbelievers

Sitting back comfortably in our guaranteed salvation and demeaning the unbeliever—hating him and condemning him to Hell, in effect—is not what the Lord calls us to do. When we come to the judgment seat of Christ, I hope that there aren't many Christians whose proudest



work is that they condemned their neighbors, friends, leaders, and teachers, and deep in their own hearts detested and felt superior to those people.

It is an awful reduction of the faith to imagine that a good Christian is someone who keeps to an exclusive society. We have enough country clubs that don't admit Jews, Blacks, Hispanics, and others. We don't need a Christian elite that throws out the wounded innocent instead of comforting them. Almighty God cared for unbelievers when He sent Jonah to Nineveh. God pled with His conceited prophet on behalf of at least the children and innocent animals of Nineveh: "And should I not spare Nineveh, that great city, wherein are more than sixscore thousand persons that cannot discern between their right hand and their left hand; and also much cattle?" (Jonah 4:11). Yet I've received letters from many modern-day Jonahs who claim that we should not help suffering unbelievers.

Loving Others

While speaking in the synagogue at Nazareth (Luke 4), our Lord highlighted the faith of pagan sufferers. As examples of proper reverence of God, the Lord referred to two people of the Old Testament: Naaman, the Syrian captain with leprosy, and the widow of Sidon. Both of these approached the prophet Elijah in true faith. After His sermon, the backbiting and jealous people of Nazareth tried to kill Jesus Christ for pointing out that God loves all of His children, even those to whom we have failed to witness. For those of you who would judge,

please make a judgment on this: Forty thousand children die per day in the Third World of the simplest, curable diseases, such as chronic diarrhea and ongoing malnutrition.

I am writing this article on a Friday. By Monday more children will have died in the Third World than all the people who were killed by the atomic bomb at Hiroshima. By the time you read this article, one million of these utterly blameless ones to whom no one has ever witnessed, nor even embraced in most cases, nor fed, nor clothed, nor visited, will have died.

None of us should go to the Lord saying, "My ministry was to correct Zola Levitt when he kept company with people whom I consider beneath me."

This teaching advanced in the 2nd century and afterward, and many Christians today believe it. But it is not Biblical.

In discussing Israel's rejection of Jesus the Messiah, the Apostle Paul addressed the Church at Rome about this erroneous idea. Paul considered Israel's destiny when he asked, "Has God cast away His people?" (Romans 11:1)

The Apostle answered emphatically: "Certainly not!" (Romans 11:1). The Greek phrase is me genoito— a double negative that is the strongest expression of negation in the Greek language. We can understand the phrase as, "No, may it never be!" or "Impossible! No way!" Then he continues, "God has not cast away His people whom

He foreknew" (Romans 11:2). Paul stated that God will never replace or forsake the Jewish people, despite their current unbelief toward Jesus the Messiah.

Replacement theology opposes Scripture not only in Romans 11:1–2 but also elsewhere in God's Word, where God has assured the permanency and prominence of Israel in His plan for the ages.

If God were finished with the Jews and the nation of Israel, He would be contradicting the great promise He made to Israel in Jeremiah 31:35–37. Here, God explains that the universe — including the sun, moon, and the stars — would cease to exist before He would allow Israel to cease as a nation before Him, despite all that they have done!

Isaiah 49:14–16 proclaims that God has indelibly engraved Israel on the palms of His hands; even if a mother could forsake her nursing child, He will never forget Israel.

The supernatural survival of the Jews for thousands of years, coupled with the fact that they have been miraculously regathered into their ancient homeland and reconstituted as a nation against all odds, was foretold in Bible prophecy. (See Deuteronomy 30:1–5; Leviticus 26:40–45; Ezekiel 36–37; Isaiah 11:11–12; Amos 9:14–15.) In the End Times, Israel will experience the seven-year tribulation (Daniel 9:24–27), and the remnant who survive in the Land will be there when Jesus returns to reclaim and save the nation of Israel, as noted in Romans 11:25–27.

God supernaturally created Israel. He used them for His glory in the past and will do so in the future. They are God's Chosen People. The immutable, eternal, and unconditional covenants God made with Abraham, David, and Jesus Christ guarantee this forever!

we've ministered previously, the Lord led us to **Ronin**, the manager of a store that sells watches and men's accessories. Though he was born in Russia, Ronin said he made *aliyah* (immigrated) to Israel with his family when he was three years old.

On hearing this, August and I explained Jeremiah's prophecies regarding the exiled Jews' return to the Land of Israel from the far north country of Russia (Jeremiah 3:18; 23:7–8). Ronin was amazed to learn this, and he wrote down the passages we cited. We also noted that Ronin was part of the fulfillment of this End Times prophecy when he returned to Israel from Russia.

Utilizing lesser to greater reasoning, we explained that if God's Word is true on this level, it's also true on the greater level about fulfillment of Messianic prophecy. We asked Ronin if he knew the only person in Jewish history to fulfill all of the First Coming prophecies in Scripture. He correctly answered, "Jesus." A Note from Mark Charitable Giving's Thorny Questions

Below are excerpts from a secular article that makes a spiritual point. The author, Peter Coy, writes about economics, business, and finance. Please note his conclusion. — Mark

On what basis do we decide who should get our money? And how much should each receive? Normally, we feel good about spending as little as possible on things, but with charitable giving, more seems better.

Benjamin Beit-Hallahmi, a psychology professor, criticized America's "capitalist system of charities." He wrote that they are "competing to the death for the same 50 cents."

One problem is that wealthy people set the priorities for philanthropy. Fundraisers increasingly focus their attention on rich people because they give the most. Other donors' preferences are relatively neglected.

- The share of households that give fell from 66% in 2000 to 50% in 2018, according to the Philanthropy Panel Study.
- Concentration of wealth has made foraging for gifts from the wealthy more cost effective.
- Leslie Lenkowsky, a professor emeritus at Indiana University, cited the decline in religiosity, since churches and other religious institutions have long been a nexus for giving.
- The increase in the standard deduction in 2017 took away the tax incentive for millions of middle-class American donors.

This is, frankly, bad for society. It's bad not only for the recipients who receive less but also for the rest of us who give less. Research shows that people are happier and communities are more resilient when neighbors look out for one another. "We are ingrained to help others, whether we're holding Mark Levitt ZLM Director since 1988

the door for someone, jumping in the water to rescue someone, or writing a check," noted Daniel Mansoor, the president of GoodWorks Group in Cleveland, a consultant to nonprofits. When we don't do that so much, we become poorer in spirit.

Jane Wales is co-chair of the Generosity Commission, a project of the Giving USA Foundation. They aspire to get more Americans to donate and volunteer their time. She states: "The single biggest barrier is the sense that you can't make a difference.... How do you overcome that? ... If average Americans feel they can't make a difference in their own actions, what does that mean for democracy?"

I'd summarize it this way: You can make a difference. Your money and your time are needed. And the biggest beneficiary of your giving may be your own soul.

Contrary to most charitable organizations who cater to the rich, the Great Commission (Matt. 28:18–20) sets this ministry's priorities. Our donors cheerfully adhere to Deuteronomy 16:17 — "Every man shall give as he is able" and 2 Corinthians 9:7 — "Every man according as he purposeth in his heart...for God loveth a cheerful giver." — Mark \$\$\$







Secrets of the Scrolls

In 1947, a Bedouin boy in search of a lost goat threw a stone through the narrow opening of a cave. Dr. Robert Eisenman, a professor of Middle East religions at California State University at Long Beach, discusses the fascinating history of the Scrolls.

In Search of Answers Dr. Eisenman recaps his quest to gain access to the Scrolls. Dr. Tabor describes his archaeological team and how they map the caves in Qumran.

Prof. Michael Wise An in-depth interview with a professor of Aramaic, the language of Yeshua. University of Chicago professor Wise helped translate the fragments when they were first released and enthusiastically discusses The New Jerusalem text, telling how the future will be.

Lastly, P.C. also encouraged us to keep doing what we're doing. She believes "it's especially important for today." We couldn't agree more!






pagan deities were — December 25th, to be exact. The pagan cultures were celebrating this day long before Jesus was born, and they continue today.





Device Zaps Airborne Viruses

This past winter, many people became sick due to a "tripledemic" of COVID-19, flu, and RSV (respiratory syncytial virus). RSV was the number one reason children were admitted to hospitals this past year, and cases overwhelmed hospitals worldwide.

Israel-based Aura Air says that its four-stage air disinfection and purification devices can help, according to newly released results of an independent study.

The Aura Air device is comprised of several components. A pre-filter targets large particles, including dust, pollen, insects, and animal hair. The HEPA Ray-Filter consists of three unique antibacterial layers that target fine particles, germs, odors, bacteria, viruses, fungi, and mold spores. The device uses ultraviolet light technology to reduce viruses, bacteria, and volatile organic compounds (VOCs). Finally, the device releases positive and negative ions to freshen indoor spaces and remove any remaining harmful pollutants.

The Innovative Bioanalysis Laboratory study shows that Aura Air's system successfully filters and removes 99.99% of airborne RSV particles. "We are committed to helping hospitals mitigate the risks of ... RSV," said Roei Friedberg, CEO of Aura Americas.

In addition to RSV, Innovative Bioanalysis Laboratory and Israel's Sheba Medical Center confirmed that Aura Air successfully filters and removes 99.99% of airborne SARS-CoV-2 (COVID-19) and 99.98% of Influenza A (flu) virus particles, in addition to many other pathogens and allergens.

Schools, hospitals, businesses, hotels, restaurants, buses, and medical associations in 87 countries, including the New Jersey Hospital Association (NJHA), have installed Aura Air to help combat the spread of these microbes.

"Hospitals and communities across the country [were] hit by an unprecedented surge in patients suffering from RSV, especially very young children," said NJHA Senior Vice President Michael A. Guerriero.

"Aura Air's advanced air purification and disinfection technology provides a welcome line of defense against these highly contagious viruses. Our partnership is focused on supporting New Jersey-area hospitals and their front-line heroes as they battle the tripledemic," added Guerriero.

Vibrating Armband Eases Migraine Pain

Loss of vision, pins and needles, and difficulty speaking are some of the symptoms that millions of people regularly suffer just before a debilitating migraine attack. Medication can help, but many patients need to combine treatments, and they rarely provide complete relief.

But a new treatment could minimize — and possibly end — the use of combination drugs to treat migraines. Israeli company Theranica has developed the Nerivio, a drug-free, smartphone-controlled, vibrating armband for the treatment of episodic and chronic migraine for people aged 12 and older.

The Conditioned Pain Modulation (CPM) in the brain decides which of the billions of daily external stimuli that we experience is a threat. For those not considered a danger, the CPM increases the release of neurotransmitters that can abort pain by temporarily blocking the body's ability to detect painful stimuli.

Many people with certain neurological diseases have a CPM deficiency, however, so their brains cannot trigger the mechanism when needed. Instead, they experience hyper-sensitization, which amplifies the pain.

The Nerivio device specifically triggers the nerve fibers that transmit the "first-pain" signals. After identifying the vibrations as a false alarm, the brain releases neurotransmitters that increase the concentration of serotonin, the "happy chemical."

Users place the device on the upper arm when a migraine starts. It vibrates at an intensity just below their pain threshold for 45 minutes. The body's nerve fibers deliver a message to the brain, which decides that the sensation is harmless and releases neurotransmitters to prevent the sufferer from feeling pain.

The Nerivio device connects to an app that guides the user during the first minute of a migraine to gradually raise the intensity of the stimulation from a low level to a level just below the pain threshold. Afterward, users can continue with their daily routines, without having to sit or lie down.



In clinical tests, over 60% of patients said that the pain eased within two hours, and 35% experienced complete pain freedom, Alon Ironi, CEO of Theranica, noted that while about 30% of patients do not benefit from the device, the number is much lower than that for some other migraine treatments.

Theranica is working with the FDA to extend its device's capabilities to be used as a preventative treatment. Currently, over 40,000 patients use the device in the U.S. It's also available in Israel. Both countries require a prescription.



Nerivio's only competitor is Cefaly, an over-the-counter device worn on the head that uses electrical signals to temporarily block local painful sensations. Ironi says that 65–70% of migraine patients are hyper-sensitive to touch, so wearing a device on their head would not be very tolerable. x

The Biden Administration's Two-State Delusion

Days after U.S. Secretary of State Antony Blinken reaffirmed the Biden administration's commitment to the "two-state solution," the Palestinians repeated their rejection of the idea and their support for more terrorism against Israel.

The Palestinian response came through a public opinion poll published in December by the Palestinian Center for Policy and Survey Research and statements by Hamas, which controls the Gaza Strip.

The poll found that 69% of Palestinians believe that the "two-state solution" is no longer practical or feasible. And, 72% believe that the chances for the creation of a Palestinian state alongside Israel in the next five years are slim or nonexistent.

Preferring confrontation over negotiation

The Palestinians, in short, are telling the Biden administration that they can keep dreaming about the two-state fantasy, but that they prefer "armed struggle" and terrorism rather than peace negotiations with Israel.

When asked about the most effective means of building an independent state, 51% of the Palestinians chose the "armed struggle." And 55% supported a return to armed confrontations and an *intifada* (uprising) against Israel.

Even more concerning is that 72% of Palestinians said they favor forming terror groups like the Lions' Den, whose members carried out attacks against Israeli soldiers and civilians in the northern West Bank in late 2022.

This is not the first poll to show that a majority of Palestinians oppose the "two-state solution." They are clamoring for a Palestinian state not alongside Israel, but instead of Israel.

Moreover, this is not the first poll to show that most Palestinians continue to support Hamas, the terror group whose charter openly calls for *jihad* (holy war) and the elimination of Israel.

The Biden administration's focus

In November, during a phone call with Palestinian Authority (PA) President Mahmoud Abbas, Blinken reaffirmed the administration's two-state fantasy especially along the notoriously indefensible 1949 armistice lines, where the fighting at the time just so happened to stop.

Then in a December speech at the J Street National Conference in Washington, D.C., Blinken reiterated

To

the administration's efforts at "realizing the enduring goal of two states." He noted: "We continue to believe, as the President said on his trip to the Holy Land [in 2022], that two states — based on the 1967 lines, with mutually agreed swaps — remains the best way to achieve our goal of Israelis and Palestinians living side by side in peace and security."

The results of the recent opinion polls demonstrate that Blinken and his team are either engaging in self-deception or simply fail to understand or see what most Palestinians want: Killing more Jews and obliterating Israel.

Rejecting Israel's previous peace offers

If the Palestinians really wanted their own state next to Israel, they could have had one years ago. However, Abbas and his predecessor, Yasser Arafat, rejected all the peace offers they received from Israeli leaders over the past 22 years without even a counteroffer.

In 2000, then Israeli Prime Minister Ehud Barak's proposal to Arafat included the establishment of a Palestinian state on some 92% of the West Bank (Judea and Samaria) and 100% of the Gaza Strip. It also included the establishment of a Palestinian capital in eastern Jerusalem. *Arafat said no.*

In 2007, then Israeli Prime Minister Ehud Olmert offered to withdraw from 93% of the West Bank, all of the Gaza Strip, and large parts of east Jerusalem. *Abbas said no.*

A coming catastrophe?

Blinken and his advisers should recall the words of former U.S. President Bill Clinton, who hosted the 2000 peace summit at Camp David. In it, Arafat refused the generous offer he received from Barak. When Arafat said no, Clinton banged on the table and said: "You are leading your people and the region to a catastrophe."

Since then, the Palestinians have sought to fulfill Clinton's prophecy. They continue to resort to terrorism, glorify terrorists and support their families financially, and back Hamas.

Establishing a Palestinian state would be paving the way for the Palestinians to use the West Bank and Gaza Strip as launching pads to attack and destroy Israel. The last thing Israel and its Arab neighbors need is an Iranian-controlled terror state in the West Bank and Gaza Strip. Such a state would be a recipe for war, not peace in the Middle East.

Time to wake up

It is time for the Biden administration to awaken to Clinton's words—that the rejectionism of the Palestinian leaders is dragging the Palestinian people, and the entire Middle East, toward a bloody and dead-end future.

The way for the international community—starting with the U.S.—to change the situation is through insisting that any aid is strictly conditioned upon the Palestinians abandoning their calls for terrorism, which now infest the entire Palestinian society. If there is non-compliance, payments must be withheld. If one goes to a bank and asks for a loan, there are conditions attached; why not with aid? Otherwise, all of the aid that does not "disappear" is openly being used to bankroll terrorism, *jihad*, and killing Jews.

Gazans Blame Hamas for Drowning of Migrants

In December, thousands of people joined the funerals of eight young Palestinian men who drowned off the coast of Tunisia as they tried to sail to new lives in Europe.

The drownings have drawn attention to the dire conditions in Gaza after a 15-year Israeli-Egyptian blockade and have prompted some rare public criticism of the ruling Hamas terror group.

"The government that governs us here is the reason," said Naheel Shaath, whose 21-year-old son Adam died. "I blame all officials here who don't care for the youths or provide job opportunities for them."

Israel and Egypt imposed the blockade after Hamas seized control of Gaza from the Palestinian Authority in 2007. The blockade has stifled Gaza's economy, where unemployment hovers near 50%, and residents are usually quick to blame Israel for the difficult conditions. But increasingly, families are complaining about Hamas's leadership, citing high taxes, its heavy-handed rule, and a growing stream of leaders, including its supreme leader, Ismail Haniyeh, who have moved abroad to more comfortable places with their families.

"Our children are drowning in the sea and their children are enjoying luxury," Mrs. Shaath said. "Isn't this unfair?" The al-Shaers, another family, buried their 21-year-old son Mohammed. His younger brother, who was on the same boat, is still missing. Their mother, Amina, blamed Hamas for the family's misery. "What do we see in Gaza? We only see oppression," she said. "They are suffocating the youth, and the youth flee because of their suffocation."

The young men who died were headed to Turkey, one of the few countries that accepts Palestinians from Gaza. From Turkey they hoped to get to Europe. About two dozen Palestinians drowned in the last quarter of 2022 on the perilous journey. According to the nonprofit Euro-Med Human Rights Monitor, around 360 people from Gaza have either died or gone missing in the Mediterranean on smuggling ships since 2014.

German Woman Convicted in Death Camp Murders

A 97-year-old German woman was convicted in December of complicity in 10,500 concentration camp murders. Irmgard Furchner was 95 when she was first arrested and charged with crimes related to her work as a secretary to an SS commander at the Stutthof concentration camp in Nazi-occupied Poland during World War II. She tried to flee by a taxi on the first day of her trial but was soon apprehended.

Furchner, who claimed that she had no knowledge of the murders being committed in the camp, was sentenced to two years of probation. She was tried in juvenile court because she was under 21 while she worked at the camp.

During her final court appearance, Furchner commented: "I am sorry for everything that happened. I regret that I was in Stutthof at that time. That's all I can say."

Earlier last year, a 101-year-old former Nazi guard was sentenced to five years in prison for his role at the Sachsenhausen concentration camp near Berlin. Due to his advanced age, he is unlikely to serve any prison time.

Google Apologizes for Definition of "Jew"

Google apologized after controversy surrounding the definition of "Jew" that appeared on the popular search engine.

When the word "Jew" was searched on Google in December, the word was defined as to "bargain with someone in a miserly or petty way," with the origin being "in reference to old stereotypes associating Jewish people with trading and money lending." The StopAntisemitism organization denounced the definition on Twitter: "When one enters 'Jew' into the Google search engine, a grotesque anti-Semitic trope comes up. This is unacceptable, Google."

Google Search Liaison Danny Sullivan later apologized on behalf of the search engine company, while also offering an explanation.

"Our apologies," Sullivan wrote on Twitter. "Google licenses definitions from third-party dictionary experts. We only display offensive definitions by default if they are the main meaning of a term. As this is not the case here, we have blocked this & passed along feedback to the partner for further review."

Fox News Digital sought a statement from Google as to why the search for the word "Jew" was listing an "offensive" verb as the top definition, before it recently was switched back to the noun definition.

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In response, Google turned the attention to Sullivan's tweet and a help center article about how Google sources definitions on Search.

Wiktionary.org, while noting the term "jew down" is offensive, still defines it as "to bargain or haggle with a seller in order to obtain a lower price."

Archaeology 2,200-Year-Old Coins Prove Book of Maccabees

Silver coins discovered near the Dead Sea

A cache of 2,200-year-old silver coins was discovered recently in a cave near the Dead Sea. Archaeologists claim that this is the first physical proof that Jews fled to the Judean Desert during the upheaval and persecution under Antiochus IV Epiphanes.

In the period prior to the Maccabean Revolt, righteous men were exhorted to leave everything and flee to the desert. Subsequently, while upholding the laws of Shabbat, they were slaughtered by the king's forces.

During excavations last May, a small, well-preserved wooden box holding 15 silver tetradrachma coins was discovered in a cave in the Darageh Stream Nature Reserve. The coins were minted by Ptolemy VI, king of Egypt, and date to up to 170 B.C., which is just before Seleucid King Antiochus IV Epiphanes began handing down harsh measures against Jews' freedom of worship.

According to Eitan Klein of the Israel

Antiquities Authority (IAA), the coins were stashed by a fleeing Jew, who presumably died in the violence leading up to the Maccabean Revolt.

"Here, we have good proof that people really were fleeing," said Klein, deputy director of the IAA's Theft Prevention Unit. "In general, when we find a cache of coins, they tell us a story of war. Otherwise, people don't run off and leave their life savings." At an average wage, the coins represented about two months' salary.

The pristine wooden box was discovered in one of the four Muraba'at Caves (continued on next page)

To Index where, some 70 years after the first scientific excavations took place in the caves near the Dead Sea, new objects are still coming to light.

Inside the newly-discovered box were 15 silver coins, a piece of purple-dyed cloth, and some wool stuffing. The dry desert climate, combined with the cave's protected atmosphere, preserved the organic materials in excellent condition.

The dating of the coins could serve to anchor the artifacts to the moving description in 1 Maccabees 2:29, in which the eventual Maccabean Revolt founder Mattathias cries out for righteous men to leave their lives of persecution and live in the desert or eremos, a Greek term for a place desolate of people or animals. (Incidentally, in 2 Maccabees we find the earliest Greek text to use the word "Judaism," according to scholar Malka Z. Simkovich.)

The silver tetradrachmas were minted by Ptolemy VI, king of Egypt, who reigned contemporaneously with his uncle, Antiochus IV Epiphanes (often called "the Wicked"), who ruled over the Seleucid Kingdom. Between 270-168 B.C., the

> Seleucids and Ptolemies fought the Six Syrian Wars. After the fourth war, the territory of Judea was conquered by Antiochus III, in the Battle of Paneion in 200 B.C. According to the IAA, the three earliest coins in the trove were minted in 176/5 B.C., while the latest coin dated to 171/0 B.C. Curiously, the name "Shalmai" was incised in Aramaic script on one of the coins.

"It is impossible to know where the person fled from....Every time there was a war or a traumatic event, people fled to the desert and hid in caves, which were their 'safe rooms.' They'd leave their homes, and take only their important items,"

Opening the wooden box Klein explained. The Muraba'at Caves were used for millennia as a refuge. Located in Nahal

Darga, the closest Jewish settlement during the Maccabean era would have been a walk of a day or two away.

At that time, the caves were very difficult to reach, which also shows the individual's desperation, Klein noted. "Today, we can take a Jeep. In that period, there was a path to the Dead Sea, but it was flanked by many unfriendly tribes, and it was dangerous to walk in the middle of the desert."

Klein explained that these are not the only silver tetradrachmas minted by Ptolemy VI that can be found in Israel today. "We've found in the antiquities market coins of that period, from looters. But now, for the first time in the Land of Israel, we've found a trove in a scientific excavation. And therefore, the coins can tell us a story," said Klein.

Since 2017, the IAA has surveyed some 500 caves in the Judean Desert — in part to look for more Dead Sea Scrolls, in part to beat antiquities looters to priceless artifacts.

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Anti-Semitism

U.N. Envoy Slammed Over Anti-Semitic Comments

Israel and the U.S. have slammed a United Nations envoy over anti-Semitic statements she made in 2014 that recently resurfaced.

Francesca Albanese, the U.N. Human Rights Council's Special Rapporteur on the situation of human rights in the Palestinian Territories, asserted that the "Jewish lobby" controlled the U.S. and compared Israelis to Nazis.

Albanese also sympathized with terror organizations, dismissed Israel's security concerns, and accused the Jewish state of potential war crimes, according to *The Times of Israel (TOI)*.

"Anti-Semitism is a persistent malice that has infected the United Nations Human Rights Council for far too long. Comments made by ... Francesca Albanese that surfaced today are yet another stain on the credibility of this body and yet another example of the impunity that exists today regarding anti-Semitism and anti-Semitic comments made by UN officials," the Israeli Mission to the U.N. in Geneva said in a statement.

"It is about time that the United Nations take concrete action in addressing systemic anti-Semitism within the United Nations Human Rights Council and its mechanisms. The lack of accountability and impunity for comments made by UN officials only works to legitimize anti-Semitism and endangers the Jewish people," the statement added.

U.S. Permanent Representative to the U.N. Human Rights Council, Ambassador Michèle Taylor, likewise denounced Albanese on Twitter: "We are appalled by [Albanese's] recently uncovered anti-Semitic remarks.... References to the 'Jewish Lobby' are an age-old trope; this is outrageous, inappropriate, corrosive, & degrades the value of the UN."

Albanese did not directly address the report, but she told the *TOI*: "Some of

the words I used [in the Facebook post] during Israel's offensive on the Gaza Strip in 2014 were infelicitous, analytically inaccurate, and unintendedly offensive. People make mistakes. I distance myself from these words, which I would not use today."

In November, Albanese spoke at a conference in Gaza attended by senior members of Hamas and Palestinian Islamic Jihad. In her speech, Albanese stated: "You have a right to resist this [Israeli] occupation."

In a June interview with an Italian magazine, Albanese claimed that "Israel says 'resistance equals terrorism,' but an occupation requires violence and generates violence." She added that the "Palestinians have no other room for dissent than violence."

Albanese also repeated long-running accusations of Israeli apartheid and suggested that Israelis holding dual citizenship could be tried for crimes in the countries of their secondary citizenship if they live in eastern Jerusalem, Judea and Samaria, or any other location deemed "occupied Palestinian territory."

In an interview with an Italian national television station in May, Albanese asserted that "Palestinian violence is inevitable because the right to exist of the Palestinian people has been denied for 55 years."


