Wait, isn't it supposed to be a trumpet? And what does this have to do with *Rosh Hashanah*? The Feast of Trumpets (also known as *Yom Teruah* or *Rosh Hashanah*) is one of the most sacred days for the Jewish people. Today, this day is mostly referred to as *Rosh Hashanah*, which literally means "head of the year" — the Jewish New Year. While associations with this day have changed over the millennia, the one thing that has not changed is its connection to the *shofar* ("trumpet").

A shofar is a ram's horn. It can be long or short. It has been a symbol associated with the Jewish people for millennia and is still blown to this day

As a death row inmate in Iran's notorious Evin Prison, arrested and sentenced to death because of the "crime" of converting to Christianity, I never imagined I would ever be able to visit Israel, much less make so many warm and close relationships with Israeli Jews.

Recently, I had the opportunity to express my thanks specifically to Israeli Air Force (IAF) pilots and crew follow-

ing their remarkable achievements, which were also very personal to me.

My dear Israeli brothers and sisters,

I am an Iranian woman who knows the evil nature of the Islamic Republic Regime in Iran, the enemy you fight while sacrificing your lives to protect your homeland and people. Like you, I have endured the brutality of this regime. In 2009, I was imprisoned for nearly nine months solely for my faith in Jesus, sentenced to death by hanging. I witnessed the execution of my cellmates and best friend, as well as the torture and abuse of countless innocent women. The regime killed my husband and destroyed my father's life. I endured immense pain, trauma, and suffering because of these radical Islamists in my homeland.

Millions of Iranians have faced unimaginable brutality. We share a common enemy. I also understand the suffering your people have endured due to the Islamic Republic and its terrorist proxies, who seek the destruction of your country and the extermination of your people.

I have felt ashamed my entire life because of these demonic rulers who share my language. Often, I hesitate to admit I am Iranian because of their actions.

Please know that Iranians are not the Islamic Republic. Millions, like me, have been oppressed and held hostage by the ayatollahs and their terrorist organizations in Iran and beyond. Like many Iranians, I have never hated you.

Our cultures share similarities — kindness, hospitality, and a love for life

Jews and Persians share a great history. Persian kings like Cyrus and Darius respected and supported you, God's Chosen People. Yet, figures like Haman and the ayatollahs have sought to divide us. Yet, the God of Israel has

always defended His people, proving His faithfulness.

It is an honor to call you my brothers and sisters. I pray that soon, Persians and Jews will restore our friendship, celebrating together over the defeat of our mutual enemies. May the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob bless and protect you, granting wisdom and victory in every battle. I hope one day the lions of Judah and Persia will stand united, that our nations become close allies, and that Iranians rise to reclaim their dignity and freedom, never again allowing evil to hijack our country.

I love and admire your bravery on behalf of my people. I will keep you and your nation in my prayers until we celebrate victory together.

in synagogues around the world. While there are some instances in Scripture where a metal instrument (trumpet, חצוצרה) is specifically mentioned (Num. 10; Ps. 98:6; Matt. 6:2, to name a few), other times, *shofar* has been translated as "trumpet." However, there is a special significance to calling the *shofar* by its actual name and not translating it as "trumpet."

Why does the shofar specifically matter for Rosh Hashanah? First, it is important to understand that the Feast of Trumpets is a Biblically appointed time. God commanded the Children of Israel to observe this special day on the first day of the seventh month of the Hebrew calendar:

On the first day of the seventh month you are to have a sacred assembly. You are to do no laborious work. It is for you a day for sounding the shofar. You are to prepare a burnt offering as a pleasing aroma to ADONAI: one young bull from the herd, one ram, and seven male lambs a year old, without flaw, with their grain offering of fine flour mixed with oil, three tenths of an ephah with the bull, two tenths with the ram, and one tenth with each of the seven lambs, as well as one male goat as a sin offering to make atonement for yourselves (Num. 29:1–5, TLV).

The command is to assemble, to rest from all work, to blow the *shofar*, and to offer sacrifices for atonement. What separates this appointed time from the other fall feasts (*Yom Kippur, Sukkot, Shemini Atzeret*) is the blowing of the *shofar*.*

Historically, people blew a shofar to announce something — the new moon, the year of Jubilee, the start of war, or to alert the Children of Israel to danger. For followers of Messiah, we believe in the spiritual and prophetic element of the shofar in that it calls us to be awake and

alert to the return of Messiah Yeshua. The Apostle Paul (*Rav Sha'ul*) emphasizes this in 1 Thessalonians 4:16–17 (TLV):

For the Lord Himself shall come down from Heaven with a commanding shout, with the voice of the archangel and with the blast of God's shofar, and the dead in Messiah shall rise first. Then we who are alive, who are left behind, will be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air — and so we shall always be with the Lord.

Clearly, the blowing of the *shofar* is a big deal! Many speculate that because Yeshua fulfilled the spring feasts (Passover, Unleavened Bread, First Fruits, and Shavuot) in His First Coming, His return and the ultimate salvation of Israel will be fulfilled during the fall feasts (Yom Teruah/Rosh Hashanah, Yom Kippur, Sukkot, and Shemini Atzeret). While we cannot say with certainty that this is what will happen, we would be wise to keep a watchful eye during these special feasts.



At the very least, we know that the Lord is calling us to be awake and alert! And we should be keeping a prayerful vigilance for Israel and its people, especially as Israel's enemies become more emboldened in these days. As the day of His return draws near, let the *shofar* remind us of His glorious and awesome promises to the people of Israel, and the redemption of the world!

Shanah Tova! [(Have) a good year!]

* While the *shofar* is traditionally blown at the end of *Yom Kippur*, this is not a Biblically mandated command. It dates back to Temple times when the priests would blow the *shofar* on the *Yom Kippur* that ushered in the Jubilee year.





Classic **Zola**A Sad Goodbye

Let's bow our heads and say farewell to the dearly departed. In this generation, truth — the sought-after virtue of Believers from time immemorial — has died.

Truth met its end in various places: Washington, D.C., Arab dictatorships, major Christian seminaries, and secular universities. It is nearly gone from some church pulpits, the legal system, law enforcement, the military, and everywhere else.

And it will be sadly missed. Our Lord said, "I am the way, the truth, and the life" (John 14:6, emphasis added). He advised us, "Everyone that is of the truth hears My voice" (John 18:37, emphasis added), and "The truth will make you free" (John 8:32, emphasis added).

I don't have to detail what's happening in the present administration in Washington. Truth died there years ago. More recently, however, the grave has been robbed and the body destroyed.

And more sadly, we are teaching our youngsters from the kindergarten level through the universities a kind of silly lie which is very damaging to us. Stymied as to how to please all of the different minorities (except the Jews, of course, whom no one has to please), we have come up with something called "multiculturalism." The National Association of Scholars recently issued a report that "gender and race" have become the major influences in determining what gets read in our schools. In order to be fair to all, we have promoted some very mediocre writers because of these two distinctions, rather than because what they've written is worthwhile. (Jewish authors, representing an authentic minority group, are included not as a minority but as "dead white males.")

In the Middle East, truth died in 1964 when some Arabs decided that they were "Palestinians." Under the British

mandate, they refused to accept this term because they said it was the Jews who were the Palestinians. But then Arafat and his henchmen persuaded them that they could just pretend to be an ancient people in the land, and American reporters would buy that story. Thus, the myth was created, and Israel is being stolen "peace by peace."

In a more specific recent example, truth has died in Lebanon. I listened to the National Public Radio's tears over the problems there (after 20 heartless years of berating Israel for "occupying Arab land"). The radio people were troubled that the Syrian-backed Hezbollah is now simply murdering people wholesale in an area that, under Israeli protection, was at least safe for civilians. Now that the Israelis have left Lebanon, the Arabs are back to their perennial sport of killing each other.

The truth has gone through tortured stages before its recent demise in the Arab areas of Israel. There were clear steps:

- "We're not the Palestinians." (before 1948)
- "We're the real Palestinians." (Arafat in 1964)
- "The Jews took our land." (the Intifada, 1987)
- "We've been here thousands of years." (declared to me personally on TV when I interviewed Faisal Husseini in the Orient House in October 1995)
- "The Jews never lived here in the past." (1999)

Hitler said that the people at large would believe a great lie more readily than a small one, and I'm afraid he was right.

This ministry has most recently been trying to resurrect the truth in our major seminaries. Many of you have



heard from Moody Bible Institute and Dallas Theological Seminary (though we haven't). The letters from them that you've forwarded to us vary along these lines: We're not teaching Progressive Dispensationalism, and if we are, it's only a few of us, and even if it's the majority of us, it doesn't matter, and even if it matters, we're getting more students, constructing more buildings, and we've even established our own bank here in Chicago!

Never mind that no professor, student, or administrator has yet tried to defend Progressive Dispensationalism, a simple error of purposely confusing two Biblical thrones. When they say that Jesus is sitting on the throne of David in Heaven — a prime tenet of Progressive Dispensationalism — they contradict Scripture. Carefully consider the following verse:

To him that overcometh will I grant to sit with me in **My** throne, even as I also overcame, and am set down with my Father in **His** throne" (Rev. 3:21, emphasis added).

Note that the verse above concerns two thrones, one of which is God's in His throne room in Heaven, and the other is the throne of David on Earth in Jerusalem. We will sit with our Lord at David's throne, since we will dwell in Jerusalem in the Kingdom to come.

But the technicalities of the error are not its major problem; it's the effect of the error. Because they assume under Progressive Dispensationalism that Jesus is already on David's throne, then the Kingdom, in effect, has already started, and they don't need all this inconvenient End Times prophecy or the chore of witnessing to, and even loving, the Jews or Israel.

The seminaries may try a hundred different explanations as to why our complaints are unjustified, but one thing they cannot deny: In the 1970s, their graduates were excited about Israel and prophecy as no generation of Christians ever had been before. Today, many seminary graduates are complete dolts on these crucial subjects. Bear in mind that these graduates will lead our churches in the future.

If the Bible said, "I will bless those who curse Israel," then the seminaries would be justified in teaching Progressive Dispensationalism. *

porters. ... The platform is a modern take on the

musicians, and authors sometimes
relied on wealthy donors' patronage to
finance their work."

Most participants are free subscribers, and they can meet other subscribers in the chat rooms and receive email alerts when ZLM posts new content. Caleb's other updates led me to write the reply below, which you may find revealing.

One possibility for your consideration, Caleb, is specifying how Levitt Letter readers can locate and navigate all the fine Bible teaching materials you and Josh are creating — both the free stuff along with products and content for purchase.

How much do we hope to raise from such online purchased items in the short and midterms? Generous donors may choose to sponsor a couple of days of totally free access to all of our behind-the-paywall content. Then we could announce those free days via the email notifications that alert ZLMers each time we post a newsletter or other important information.

Our paywall could include an announcement along the lines of "For free access to our Patreon pages, etc., please come back on our next Free



Day — [specifying a date]." If all goes well, the frequency of our free days would continue to increase, depending on how the Lord leads us to manage the ratio of free days to paid.

At one point, we could calculate how many weeks or months we could offer either back-to-back or intermittent free days if someone were to donate, say, \$100,000. Some donors might use their wills, IRAs, and/or 401(k) retirement funds specifically to sponsor free access to all of our online content that otherwise would reside behind a paywall. (501(c)3 nonprofits like ZLM would be exempt from paying taxes, whereas most of the will's other beneficiaries would pay deferred income tax.)

For that matter, should we suggest that donors designate contributions to our ongoing social media expansion effort? We presently pay our Israeli marketing company \$6,000 per month to grow our social media quickly — to steadily increase our number of followers.

On the bulk mail battlefront, we could suggest a donation amount for a given month's *Personal Letters* (*PLs*) going to our prisoners. Our 2,400 inmate subscribers presently receive just our *Levitt Letters* (*LLs*). One benefit of them receiving the *PL* in addition to the *LL* is





that we would have a greater selection of "snail mail" comments and questions to publish.

Unlike most ZLMers who have instant Internet access via Apple products, PCs, and Androids, our brothers and sisters behind bars have abundant time to read, pray, and meditate. They value our ministry's good, ole'-fashioned hard-copy news magazine. Imagine their joy in reading that the PL they're receiving is a gift designated for them — thousands of them!

According to gemini.google.com, many state and federal prison libraries have DVD players. Their purposes include:

- 1) Providing access to documentaries, instructional videos, and educational series.
- 2) Offering movies to reduce idleness and provide leisure activities.
- 3) Rehabilitation by supporting inmates' personal development and well-being.
- 4) Behavior management via a structured activity.

The selection of DVDs varies by facility. Educational and G/PG-rated entertainment films are common. While you won't find a personal DVD player in every cell, communal or designated viewing areas within the library or education departments often provide access to DVD players and a collection of movies.

Our ministry has tons of Bible-teaching DVDs — thousands and thousands

— just as many people had too many LP records decades before turntables resurfaced. Now, imagine ZLMers buying our DVDs in bulk at half off and designating them as gifts for the facilities of our tremendous inmate readership. Our incarcerated brethren could even suggest that their chaplains send us consent to provide them free

DVDs and/or request particular titles. Hello, prison ministry.

Or rather, "Hello, enhanced prison ministry." Why? Because ZLM has been in prison ministry for four decades. Our Levitt Letter's Bulletin Board once featured "Brothers in Bonds" announcements, seeking prayers for particular prisoners.

As you can see, Caleb, your email inspired me to brainstorm about potential ways to better harness our resources to feed more of God's sheep. Now hopefully, this Note will lead our readers to write in and donate, adding and contributing to the visions that I've described above.

What Is the Biblical Definition of Faith? Part 1

Hebrews 11:1 defines faith as "the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen." Thus, true Biblical faith is the conviction or belief that God will fulfill His promises, even though they are not yet visible. If everything God promised were tangible, faith would not be necessary — our assurance would rest on what is seen, rather than on trust in God's promises and His trustworthy character. Much like our eyes let us see the physical world, faith allows Believers to perceive the invisible realities of God's Kingdom (2 Cor. 4:18).

Christian faith is not a blind leap in the dark; instead, it is a confident trust rooted in the historical reality of Jesus Christ and His redemptive work (Rom. 10:9–10). EnduringWord.com emphasizes the connection between faith and reason:

Faith does not contradict reason.

though it may go beyond reason. One may objectively prove the Bible is the most unique book ever published and has impacted society more than any other book. But only faith can prove that the Bible is the Word of God. Therefore, this is a belief beyond reason but not in contradiction to reason or against reason.

Jesus commended such faith when He told Thomas, "Because you have seen Me, you have believed. Blessed are those who have not seen, and yet have believed" (John 20:29).

In the New Testament, the most common Greek word for faith, *pistis*, stems from a root meaning "to persuade." In antiquity, this term referred to a warranty. Thus, Biblical faith is a divine persuasion — God's spiritual assurance or guarantee that His promises are true and will be fulfilled.


There are three essential components of faith, expressed in Latin as *notitia*, assensus, and fiducia.

- Notitia refers to knowing facts about the Christian faith. This includes the objective, historical facts about Jesus: He is God in the flesh, was born of a virgin, lived a sinless life on Earth, died a sacrificial death in place of sinful humanity, rose from the dead to give us eternal life, and is coming again.
- **Assensus** refers to a person acknowledging or affirming that these facts are true.
- Fiducia refers to someone personally trusting in Jesus Christ for salvation. Mere agreement with Christian doctrine isn't enough one must actively rely on Christ alone.

Saving faith is a gift from God that doesn't result from human effort (Eph. 2:8–9). Paul writes in Romans 12:3 that God has allotted each Believer a "measure of faith."

Next month, we will continue to look at the Object of our faith and the results of faith. \$\phi\$



were pagan Greco-Roman settlements. Thus, most first-century Jews avoided the area as ritually and morally unclean. But today, Sussita/Hippos is a National Park of Israel where the park rangers are mostly Jewish!

God led us to share the Gospel of Yeshua the Messiah with two park rangers, **Elon** and **Jonathan**. Both men knew that Jesus of Nazareth ministered in that area. August and I told the men that Yeshua's ministry — giving eternal life to those who believe in Him — continues today in that area as we offered each of them God's Good News and a complete Bible in Hebrew. We explained that both Testaments of the Bible proclaim that Yeshua is the Messiah, the Son of the living God (Ps. 2:7, 12; Matt. 16:16).

Both Elon and Jonathan gladly accepted the Hebrew Bibles and Messianic Gospel tracts that we offered them. So, while the ancient cities are gone, in their ruins, we preached the everlasting Gospel, freely distributed the Word of God, and testified about Messiah Jesus to the Jewish men working there.

A funeral for some of the 46 Christians killed on June 1, 2025, in Ankali, Edikwu Ankpali, Apa County, Benue state, Nigeria.

Christian persecution is increasing across the globe, according to a new report from International Christian Concern (ICC). The "2025 Global Persecution Index" reveals that around 300 million Christians worldwide face punishments including prison, torture, and assassination.

"We have staff all over the world ... so they're feeding us news of what's going on in their countries," explained **Jeff King**, (right), president of ICC. "We're constantly monitoring and watching."

The current report reveals a worsening persecution picture, ranging from terrifying government restrictions in China to rampant persecution and land-grabbing in Nigeria.

King also noted that Russia has destroyed hundreds of churches and heritage sites in Ukraine since Russia's 2022 invasion, among other disturbing issues.

"And then you've got all the usual places like India, Egypt, and North Korea," King explained. "It's an absolutely horrible situation ... not necessarily new, but it's terrible."

Nigeria and North Korea are perhaps the two most difficult nations in which to be a Christian. For Christian farmers or villagers in Nigeria, King stated that "the Fulani terrorists — the Islamic terrorists — [might] come in with guns, with machetes; they shoot, maim, slice, and drive you off the land. And if you decide to come back, they'll attack you again."

He stressed that the Nigerian government often does little to stop the carnage, while the Biden administration didn't put the required pressure on them to help stop the madness. As a result, over three million Christian farmers have been driven off their lands.

As for North Korea, King lamented a government system that tends to elevate dictator Kim Jong Un to a god-like status. "They're constantly being told the propaganda that they live in a utopia and the best country on Earth and the United States is the worst place on Earth," he declared, adding that anyone who goes against that narrative risks his or her life.

"If you're a real Christian, you're either killed right away or you're sent to a gulag — a massive, massive prison camp," he emphasized. "These prison camps, some of them are the size of Washington, D.C., and are basically slow extermination chambers. *\psi'

Read Hebrew right to left!



The "world" is a place of fearful exile from the Lord. To find healing and peace, we must turn away from its faithless messages and listen (shema) to the great promises of God. As it is written: "He who abides in the secret of the Ascended One will dwell in the shadow of Shaddai" (Ps. 91:1).

The sages say that Moses wrote Psalm 91 as he dwelt in the "secret place" (סֶתֶר) of the Most High God — in the "midst of the dark cloud" (Exod. 24:18), a place of sacred and holy concealment. The thick clouds were a "hiding place" for Him (Job 22:14). Notice that the one who "abides" in the secret of the Most High dwells in an ascended place of rest — lifted up above the surrounding madness of this fallen world. The Hebrew word means to lodge or "sleep" (לוון), connecting it with death and resurrection. By dwelling in the death and resurrection of Yeshua, God will shield you with His Presence and make evil powerless before you.

When you abide in the secret of *Elyon* (עֶּלְיוֹן) — "the Ascended One" — you are concealed by the dark clouds of His

Glory, and the Presence of Shaddai (שַּיַרי) overshadows you. The Lord will save you from the ensnaring trap and from the devastating pestilence (Ps. 91:3). By abiding in the truth that God's Presence pervades all things at all times, you become a "stranger" (אַנישָּׁיבּר) with the Lord in this world — a "sojourner" (אַנישָּׁיבּר) who awaits the healing of the world at the end of the age. "You will tread on the lion and the adder; the young lion and the serpent you will trample underfoot" (Ps. 91:13).

We are made secure exclusively on account of Yeshua the Savior, who gloriously ascended over the powers of this age and made safe passage for us by means of His sacrificial death on the Cross. Because of Him alone, we have acceptance and access to the Holy of Holies made without human hands. Yeshua is the Ascended Lord of Glory, the Master of all possible worlds, and the King over all things! Nothing can stop Him or thwart His victory secured for those who are trusting in Him. 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

Prof. Michael Wise An in-depth interview with a professor of Aramaic, the language of Yeshua. University of Chicago professor Wise helped translate the fragments when they were first released and enthusiastically discusses The New Jerusalem text, telling how the future will be.





Israel's Iron Beam: Military "Game-Changer"

The Iron Dome system, which intercepts enemy missiles, has become the iconic image of Israel's defense. Now, a new era is dawning, with a weapon that is invisible, silent, and strikes at the speed of light.

Israel has become the first nation to deploy a high-energy laser in combat. The state-of-the-art technology, called the Iron Beam, uses directed energy in the form of laser light. The breakthrough in this technology came with the idea of shooting hundreds of small beams at a target rather than a single large beam. It works by locking a small beam onto a weak point in the target, then multiple beams follow, concentrating heat like a high-intensity spotlight until the threat is destroyed.

While countries such as the U.S., China, Germany, and Japan are experimenting with laser technology, only the Iron Beam has proven itself in battle. Israel Defense Forces Brig. Gen. Doron Gavish, a specialist in the Iron Beam technology, noted that the system has been used

border, each costing just a few hundred dollars. Defending against this array was incredibly expensive, until now.

Journalist and military analyst Yaakov Lappin called the Iron Beam a "game-changer." He explained that cost was one of the system's major advantages: "Instead of \$50,000 for an Iron Dome interceptor, it's \$5 now per interception."

Israel's Rafael Advanced Defense Systems developed the Iron Beam system. CEO Yoav Tougeman sees this as the first time in military history that the defender has the economic advantage over the attacker.

Because the Iron Beam is mobile, it can accompany military forces when they maneuver in enemy territory or can be operated remotely. Lappin added that two other versions of Iron Beam are expected. The second system, due by the end of the year, would be capable of intercepting a wide range of missiles up to six miles away, almost instantly after launch, even before they leave enemy territory. A third, still in development with Israel's Elbit Systems, could take the laser airborne.

Both fog and dust storms can limit the Iron Beam's effectiveness. Thus, the new system will enhance, rather than replace, Israel's multi-faceted defense systems comprised of Iron Dome, David's Sling, and Arrows 2 and 3. 🌣

Cancer-Sniffing Dogs

A cancer sniffing Beagle

Israeli researchers have developed a method for detecting cancer by training dogs to identify the disease through scent. The goal is to offer a fast, noninvasive screening tool for early cancer detection in Israel and beyond.

Patients simply breathe into a face mask for three minutes. The mask is then sealed and sent to a testing facility, where it is presented to the trained dogs in a sterile environment. When a dog identifies a positive sample, it signals detection by sitting or lying down.

SpotitEarly, an Israeli medical technology company, trained Beagles using repeated exposure to breath samples from both healthy individuals and cancer patients. The dogs were later used in a study that showed promising results.

Approximately 1,400 people participated in the study. Of the 261 participants diagnosed with cancer, the dogs correctly identified 245 — a 94% accuracy rate. Among the 1,048 healthy individuals, only 60 were incorrectly flagged, reflecting a relatively low false-positive rate.

To improve the reliability of the results, researchers incorporated artificial intelligence and computer vision into the testing process. These technologies tracked the dogs' behavior and analyzed their responses, reducing the risk of human error and ensuring a consistent, standardized evaluation.



Canines have one of the most powerful olfactory systems in the animal kingdom, with about 300 million scent receptors, compared

to around 5 million in b humans. The part of the canine brain dedicated to smell is 40 times larger than in people. Thus, dogs can detect tiny chemical changes in breath samples,



Shlomi Madar, CEO of SpotitEarly, said the next phase includes clinical trials in the United States, aimed at securing regulatory approval for widespread use. The company also plans to expand its team of Beagles and develop mobile diagnostic units.

"Our vision is to make early cancer detection widely accessible — using tools that are noninvasive, safe, and affordable." Madar stated. The first test kits are expected to launch within a year, with a projected price of \$250 per test.

"This is a breakthrough that enhances our ability to detect malignancies early, when the chances of successful treatment are highest," said Prof. Meirav Ben-David, head of the Oncology Institute at Assuta Medical Center in Tel Aviv.

"Because the test is noninvasive and painless, it can be conducted frequently and adjusted based on an individual's personal risk factors. We are also working to refine the dogs' ability to distinguish between different types of cancer." 🌣



Are the Dead Sea Scrolls Older than We Thought?

The Dead Sea Scrolls contain some of the earliest known versions of texts from the Bible, including the Books of Genesis, Exodus, Isaiah, Kings, and Deuteronomy. For decades, researchers relied on handwriting style and radiocarbon dating to determine that the manuscripts originated between the third century B.C. and the first century A.D.

Now, however, artificial intelligence (AI) is giving researchers more accurate insight into when the scrolls originated.

Findings recently published in the journal *PLOS One* contend that the Biblical manuscripts date to about 2,300 years ago, which would be up to 150 years earlier than researchers originally thought.

The new dating discovery places Dead Sea Scrolls for the Book of Daniel directly in the same time period as the life of its presumed author.

"The Dead Sea Scrolls were extremely important when they were discovered because they completely changed the way we think about ancient Judaism and early Christianity," said **Mladen Popović**, (right), who is dean of the Faculty of Religion, Culture, and Society at the University of Groningen in the Netherlands.

"Out of around 1,000 manuscripts, a bit more than 200 are what we call Biblical Old Testament, and they are the oldest copies we have of the Hebrew Bible. They gave us a lot of information about what the text looked like back then," he continued.

Popović and his team used an AI program called Enoch to analyze handwriting on 27 pieces of thumbnail size scraps of parchment through an algorithmic approach and then compared that with radiocarbon dating. They then compared the handwriting style of other manuscripts from the region to objectively determine an approximate age range.

"With the Enoch tool, we have opened a new door into the ancient world, like a time machine, that allows us to study the hands that wrote the Bible, especially now that we have established, for the first time, that two Biblical scroll fragments come from the

time of their presumed authors," Popović explained.

"They are physical, tangible evidence of a period of history that is crucial — whether you're Christian or Jewish or don't believe at all — because the Bible is one of the most influential books in the history of the world. So the Scrolls allow us to study it as a form of cultural evolution," he added.

The Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered by Bedouin shepherds inside the Qumran caves in the Judean Desert from 1946 to 1947.

Previously, researchers relied heavily on paleography — the study and decipher-

ing of ancient writing and manuscripts — to determine the manuscript's age.

Popović contends that AI's ability to analyze the Dead Sea Scrolls will transform how researchers study artifacts.

Even so, Christopher Rollston, a professor and chair of Biblical and Near Eastern languages and civilizations at George Washington University, argued that the AI analysis wasn't very surprising. "The results of this study are very interesting and presumably important, but not Earth-shattering," he noted. "Most of the conclusions of this article also dovetail with what the great paleographers in the

field ... had already stated more than 60 years ago."

Rollston commented that while AI could be helpful in research, it should not be the "only tool in the toolbox of someone wishing to determine the date for the writing of a manuscript. After all, handwriting, and all of its variations and idiosyncratic features, is a deeply human trait. Machines can be helpful in isolating features of a script, but the presence of a gifted paleographer is at least as valuable as a machine-learning tool."

Senior Iranian Official: Israel Used Occult During 12-Day War

In July, Abdollah Ganji, former editor of the IRGC-linked newspaper Javan, told his 150,000 followers on X/Twitter that a "strange phenomenon" happened during the 12-day War. The Mossad's official X account in Farsi responded to Ganji's post: "Using drugs and talking to the jinn are not desirable traits for someone leading a country."



Jinn, first mentioned in the Koran, supposedly have extraordinary powers and can assume different forms. According to Britannica.com, Islam conceptualizes them "as creatures parallel to human beings who are capable of choosing between good and evil and must thus face eventual salvation or damnation"

110 Immigrants Arrive in Israel One Day After Ceasefire

Philly, an extremist anti-Israel group which touts itself as "families in Philly coming together to stop the genocide in Gaza."

The group organized a rally in February where speakers said, "all glory to the martyrs," and led workshops aimed at teaching people how to have conversations with kids about "oppression," "genocide," and "apartheid."




An advertisement for an August event featured a photo of a child wearing a headscarf reading "Jerusalem, we are coming" — a slogan used by terrorist groups Hamas and Hezbollah.

The events have sparked major backlash from community members and Jewish leaders who are furious that tax money is paying for anti-Jewish propaganda aimed at children.

"Libraries are [viewed as] safe places where parents and grandparents can take their kids and the programming is safe as milk," noted Steve Feldman, executive director of the Greater Philadelphia Zionist

Organization of America. "[They] shouldn't be used for programming that incites Jew-hatred and other forms of social engineering ... They're not indoctrination centers."



Who was Buried in Salome's Tomb?

Inside the cave

An imposing burial cave from the Second Temple Period has been venerated for centuries as a Christian pilgrimage site believed to be the tomb of Salome, a follower of Jesus. New research by the Israel Antiquities Authority (IAA) now suggests that it was more likely the final resting

place of a member of King Herod's family.


Thanks to excavations conducted in 2022–2023, IAA archaeologists have discovered that the site known as the "Cave of Salome" was far more elaborate than previously understood.

In a paper published in the 2025 issue of the IAA journal *Atiqot*, Nir-Shimshon Paran and Vladik Lifshits suggest that the

burial site, near the village of Eliav in the Judean Foothills, may have preserved the memory of Salome, Herod the Great's powerful sister.

"The structure consists of a courtyard, an entrance, and the cave itself, which presents several burial niches and other installations for burial practices," Paran noted. "The site is one of the largest, if not the largest, burial estates from the period found in Israel, nicely built and richly decorated."

According to Paran, the burial estate was built between the first century B.C. and the first century A.D. Later, it fell into

disuse until it was revived in the sixth century A.D. as a Christian pilgrimage site for roughly 400 years.

Herod, of Edomite ancestry, was appointed King of the Jews by the Roman Senate, and ruled over Israel on behalf of the Roman Empire. His sister Salome was highly involved in the court's affairs

and intrigues. When Herod died, he willed her several cities, over which she then ruled.

In the first century, the name Salome (Shlomit in Hebrew) was quite common. According to Mark's Gospel, Salome was one of the followers of Jesus who witnessed Jesus's crucifixion (Mark 15:40; 16:1). The apocryphal Gospel of James, likely written in the second century A.D., mentions another Salome, supposedly a companion of the midwife who assisted Mary during childbirth. During the Middle Ages, the name became associated with the midwife herself.

The cave was first excavated in the 1980s after looters had plundered it. The digs

after looters had plundered it. The digs uncovered dozens of inscriptions in Greek, Arabic, and Syriac dating back to the Christian use of the cave. Among the inscriptions in Greek, two indicate Salome was the person to whom the site was dedicated.

The cave features a roughly 2,422-squarefoot courtyard, as well as exquisite ashlar masonry and other architectural decorations.


According to Paran, the monumental structure of the tomb has few parallels in Israel. "There are similarities between this cave and some luxurious burial estates in Jerusalem, but this is larger and more elaborate than most of them," he noted.

Two grandiose Roman villas have also been discovered in the area — one located a little more than half a mile from the burial estate, the other roughly three

miles away. According to the researchers, the burial site was likely constructed by the same individuals who owned the nearby luxurious residences.

The connection to Queen Salome may help explain why such grand estates were built in this remote area, far from Jerusalem's political and administrative heart.

"We know that [Herod's sister] Salome lived in Ashkelon, where Herod built her a palace, but she also owned lands in the Jordan Valley, north of Jericho," Paran explained, noting that the cave is located on the route between the two cities. "In addition, this area in the Second Temple Period was known as Idumea, where Herod's family came from.

"While we have no definite evidence to prove our theory, we believe it is a very plausible explanation since everything connects," he added.

"During the Byzantine Period, the first Christian era in the Land of Israel, Believers actively sought out holy sites and relics connected to their faith," Paran noted. "Every place that they could somehow tie to the Old or the New Testament was turned into a pilgrimage site."

Paran explained that the Cave of Salome could have been visited by hundreds of thousands of people over the centuries, as testified by the number of inscriptions and other artifacts unearthed in the cave, including dozens of oil lamps featuring intricate decorations.

The archaeologist added that a reference to the original Salome may have existed in the cave, which could have contributed to the development of the tradition. "During the Second Temple Period, it was not common to leave inscriptions on walls, but sometimes the name of the deceased was written on ossuaries," Paran noted. "It is possible that the cave contained an ossuary carrying the name of Salome, even though we did not find it. It might have been looted."



Anti-Semitism

Ontario Teacher: Student with a Jewish Parent is "Half-Human"

The incident surfaced during a study on anti-Semitism in Ontario, which is home to 30,000 Jewish children. University of Toronto sociology professor **Robert Brym** surveyed 599 Jewish parents between January and April. Many parents, including those of the six-year-old, responded that the form of anti-Semitic harassment that their families experienced was not directly connected to the war in Gaza.

In one case, a 13-year-old girl was swarmed several times a day with groups of children giving her the Nazi salute.

Many incidents referred to the Gaza war, with one teacher calling a student a "baby killer" because she admitted that her family supported Israel's war against Hamas. Other educators reportedly told students that they were personally responsible for the war in Gaza.

Deborah Lyons, who recently resigned as Canada's Special Envoy for Preserving Holocaust Remembrance and Combatting Anti-Semitism, became involved in the probe after hearing reports of anti-Semitism from Jewish parents.

"Jewish students deserve what every Canadian child deserves: to feel safe, valued and included in their classrooms," Lyons commented in a statement. "This is not the reality today — and it must change."

One-sixth of the parents responded that their child experienced anti-Semitism from an educator during a school-related activity. On one occasion, a teacher told a student that their Hebrew teachers were lying that Israel existed. Another teacher wore T-shirts with anti-Israel slogans, such as "From the river to the sea," a rallying cry that calls for the erasure of the State of Israel.

Many incidents in schools were not reported, and many institutions narrowly define anti-Semitism as based only on religious practice rather than ethnicity, nationality, or culture.

"It is disconcerting to see the number of reported anti-Semitic incidents being ignored in Ontario schools," Lyons added. "Silence in the face of anti-Semitism is not neutrality — it is complicity and sends a bad message to all students about standing up against hate."


