Strangers meeting Rabbi Jacob Rosenberg for the first time hear his title, see his bearded face and the yarmulke perched on the back of his head, and make assumptions about his beliefs. They are usually wrong.

"Most people don't know what Messianic Judaism actually is — that we believe Jesus is the Messiah," explained Rosenberg, rabbi at the Adat Hatikvah Messianic Synagogue in Deerfield, Illinois. "Some people think Jesus was a prophet. Some think He was crazy. Others, that He was just a nice, Jewish boy. But we believe He was the Messiah whom the prophets and Hebrew Scriptures foretold."

So asking Rosenberg, "What do Hanukkah and Christmas mean to you?" yields some interesting answers.

Most simply? "Light. Jesus is the light of the world," Rosenberg explained, quoting from the

Intercession, Not Indignation

I never thought I'd be glad to leave Israel and go to an Arab nation. Such was the case. however, as I left

the land that I love so much during its war against the Hamas terrorists who attacked the Holy Land.

During the first week of October, the crew of Our Jewish Roots filmed teaching in Israel by Joshua and Caleb Colson about events leading to the battle at Armageddon. We had prepared for the new series, Roadmap to Armageddon, for many months, unaware of how close we would

be to the escalation of a festering hatred toward God's Chosen People.

As we filmed in Jerusalem on Saturday, October 7, sirens sounded as missiles soared above us. Like most others in Israel, we took shelter. Because of the war, we could not fly home, and remained in Jerusalem for almost a week.

We finally got to Amman, Jordan after an extraordinary evacuation, thanks to a congressman who financed the rescue of our team and about 40 other Americans. Sadly, many Americans remained in Israel, unable to escape the advancing war zone, not knowing if their evacuation would happen. U.S. Representative Cory Mills of Florida, who had never been to Israel before, believed that our rescue was "the right thing to do." Coordinating the necessary vehicles, facilitating border crossings, and securing accommodations in Jordan took considerable effort. When I offered to pay for hotel rooms for my four team members, Rep. Mills said that he wanted to cover everyone's expenses. He never asked us to promote him or his cause. During the evacuation from Afghanistan in 2021, he also chartered a plane and secured transportation and lodging - costing him \$400,000 — for FOUR Americans. Cory Mills is a Believer* with an amazing, Christlike spirit!

In my 76 journeys to Israel over 45 years, while I've witnessed conflicts and threats, I've never experienced a fullblown war. More Jewish lives were lost on October 7 than on any other day since the Holocaust.

I'm writing this on the "Day of Rage" the *jihad* called for by Hamas and others seeking Israel's destruction. Rather than *indignation*, I'm calling on Believers to join me in *intercession* through "Days of Prayer" — as King David implored us to "*pray for the peace of Jerusalem*" (Psalm 122:6) some 3,000 years before the current atrocities against Israel.

Gospels of Matthew and John. "His light is what brings each of us out of darkness and gives hope to all nations." Rosenberg's sermons and family celebrations during the winter holiday season focus on this light.

"As Messianic Jews, we celebrate the best of both Hanukkah and Christmas and how they are linked through Yeshua," Rosenberg stated. "There is continuity between ancient prophecies written in the Hebrew Scriptures and texts, and the Greek Scripture (the New Testament). Together, they form a path for the whole world to be unified under one God."

Even though the original events of Hanukkah in the second century B.C. were, in Rosenberg's words, "a political chaos machine," he noted that lighting candles today "reminds us that Jesus is a light that never goes out. The events surrounding His birth were the fulfillment of hundreds of prophecies. So, during Hanukkah, we sing the traditional Jewish blessings and light each of the candles from the center candle representing Yeshua, and finish each blessing in His name."

At home with his wife Heather and two children during Hanukkah, Rosenberg lights the menorah that he's had his whole life. It helped him through a difficult time in his childhood. He remarked, "It was a spark of light in darkness then and is a reminder today of the blessings of my family, our connection to each other, and to Jesus as the light."

Heather grew up in a Christian home, celebrating Christmas with trees, gifts, and treats. But when Jacob and Heather married and started their family, "We wanted our celebrations to focus more on Jesus and less on the decorations. For us [the season] is about light in the darkness and Yeshua being the light of the world."

Rosenberg's journey to becoming a Messianic Jewish rabbi was rooted in

family history. "My dad's parents adhered to traditional Jewish faith and customs." he said. "But then my dad's older brother became a Believer in Jesus. Because my dad and mom were hippies, they wanted nothing to do with either tradition. So, they drove across the country to Oregon to get away from that."

"They actually lived in a van down by the river," he noted. "There was a little church community there that used to do potlucks. My parents started going to those for the free food." Eventually, however, they became Believers. Later, they started a Messianic Jewish synagogue in New York. Today, four Rosenbergs are Messianic Jewish rabbis, and another leads a Midwestern non-denominational church.

Rosenberg first wanted to be a comic book artist. After high school he studied art, but later switched to 3D animation. While working as a computer technologist in Manhattan brought him a great

salary and lifestyle, eventually he didn't like who he had become.

Changing course, Rosenberg returned to school to obtain a bachelor's degree in religion, followed by two more theological degrees. He then taught, was a guest preacher, and later became a rabbi. "I often tell people, it's not where you start; it's where you are headed," noted Rosenberg. "And the holiday season is a very good time to think much more deeply about that. Who are you, really? Who do you want to be? Who do you believe God to be? And what will you do with that?"

"During the holidays, the focus in much of our culture is on 'presents' rather than 'presence' — God's presence in your life, and your presence in the community and in other's lives," Rosenberg concluded. "We are at this place in time where people rush from one thing to the next or substitute social media for being physically present with others. But one of the best presents you can give is to be present. Look for ways to do that this holiday with your family and others in the community, through service organizations, your church, your synagogue, or your own chosen actions. Doing that is a wonderful way to be the lights that we celebrate at Hanukkah and Christmas. x

Being Kind About Christmas

On our end-of-the-year television programs for *Our Jewish Roots (OJR)*, we always decorate our set with some festive greenery. Because of this decor, we often receive comments from some viewers who think it's wrong for us even to acknowledge such "heathen" traditions on *OJR*. While I realize that some Believers want nothing to do with Christmas, I also know that most Believers celebrate the holiday. Wherever you land on this issue, my wish is for us to offer a little *extra* kindness and understanding to each other this year.

David and I were brought up by Christian parents who were passionate about Christmas music and attending celebratory musicals. These annual customs offered us ways to honor the birth of Jesus/Yeshua. Thus, the festive Christmas season has always held a special place in our hearts.

Debates about dates

Only in the last decade did I learn that our Savior probably wasn't born in December. Then, as I examined the origins of what we celebrate on December 25, I discovered many discrepancies and doubts about it being the true day of Yeshua's birth.

Jesus' death and resurrection bring eternal life to all who believe in Him as Savior and Lord (John 3:16; Rom. 10:9). God in Our Midst

This is not the article that we planned to write. We anticipated telling a heartwarming story of how God supernaturally worked on our first trip to the Holy Land as representatives for *Our Jewish Roots*. We went to Israel to get video footage for two new series: *Roadmap to Armageddon* and *Josiah and the Last Reformation*. Prior to our trip, the Lord often spoke to us. He prepared us for what was ahead, including divine appointments and even the outbreak of war.

Three days before departure, I (Joshua) tore the tendons in my calf. I couldn't walk and was in immense pain. I decided to pray for healing, and God completely healed me before I left for the airport. Aboard the plane, we hadn't left the tarmac before the Lord activated His assignments for us.

Throughout our trip, the Holy Spirit brought individuals across our path for us to minister to, and sometimes to minister to us. Difficulties, cancellations, road-closures, and blockades were daily occurrences. But with each snare Satan set, God intervened with a more powerful result than we could have imagined. Every day that we filmed was a miracle. And each day as we wrapped up shooting

Outbreak of War

On the day of Hamas's attack, we stood in front of the second largest mosque in Israel, teaching about repentance as sirens sounded and missiles flew above us. Still, we continued filming until we completed God's message. This happened again and again during our shoots that day and the next — God covered us with His hand of protection as we prayed Psalm 91 over our team. Being in this unique situation, we followed the Holy Spirit's direction to keep the world informed with the news behind the war. Daily, we filmed our stories and posted them on social media. With each video, hundreds of comments poured in that included prayers, tears, and hearts turned to Yeshua. We saw the Lord moving and touching hundreds of thousands of people on nearly every continent and throughout many countries.

Exodus

Our return flights to the U.S. were canceled time and again due to continued rocket attacks on Ben Gurion Airport.

Even so, God provided a way out. While at our hotel in Jerusalem, the Lord supernaturally initiated a friendship as Brenda and Paul Crouch spotted us on the roof of the hotel filming our "War Updates." They were connected with U.S. Rep. Cory Mills, who was planning to extract trapped Americans from Israel. The Crouches generously offered us their seats out of the country. Many other Americans, including our crew, were also desperate to leave. Ultimately, Congressman Mills funded, organized, and supervised an exodus of 45 Americans to Jordan where we were able to travel home to the U.S.

In the midst of hate, death, and destruction, God's Spirit always manifests Himself in power, confounding the spirit of the enemy. This war's effect on the people of Israel is tragic, and the death toll catastrophic. The ramifications of this conflict will continue for years to come. Please keep praying for the lost and those who are suffering in this war. Pray for God to remove the blinders from Israel's enemies who seek its destruction. It's not God's will that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance and believe on His Son, Yeshua (2 Peter 3:9; Acts 16:31).

Classic **Zola** Media Misinformation

I really am disheartened by reading and viewing the "news." There is so much misinformation being promulgated about the situation in the Middle East. It's time to define some terms.

Palestine

There never was such a country. "Palestine" was the name placed on Israel by the Emperor Hadrian in A.D. 135. It was replaced by the Israelis in 1948. For the intervening years, those living in the land — Jews, Arabs, Egyptians, Turks, etc. — were called Palestinians, just as all U.S. residents are called Americans, even though only Native Americans are indigenous to this land.

Palestinian

This word pertained to anyone who lived in Israel while it was called Palestine (A.D. 135-A.D. 1948). It harked back to the ancient Philistines — Greeks who settled along the shores of Gaza 3,000 years ago. It does not denote Arabs of any kind, but rather was applied to Jews before 1948. In fact, Arab-Muslims disliked being called Palestinians because the Jews were known by that name. Arab-Muslims began to co-opt the term "Palestinian" after 1948 when the Jews renamed the country "Israel." By 1964, when the Palestine Liberation Organization (PLO) was formed by the Egyptian, Yasser Arafat, the name was completely taken over by the Arab-Muslims of the land. But there was no Palestinian culture in history, just as there was no Soviet culture. The term "Soviet," which was applied to the various peoples who lived in Russia and its environs for 70 years, has come and gone. Likewise, the name "Palestine" or "Palestinian," applied to various peoples, has come, and should have gone.

Occupation

It is the Arab-Muslims of Israel who are occupying Jewish land and not the other

way around. While Arafat's people have, by constant repetition, tried to establish that Israelis are "occupying the West Bank," that territory, as well as all the rest of Israel, was given to the Jews by divine land grant (Gen. 12:1-3; Deut. 30:3-5; etc.). The Arab-Muslims in the land, now calling themselves Palestinians, largely have come over the borders since 1948 when the Israelis began building a modern nation. The Arab-Muslims took the jobs in construction and other skilled labor to help build the land, and they were paid fair wages. They came from Egypt, Syria, Jordan, Lebanon, and so forth. The idea that Israel was ever their own land is a myth.

War crimes

In paid advertising purchased by Arab-Muslims, the Jews are accused of using heavy weaponry like tanks and helicopters against unarmed civilians. The fact is that the Israelis are confronting hordes of rioters throwing rocks and even shooting with rifles provided to their "policemen" by Israel as part of the peace process. The Israeli soldiers are under strictest orders to deal with these mobs as gently as humanly possible. Indeed, if a modern army could kill only 200 people in a whole month with tanks and helicopters, it ought to go into some other business. One tank can kill 100 people in one second. Obviously, if the Palestinians stopped charging in huge mobs and challenging the Israelis, there would be no action whatever and no one killed or injured.

Temple Mount

This entire area is Jewish and was the home of the two Jewish Temples for 1,000 years as given in Scripture. It is particularly sensitive to Jewish people, as it is their holiest place on Earth. Muslim shrines were built there when the Jews were dispersed, but Jerusalem was never a holy city to the Muslims. And




the Muslim shrines have been respected by the Israelis and always protected by them. The idea that a Jew should not set foot on the Temple Mount is as ridiculous as claiming that an American should not set foot in Washington, D.C.

The Koran

Considered the holy writ of Islam, the Koran is actually replacement theology designed to supplant both Judaism and Christianity. The book teaches that Muslims are to kill the Jews and the Christians, and thus is extremely suspect as inspired by any god. The Arab-Muslims of Israel are not very religious people in general, and the sermons in the mosques seem completely given over to politics.

I could go on and on, but let's face it. If we are misinformed daily by the "Pales-

tinians" and by our Palestinian-guoting media, Israel will never get a fair shake. Sadly, that is what seems to be happening, and the Israelis seem to have nowhere to turn. I continue to favor the idea of unilateral separation, which is being discussed in the Israeli Parliament at this time. That would amount to simply drawing borders with the Arab-Muslims and then letting them operate as a separate country or whatever they like but knowing that they cannot cross that border. It would take a passport or other legal permission for them to enter the land of Israel. I've come to the same conclusion as the conservatives in Israel; there are some people you cannot make peace with or even live with. 众

Why is Jerusalem Important?

PART 2

Jerusalem — mentioned over 800 times in the Bible (and none in the Koran) has been an important city for thousands of years. Initially known as "Salem" (Gen. 14:18), it was later referred to both as Jerusalem and Jebus (Josh. 10:1; 18:28; Judg. 19:10). After King David captured it and made it the capital of Israel, Jerusalem was occasionally called Zion or the City of David (2 Sam. 5:7; 1 Kings 8:1).

Beyond its Biblical prominence, Jerusalem has remained important over the past 2,000 years, with different groups controlling it through the centuries. After modern Israel was established in May 1948, its leaders declared Jerusalem as its "eternal and sacred" capital in December 1949. Israel finally controlled all of Jerusalem after the 1967 Six-Day War, but the Jordanian *Waqf* (Islamic trust) now has administrative control of the Temple Mount compound.

Jerusalem will also play a major role in the End Times. The Prophet Zechariah proclaimed this Word from God:

"Behold, I will make Jerusalem a cup of drunkenness to all the surrounding peoples, when they lay siege against Judah and Jerusalem. And it shall happen in that day that I will make Jerusalem a very heavy stone for all peoples; all who would heave it away will surely be cut in pieces, though all nations of the earth are gathered against it. In that day," says the LORD, "I will strike every horse with Dr. Todd Baker Zola Levitt Ministries Staff Theologian staff@levitt.com




confusion, and its rider with madness; I will open My eyes on the house of Judah, and will strike every horse of the peoples with blindness." — Zechariah 12:2–4

During the Tribulation, a rebuilt Temple will stand in Jerusalem (Dan. 9:24–27; Matt. 24:15; 2 Thess. 2:4), which will be the temporary headquarters of the antiChrist. The Two Witnesses will also preach, be killed, and raised from the dead after their bodies lie in the streets of Jerusalem for three-and-a-half days (Rev. 11:1–12).

The Lord Jesus will reign from Jerusalem when He comes again to save Israel, defeat her enemies, and establish His Millennial Kingdom over all the Earth (Zech. 9–14). The Millennial Temple, from whence the Messiah will rule, will stand in Jerusalem (Ezek. 40–45). After the thousand-year reign of Christ over the world from Jerusalem is finished, God will create a new Heaven and a new Earth and bring down the Heavenly New Jerusalem (Revelation 21).

Psalm 122:6 commands: "*Pray for the peace of Jerusalem.*" That prayer will be fully realized when Jesus, the Prince of Peace, returns to bring redemption to the city and uninterrupted peace — both spiritual and political — to all of the world. Only then will Jerusalem fulfill the meaning of its name as the "city of peace." ☆

No Longer Hiding

When Israel was attacked on October 7, I didn't consider checking our ministry's YouTube comments. When I did, I couldn't believe what I read!

Joshua and Caleb (The Bearded Bible Brothers) were in Israel filming when the attack occurred. They posted YouTube updates that raised our visibility — 1 million views in a week! Those videos attracted some wicked responses.

Interspersed with sympathy and shock posts were over 200 blatant anti-Semitic comments. It took hours to remove those bad enough to be automatically flagged. Later, I deleted over 150 subtle posts that weren't flagged as possibly offensive. But some posts were so bad that YouTube made me click to a new page to see them ... after a warning.

Many posters proclaimed hatred for Israel and the Jews, some tried to convince others to hate, and some simply wrote insults. There were three "Hitler was right" comments and several calling the Jews "Nazis"! Here are the primary types of remarks:

- Israel has killed innocent Palestinians daily for years, so what do you expect?
- The Jews in Israel aren't the real Jews; but are European occupiers.
- Jews spit on Christians, and curse Jesus and Mary while Muslims honor them.
- The Jews killed Christ, you know.
- "Death to Israel" and "Free Palestine."

None of this hatred is new, but the amount appearing on ZLM's social media is. Some posts are from people who must believe that Israel kills Palestinians regularly, though nothing could be further from the truth. Before Israel attacks a terror site, whenever possible,



the Israel Defense Forces drop leaflets warning innocents to flee and even send text message warnings. Still, the false narrative remains. People begin to believe what they read and hear over and over. After reading and hearing lies repeatedly, they assume that they are true.



Those with such hate no longer hide it — they boldly express it. I'm not Jewish, so I didn't grow up with this anti-Semitism and perhaps I'm naive. Are we losing the battle against hate? I don't know. Yet I realize that such hearts and minds must be changed.

ZLM's To The Jew First fund will soon send Todd Baker's team to Israel for the 55th time to witness and distribute complete Hebrew Bibles to Muslims and Jews. These missionaries continue to be well received; their Gospel message is getting through. They aren't deterred by terrorism, war, or rumors of war. They know that Yeshua/Jesus, the Prince of Peace, is the only way for people in Israel and elsewhere to experience genuine peace. Only through Him will lost souls truly be transformed.

Will it ever occur to their "militants" (read: *terrorists*) that chanting *Allahu Akbar* (Arabic for "Allah is the greatest") while desecrating corpses is some of Islam's poorest P.R.?

The Renaissance in Europe, ranging from the 14th to 17th centuries, was a period of remarkable cultural and intellectual change. It was a time of renewed interest in classical learning and art that spawned the emergence of new ideas in science, philosophy, and literature.

This ministry's ongoing transition from Dr. Jeffrey Seif's Bible teaching to that of our Bearded Bible Brothers, Joshua and Caleb, could be deemed our own latest renaissance. Viewers and readers are experiencing a new, timely approach to meaty Bible teaching — geared to shorter attention spans — while our outreach's theological integrity remains intact. Let me explain.

Margot Dokken, our prior newsletter editor, now serves on our board of directors. She recently asked what formal theological expertise our ministry has since, as was Zola back in the day, the Bearded Bible Brothers Joshua and Caleb are self-taught. I posed Margot's query to Clayton Herring, the producer for Berg Productions, who responded:

Just as Zola consulted Dr. Thomas McCall, it remains important for us

to have access to a Bible expert with a doctorate in theology. Fortunately, Caleb and Dr. Jeffrey Seif have a very warm relationship with an open line of communication. Jeff appears on the set and in cameos as part of the February 2024 television series *Roadmap to Armageddon*.

We've also talked with Dr. Todd Baker (To the Jew First missionary and "Ask the Chaplain" author) about an interview for an upcoming series. Caleb and Todd worked together on Todd's *Faith Foundations* videos. Todd has graciously made himself available to Joshua and Caleb as a consulting theologian.





Remarkably, our television production crew was filming in Israel at the time of Hamas's worst attacks ever. Unable to leave, they did what the bravest journalists do: They ventured onto the streets for man-on-the-street interviews for social media posts and *Our Jewish Roots* broadcasts!

Kudos to our production team members in the trenches who routinely employ their faith, chutzpah, and smarts to bring you the best teaching from the Holy Land itself — rather than from the confines of a comfy studio. That said, this ministry needs your help after setbacks that include missing out on much of the Holy Land footage that we were anticipating along with having to postpone (and miss the revenue from) our fall tour. Please help us continue to bless Israel as per Genesis 12:3. 🜣





PA Rewards Terrorists' Families with Nearly \$3 Million

The Palestinian Authority (PA) paid the families of Hamas terrorists who died in October while carrying out the deadly attacks on Israeli civilians almost \$3 million as "martyr payments." Palestinian Media Watch (PMW) reported that the PA will also pay \$17,590 per month in salaries to the 50 Hamas prisoners captured by Israeli soldiers. Trump signed the Taylor Force Act, which halted American economic aid to the PA until they stop paying stipends through the "Palestinian Authority Martyr's Fund."

The Taylor Force Act was named for U.S. Army veteran Taylor Force, who was stabbed to death by an Arab-Muslim terrorist while visiting Israel in March

Under PA law, terrorists who are killed attacking Israel are defined as "martyrs" and their families receive a monthly stipend — often termed "pay for slay." The PA paid \$2,789,430 in October alone to the families of 1,500 dead Hamas terrorists as a reward for participating in the October 7 attack that resulted in the deaths of 1,400 Israeli citizens, the

kidnapping of more than 200 people, and the raping of women and children, PMW reported. This figure is in addition to the more than \$25 million per month that the PA already pays in salaries to imprisoned terrorists and families of terrorist "martyrs."

"The Palestinian Authority should be sending a big thank you to the EU countries and Norway, currently the largest funders of the PA, because the PA could not possibly make these terror payments without them," wrote Itamar Marcus for PMW. "These donor countries like to pretend that it's not their money rewarding terrorists, but everyone knows that the PA could not reward terrorists without this generous foreign funding. When payments to teachers, police, and street cleaners are taken care of by international donors, the PA has the hundreds of millions available it needs to pay for terror."

The U.S. indirectly funds these martyr payments by sending foreign aid to the PA. In 2018, then-President Donald 2016. Though the terrorist was killed by police, the PA government praised him, and his family receives lifelong financial compensation.

The law cut about a third of U.S. aid to the PA, but more legislation has been pushed to end those payments entirely. This year, U.S. Rep. Doug Lamborn (R-CO) re-introduced the Taylor Force Martyr Payment Prevention Act. Originally introduced by Sen. Tom Cotton (R-AR) in 2021, the legislation builds upon the original act by seeking to hold accountable the financial institutions that process "payfor-slay" payments.

"Radical Islamic terrorists shouldn't be rewarded for killing innocent people, and banks should be held responsible for processing any sort of "martyr payments." Our bill will build upon the original Taylor Force Act to ensure Palestinian terrorists don't benefit financially for committing these senseless murders," Cotton announced. 🜣

If you are right, our hearts are prepared as well, because the teaching of a pre-trib Rapture is about being prepared like the 10 virgins. Just so you know, the "last trumpet" refers to the Feast of Trumpets, Rosh Hashanah. There are several blowings of the *shofar* during that Feast; the Last Trumpet only occurs during that time. That term has been



Israeli Hospital Innovates to Treat War-Related Head Trauma

Faced with a growing number of head trauma cases due to the ongoing war with Hamas, medical professionals in Israel's largest hospital are innovating — including using artificial intelligence — to help treat victims of the war.

While the doctors of the Sheba Medical Center are used to treating many patients with diverse conditions every year, many of their new cases have complex brain injuries that cannot be addressed by conventional means.

The Center's Endovascular Neurosurgery Unit — which normally treats patients suffering from strokes, aneurysms, and brain bleeds — is modifying existing medical techniques to cope with the new cases. Suffering from head trauma due to gunshot wounds, rocket shrapnel, or falling debris, many of the new patients

have developed a brain aneurysm — an abnormal bulge in a blood vessel of their brains that is at risk of rupturing.

Brain aneurysms are usually the result of blood vessels weakening with age or a genetic defect. They are more common in people over the age of 40. If not detected in time, they may cause bleeding inside the patient's brain, which can be fatal.

These new cases, however, are occurring in soldiers on the frontlines and civilians in the south of the country who have been most impacted by the war with Hamas. Unlike conventional brain aneurysms, these aneurysms are appearing in small arteries that are so delicate that they can rupture during surgery.

The Neurosurgery Unit team has modified the tools used to treat other vascular diseases that involve small blood vessels — such as coronary microvascular disease — in order to perform these time-sensitive operations.

"These are some of the most difficult aneurysm cases we have encountered," explained Dr. Gal Yaniv, director of the hospital's Endovascular Neurosurgery Unit. "They're much more dangerous than normal aneurysms, and we're very confined by the way we can treat them. So, we have been improvising during each case, and are trying to understand how we can treat [each] patient without causing them any additional damage."

Aside from its Endovascular Neurosurgery Unit, Sheba Medical Center has streamlined the process of hospitalizing and tending to patients in urgent condition, as the number of soldiers and civilians wounded by the ongoing war rises.

The hospital has also integrated advanced artificial intelligence (AI) algorithms into its medical systems that are capable of analyzing X-rays, CT scans, and ultrasounds. They can

also quickly flag brain aneurysms, as well as other serious conditions. These algorithms, which were developed by Israeli startup Aidoc, notify practitioners when they spot a medical anomaly. They are much faster and more accurate than a radiologist.

Previously, the staff at Sheba had to manually analyze the scans, which has resulted in missing or delaying a diagnosis. "This is extremely important because when you have such a huge flow of work both for the radiologist and the clinician — especially now sometimes really serious pathologies can be missed, just because of the sheer amount of patients and scans," stated Yaniv, who is also the chief medical officer at Aidoc.

Due to the war, the Endovascular Neurosurgery Unit has seen a significant increase in the number of patients it has treated. AI tools have been crucial in treating these patients. "We're used to treating emergencies because we treat strokes and bleeds. But most of our time right now is dedicated to these trauma patients," Yaniv noted. "Like everyone in Israel right now, we're trying to be busy and productive."




Journalistic Bias in Media's Gaza Hospital Blast Coverage

Almost immediately after the parking lot of Gaza City's al-Ahli Hospital was struck, the headlines came quickly. "Israeli Strike Kills Hundreds in Hospital, Palestinians Say," blared *The New York Times*'s initial summary before it was updated to a no less problematic headline.

Without waiting for a single fact to be established other than a hospital had been hit — the Times jumped at the opportunity to blame Israel. They parroted the claim that 500 people had died without bothering to mention that Hamas controls the Palestinian Health Ministry. Even more disturbingly, the Times manipulated readers when they initially showed an image of a destroyed building in the Gaza Strip that had nothing to do with the hospital.

Predictably, the *Times* was not alone. *The Wall Street Journal* and CNN, abandoning all journalistic integrity, showed images of the destruction while indicating that it was an "Israeli strike."

The Associated Press and Reuters — two of the world's biggest wire agencies relied solely on Hamas and blamed the hospital hit on Israel. More disturbingly, Reuters concealed the fact that Hamas was its source by attributing the information to a "civil defense official."

Live news coverage also saw many anchors and reporters forgetting their duty to report verified facts and instead running with Hamas's verdict. In a galling example, BBC correspondent Jon Donnison announced that he found it "hard to see what else this could be really given the size of the explosion other than an Israel airstrike or several airstrikes because when we've seen rockets fired out of Gaza, we never see explosions of that scale."

Just 12 hours after the blast, Israel's military provided a wealth of evidence that exonerated itself. This included several videos showing that the rocket was fired by Hamas's ally Palestinian Islamic Jihad (PIJ). Most damningly,



Israel presented a recording of a phone conversation between two Hamas operatives who admitted that they were likely responsible for the blast.

Rather than updating stories to reflect the new evidence, news outlets instead were deliberately vague about what caused the explosion.

The al-Ahli Hospital explosion is a twopart tragedy.

The **first tragedy** occurred when PIJ showed no regard for innocent Palestinian civilians by firing a rocket at Israel, knowing full well that it might backfire with catastrophic consequences.

The **second tragedy** was when the international media showed no regard for the truth by blaming Israel first. They didn't even bother asking questions later.

"Not What We Expected" — Holocaust Survivors on the Hamas Atrocities

They spend their days telling people about the horrors they witnessed as children. They didn't expect to see similar horrors again some 80 years later.

As 15 Holocaust survivors who volunteer at the U.S. Holocaust Memorial Museum in Washington, D.C. gathered in front of the museum, two survivors read aloud a letter that they had composed:

"We are always gratified to see how much interest there is [in the Holocaust] from young people from every part of the world," said Dora Klayman, 85, who survived the Holocaust in what is now Croatia. "To hear their comments and questions gives us hope for the future. Today, as we see the murderous destruction in Israel, that hope is dimmed."

Nat Shaffir, 85, a Holocaust survivor from Romania, continued: "This is not what we expected in this final chapter of our lives, as we contemplate our legacy, the future of Holocaust memory and education, and the future of our people."

David Schaecter, 94, president of the Florida-based Holocaust Survivors' Foundation USA, remarked: "The barbarity of the Hamas attacks indeed reminds us that hatred of the Jewish people, and the infinite capacity for cruelty against our people, is a cancer that will never be eradicated. It must be recognized, protected against, and crushed when it threatens our people." Ruth Cohen — a 93-year-old Holocaust survivor from Hungary and Czechoslovakia who was deported to Auschwitz — responded to the recitation of the letter: "Speaking that was wonderful. But it's a terrible, terrible situation."

In January, Cohen traveled to the United Arab Emirates to mark International Holocaust Remembrance Day, one of the first commemorations in the Arab world. That gave her hope, she commented, and it persists "even through this, what's happening."

ER Doc Fired for Praising Hamas Attack

Mosab Hassan Yousef, the son of a Hamas leader, left the terror group and supposedly became a Christian [but that may not be true, based on his recent statements]. Interviewed in October about Israel's war against Hamas, Yousef was adamant about the need to remove the terror organization from the Gaza Strip. "This is an ugly war," Yousef said. "And Israel did not start it. Hamas did."

"Today, 25 years later, they are the rulers of Gaza, and we see what they are capable of doing," Yousef asserted.

Yousef rejected the idea that the terror organization is waging a political struggle for the Palestinian people. "Hamas is not a national movement. Hamas is a religious movement with a goal to establish an Islamic State," Yousef explained. "My understanding is that they are using the Palestinian cause only to achieve their goals, so the longterm goal, you know, is transforming the Middle East and the world into an Islamic State."

The former Hamas member believes that Israel should focus on removing Hamas more than on the public relations battle. "It is not the time to win public opinion," Yousef remarked, "it is the time to win the war against the most brutal terrorist organization living today."



Archaeology Archaeological Evidence for Hanukkah

Shortly after the 1967 Six-Day War, Theo and Miriam Siebenberg purchased a new home on a hill in the newly liberated Old City of Jerusalem. Years later, it became home to the Siebenberg House, a remarkable museum of Jewish history.


After moving in, Theo wanted to start digging. Since they were close to the Temple Mount, he expected that Jews had lived there 2,000 years ago. So, Theo contacted the authorities, who granted permission to excavate.

Immediately, "we pulled the hill out from under the house," Miriam noted. "We found two ritual baths, a wall from the Second Temple period, and a burial crypt dating back 3,000 years ago to the time of Kings David and Solomon."

Over the course of 18 years, they discovered many remarkable items, including coins, pottery, glass, jars, and mosaics. They also found large stones from a building that dated to the time of the Hasmonean Dynasty.

The Hasmonean period began when Israel, led by Judah the Maccabee, revolted against King Antiochus IV Epiphanes.

Modern upstairs, ancient downstairs



The king had outlawed circumcision and Sabbath observance as he sought to eradicate all traces of the Jewish faith. His army plundered the Temple, set up idols in it, and sacrificed a pig on the altar. In 164 B.C., Judah recaptured Jerusalem and the Temple. He removed the idols and rededicated the Temple. The celebration of Hanukkah commemorates this victory. The Hasmonean Dynasty, founded by the Maccabees, ruled until 63 B.C.

The Siebenbergs never lost their sense of excitement about living, literally, on top of Jewish history. Miriam described a number of

findings, such as a 2,600-yearold arrowhead used in the war against the Babylonians and a bronze bell that may have been part of a musical instrument some 2,000 years ago.

A support pillar on the property has black streaks containing "ashes from the time of the destruction of the Old City about 2,000 years ago," Miriam

enthused. A radiocarbon laboratory in South Africa confirmed that the ashes were "remnants from between the years [A.D.] 40 and 90," she explained. "The exact date of the destruction of the Upper City [now called the Old City] — the eighth day of the Hebrew month of Elul in the year 70 — we get from [first-century historian Flavius] Josephus."

The Siebenbergs have always radiated pride not only in their home and their incredible achievement, but also in their heritage. Former President Chaim Herzog, speaking in 1985 at the Siebenberg House, stated: "Here, in our time, you have created a direct link between our wonderful past and present and our exciting future."

Hamas Planned Social Media War Alongside Terror

An Israeli startup identified tens of thousands of fake social media accounts supporting Hamas. Most were created more than a year ago and remained inactive until the massive terror attacks in Israel on October 7.



abra — which monitors threats and Credit: misinformation on social media — identified more than 40,000 fake accounts across all platforms. Rafi Mendelsohn, Cyabra's VP of marketing, said that these fake accounts became active in a social media war that ran alongside

the brutal terror attacks. This coordinated action points to an "enormous level" of planning and organization.

Cyabra noted three primary narratives pushed on social media by the fake accounts.

The **first narrative**, primarily in Arabic, claimed that the number of Israeli hostages seized by Hamas meant that Israel was about to release Palestinian prisoners held in its jails.

The **second narrative**, mostly in English, highlighted the alleged compassion of Hamas toward its hostages. This occurred by manipulating images from mainstream media and using them to fit the Hamas narrative. An example is footage of Israelis being taken hostage into Gaza —later edited to suggest that the hostages were not being mistreated. Such disinformation can sway people to believe one narrative over another. That these three narratives were promoted in different languages shows "another layer of sophistication," Mendelsohn noted. The fake accounts use both pro-Hamas and pro-Israel hashtags in order to insert their content into as wide an audience as possible. This "incredible" sophistication, he asserts, "is definitely more akin to a state level actor-type operation."

In working with intelligence agencies, Cyabra also noted how much personal information about the hostages has been shared online. This information, he warned, is a weapon that is being utilized by Hamas.

Russia used similar fake social media accounts during its invasion of Ukraine. Mendelsohn noted that they are an increasingly effective tactic — "certainly cheaper than creating an army." \$






